A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series, 3-6...are 2-3 in Seattle, 0-2 in Oakland and 1-1 Tokyo...have lost three of the previous five season series and are 45-59 (.433) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 295-223 (.569) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .579)...are 163-94 in Oakland, 131-128 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 55-64 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last nine games and has a 10.2-inning scoreless streak.

Coco Crisp has batted leadoff in each of his last 11 games and is 14 for 41 (.341) with seven walks, six stolen bases and seven runs over that span.

Jonny Gomes is batting .367 (11 for 30) in June after hitting .222 in May.

Jim Miller ranks eighth among AL relievers with a 1.48 ERA.

Josh Reddick has 17 homers and is the second Athletic since 2003 with at least 17 homers by the end of June (Swisher, 19 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire ties a pair of Oakland records by hitting three home runs and scoring five runs in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland...in **1996** the A's hit a franchise record eight home runs in a 18-2 win at California...the A's also collect an Oakland record 44 total bases and 11 extra base hits and score in eight different innings, tying an American League record...in **2002** Miguel Tejada plays in his 348th consecutive game, breaking Alfredo Griffin's Oakland record for consecutive games played...Tejada's streak reached 594 before signing with Baltimore as a free agent.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 10-4 since June 12, which is the fourth best record in the majors over that span...are now 14-9 over the last 23 games after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...are in third place in the American League West for the 15th consecutive day and trail Texas by a season-high tying 10 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 26 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...lost two of three to San Francisco last weekend, snapping a three-series winning streak...it was the first time the A's won three straight series since September 3-12, 2010.

PITCHING: The A's allowed seven hits last night and have now surrendered 63 hits over the last 12 games...the 63 hits are the **fewest by an Athletics team over a 12-game span since 1916** (previous: 64, April 15-27, 1986)...the A's have a 2.44 ERA (29 er in 107.0 ip) and .172 (63 for 366) opponents batting average over the last 12 games...have a 3.55 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the AL...have tossed three shutouts in the month of June and now have eight shutouts for the season, which is tied for second in the American League...are tied for the second fewest home runs (61) and have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.375)...however, have the fourth most walks (245) and second fewest strikeouts (471).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-2 with a 1.77 ERA (15 er in 76.1 ip) and .160 (41 for 257) opponents batting average over the last 12 games...have allowed three hits or fewer in seven of those games and one run or fewer seven times...have a 3.87 ERA (193 er in 449.1 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the American League...Tommy Milone tossed the A's first complete game of the season a week ago today against Los Angeles and it came in the A's 69th game...in Athletics history only the 2009 (game 81) and 1996 (game 78) teams went farther into the season without a complete game.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost last night, 3-2, and each of their last five losses have been by one run...are now 7-10 (.412) in one-run games, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are 4-2 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 11-9 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-8 in the last at bat...won their second 1-0 game of the season Monday and Tommy Milone was the starter in both games (also April 9 vs. Kansas City)...the lone run scored on a Seth Smith home run, the 12th 1-0 win in Oakland history in which the lone run scored on a home run (last: Erubiel Durazo on September 12, 2004 vs. Cleveland)...have five "walk-off" wins this year, which is two more than last year...last Friday, the A's lost for the fourth time this year when leading after eight innings, which is the most such losses in the majors.

A's IN JUNE: The A's lead the majors in runs (120) and walks (94) in the month of June...lead the American League in strikeouts (203), rank second in extra base hits (77) and triples (6), third in on-base percentage (.336), tied for third in doubles (44) and fourth in home runs (27)...the pitching staff has the lowest opponents batting average (.226) and slugging percentage (.337) in the AL and ranks second in ERA (3.29)...however, has issued the second most walks (76)...are 14-10 (.583), which is the fourth best record in the AL...need one more win to clinch a winning record in June for the first time since 2008 (16-10)...the 14 wins match the A's highest single month total from last year...have not won more than 14 games in any month since going 16-12 in May, 2010...went 10-12 in April and 11-16 in May this year and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.224), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.362) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.304)...have scored the fewest runs in the American League (284) and have been shut out a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...**lead the American League in stolen bases** (61) and are tied for the second fewest grounded into double plays (48)...are batting .335 (59 for 176) with runners in scoring position over the last 21 games after hitting .209 over the first 54 contests...have hit 69 home runs after tallying just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break last year...33 of the A's 69 home runs have come with two outs, which is fourth most in the AL...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.00).

