<u>'88 REVISITED</u> – The Dodgers return to the scene of their last World Series victory tonight as they begin a three-game series with the Oakland Athletics. The series also marks the start of a nine-game road trip that also features stops down the road at Angel Stadium (3 games) and up the coast at AT&T Park (3). The Dodgers own the Majors' best overall record at 42-25 and are a formidable 18-13 (.581) on the road this season.

- ► Los Angeles leads the San Francisco Giants by 4.5 games in the NL West.
- ▶ The Dodgers are looking to move to 18 games over .500 for the first time all season. The club has lost on all five attempts (May 23 at ARI, May 28 vs. MIL, June 11 vs. LAA, June 13 vs. LAA and June 16 vs. CWS) to reach that plateau this year.
- ▶ The Dodgers are nine games (5-4) into their 15-game Interleague schedule with three games against the Mariners (2-1), White Sox (2-1) and Athletics and six games versus the Angels (1-2).
- ▶ This series marks the Dodgers first trip to the Oakland Coliseum since being swept over a three-game stretch from June 16-18, 2006.
- ► After another tight one on Sunday, the Dodgers are 18-13 in one-run games. The 31 one-run contests are the most in the Major Leagues this year.

<u>UP FOR A RUBBER MATCH?</u> – The Dodgers and A's have only played 22 regular season games against each other, but the two squads split a couple of World Series, with Oakland winning the '74 Fall Classic 4 games to 1 and Los Angeles returning the favor, 4 games to 1, in 1988. The A's lead the regular season series, having won 13 of 22, including nine of 11 at Oakland Coliseum. The last time these two teams hooked up, the Dodgers took two of three at Dodger Stadium from June 16-18, 2009.

<u>DON'T STOP VOTING</u> – The latest installment of the National League All-Star ballot results was released today and outfielder **Matt Kemp** continues to lead all National League players with 3,322,009 votes. If Kemp is elected by the fans to Kansas City, it will mark the first time since balloting began in the early 1970's that the Dodgers have a fan-elected starter in three consecutive Midsummer Classics.

▶ Dodger outfielder **Andre Ethier** leads the National League with 55 RBI, but is currently fifth in the voting among NL outfielders with 1,517,218 votes. Ethier trails Ryan Braun (fourth) and Melky Cabrera (third) by more than 600,000 votes for the final NL starting outfield spot.

<u>THE ROCK</u> – Dodger outfielder **Bobby Abreu** pinch-hit, singled and scored the game-tying run in the ninth inning Sunday, raising his average with the Dodgers to .320 (32-for-100). In 38 games with Los Angeles, Abreu has a homer, 10 RBI, seven doubles, 18 runs scored, 19 walks and a .433 on-base percentage. Since joining the club on May 4, Abreu's on-base percentage ties for third in the NL.

FROM GREEN TO BLUE – The Dodgers have several players with ties to the Oakland A's, including second baseman Mark Ellis, who was a fan favorite for nine seasons in the Bay Area. Ellis, who did make the trip to Oakland, is currently on the disabled list following a fasciotomy on his lower left leg. In addition to Ellis, All-Star outfielder Andre Ethier was selected in the second round of the 2003 First-Year Player Draft by Oakland and was the organization's Position Player of the Year and Double-A Texas League Player of the Year in 2005. Adam Kennedy (2009), Ted Lilly (2002-03) and Aaron Harang (2002-03) all played for the Athletics at some point in their careers as well.

► Harang was originally drafted by the Rangers in the sixth round of the 1999 First-Year draft, but was traded to Oakland on Nov. 17, 2000 and made his big league debut right here at the Oakland Coliseum on May 25, 2002 vs. Tampa Bay. Harang tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while striking out 10 in his debut. The 6-foot-7 right-hander has never faced the A's and will be making his first appearance in Oakland since being traded to the Reds on July 30, 2003.

