The A's and Dodgers meet for the first time since June 16-18, 2009 when the A's lost two of three at Los Angeles...have not met in Oakland since June 16-18, 2006 when the A's swept a three-game series...the A's have won four of the seven season series and are 13-9 against the Dodgers...that includes 9-2 in Oakland and 4-7 at Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jonny Gomes is batting .438 (7 for 16) with two home runs and four RBI in June after hitting .222 with one home runs and seven RBI in May.

Brandon Moss was named American League Player of the Week yesterday after batting .348 with three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first career weekly honor.

Seth Smith is batting .433 (13 for 30) with four doubles, three home runs and nine RBI over his last 10 games...is batting .340 (33 for 97) with all seven of his home runs in 32 games in the outfield compared to .178 (13 for 73) in 23 games at designated hitter.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1979** Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City...Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in **2003** Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high five-game winning streak snapped Sunday...are 9-6 over the last 15 games after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...are 12-19 since May 15 after going 19-17 over the first 36 games...the mark since May 15 is tied for third worst in the majors...are 31-36 for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in third place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and are a season-high 9½ games behind Texas...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 18 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...won two of three from San Diego to start the homestand after sweeping a three-game series at Colorado...have won back-to-back series for the second time this year (April 30-May 6 at Boston and Tampa Bay).

LAST 15, PREVIOUS 18: The A's are batting .284 (149 for 524) over the last 15 games (since June 2), including .333 (48 for 144) with runners in scoring position...hit .181 with a .179 average with RISP over the previous 18 contests...have 90 runs over the last 15 games (6.0 per game) after tallying 38 over the previous 18 (2.1 per game)...have 58 extra base hits in the last 15 games (33 doubles, six triples, 19 home runs) after collecting 31 over the previous 18 (17 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 6-6 in interleague play (1-2 at San Francisco, 0-3 at Arizona, 3-0 at Colorado, 2-1 vs. San Diego)...have scored 69 runs, which is second most in the majors (Minnesota, 71) and 19 more than the A's scored all last year in interleague play (50)...have 15 home runs after combining for 16 over the previous two seasons...rank third in interleague play in extra base hits (43) and fifth in slugging (.453)...however, have a 4.95 ERA (57 er in 103.2 ip), which is four highest...are 27-39 (.409) over the last four years (since 2009), which is the fifth worst mark in the majors...however, are 150-128 (.540) all-time, which is seventh best...following this three-game series with the Dodgers, the A's conclude interleague play with San Francisco...went 8-10 in interleague play last year, their third consecutive season with a losing record against the NL...it was just the fifth time in 15 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing interleague record.

A's IN JUNE: The A's lead the American League in runs (90), doubles (34), triples (6), on-base percentage (.346), slugging percentage (.462) and extra base hits (59) in the month of June...also rank second in batting (.275), third in walks (58) and tied for fourth in home runs (19)...are 9-7 (.563), which is the fifth best mark in the AL...the nine wins match the A's June total from last year...went 10-12 in April and 11-16 in May and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years...hit .211 in April and .210 in May.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 12 home runs in the last six games and now have 61 for the season...last year the A's hit just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break...31 of the A's 61 home runs have come with two outs, which is tied for second most in the American League...hit four home runs a week ago today at Colorado, the A's first four-homer game since June 3, 2010 at Boston...it snapped a 330-game streak with three home runs or fewer, which was second longest in Oakland history (440, Aug. 10, 1976-June 18, 1979).

PITCHING: The A's allowed eight runs in the three-game series against San Diego (27.0 ip, 2.67 ERA) after surrendering 36 runs in six games on the last road trip (35 er in 51.2 ip, 6.10 ERA)...are tied for second in the American League in shutouts (6) and fewest home runs (58)...have the second fewest strikeouts (422) and the fourth most walks (223)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in each of the last four games (5 er in 21.0 ip, 2.14 ERA) after tossing five innings or fewer in each of the previous five contests (26 er in 23.2 ip, 9.89 ERA).