PLAYERS USED: On Sunday, A.J. Griffin became the 42nd player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied with Boston for second most in the majors to San Diego (45)...last year, the A's used 48 players, which was their fewest since 2006 (40)...Griffin is the 16th rookie, which is the most in the majors and two more than the A's season total from last year...currently have 10 rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Doolittle, Griffin, Miller, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game road trip to Seattle (1-1) and Texas (four games)...had their season-high tying four-game road winning streak snapped last night...went 6-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (2-1), Los Angeles (3-0) and San Francisco (1-2) after going 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 19-19 at home compared to 17-20 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 2.99 ERA (117 er in 352.2 ip) at home compared to 4.20 (148 er in 318.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is second lowest in the American League while the road ERA ranks eighth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have turned 81 double plays, which ranks third in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is tied for third in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times and currently have eight players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Colón, Cowgill, Devine, McCarthy, Sizemore)...the eight players matches the season high (also May 18-20)...three of those players will miss the remainder of the season (Carignan, Devine, Sizemore)...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season, the 13th of his career...the A's are 5-6 (.455) in his starting assignments and his teams are 6-6 (.500) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in eight of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

ONE RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one run or fewer in five of his last six starts and is 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA (8 er in 39.0 ip) and .191 (25 for 131) opponents batting average over that span...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 12 career starts...since 1918, the only other starting pitchers to allow one run or fewer in eight of their first 12 games are Dwight Gooden (1984), Dontrelle Willis (2003) and Zach Duke (2005)...of those three, only Gooden did it in nine of his first 13 games...has allowed no runs in four of his starts and has yielded more than two runs just twice.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has tossed 66.2 innings, which is 8.1 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he ranks seventh in the American League in opponents batting average (.214) and eighth in ERA (2.70)...has allowed just two home runs for an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which is the lowest in the AL...is fourth in opponents slugging (.303).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks sixth among American League rookies in innings (66.2), tied for sixth in starts (11) and strikeouts (49) and tied for eighth in wins (3)...his .214 opponents batting average is lowest among AL rookies with 60 or more innings and his 2.70 ERA ranks second (Diamond, MIN 2.67).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 12 for 64 (.188) with six walks (.257 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average is fourth lowest in the American League and the on-base percentage ranks sixth...has held the opponents number four hitter to a .138 (4 for 29) batting average, which is second lowest in the American League...has allowed a .191 (9 for 47) batting average with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .185 (31 for 168) batting average the first two times through the lineup and .288 (19 for 66) after that...has yielded just two home runs in 66.2 innings, both against left-handed hitters...has not allowed a home run to a right-handed hitter in his career...has issued 32 walks, an average of 4.32 per nine innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.39 ERA (13 er in 26.2 ip) and .240 (23 for 96) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-1 with a 1.58 ERA (7 er in 40.0 ip) and .196 (27 for 138) opponents batting average in six starts at home...has the fourth lowest home ERA in the American League and the seventh lowest opponents batting average.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-3 with a 4.36 ERA (16 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest or fewer and 2-0 with a 1.07 ERA (4 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 after going 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts with the River Cats...replaced Graham Godfrey in the starting rotation.

