A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series, 4-2...won three of four in Oakland earlier this month after splitting a two-game series in Texas in May to open the season series...have lost five of the previous six season series and are 55-65 (.458) against Texas over that span (since 2006)...are 296-309 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 159-145 in Oakland and 137-164 in Texas...have an all-time record of 393-391 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run over his past 10 games and has an 11.2-inning scoreless streak over that span...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings.

Ryan Cook ranks second among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.102) and opponents slugging percentage (.139) and is 10th in ERA (1.60).

Coco Crisp hit the fifth leadoff home run of his career yesterday...has batted leadoff in each of his last 12 games and is 15 for 45 (.333) with eight runs, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, seven walks, six stolen bases and five multiple hit games over that span.

Jonny Gomes is batting .367 (11 for 30) in June after hitting .222 in May.

Jim Miller ranks eighth among American League relievers with a 1.48 ERA.

Josh Reddick has 17 homers and is the second Athletic since 2003 with at least 17 homers by the end of June (Swisher, 19 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1994 Bobby Witt pitches a two-hit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three in Seattle and have now won four of the last five series...that includes a three-series winning streak June 12-21 against Colorado, San Diego and Los Angeles (NL), which marked the first time the A's won three straight series since Sept. 3-12, 2010...the streak was snapped June 22-24 against San Francisco (1-2)...are now 11-4 (.733) since June 12, which is the fourth best record in the majors over that span...are 15-9 over the last 24 games after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...are in third place in the American League West for the 16th consecutive day and trail Texas by a season-high tying 10 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 27 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won yesterday, 2-1, and scored both of their runs on solo home runs (Crisp, Céspedes)...that marked the **first time in Oakland history** that the A's won a game with two hits and both hits being home runs...are now 8-10 (.444) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...each of their last five losses have been by one run...are 4-2 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 12-9 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-8 in the last at bat...won their second 1-0 game of the season Monday and Tommy Milone was the starter in both games (also April 9 vs. Kansas City)...the lone run scored on a Seth Smith home run, the 12th 1-0 win in Oakland history in which the lone run scored on a home run (last: Erubiel Durazo on September 12, 2004 vs. Cleveland)...have five "walk-off" wins this year, which is two more than last year...however, have four losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied with Miami for the most such losses in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's allowed four hits yesterday and have now surrendered 67 hits over the last 13 games...the 67 hits allowed are the **fewest by an Athletics team over a 13-game span since 1916** (previous: 71, twice; last: April 10-21, 1981)...the fewest hits allowed by the A's over a 14-game span is 77 (twice, last: June 19-July 4, 1994)...have a 2.33 ERA (30 er in 116.0 ip) and .168 (67 for 398) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...now have a 3.52 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the AL...have tossed three shutouts in the month of June and now have eight shutouts for the season, which is tied for second in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.374) and have allowed the third fewest home runs (62)...however, have the fourth most walks (249) and second fewest strikeouts (481).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 1.73 ERA (16 er in 83.1 ip) and .157 (44 for 281) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...have allowed three hits or fewer in eight of those games and one run or fewer eight times...have a 3.83 ERA (194 er in 456.1 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the American League...Tommy Milone tossed the A's first complete game of the season June 20 against Los Angeles and it came in the A's 69th game...in Athletics history only the 2009 (game 81) and 1996 (game 78) teams went farther into the season without a complete game.

A's IN JUNE: The A's are 15-10 (.600) in the month of June with three games to play...that clinches a winning record in June for the first time since 2008 (16-10)...the 15 wins are their most in any month since going 16-12 in May, 2010...went 10-12 in April and 11-16 in May this year and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years...have scored 122 runs this month, which is tied for third most in the American League and fourth in the majors...lead the AL in strikeouts (210), are tied for the lead in walks (96), tied for second in extra bases hits (79) and triples (6), rank fourth in home runs (29) and fifth in doubles (44) and on-base percentage (.330)...the pitching staff has the lowest opponents batting average (.222) and slugging percentage (.334) and ranks second in ERA (3.20)...however, has issued the second most walks (80).