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.226), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.364) and third lowest on-base percentage (.302)...rank last in the American League in runs (254) and have the fourth lowest average with runners in scoring position (.245)...have been shutout a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...are tied for the AL lead in stolen bases (53) and are tied for the fewest grounded into double plays (41)...have six double steals, which is second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (had 11 in 2010)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98)...A's designated hitters are second to last in the AL with a .207 (43 for 208) batting average (Seattle, .199).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 13 assists, which ranks second in the American League...the A's have turned 74 double plays, which is second most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this nine-game homestand against San Diego (2-1), Los Angeles (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season to a 10-game stand from July 30-August 8...it follows a stretch from May 28 to June 14 where the A's played 12 of their 16 games on the road...went 7-9 over that span, including 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 15-17 at home and 16-19 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 3.04 ERA (101 er in 298.2 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (145 er in 301.2 ip) on the road.

COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's overcame a four-run deficit to win last Wednesday night for the second consecutive game and third time this year...that marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's have overcome a deficit of four or more runs to win in back-to-back games...the other two times are September 7-8, 1996 (Kansas City) and April 26-27, 1998 (Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...are 9-7 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-6 in the last at bat...are 6-7 in one-run games and the 13 decisions are tied with Cleveland for the fewest in the majors...are 15-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 16-21 in all other games...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the American League in extra inning wins and tied for third in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times and currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, Norberto, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season, his third since being reinstated from the disabled list June 2...the A's are 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments and are 18-18 (.500) in his two seasons with the A's...his teams are 45-47 (.489) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in six of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the disabled list June 2 and is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts since his return...was 3-3 with a 2.95 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 18 with a strained right shoulder...it was his seventh career stint on the DL...has also missed a start twice this year...today's start is his first since June 7...also went nine days without pitching from May 2-12.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Extended his winning streak to five games with a win in his last start, a new career-high...his previous high was four two times (last: July 15 to August 6, 2011)...the winning streak is tied for second longest in the American League this year...is 5-0 with a 2.31 ERA (10 er in 39.0 ip) and .228 (33 for 145) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-3 with a 3.38 ERA and .308 opponents average over his first five starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League with a 2.79 ERA...has allowed five home runs in 71.0 innings, an average of 0.63 per nine innings, which is seventh lowest in the AL...is third in fewest pitches per inning (14.7).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .265 opponents batting average, which includes .209 (28 for 134) against right-handed hitters compared to .319 (45 for 141) against left-handers...the mark against righties is sixth lowest in the American League...has issued 12 of his 18 walks and surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...has the third lowest on-base percentage against right-handers (.245) and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.291)...opponents are batting .306 (49 for 160) with the bases empty compared to .209 (24 for 115) with runners on base...including .197 (13 for 66) with runners in scoring position...the mark with RISP is seventh lowest in the AL.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is making his first interleague start as an Athletic...his only interleague appearance over the last five years was a start on May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston, a nine-hit shutout in a 5-0 win (1 bb, 6 so)...is 2-1 with a 1.41 ERA (5 er in 32.0 ip) and .213 (26 for 122) opponents batting average in nine career interleague appearances, including four starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 1.85 ERA (8 er in 39.0 ip) in six starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 3.94 ERA (14 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts on the road...has the fourth lowest home ERA in the American League...in two seasons with the A's, he is 8-5 with a 2.40 ERA (33 er in 124.0 ip) in 19 starts at home compared to 6-7 with a 3.97 ERA (52 er in 117.2 ip) in 17 starts on the road.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer in seven of his 11 starts this year, including one run or fewer three times...in two seasons with the A's, he is 2-12 with run support of three runs or fewer and 12-0 in 14 starts with run support of four runs or more.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on 11 days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.46 ERA (15 er in 39.0 ip) six five starts on four days rest and 3-1 with a 1.97 ERA (7 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more...in two seasons with the A's, he is 6-5 with a 3.96 ERA (50 er in 113.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest and 8-7 with a 2.46 ERA (35 er in 128.0 ip) in his other 19 starts