SUPERMAN – Dodger super utilityman Elian Herrera went 3-for-4 on Sunday, raising his average to .305 (32-for-105) in 31 games. Herrera collected his ninth multi-hit game and the 27-year-old has started 26 games at third base (10), second base (nine), center field (5) and left field (2). The native of the Dominican Republic is hitting .341 (14-for-41) with runners on base and since his debut on May 15, his .407 on-base percentage ranks third among qualifiers on the team, behind just Bobby Abreu (.462) and A.J. Ellis (.413).

► Among Major League rookies with at least 100 at-bats, Herrera leads the pack with a .407 on-base percentage and also ranks among the big league rookie leaders in batting average (2nd), runs (17, T-9th), doubles (9, T-10th) and walks (18, T-4th)

SLICK WILLIE – On this day in 1973, Dodger outfielder Willie Davis hit a home run for his 2,000th career hit. Since Davis' milestone, only Gary Carter (July 5, 1991), Brett Butler (May 16, 1994), Tim Wallach (Sept. 24, 1995) and Jeff Kent (July 8, 2005) have collected their 2,000th hit in a Dodger uniform.

► On June 19, 1952, Dodger hurler **Carl Erskine** pitched the first of his two no-hitters, blanking the Cubs, 5-0.

- The 34-year-old San Diego native will make his 14th start of the season today... signed with Los Angeles as a free agent this offseason... reached the 1700.0-inning plateau in his last start, becoming the 33rd active player to reach that mark...originally selected by Texas in the sixth round of the 1999 First-Year Player Draft out of San Diego State University
- **LAST TIME OUT** Did not factor in the decision on Tuesday against the Angels, but made his third straight quality start, allowing just two runs (zero earned) on six hits in the Dodgers' eventual 5-2 win...walked four, struck out five and threw a season-high 118 pitches
- VS. OAKLAND Will be making his first career start against the Athletics...has gone 10-10 with a 3.17 ERA (59 ER/167.1 IP) in 27 career Interleague starts...has two complete games in his career during Interleague play, shutting out the Indians with a seven-hitter on June 23, 2006 and losing an 8.0-inning complete game on May 21, 2006 at Detroit...played two seasons with Oakland from 2002-03, going 6-7 with a 4.97 ERA (60 ER/108.2 IP) in 23 games (21 starts)...originally acquired by Oakland prior to the start of the 2001 season with Ryan Cullen from Texas for Randy Velarde and then dealt to Cincinnati on July 30, 2003 with Jeff Bruksch and Joe Valentine in exchange for Jose Guillen
- QUALITY CONTROL Has posted a quality start in each of his last three starts, going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) since June 2...has limited opposing hitters to a .240 batting average (18-for-75) in that span
- A RE-K-ORD SETTING NIGHT Established a Dodger record on April 13 by striking out nine consecutive Padre hitters, breaking Johnny Podres' franchise record of eight set on July 2, 1962 vs. Philadelphia...finished the night with 13 strikeouts, which tied his career high (also: Sept. 29, 2007)...became the first Dodger pitcher in the last 90 seasons to have 13 or more strikeouts in a game while pitching fewer than 7.0 innings
- **HOME SWEET HOME** Has fared much better in his five home starts this season, posting a 2.51 ERA (9 ER/32.1 IP) with a .203 opponents' batting average at Dodger Stadium while having a 4.37 ERA (22 ER/45.1 IP) and a .294 opponents' batting average in his eight road starts...has a 3.00 ERA (19 ER/57.0 IP) in nine career starts at Dodger Stadium
- **DOWN SOUTH** In 2011, led the Padres with 14 wins (14-7) and posted a career-low 3.64 ERA
- **LEADERBOARD** –Since 2004, ranks among the NL leaders in wins (90, 7th) strikeouts (1,287, 3rd), innings pitched (1545.1, 4th), starts (245, 3rd) and complete games (13, T-8th)
- A SPRING IN HIS STEP Went 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 ER/24.0 IP) in six Cactus League starts this spring
- STAND TALL At 6-feet 7-inches tall, became the eighth Dodger player to be 6-7 or taller, joining Billy Ashley, John Candelaria, John Duffie, Mark Hendrickson, Frank Howard, Sean Maloney and Rick Sutcliffe.