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.223), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.361) and third lowest on-base percentage (.302)...have scored the fewest runs in the American League (286) and have been shut out a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...**lead the American League in stolen bases** (61) and have the third fewest ground into double plays (49)...are batting .335 (59 for 176) with runners in scoring position over the last 22 games after hitting .209 over the first 54 contests...have hit 71 home runs after tallying just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break last year...33 of the A's 71 home runs have come with two outs, which is fourth most in the AL...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.99).

PLAYERS USED: On Sunday, A.J. Griffin became the 42nd player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied with Boston for second most in the majors to San Diego (47)...last year, the A's used 48 players, which was their fewest since 2006 (40)...Griffin is the 16th rookie, which is the most in the majors and two more than the A's season total from last year...currently have 10 rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Doolittle, Griffin, Miller, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this seven-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (four games)...went 6-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (2-1), Los Angeles (3-0) and San Francisco (1-2) after going 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 19-19 at home compared to 18-20 on the road...the pitching staff has a 2.99 ERA (117 er in 352.2 ip) at home compared to 4.09 (149 er in 327.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is second lowest in the American League while the road ERA ranks eighth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have turned 81 double plays, which ranks third in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is tied for fourth in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times and currently have eight players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Colón, Cowgill, Devine, McCarthy, Sizemore)...the eight players matches the season high (also May 18-20)...three of those players will miss the remainder of the season (Carignan, Devine, Sizemore)...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...the A's are 4-7 (.364) in his starting assignments this year and 8-11 (.421) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in five of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 5.74 ERA (26.2 ip, 30 h, 19 r, 17 er, 17 bb, 17 so, 5 hr) and .297 (30 for 101) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the four-game losing streak matches his career-high (also April 15-June 1, 2010).

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 23 for his third stint with the A's...was the A's final cut of the spring as he was optioned to Sacramento April 4...was one of the three inactive players in Japan...went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17, the first day the A's needed a fifth starter...went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31...went 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA in two starts before returning June 16 to start against San Diego after McCarthy missed a turn in the rotation...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day...did not pitch for the River Cats following the option as he returned last Saturday when Colón went on the disabled list.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is 2-7 and his .222 winning percentage is tied for second lowest in the American League...is tied for fifth in losses...his 6.02 ERA is second highest in the AL among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched (Blackburn, MIN 7.74)...using the same minimum, he has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.309).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-4 with a 3.89 ERA (15 er in 34.2 ip) and .221 (27 for 122) opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 1-3 with a 9.13 ERA (24 er in 23.2 ip) and .407 (44 for 108) opponents average in five starts at night...his career splits are 3-6 with a 3.53 ERA (26 er in 66.1 ip) in 17 day games compared to 3-8 with a 6.42 ERA (48 er in 67.1 ip) in 29 games at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 4.82 ERA (15 er in 28.0 ip) and .250 (26 for 104) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 7.12 ERA (24 er in 30.1 ip) and .357 (45 for 126) opponents average in six starts on the road...his career splits are 2-6 with a 3.72 ERA (27 er in 65.1 ip) and .252 (61 for 242) opponents average in 23 games at home compared to 4-8 with a 6.19 ERA (47 er in 68.1 ip) and .312 (82 for 263) opponents average in 23 contests on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents have a .309 batting average, which breaks down to .257 (27 for 105) against right-handed hitters and .352 (44 for 125) against lefties...the mark against lefties is fourth highest in the American League...has issued 21 of his 29 walks to left-handers and his .456 on-base percentage against lefties is the highest in the AL...has a .264 (23 for 87) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .303 (27 for 89) the second time and .389 (21 for 54) the third time.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 2-3 with a 3.06 ERA (12 er in 35.1 ip) in six starts when pitching on four days rest and 0-4 with a 10.57 ERA (27 er in 23.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.68 ERA (9 er in 22.0 ip) over the first two innings, a 5.48 ERA (13 er in 21.1 ip) in the third and fourth innings and a 10.20 ERA (17 er in 15.0 ip) from the fifth inning on.