2012 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Seattle in Tokyo on **March 28**...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the seventh different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last seven years (Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on a Dustin Ackley home run in the fourth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Seattle **April 6** in Oakland...joined Joe Blanton as the only pitchers in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...Blanton did it in 2008, the last time the A's went to Japan...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 12-inning win over Kansas City **April 11** in Oakland...left after six innings with a 3-2 lead but Fuentes allowed a Gordon home run in the seventh inning for the blown save...started three of the A's first seven games...since 1977, the only other Oakland pitcher to start three of the A's first seven games was Joe Blanton...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles **April 16**...allowed 11 hits in 7.0 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Morales in the first inning but then blanked the Angels on five hits and a hit batter over the next six innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Cleveland **April 21** in Oakland...allowed 10 hits, his second consecutive start with 10 or more hits...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-2 win at Baltimore **April 27**...it snapped a four-game losing streak dating back to last year...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 win at Boston **May 2**...blanked the Red Sox on three hits and two walks over the first six innings and had a 4-0 lead entering the bottom of the seventh...extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit **May 12** in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter...it was his third career 10-strikeout game and the second time he did not walk a batter or allow a run in those games...allowed only one base runner past second base...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win at Texas **May 17**...had a 3-0 lead before Moreland then hit a two-run home run in the fourth and a solo shot in the sixth to tie the game...another run scored in the sixth inning and left trailing 4-3...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Kansas City **June 2**...allowed a RBI single to Francouer in the first inning and a RBI double to Hosmer in the sixth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 win over Texas June 7 in Oakland...retired 10 of the first 11 batters he faced...allowed a one out double to Hamilton in the fourth and he scored on a Beltré RBI single...then retired each of the final 11 batters he faced.

McCARTHY vs. LOS ANGELES: Has never faced the Dodgers in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (6-5, 4.48 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season...is 0-2 with a 6.35 ERA (16 er in 22.2 ip) over his last four starts...the losing streak is the first of his career...is tied for the lead among American League rookies in games started (13), tied for second in innings pitched (80.1) and tied for third in wins (6)...is 4-1 with a 0.98 ERA and .186 opponents average in five starts at home compared to 2-4 with a 7.42 ERA and .317 opponents batting average in eight starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the majors and the third highest road ERA...has allowed 12 of his 13 home runs on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-8 A's win at Colorado last Wednesday (4.0 ip, 7 h, 8 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Dodgers in his career...is 0-0 with a 12.00 ERA in two career interleague starts, both this year, compared to 6-5 with a 3.53 ERA in 11 starts against the American League.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and fifth start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his 12th appearance overall this year...the A's are 1-3 (.250) in his four starting assignments and his teams are 4-8 (.333) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in one of his four starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer three times.

ALMOST EIGHT YEARS: Was the winning pitcher in his last start, his first Major League win since he defeated Seattle in his Major League debut July 1, 2004...the span of seven years, 350 days between wins is the longest since Vicente Romo went 8 years and 3 days between victories from July 16, 1974 to July 19, 1982...it is the fourth longest streak by a pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) behind Jim Bouton (8 years, 65 days), Romo and Joe Grzenda (7 years, 362 days)...the win snapped a career-high five-game losing streak dating back to July 7, 2004.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Triple-A Fresno and was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, before he was selected by San Francisco May 1...posted a 9.00 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four relief appearances with San Francisco before he was designated for assignment May 13...was claimed off waivers by the A's May 15 and did not allow an earned run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip) before making his first start May 28...is 1-2 with a 3.76 ERA (11 er in 26.1 ip) in seven games, four starts, with the A's.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-2 with a 4.87 ERA (11 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts this year and 0-0 with a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip) in seven relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 for 6 with a sacrifice hit in his relief appearances and he allowed 1 of 2 inherited runners to score...had eight career appearances entering this season and all were starts...is 2-5 with a 7.69 ERA (47 er in 55.0 ip) in 12 career starts...made six starts with Seattle in 2004 and two with San Francisco in 2007.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 4 for 29 (.138) with two walks (.194 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has issued all 10 of his walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed a .333 (11 for 33) average with runners in scoring position.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in four career interleague appearances, including two starts...all have been this year.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Minnesota May 28...blanked the Twins on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Plouffe in the fifth inning...the A's scored a run in the sixth to increase the lead to 3-1 but Norberto allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was his first Major League start since September 29, 2007.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven hits and but also matched his career best with five strikeouts...retired the first six batters before the Rangers scored three times in the third inning on a two-run double by Kinsler and a RBI double by Hamilton...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Torrealba in the fourth and a RBI triple to Young in the fifth.

