A's vs. GIANTS

The A's trail in the season series 1-2 after losing two of three in San Francisco, May 18-20...split the season series last year, 3-3...the A's won all three games in Oakland last year and have a sixgame winning streak against the Giants in the Coliseum...in the previous 15 season series, the A's have won four, the Giants two and the clubs have split the season series nine times...the A's are 46-43 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 26-17 in Oakland and 20-26 in San Francisco.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes hit his first career walk-off home run yesterday, a three-run shot...six of his seven home runs have come with runners on base, six have come at home and four have come in the seventh inning or later.

Brandon Moss has hit six home runs in interleague play, which is tied for fourth in the majors...it also matches the most by an Athletic in interleague play (Miguel Tejada, 2000).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Sal Bando, Ted Kubiak and Reggie Jackson all hit solo homers in the third inning of the A's 7-3 win against Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...it is the first three-homer inning in Oakland history...in 1979, twelve days after Jim Essian's inside-the-park Grand Slam, Larry Murray hits an inside-the-park home run in the A's 6-5 win over the Texas Rangers.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's swept a three-game series from the Dodgers, who began the series with the best record in the majors...the last time the A's swept a team that had the best record in the majors at the start of the series was May 23-25, 2008 against Boston...have now won eight of the last nine games since June 12 but Texas has also gone 8-1 over that span and the A's remain nine games behind the Rangers in third place in the American League West...are 12-6 over the last 17 games after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...have won three straight series for the first time since September 3-12, 2010...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 21 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

HITS ALLOWED: The A's allowed eight hits in the three-game series against Los Angeles, which is the fewest hits allowed by an A's team in a three-game series since at least 1918...the previous low was 10 against Tampa Bay, May 7-9, 2010...it marked just the third time since 1918 the A's allowed three hits or fewer in three consecutive games (Sept. 2-3, 1952 and July 11-16, 1992)...have allowed 17 hits in the last five games, 22 in the last six and 28 in the last seven, all of which are the fewest by an A's team over those spans since at least 1918.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 10 runs on 22 hits over the first six games of the homestand for a 1.67 ERA (10 er in 54.0 ip) and .124 (22 for 178) opponents batting average...had a 6.10 ERA and .305 opponents batting average on the last road trip...now have a 3.56 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are tied for second in the AL in shutouts (7) and fewest home runs (58) and have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.381)...however, have the fourth most walks (228) and second fewest strikeouts (438).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in each of the last four games (3 er in 26.0 ip, 1.04 ERA) and two runs or fewer in each of the last seven contests (7 er in 45.0 ip, 1.40 ERA)...prior to the last seven games, starters tossed five innings or fewer in five consecutive contests (26 er in 23.2 ip, 9.89 ERA)...now have a 3.98 ERA (185 er in 418.0 ip) for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...Tommy Milone tossed the A's first complete game of the season Wednesday night and it came in the A's 69th game...in Athletics history only the 2009 (game 81) and 1996 (game 78) teams went farther into the season without a complete game.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have won eight of their last nine interleague games after losing five of the first six...are 9-6 overall (1-2 at San Francisco, 0-3 at Arizona, 3-0 at Colorado, 2-1 vs. San Diego, 3-0 vs. Los Angeles), snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing interleague record...last finished above .500 against the National League in 2008 when they went 10-8...need one more win to clinch a winning interleague record for the ninth time in 16 seasons...have scored 80 runs in the first 15 interleague games, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2007 (92)...have hit 17 home runs, which is one more than the combined total from the previous two seasons...have a 153-128 (.544) all-time mark in interleague play all-time, which is sixth best.

PLAYERS USED: Yesterday, Derek Norris became the 40th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is third most in the American League behind Boston (41) and Detroit (41)...Norris is the 15th rookie, which is the most in the majors and one more than the A's season total from last year...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Doolittle, Miller, Milone, Norris, Parker).

