HOUSE OF HORRORS – The Dodgers continue their Interleague series with the Oakland A's and are still looking for their first victory at Oakland Coliseum since June 24, 2004. The finale of the threegame series today completes the first stop on a nine-game road trip (0-2) that also brings the club down the road at Angel Stadium (3 games) and back up the coast at AT&T Park (3). The Dodgers own the National League's best overall record at 42-27 and are 18-15 on the road this season.

- ► The Dodgers lead of 4.5 games over the Giants in the NL West is the largest divisional lead in the NL.
- ► The Dodgers are 11 games (5-6) into their 15-game Interleague schedule with three games against the Mariners (2-1), White Sox (2-1) and Athletics (0-2) and six games versus the Angels (1-2).

<u>UP FOR A RUBBER MATCH?</u> - The Dodgers and A's have only played 24 regular season games against each other, but the two squads split a couple of World Series, with Oakland winning the '74 Fall Classic 4 games to 1 and Los Angeles returning the favor, 4 games to 1, in 1988. The A's lead the regular season series, having won 15 of 24, including 11 of 13 at Oakland Coliseum.

EVERYBODY LOVES CHRIS - The Dodgers would like to congratulate left-hander Chris Reed on his nomination to the World Team in the upcoming XM Futures Game. Reed, who was born in London, has a 2.00 ERA in three starts at Double-A Chattanooga and was 1-4 with a 3.09 ERA with Single-A Rancho Cucamonga to begin this season.

NEED A LITTLE RELIEF? - The Dodger bullpen ranks fourth in the National League with a 3.10 ERA, trailing just Cincinnati (2.70), Pittsburgh (2.73) and Washington (2.95). Dodger relievers are third with a .220 opponents' batting average and rank seventh with 191 strikeouts.

> ► Since **Ronald Belisario** joined the relief corps on May 5, the bullpen owns a National League-best 2.30 ERA (30 ER/117.1 IP). Belisario has allowed just nine hits (9-for-70 in 21.2 innings this season. The native of Venezuela owns a 1.25 ERA and has allowed just one run in his last eight appearances (10.1 IP).

THE ROCK - Dodger outfielder Bobby Abreu is hitting .302 (32for-106) with a .417 on-base percentage in 40 games with Los Angeles. Abreu ranks sixth among the NL's OBP leaders (min. 100 AB) and is one of five Dodgers among the league leaders, joining Matt Kemp (.444, 3rd), A.J. Ellis (.428, T-4th) and Jerry Hairston **Jr.** (.399, T-9th).

> ► Los Angeles ranks second in the National League with a .334 team on-base percentage, trailing only the Cardinals'

PLEASE SIGN HERE - The Dodgers have signed 28 of their 41 picks in the 2012 First-Year Player Draft, including eight of their 11 selections in the draft's first 10 rounds. Los Angeles recently added its third-round selection, left-hander Onelki Garcia, and fourth-round pick, first baseman Justin Chigbogu, to its list of signees.

> ► Dodger draft picks were well represented at the NCAA College World Series in Omaha as Justin Gonzalez's Florida State Seminoles (shortstop, 27th round) are still playing for a title shot, while Steven Rodriguez's Florida Gators (left-handed pitcher, 2nd round), Scott Griggs' UCLA Bruins (right-handed pitcher, 8th round) and **James** Campbell's Stony Brook Seawolves (right-handed pitcher, 12th round) have all been eliminated.

