

2011 SEASON:

Spent third season with Angels in 2011, his 14th full season in Majors...Streak of 150 games played ended at 13 consecutive seasons (142 G)...Streak equaled Willie Mays' MLB record (1954-66)...First season since 1997 Abreu did not reach double-digit HRs and first campaign since 1998 he did not reach 75 RBI...253 clip was lowest of career for a full season...Logged at least 30 doubles for 12th time in his career...Posted 20 SBs for 13th consecutive season, longest streak in majors since Rickey Henderson had 23 straight campaigns from 1979 to 2001...Finished second on Halos batting .291 (32/110) with RISP...78 walks ranked T9th in A.L. - marked 13th time in 14 seasons he reached 75 free passes...1,419 career walks rank third among actives...HR on June 22 at Florida marked career hit #2,334 to pass A. Galarraga for third most all-time among Venezuelans...896 career extra-base hits are most all-time among Venezuelans...Tied season-high with three RBI August 20, including walk-off SF in 12th, his 11th career walk-off RBI and fourth in last two seasons...Posted 16th career multi-HR game August 9 at NYY.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

Enters 2012 16 home runs shy of 300 for career & seven stolen bases from 400 - in MLB history, only Bobby and Barry Bonds have reached both milestones...Abreu has posted at least 20 SBs in each of the last 13 seasons, longest streak in majors since Rickey Henderson had 23 straight campaigns from 1979 to 2001...Two-time All-Star (2004 & 2005), Gold Glove recipient (2005) and Silver Slugger honoree (2004)...HR Derby Champion in 2005 at Comerica Park (hit 41 total HRs, including 24 in one round)...Streak of 150 games played ended at 13 consecutive seasons in 2011...Streak equaled Willie Mays' MLB record (1954-66)...One of four active players with 1,400 runs & 1,300 RBI (Chipper Jones, Alex Rodriguez and Jim Thome)...His 554 doubles rank 25th in MLB history...One of just four players all-time with: 500 2Bs, 250 HRs & 350 SBs (Barry Bonds, Rickey Henderson and Craig Biggio)...Has logged 20 HRs, 20 SBs & 40 2Bs in a season five times in his career – no one else in MLB history has completed the trifecta more than three times...5th player in history to have five different seasons with 100 RBI and 30 SB - in 2009, Abreu joined Honus Wagner, Hugh Duffy, Ty Cobb and Barry Bonds...9th among actives with 2,384 hits (entering '12)...6th among actives with 393 stolen bases...Since 2001, he has been on base 2,943 times, 3rd most in MLB in the span (Pujols & Ichiro)...Has 11 career walk-off hits/RBI and five career walk-off home runs...Ranks T85th all-time with 1,412 runs scored...In 2011 he passed Andre Dawson (1,373), Tony Gwynn (1,383) and Joe DiMaggio (1,390) on the all-time runs list...Approaching Hall of Famers Roberto Clemente (1,416) and Rod Carew (1,424)...His 2,384 hits rank third all-time among Venezuelans behind Omar Vizguel (2,841) and Luis Aparicio (2,677).

POST-SEASON EXPERIENCE:

Made fifth career appearance in playoffs in 2009 and reached LCS for first time in career...Batted .160 (4/25) with two doubles, four walks and two RBI in six LCS games vs. Yankees...In Division Series, batted .556 (5/9) in three games vs. Red Sox with two doubles, four walks and one RBI...Reached base safely in nine of 13 plate appearances in DS...Registered four walks in Game 1 to tie a DS record...His 9th inn., two-out double in Game 3 of DS brought Angels within a run...Scored game-winning run on Vladimir Guerrero's 2-run single...In 2007 with Yankees, batted .267 (4/15) with one double, one HR and two RBI, starting all four Division Series games in right field vs. Cleveland...Homered in 9th inning of Game 4 loss off Joe Borowski...In 2006 with NYY, hit .333 (5/15) with team-leading four RBI in four Division Series games vs. Detroit...In 1997, appeared in three games with Astros in Division Series vs. Atlanta...Went 1-for-3 with a stolen base for series.