A's IN JUNE: The A's lead the majors in runs (101) in the month of June...lead the American League in extra base hits (65), are tied for the lead in doubles (38) and triples (6), rank second in walks (74) and on-base percentage (.344) and third in slugging percentage (.448)...are 12-7 (.632), which is tied for the third best mark in the AL...the 12 wins are the A's most in June since going 13-15 in 2009...went 10-12 in April and 11-16 in May and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years.

LAST 18, PREVIOUS 18: The A's are batting .274 (167 for 610) over the last 18 games (since June 2), including .333 (55 for 165) with runners in scoring position...hit .181 with a .179 average with RISP over the previous 18 contests...have 101 runs over the last 18 games (5.6 per game) after tallying 38 over the previous 18 (2.1 per game)...have 64 extra base hits in the last 18 games (37 doubles, six triples, 21 home runs) after collecting 31 over the previous 18 (17 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs).

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.225), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.362) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.303)...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (265) and have been shutout a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...are tied for the AL lead in stolen bases (56)...have six double steals, which is second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (had 11 in 2010)...have grounded into just 43 double plays, which is tied for the fewest in the AL...have hit 63 home runs after tallying just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break last year...32 of the A's 63 home runs have come with two outs, which is second most in the AL...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98)

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-1 on this nine-game homestand against San Diego (2-1), Los Angeles (3-0) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season to a 10-game stand from July 30-August 8...it follows a stretch from May 28 to June 14 where the A's played 12 of their 16 games on the road...went 7-9 over that span, including 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...have won seven of their last eight home games and are 18-17 at home compared to 16-19 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 2.85 ERA (103 er in 325.2 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (145 er in 301.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is the lowest in the American League.

WALK-OFF WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their fourth "walk-off" win of the season yesterday, which is one more than their season total from last year...are now 10-7 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-6 in the last at bat...are 6-7 in one-run games and the 13 decisions are the fewest in the majors...are 15-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 19-21 in all other games...are 4-2 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the American League in extra inning wins.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, the 12th of his career...the A's are 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments and his teams are 6-5 (.545) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in seven of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has not allowed a run in three of his last four starts and is 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) over that span...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 career starts.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has tossed 60.2 innings, which is 9.1 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.82) and opponents batting average (.216)...has allowed just two home run for an average of 0.30 per nine innings, which is the lowest in the AL...is fifth in opponents slugging (.315).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks sixth among American League rookies in innings (60.2), seventh in starts (10) and strikeouts (45) and tied for eighth in wins (3)...his 2.82 ERA and .216 opponents batting average is the lowest among AL rookies with 60 or more innings.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made three interleague starts this year and is 1-2 with a 7.71 ERA (12 er in 14.0 ip) and .294 (15 for 51) opponents batting average...they are the first three interleague starts of his career...is 2-1 with a 1.35 ERA (7 er in 46.2 ip) and .191 (31 for 162) opponents batting average in seven starts against American League teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 10 for 58 (.172) with five walks (.238 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .186 (8 for 43) batting average with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .192 (29 for 151) batting average the first two times through the lineup and .274 (17 for 62) after that...has yielded just two home runs in 60.2 innings, both against left-handed hitters...has not allowed a home run to a right-handed hitter in his career...has issued 30 walks, an average of 4.45 per nine innings.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on seven days rest today...is 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA (3 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more and 1-3 with a 4.36 ERA (16 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest or fewer.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 after going 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts with the River Cats...replaced Graham Godfrev in the starting rotation.