MR. INVALUABLE – Dodger utilityman Elian Herrera has started games at third base (10), second base (nine), center field (5) left field (3) and right field (1) and is hitting .333 (14-for-42) with runners on

- The 24-year-old left-hander will make the 15th start of his fifth Major League season...made his second consecutive Opening Day start on April 5...earned his first All-Star selection last season...was originally selected by Los Angeles in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft
- LAST TIME OUT Did not factor in the decision on Friday against the White Sox, allowing five runs (four earned) on a season high-tying eight hits in the Dodgers' eventual 7-6 win...walked two, struck out seven and threw 104 pitches
- **VS. ATHLETICS** Did not factor in the decision in his only start against Oakland on June 16, 2009 at Dodger Stadium, allowing just four hits and striking out eight in 5.2 scoreless innings in the Dodgers' eventual 5-4 extra-inning win...has gone 5-3 with a 3.19 ERA (31 ER/87.1 IP) in 14 career Interleague starts, including complete-game efforts on June 20, 2011 vs. Detroit and June 26, 2011 vs. the Angels
- GONE STREAKING Fired 22.0 consecutive scoreless innings from May 8-19 (three starts)...was the longest streak of his career and the sixthlongest streak in the Majors this season
- HANG 10 Posted a career-long 10-game winning streak, which began on Aug. 13, 2011 (vs. Houston at Dodger Stadium) and ended on April 27, 2012...went 10-0 with a 1.22 ERA (13 ER/96.0 IP) during the run and limited opposing hitters to a .189 average (65-for-344)
- WHAT A HOMER! Won 12 straight home decisions from May 2, 2011-April 27, 2012, tying Ed Roebuck (6/4/60-8/29/62) and Orel Hershiser (9/20/84-10/2/85) for the longest home winning streak in LA Dodger history...has gone 3-3 with a 2.37 ERA (15 ER/57.0 IP) in eight home starts this season and has a 28-15 record with a 2.46 ERA and five complete games in 68 career starts at Dodger Stadium
- FOLLOW THE LEADER Ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (2.86, 13th), opponents' batting average (.221, 12th), pickoffs (4, 2nd) and WHIP (1.04,T-7^t
- OPENING DAY HONOR Made his second consecutive Opening Day start on April 5, becoming the first reigning Cy Young Award winner to make an Opening Day start for Los Angeles since Sandy Koufax in 1964...is the first Dodger to make consecutive Opening Day starts since Derek Lowe from 2005-07
- <u>CY YOUNG</u> Won the 2011 NL Cy Young Award, earning 207 overall points with 27 (of 32) first-place votes...at 23 years old, became the second-youngest Dodger to win the award behind **Fernando Valenzuela** (20, 1981) and the youngest National Leaguer to win it since Dwight Gooden (20, 1985)...became the eighth different Dodger to win the Cy Young with a Dodger pitcher winning the award for the 10th time, both of which are the most in the Majors
- AWARDS SEASON Was selected by the Los Angeles Sports Council as its 2011 Sportsman of the Year and won his first career Rawlings Gold Glove, the Players Choice Award for Outstanding NL Pitcher, the Warren Spahn Award, the Texas Professional Baseball Player of the Year and the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum's Bullet Rogan Award for NL "Pitcher of Year"...also selected as a Sporting News NL All-Star
- TRIPLE CROWN Became the 16th National League pitcher to win the league's pitching Triple Crown since 1900, leading the Majors with a 2.28 ERA, tying with Arizona's Ian Kennedy for the NL lead with 21 wins and ranking first in the league with 248 strikeouts...became just the third different Dodger to achieve the feat, joining Dazzy Vance (1924) and Sandy Koufax (1963, 1965 and 1966)...also ranked among the NL leaders in opponents' batting average (.207, 1st), winning percentage (.808, 2nd), innings pitched (233.1, 3rd), complete games (5, 3rd), shutouts (2, T-2nd) and WHIP (0.98, 1st)
- GIVING BACK Recognized for his charity work last season as the Dodgers' nominee for the Roberto Clemente Award...established the Kershaw's Challenge Program and donates, along with his wife Ellen, \$100 per strikeout to Arise Africa, a charity organization that raises money to help build orphanages in Zambia...has visited Zambia in each of the past two offseasons and recently published a book with Ellen titled Arise about their life together and trips to Africa