MAJOR LEAGUE SUMMARY:

2010 marked his second season with the Angels...Batted .255 (146/574) with 88 runs, 41 doubles, one triple, 20 home runs, 78 RBI and 24 stolen bases in 154 games...Led club in walks (87), runs and stolen bases...Did not reach 100 RBI for first time since 2002, snapping a streak of seven consecutive seasons at the century mark...Reached 150 games played for the 13th consecutive season to match Willie Mays' MLB record (1954-66)...Logged 20 SB for the 12th consecutive season, the longest streak among active players...Posted 20 HR,

20 SB & 40 2B for the fifth time in his career – no one else in MLB history has completed the trifecta more than three times...Hit HRs #19 and #20 Sept. 19th at TB (15th career multi-HR game)...Registered ninth career 20/20 season...The only other players in MLB history with more than seven such seasons are Bobby and Barry Bonds (10 each) – ELIAS...He and Howie Kendrick became the first Angel teammates with 40 doubles apiece since 1998 (J. Edmonds & G. Anderson)...Reached 40 doubles for the seventh time...Connected for a walk-off solo HR on Sept. 10 in 14th

inning vs. Seattle, his 10th career walk-off hit or RBI and fifth career walk-off HR...Logged three walk-off hits in 2010 (2 HR)...Named A.L. Player of the Week (Aug. 9-16) after posting .524 (11/21) clip with two home runs, five RBI, a .615 OBP and a .952 SLG pct...Hit 500th double June 2 at KC to become one of just one four players all-time with: 500 2Bs, 250 HRs & 350 SBs (Barry Bonds, Rickey Henderson and Craig Biggio)...Launched ninth career grand slam April 13 at NYY.