IN MAY: Went 1-5 with a 6.53 ERA in six starts in May...led the American League and tied for the Major League lead in losses in the month...his ERA was fourth highest in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed three home runs May 25 against New York, the only time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in an outing...has surrendered seven home runs for the season...six have come with runners on base and five have come at home.

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Los Angeles **April 17**...left after six innings trailing 2-1 but the A's scored four times in the eighth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 victory over Cleveland **April 22** in Oakland...the victory came on his 25th birthday and he became the first Oakland pitcher to start and win on his birthday since Todd Stottlemyre in 1995 (May 20 vs. Kansas City)...issued a career-high five walks in 6.2 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Baltimore **April 28**...allowed a career-high nine runs on 11 hits in 4.0 innings...combined with Balfour, Norberto and Cook on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles **May 14**...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed five of the hits...was charged with his fourth loss of the season in the A's 4-0 loss at San Francisco **May 19**...tossed a career-high 108 pitches in 6.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to New York **May 25** in Oakland...allowed a career-high 12 hits and yielded a career-high three home runs...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over San Diego **June 16** in Oakland...allowed just one hit, a two-run home run to Quentin in the sixth...left with a 3-2 lead but Doolittle allowed two runs in the seventh for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-8 loss to San Francisco last Saturday in Oakland...allowed two runs, one earned, in the second inning...Posey scored on a Gomes error and Belt had a RBI single...allowed three runs, two earned, in the fourth as two runs scored on a double-error by Moss...relieved by Blevins who allowed another of his runners to score.

ROSS vs. TEXAS: Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (6.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so, 0 hr) in three career appearances, all in relief in 2010...retired all three batters he faced in the eighth inning May 3 at Oakland and then tossed 2.0 scoreless innings (2 h) in a 4-1 win on May 5...the win came in his only appearance at Texas on May 11 when he tossed 3.0 innings (5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so) in the A's 7-6, 13-inning win.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA in four starts with Sacramento...allowed a .253 opponents batting average, including .188 (9 for 48) against right-handed hitters and .343 (12 for 35) against left-handers...opponents were 1 for 19 (.053) with three walks when leading off an inning...yielded a .170 (9 for 53) average with the bases empty, .400 (12 for 30) with runners on and .235 (4 for 17) with runners in scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (0-0, 3.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and his career...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Posey in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings...was relieved by Doolittle with the A's trailing 2-1...Derek Norris hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to get him off the hook...combined for a 6-3 record and a 2.66 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...ranked third in the A's farm system in ERA and strikeouts (84) and tied for fourth in wins at the time of his promotion.

The A's bullpen is 1-2 with two saves, a blown save and 5.52 ERA (9 er in 14.2 ip) over the past six games after going 3-0 with five saves, one blown save and a 1.48 ERA in its previous nine games...has a 2.89 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has the lowest opponents batting average (.207) and slugging percentage (.324)...has allowed the second most walks (105)...has 75 strikeouts in 70.2 innings over its last 24 games (9.6 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings).

- Has not allowed a run over his past 10 games and has an 11.2-inning scoreless streak over that span...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings (twice, last: June 16-July 31, 2011).
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (37), ranks fifth among AL relievers in innings pitched (38.0) and is tied for eighth in walks (15).
- Has a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) in 18 appearances at home compared to a 4.26 ERA (9 er in 19.0 ip) in 19 outings on the road.
- First batters faced are 9 for 31 (.290) with six walks for a .405 on-base percentage...the six walks are tied for second most among AL relievers and the on-base percentage ranks sixth highest.
- Has not allowed a run in three games against the Rangers this year (3.1 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA in 29 appearances in his career (34.2 ip, 20 h, 8 r, 8 er, 20 bb, 35 so, 4 hr).

- First batters faced are 9 for 25 (.360), which is the fourth highest mark among American League relievers.
- Has allowed 6 of 16 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the sixth highest percentage in the AL.
