<u>SUM-SUM-SUMMERTIME</u> – The Dodgers continue their Interleague series with Oakland on the first day of summer as the summer solstice rolls through just after 4 p.m. today. The series is also the first stop on a nine-game road trip (0-1) that also brings the club down the road at Angel Stadium (3 games) and back up the coast at AT&T Park (3). The Dodgers own the Majors' best overall record at 42-26 and are 18-14 (.563) on the road this season.

- ► The Dodgers lead of 4.5 games over the Giants in the NL West is the largest divisional lead in the NL.
- ► The Dodgers once again failed to move to 18 games over .500 for the first time all season. The club has lost on all six attempts to reach that plateau this year.
- ▶ The Dodgers are 10 games (5-5) into their 15-game Interleague schedule with three games against the Mariners (2-1), White Sox (2-1) and Athletics (0-1) and six games versus the Angels (1-2).

<u>UP FOR A RUBBER MATCH?</u> – The Dodgers and A's have only played 23 regular season games against each other, but the two squads split a couple of World Series, with Oakland winning the '74 Fall Classic 4 games to 1 and Los Angeles returning the favor, 4 games to 1, in 1988. The A's lead the regular season series, having won 14 of 23, including 10 of 12 at Oakland Coliseum.

<u>NATE THE GREAT</u> – Despite a 1.82 ERA (5 ER/24.2 IP) in his four starts, Dodger starter **Nathan Eovaldi** is still searching for his first victory since winning his first-career game on Aug. 6, 2011. The Texas native is limiting hitters to a .231 batting average (21-for-91), but has received an average of just 0.73 runs of support.

- ► The Dodgers are 0-4 when Eovaldi pitches after going 4-2 in his six starts last season.
- ▶ The Dodger bullpen fired 4.1 scoreless innings last night in relief of **Aaron Harang** and has not surrendered a run in its last 10.1 innings dating to Friday night. Los Angeles relievers have posted a National League-best 2.33 ERA (12 ER/46.1 IP) this month.
- ► Los Angeles ranks third in the Majors with a 2.94 team ERA (49 ER/150.0 IP) in 17 June games. Overall, the Dodgers' 3.13 team ERA is the second-best mark in the big leagues behind only Washington (3.03 ERA).

<u>WALKING THE WALK</u> – On this date in 2008, the Dodgers received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. The star sits on Hollywood Boulevard near Highland.

THE ROCK – Dodger outfielder **Bobby Abreu** is hitting .311 (32-for-103) with a .427 on-base percentage in 38 games with Los Angeles. Abreu ranks fifth among the NL's OBP leaders (min. 100 AB) and is one of five Dodgers among the league leaders, joining **Matt Kemp** (.444, 3rd), **A.J. Ellis** (.428, 4th), **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (.403, 9th) and **Elian Herrera** (.394, T-12th).

► Los Angeles leads the NL and ranks second in the Majors with a .337 team on-base percentage, trailing only the Rangers' .342 mark.

KIND OF A BIG DEAL – Last night, three minor league All-Star games took place and Dodger prospects were in abundance with no one shining brighter than Single-A Great Lakes first baseman O'Koyea Dickson. Dickson went 2-for-3 with a two-run homer and two runs scored, helping the East squad to an 18-2 triumph in the Midwest League All-Star game. A native of San Francisco, Dickson wasn't called up to Great Lakes until early May, but has hit .331 (44-for-133) with a .564 slugging percentage and a .442 on-base percentage in 39 games. Dickson was selected by the Dodgers in the 12th round of the 2011 First-Year Draft.

- ▶Over in Tennessee, seven Double-A Chattanooga Lookouts took part in the Southern League All-Star game with both Pedro Baez and Blake Smith starting and going 1-for-4. J.T. Wise was 0-for-2. On the mound, Matt Magill saw action while Steven Ames, Ethan Martin and Red Patterson combined to throw 2.2 scoreless innings out of the bullpen.
- ► In Winston Salem, NC, a team of California League All-Stars took on their Carolina League counterparts and lost, 9-1. Single-A Rancho Cucamonga outfielder **Leon Landry** went 1-for-2 in the contest.

SHOCKING, I KNOW – Utilityman **Elian Herrera** went 0-for-4 last night, failing to reach base for just the third time in his 27 starts. The 27-year-old has started games at third base (10), second base (nine), center field (5) and left field (3) and is hitting .341 (14-for-41) with runners on base.

► Among National League rookies with at least 100 at-bats, Herrera leads the pack with a .394 on-base percentage and also ranks among the NL rookie leaders in average (2nd), runs (17, T-7th), doubles (9, T-9th) and walks (18, 4th)

<u>JUAN-DERFUL DAY</u> – The Dodgers would like to wish a very happy 40th birthday to former player and current Special Assistant, Baseball Operations and Player Development, **Juan Castro**. Castro retired in 2010 after 17 Major League seasons and immediately joined the Dodger front office. He is currently in Arizona, working with the youngsters at Camelback Ranch.

<u>ALL IN THE FAMILY</u> – Yesterday morning, **Scott Van Slyke** and his wife, Audrey, welcomed their first child, a baby boy named Jackson Lee, into the world. The newest member of the Dodger family weighed in at seven pounds, 11 ounces and is a foot long.

- The 22-year-old right-hander is making his fifth start of the season and 11th big league start tonight after being selected in the 11th round of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft...recalled on May 29 for his second stint with the Dodgers this season after not appearing in a game during a brief recall from April 27-28...last name is pronounced E-vald-i
- GOOD LOOKING OUT Was 2-2 with a 3.09 ERA (12 ER/35.0 IP) in nine games (eight starts) for the Double-A Chattanooga Lookouts...struck out 30, walked 13 and limited hitters to a .244 average
- **SOUTHERN COMFORT** Selected as a Double-A Southern League Midseason and Postseason All-Star in 2011...ranked second in the league with a 2.63 ERA and a .203 opponents' batting average in 20 games (19 starts) for Chattanooga...held left-handed hitters to a .188 batting average (30-for-160) with right-handers hit just .215 (46-for-214)...averaged just under a strikeout per inning with 99 strikeouts in 103.0 innings