- Spent first season with Angels in 2009 and batted .293 (165/563) with 96 runs, 29 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs, 103 RBI and 30 stolen bases in 152 games...Played at least 150 games for the 12th consecutive season...Reached 100 RBI for the seventh consecutive year...Logged 87 RBI over his last 112 games (spanning to May 25th) to rank second in A.L. in RBI during that stretch (M. Teixeira, 88 RBI)...Finished 8th in A.L. with 103 RBI...Hit .354 (56/158) with RISP to lead Angels and rank 6th in A.L...Led Angels with 23 go-ahead RBI...T3rd in A.L. with 94 walks...Took 67.6% of pitches he saw (2nd most in MLB)...With 30 stolen bases, logged 20+ stolen bases in 11 consecutive season (1999-2009)...Became just the fifth player in history to have five different seasons with 100 RBI and 30 SBs joins Honus Wagner, Hugh Duffy, Ty Cobb and Barry Bonds...Just second Angel in history with at least 100 RBI and 30 steals (Bobby Bonds had 115 RBIs and 41 steals in 1977)...Named AL Player of the Month for July...Batted .380 (38/100) with 28 RBI in 26 games...Second Player of the Month honor in his career (May, 2005)...First inning double June 7 at Detroit was 2,000th hit...Became just the fifth Venezuelan player to reach the 2,000 hit mark as he joined Hall of Famer Luis Aparicio (2,677 hits), Omar Vizquel (2,674), Andrés Galarrága (2,333) and Dave Concepción (2,326)....With 252nd career HR Aug. 16 at Baltimore, passed Tony Armas for third place for home runs by Venezuelans (Galarraga 399; M. Ordonez 278)...Singled in first at-bat Opening Night to extend Opening Day hit streak to 13 consecutive games.
- In 2008 with Yankees, hit .296 (180/609) with 100 runs scored, 20 home runs and 100 RBI in 156 games (148 starts in RF, four starts at DH)...Set career-high with 609 at-bats...His 87 hits with two strikes were most in Majors...Did not swing at 630 of his 684 first pitches seen (92.2%)...Hit two-run double in third inning in 4/24 loss at Chicago (AL), giving him 1,000 career RBI...Tied career-high with four runs and two triples in 5/30 win at Minnesota...Hit four HR over a four-game stretch from 7/30-8/2 marking his first such four-game stretch since 5/15-18/05 with Phi...Tied a career-high with five hits in 8/22 win at Baltimore, going 5-for-5 (also 5 hits on 8/8/99 w/ Phi.)... Marked his third career game with six-or-more RBI...Hit game-winning grand slam in 10th inn. 9/24 at Toronto.
- In 2007, hit .283 (171/605) with career-high 123 runs, 40 doubles, five triples, 16 HR, 101 RBI and 25 SB in 158 games with Yankees (150 starts in RF and one start at DH)...Led MLB with 90 two-strike hits and ranked second in A.L. with 123 runs scored...Also ranked third in Majors, seeing 4.38 pitches per plate appearance and saw a total of 3,060 pitches, second-most in MLB)...Suffered strained right oblique muscle at start of Spring Training and missed first 19 games...Reached base safely in nine consecutive plate appearances from 6/9-12 (four singles, one double, one triple, one home run and two walks)...Scored 1,000th run of his career in 6/13 win vs. Arizona...According to Elias, became fifth player in expansion era (since 1961) with 400 doubles in fewer than 5,800 AB, joining Edgar Martinez (5,349 AB); Wade Boggs (5,695 AB); Larry Walker (5,756 AB) and Hal McRae (5,763 AB)...Drove in his 100th run of season on 9/30 at Baltimore in Yankees' final regular season game.
- In 2006, batted .297 (163/548) with 98 runs, 41 doubles, 15 HR, 107 RBI and 30 SB in 156 games with Philadelphia and Yankees (152 starts in RF, two starts at DH)...Led MLB with 124 BB, reaching the 100-walk plateau for the eighth consecutive season (1999-2006), becoming only third player in MLB history to do so (also Max Bishop, 1926-33; and Frank Thomas, 1991-98)...With Yankees, hit .330 (69/209) with 7 HR and 42 RBI in 58 games (54 starts in RF, one start at DH)...Acquired from Phillies on 7/30 with RHP Cory Lidle in exchange for four minor leaguers...Stole 18 consecutive bases from 6/5-8/19...Drove in a career-high seven runs in 9/12 win vs. TB...Hit three-run HR and three-run double in the first inning and was 2-for-3 with one SF...With six RBI in the first inning, tied A.L. record for most RBI in a single inning (10th time)...Began season with Phillies, batting .277 (94/339) with 25 doubles, 8 HR, 65 RBI and 20 SB in 98 games (95 starts in RF, one start at DH)...Reached base safely in 34 straight games from 6/1-7/9.
- In 2005, batted .277 with 37 doubles, 1 triple, 24 HR, 102 RBI and 31 SB in 162 games with Phillies, becoming only third player in Major League history with seven consecutive 20 HR/20 SB seasons, joining Barry Bonds (nine straight) and Bobby Bonds (seven straight)...Became first player in MLB history to hit at least one home run in nine out of 10 team games (from 5/8-18)...Won first NL Gold Glove after finishing third among NL right fielders in fielding percentage (.986) and sixth in assists (7)...Set a club record by drawing at least 100 walks for seventh straight season...Tied a club record by homering in five straight games (5/8-12)...Also tied a club record by collecting an RBI in 10 consecutive games, 5/8-18 (18 RBI), joining Pinky Whitney (1931)...Led all MLB players with 3,159 pitches seen...His three grand slams were the most by a Phillie in one season since 1959 (Gene Freese) and one shy of club record of four, set by Vince DiMaggio in 1945...Led NL in grand slams (three), tied for first in games (162) and second in walks (117)...Named NL "Player of the Week" for the period of 5/9-15, batting .583 (14/24) with 6 HR and 12 RBI...Scored a run in 11 straight games from 5/8-19 (12 runs overall)...Named NL "Player of the Month" for May (.396, 11 HR, 30 RBI, 30 BB, .535 OBP, .792 SLG)...Won Home Run Derby on All-Star Workout Day at Detroit's Comerica Park, setting new records for total HR (41) and HR in a round (24 in 1st round)...Voted by the fans as the starting RF for the NL All-Star squad, his first starting assignment.