2012 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Fukudome in the seventh inning...Balfour allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas...is just the second pitcher since 1990 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of five or more innings and one run or fewer...the other is Rich Harden, who did it for the A's from July 21 to 31, 2003...had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win over Toronto *May 8* in Oakland...issued a career-high five walks in seven innings...was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 3-1 loss to Detroit *May 13* in Oakland...the score was tied at 1-1 when he loaded the bases in the sixth...was relieved by Balfour, who walked in the go-ahead run...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-6 loss at San Francisco **May 18**...allowed a career-high six runs in a career-low 2.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Los Angeles **May 23** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Minnesota **May** 29...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and four walks...the A's scored a run in the seventh to take a 1-0 lead and he was relieved by Blevins to start the bottom of the seventh...the A's had a 2-0 lead entering the ninth but Fuentes allowed a three-run "walk-off" home run to Willingham for the blown save and loss...he was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-1 win over Texas June 4 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 shutout innings and yielded just one hit...no-hit the Rangers over the first seven innings...Young then singled to lead off the eighth...walked three batters and did not allow a runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss at Arizona *June 9*...allowed a career-high eight hits and matched his career highs with six runs and five walks...allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the first, snapping his careerhigh scoreless streak at 18.0 innings...the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the second but he allowed five runs in the fifth inning on a RBI double by Upton and grand slam by Montero.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-2 win at Colorado June 14...tossed 7.0 shutout innings...allowed just one runner as far as second base over the first five innings...the Rockies biggest threat off him came in the sixth inning when Nelson singled, went to second on a sacrifice and third on a Scutaro ground out...struck out Gonzalez to end the inning...left leading 5-0...Fuentes allowed two runs in the ninth.

PARKER vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, an 8-6 A's loss at San Francisco last month on May 18...allowed a career-high six runs in a career-low 2.0 innings...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed two runs in the second on a Belt RBI single and an Arias sacrifice fly...did not retire a batter in the third inning, allowing each of the first five batters to reached base...yielded a RBI double to Crawford and was relieved by Blevins after walking Belt with the bases loaded...Blevins allowed two inherited runners to score.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts...struck out 21 batters in 20.2 innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .271 (13 for 48) against right-handed hitter and .281 (9 for 32) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...opponents were 4 for 29

RHP Tyson Ross (2-6, 6.11 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento today for his third stint with the A's...recalled for the first time April 17 and went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31...returned June 16 to start against San Diego after McCarthy missed a turn in the rotation, but was optioned back to Sacramento the next day...did not pitch for the River Cats following the option as he returns today...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over the Padres (6.0 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA in two career appearances, including one start, against the Giants...the start came in his only outing this year, a 4-0 A's loss at San Francisco May 19 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so).

The A's bullpen is 3-0 with five saves, one blown save and a 1.48 ERA (5 er in 30.1 ip) over its last nine games after going 0-3 with one save, four blown saves and a 5.40 ERA (17 er in 28.1 ip) over the previous 12 contests...has a 2.71 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...has the lowest opponents batting average (.205) and slugging percentage (.321) and has allowed the third fewest home runs (15)...has allowed the third most walks (96)...has 60 strikeouts in 56.0 innings over its last 20 games (9.6 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings)

- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.

 optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits
 for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home
 runs.

LUKE HUGHES

 Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports
 Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over
 a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more
 RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16
 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was
 his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one
 sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas,
 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).

- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.
- Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.
- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the
 first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota,
 August 12-14, 1996.
- Matched his career-high with three hits (fifth time, first since June 20, 2009 at Colorado) and three RBI (fourth time, second time this year: June 12 at Colorado) June 14 at Colorado.

- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).

JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on thw 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder...
 made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.

DEREK NORRIS

Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut.

CLIFF PENNINGTON

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday...is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.

ANTHONY RECKER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he
was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned ba;ck to Sacramento June 16...

TYSON ROSS

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.
- Returned on June 16 to start against San Diego and allowed two runs on one hit and four walks in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief
 appearances with the River Cats.
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 15 against San Diego and recorded his first Major League save in the A's 10-2 win.
- · Was optioned to Sacramento, June 16.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left
knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports
Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21 but returned to Oakland June 16.

KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

RICH THOMPSON

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

NEIL WAGNER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
- Was claimed off waivers by San Diego May 28.

JEMILE WEEKS

- Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span...
 since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career
 is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the
 previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
- Stole his 10th base of the season May 15 at Los Angeles (AL)...is the fifth player in Oakland history
 to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first two seasons, the first since Jason McDonald in 1997.
- Had two RBI June 4 against Texas, snapping a career-high 25-game streak without an RBI