2012 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago **April 25** in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Fukudome in the seventh inning...Balfour allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston **May 1**...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas...is just the second pitcher since 1990 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of five or more innings and one run or fewer...the other is Rich Harden, who did it for the A's from July 21 to 31, 2003...had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win over Toronto **May 8** in Oakland...issued a career-high five walks in seven innings...was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 3-1 loss to Detroit **May 13** in Oakland...the score was tied at 1-1 when he loaded the bases in the sixth...was relieved by Balfour, who walked in the go-ahead run...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-6 loss at San Francisco **May 18**...allowed a career-high six runs in a career-low 2.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Los Angeles **May 23** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Minnesota **May 29**...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and four walks...Fuentes allowed a three-run "walk-off" home run to Willingham for the blown save and loss...he was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-1 win over Texas **June 4** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 shutout innings and yielded just one hit, a Young singled to lead off the eighth innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss at Arizona **June 9**...allowed a career-high eight hits and matched his career highs with six runs and five walks...allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the first, snapping his career-high scoreless streak at 18.0 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-2 win at Colorado **June 14**...tossed 7.0 shutout innings...allowed just one runner as far as second base over the first five innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to San Francisco last Friday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Blanco in the third inning, but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...allowed a leadoff single to Sandoval in the seventh and was relieved by Blevins with a 3-1 lead...the A's maintained that lead until Cook allowed four runs in the ninth inning for the blown save and loss.

PARKER vs. SEATTLE: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts...struck out 21 batters in 20.2 innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .271 (13 for 48) against right-handed hitter and .281 (9 for 32) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...opponents were 4 for 29 (.138) with runners in scoring position...tossed 6.0 innings in each of his first three starts before leaving his last start April 21 at Reno after just 2.2 innings in preparation for starting in Oakland April 25 on three days rest.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Tyson Ross (2-7, 6.20 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...is 0-4 with a 5.74 ERA (26.2 ip, 30 h, 19 r, 17 er, 17 bb, 17 so, 5 hr) and .297 (30 for 101) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the four-game losing streak matches his career-high (also April 15-June 1, 2010)...his opponents have a .309 batting average, which breaks down to .257 (27 for 105) against right-handed hitters and .352 (44 for 125) against lefties...was the losing pitcher in his last start, the A's 9-8 loss to San Francisco last Saturday in Oakland...allowed two runs, one earned, in the second inning...Posey scored on a Gomes error and Belt had a RBI single...allowed three runs, two earned, in the fourth as two runs scored on a double-error by Moss...relieved by Blevins who allowed another of his runners to score...is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (6.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so, 0 hr) in three career appearances, all in relief in 2010, against Texas.

Save/Save Opportunities: 19/28 (67.9%)

The A's bullpen is 1-2 with a save, blown save and 6.39 ERA (9 er in 12.2 ip) over the past five games after going 3-0 with five saves, one blown save and a 1.48 ERA in its previous nine games...has a 2.92 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has the lowest opponents batting average (.208) and slugging percentage (.325)...has allowed the second most walks (105)...has 74 strikeouts in 68.2 innings over its last 23 games (9.7 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings).

- Has not allowed a run over his past nine games and has a 10.2-inning scoreless streak over that span...now has a 0.77 ERA (1 er in 11.2 ip) in 10 games in June after posting a 3.65 ERA in 13 games in May and 4.09 ERA in 11 appearances in April.
- Is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (36), ranks seventh among AL relievers in innings pitched (37.0) and is tied for seventh in walks (15).
- Has a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) in 18 appearances at home compared to a 4.50 ERA (9 er in 18.0 ip) in 18 outings on the road.
- First batters faced are 9 for 30 (.300) with six walks for a .417 on-base percentage...the six walks are tied for second most among AL relievers and the on-base percentage ranks fifth highest.
- Has not allowed a run in five games against the Mariners this year (5.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...however, has a 4.19 ERA (9 er in 19.1 ip) in 20 career appearances, including a 5.06 ERA (6 er in 10.2 ip) in 12 games in Seattle.
- His last save was May 5 and it was the 17th of his career, tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).

- Has a 4.32 ERA (4 er in 8.1 ip) in nine games in the month of June after posting a 1.98 ERA in 10 games in May and 2.08 ERA in seven appearances in April.
- First batters faced are 9 for 25 (.360), which is the fifth highest mark among American League relievers.
- Has allowed 6 of 16 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the seventh highest percentage in the AL.
- Has faced Seattle four times this season (3.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so, 1 hr, 2.45 ERA)...is 1-1 with a blown save and 5.79 ERA in 27 games in his career against the Mariners (23.1 ip, 30 h, 15 r, 15 er, 13 bb, 20 so, 2 hr).