- In 2004, hit .301 with 118 runs, 47 doubles, one triple, 30 HR, 105 RBI and 40 SB in 159 games with Philadelphia... With his HR on final day of season, reached 30 HR and 30 SB for second time in career...Became fourth player in MLB history with six straight 20 HR/20 SB seasons en route to his first All-Star selection...Earned Silver Slugger Award...Reached career-highs in walks (127) and steals (40) and tied a then career-high in runs (118)... Became only second player in club history to have 40 doubles and 40 stolen bases in a season (Ed Delahanty, 1895)...Homered in three straight games from 5/12-15...Scored a run in 11 straight games from 5/11-22 (18 runs overall)...Ejected on 6/22 at Montreal for arguing a called third strike - first ejection of his career...Named NL "Player of the Week" for 6/28-7/4 (.417, 10-for-24, 5 2B, 2 HR, 10 RBI, 12 BB, .611 OBP, .875 SLG).
- ◆ In 2003, batted .300 with 99 runs, 35 doubles, one triple, 20 HR, 101 RBI and 22 SB in 158 games with Phillies...Finished fourth in NL with 109 BB, becoming just second Phillie in franchise history to walk 100 or more times in five straight seasons...Singled off Carl Pavano for 1,000th career hit on 7/4 vs. Florida...Hit third career grand slam on 7/24 at Chicago off Kerry Wood...Also hit a sacrifice fly in the inning, becoming just second Phillie in club history to get five RBI in one inning, joining Von Hayes (6/11/85 vs. Mets).
- In 2002, hit .308 with 102 runs, 50 doubles, six triples, 20 HR, 85 RBI and 31 SB in 157 games with the Phillies...Led NL with 50 doubles, becoming only third Phillie ever to reach the mark (Chuck Klein, 1930, '32 and Ed Delahanty, 1899)...Became second Phillie with three straight 40-double seasons (Delahanty, 1895-97)...Hit 20 or more home runs, walked 100 or more times and scored 100 or more runs for fourth straight season...Stole 30 or more bases for second straight season...Hit 100th career home run on 6/1 vs. Montreal (off Tony Armas)...Had a career-best 17-game hit streak from 9/5-24, hitting .455 (30/66).
- In 2001, batted .289 with 118 runs, 48 doubles, four triples, 31 HR, 110 RBI and 36 SB in all 162 games with Philadelphia, setting career-highs in home runs and RBI...Became first Phillie in franchise history to reach 30 HR and 30 SB, joining Montreal's Vladimir Guerrero as only Major Leaguers to accomplish feat in 2001... Finished tied for first in NL in games (162), tied for third in walks (106), fourth in doubles (48) and stolen bases (36)...His 83 extra-base hits were most by a Phillie since Chuck Klein's 103 in 1932...Was first Phillie to play 162 games since Pete Rose and Gary Matthews in 1982...Was also first Phillie to reach 100 RBI and 30 SB since Sherry Magee in 1910...Named NL "Player of the Week" for period from 5/28-6/3, hitting .522 (12/23) with 13 runs, 3 doubles, 3 HR, 10 RBI and 4 SB...Hit third career inside-the-park HR on 6/24 at Florida... His 30 RBI in June were most in a month by a Phillie since Darren Daulton in May 1993...Scored a run in 12 straight games from 6/23-7/4 (15 runs overall).
- ◆ In 2000, hit .316 with 103 runs, 42 doubles, 10 triples, 25 HR, 79 RBI and 28 SB in 154 games for Phillies, becoming first Phillie since Juan Samuel (1984-87) to reach double figures in doubles, triples, HR and SB in consecutive seasons...Was only NL player to accomplish feat in 2000...Also became just second Phillie to reach 20 HR and 20 SB in consecutive seasons (also Mike Schmidt from 1974-75)...Hit 10th-inning, game-winning inside-the-park home run on 8/27 vs. San Francisco...Also homered earlier in same game, becoming first Phillie with both a HR and inside-the-park HR in same game since Scott Rolen on 7/2/99 vs. Chicago (NL).
- ◆ In 1999, established career-highs in average (.335), hits (183) and triples (11) with Philadelphia...Average ranked third in NL and was highest by a Phillie since Tony Gonzalez hit .339 in 1967...His .446 on-base percentage ranked third in NL and was highest by a Phillie since Rich Ashburn's .449 mark in 1955...Tied for first in NL in triples, ranked fifth in walks (109) and tied for fifth in runs (118)...Hit first career grand slam on 4/16 vs. Florida and first career inside-the-park HR on 5/14 vs. Mets...Had career-high five hits on 8/8 vs. Arizona...Drove in six runs and tied a career-high with 2 HR on 8/24 vs. SD...Underwent arthroscopic surgery to remove loose bodies from right elbow on 10/4.
- ◆ In 1998, led Phillies in batting average (.312) and on-base percentage (.409), recording 29 doubles, six triples, 17 HR, 74 RBI and 19 SB in 151 games...Average never dipped below .300 entire season...His .427 average with RISP was tops in Majors...His 17 outfield assists were third in NL and most by a Phillie since Glenn Wilson's 18 in 1987...Recorded second career two HR game, 5/28 at Chicago (NL)...Played winter ball for Caracas in Venezuela Winter League.
- ◆ In 1997, appeared in 59 games with Houston, batting .250 with 10 doubles, two triples, 3 HR, 26 RBI and 7 SB...Was Astros' Opening Day right fielder...Hit .349 (15/43) with RISP and .316 (24/76) with runners on base...Hit his first two Major League home runs in same game, 4/28 vs. Colorado (off Jamey Wright and Steve Reed)...Placed on 15-day D.L. from 5/23-6/30 with fractured hamate bone in right hand...Rated by *Baseball America* as Houston's third-best prospect.
- In 1996, saw his first Major League action when recalled by Astros on 9/1...Appeared in 15 games for Houston with four starts batting .227 with one double and one RBI...Collected first Major League hit, a single off Bobby Jones, as a pinch-hitter on 9/24 vs. Mets...Collected first Major League RBI on 9/28 vs. Florida...Spent full season at triple-A Tucson, hitting .285 with 24 stolen bases in 132 games...Named Astros' third-best prospect and Pacific Coast League's fifth-best prospect by Baseball America...