THIRD START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona June 10...allowed three runs, two earned, in the first inning on a fielders choice and a two-run single by Hill...the A's scored twice in the fourth to make the score 3-2 but he allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the fifth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over San Diego last Friday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 6.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Quentin in the first inning but the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first...also allowed a RBI single to Denorfia in the second but retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced.

BLACKLEY vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Has made two career appearances, both in relief this year at San Francisco (2.1 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...retired the side in order in the eighth innings on May 18...then pitched the final 1.1 innings the next day (1 h, 1 so)...pitched for the Giants in 2007 and this year and was 0-0 with a 7.90 ERA in six games, including two starts.

WITH FRESNO: Was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, with Triple-A Fresno in the San Francisco organization...walked just three batters in 23.1 innings (1.16 per nine innings) and allowed one home run...allowed a .163 opponents batting average, including .153 (9 for 59) against right-handed hitters and .190 (4 for 21) against left-handed

hitters...opponents were 1 for 27 (.037) with runners on base, including 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position...tossed at least 4.0 innings in each of his four outings...did not allow a run over his final two starts and finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign with a 15.1-inning scoreless streak.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Pitched for the KIA Tigers of the Korean Baseball Organization...appeared in 25 games, including 22 starts, and posted a 7-5 record with a 3.48 ERA...struck out 115 and walked 62 in 126.2 innings.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Was originally signed by Seattle as a non-drafted free agent on October 29, 2000 and is 69-57 with a 3.91 ERA (476 er in 1094.2 ip) in 227 career appearances, including 176 starts, over 10 minor league seasons...traded to San Francisco April 1, 2007...was a Rule 5 draft selection by Philadelphia prior to the 2008 season, was signed by Arizona as a free agent for 2009 and inked a minor league deal with the New York Mets for 2010...was released by the Mets May 1, 2010 and signed a minor league contract with the A's May 14...posted a 2-1 record and a 2.43 ERA in 17 games, six starts, with Single-A Stockton and Double-A Sacramento...was released December 20 to play in Korea...returned to the United States after signing a minor league contract with San Francisco February 19, 2012.

BRETT ANDERSON

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

DARIC BARTON

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento June 2.

JERRY BLEVINS

- Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).

- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Leshar, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.

BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.

RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.

COLLIN COWGILL

- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419)

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17.

BRIAN FUENTES

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

GRAHAM GODFREY

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.

LUKE HUGHES

- Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin... it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his two-game rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.

TOMMY MILONE

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a career-high 49-game homerless streak.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).

JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder.

CLIFF PENNINGTON

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday...is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.

ANTHONY RECKER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned back to Sacramento June 16..

TYSON ROSS

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.
- Returned on June 16 to start against San Diego and allowed two runs on one hit and four walks in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 15 against San Diego and recorded his first Major League save in the A's 10-2 win.
- Was optioned to Sacramento, June 16.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.

- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21 but returned to Oakland June 16.

KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

RICH THOMPSON

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

NEIL WAGNER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
- Was claimed off waivers by San Diego May 28.

JEMILE WEEKS

- Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span... since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
- Stole his 10th base of the season May 15 at Los Angeles (AL)...is the fifth player in Oakland history to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first two seasons, the first since Jason McDonald in 1997.
- Had two RBI June 4 against Texas, snapping a career-high 25-game streak without an RBI