Led PCL in triples (16)...Led all Astros minor leaguers in runs (86), triples, walks (83) and outfield assists (15)...Named Astros' Minor League Player of Year...Played winter ball for Magallanes and led all batters with .588 average in Caribbean World Series.

GAMER Since 1998, Bobby Abreu's 2,173 games played are the most in the Majors.

MINOR LEAGUE SUMMARY:

In 1995, spent his first season at triple-A Tucson, batting .304 with 24 doubles, 17 triples, 10 HR, 75 RBI and 16 SB...Was club's youngest player at 21 years old...Named PCL's fourth-best prospect by Baseball America...Reached .300

mark for the third time in five pro seasons...Led all professional baseball in triples, matching his career best...Also led PCL in outfield assists (18) and ranked second in walks (67)...His 75 RBI were third-best in the Astros' farm system.

- In 1994 with double-A Jackson, hit .303 in 118 games...Led Texas League with .530 slugging pct...Was secondyoungest player in league at 20 years old...Finished third in league in triples (9), T4th in extra-base hits (50) and T5th in HR (16)...His home run and RBI (73) totals led club...Hit two home runs on 7/9 vs. San Antonio.
- In 1993, was promoted to single-A Osceola and set club record with a Florida State League-high 17 triples in 129 games, batting .283 with a team-high 21 doubles, 5 HR and 55 RBI...Also led club with 18 outfield assists.
- In 1992, hit .292 at single-A Asheville and finished among Astros' organizational leaders in runs (81), at-bats (480), hits (140) and walks (63) as an 18-year-old...Earned South Atlantic League "Player of the Week" honors, 6/15-21...Tallied 15 outfield assists.
- In 1991, hit .301 in first pro season while with Gulf Coast Astros...Led league with 13 outfield assists.

PERSONAL/MISC:

- In 2010, initiated the "Abreu's Amigos" program during Angels home games...Abreu donates 30 tickets for several home games to the Anaheim Police Department's "Cops 4 Kids" program and other local youth organizations.
- Introduced a new line of athletic shoes in 2009 under his 'BTOP' label...The line includes: baseball shoes/ cleats, running shoes, kids shoes and sandals.
- Full name is Bob Kelly Abreu...Known as "El Comedulce" in Venezuela which translates roughly to "the candyeater," which had been his father Nelson Abreu's nickname...Following Nelson's death, Bobby began asking people to call him the same name as a way of honoring his father's memory.
- Third overall pick by Tampa Bay in Expansion Draft, 11/18 /97; then traded to Phillies for Kevin Stocker on same day.
- Had three brothers in pro baseball: Dennis played in Cubs' minor league system; Nielsen played in Phillies' minor league system; Nelson played for Camden of Independent Atlantic League.
- Signed by Astros' scout Andres Reiner.
