A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series, 4-3...are 1-2 in Texas following last night's loss and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost five of the previous six season series and are 55-66 (.455) against Texas over that span (since 2006)...are 296-310 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 159-145 in Oakland and 137-165 in Texas...have an all-time record of 393-392 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run over his past 10 games and has an 11.2-inning scoreless streak over that span...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings.

Ryan Cook ranks second among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.102) and opponents slugging percentage (.139) and is ninth in ERA (1.60).

Coco Crisp has batted leadoff in each of his last 13 games and is 18 for 50 (.360) with 10 runs, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, seven walks, seven stolen bases and six multiple hit games over that span.

Jonny Gomes is batting .367 (11 for 30) in June after hitting .222 in May.

Josh Reddick has 18 homers and is the second Athletic since 2003 with at least 18 homers by the end of June (Swisher, 19 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Stewart pitches the fifth no-hitter in Oakland history in the A's 5-0 win at Toronto...in **1996** the A's hit three home runs in an 11-9 win at California...it gives Oakland 18 home runs in their last four games, tying an American League record...in **2003** Eric Byrnes becomes the fifth player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle and also ties an Oakland record with five hits in the A's 5-2 win at San Francisco.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 11-5 (.688) since June 12, which is the fifth best record in the majors over that span...are now 15-10 over the last 25 games after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...are in third place in the American League West for the 17th consecutive day and trail Texas by a season-high 11 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 28 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...have won four of the last five series...that includes a three-series winning streak June 12-21 against Colorado, San Diego and Los Angeles (NL), which marked the first time the A's won three straight series since Sept. 3-12, 2010.

THE LONG BALL: The A's had five straight hits that were home runs between the past two games (Crisp, Cespedes on Wednesday; Reddick, Norris, Pennington yesterday)...according to Elias, that marked the fourth time in Oakland history that the A's had five or more consecutive hits that were home runs, the first time since Sept. 22-23, 2001 (Hernandez, Chavez, Tejada on Sept. 22; Dye, Myers on Sept. 23)...the record is six straight, June 15-16, 1971...won Wednesday, 2-1, and scored both of their runs on solo home runs (Crisp, Céspedes)...it was the first time in Oakland history that the A's won a game with two hits and both hits being home runs...won their second 1-0 game of the season Monday...the lone run scored on a Seth Smith home run, the 12th 1-0 win in Oakland history in which the lone run scored on a home run (last: Erubiel Durazo on Sept. 12, 2004 vs. Cleveland).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost yesterday, 7-6, and are now 8-11 (.421) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...each of their last six losses have been by one run, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (also May 14-24, 1969)...are 4-2 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 12-9 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-8 in the last at bat...have five "walk-off" wins this year, which is two more than last year...however, have four losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied with Miami for the most such losses in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's allowed seven runs on 14 hits last night...had allowed just 67 hits over the previous 13 games, which was the fewest by an Athletics team over a 13-game span since 1916...now have a 2.61 ERA (36 er in 124.0 ip) and .188 (81 for 431) opponents batting average over the last 14 games...have a 3.56 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have tossed eight shutouts, which is tied for second...have allowed the second fewest home runs (62) and have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.375)...however, have the fourth most walks (255) and second fewest strikeouts (87).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 2.16 ERA (21 er in 87.1 ip) and .173 (52 for 300) opponents batting average over the last 14 games...have allowed three hits or fewer in eight of those games and one run or fewer eight times...have a 3.89 ERA (199 er in 460.1 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the American League.

A's IN JUNE: The A's are 15-11 (.577) in the month of June with two games to play...will finish June with a winning record for the first time since 2008 (16-10)...the 15 wins are their most in any month since going 16-12 in May, 2010...went 10-12 in April and 11-16 in May this year and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years...have scored 128 runs this month, which is third most in the American League...lead the AL in walks (100) and strikeouts (216) this month, are tied for second in triples (6), tied for third in extra base hits (82), rank fourth in home runs (32) and on-base percentage (.332) and fifth in doubles (44)...the pitching staff has the lowest opponents batting average (.230) and slugging percentage (.340) and ranks second in ERA (3.32).

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.224), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.364) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.303)...have scored the fewest runs in the American League (292) and have been shut out a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...rank second in the American League in stolen bases (62) and have the third fewest grounded into double plays (50)...are batting .333 (62 for 186) with runners in scoring position over the last 23 games after hitting .209 over the first 54 contests...have hit 74 home runs after tallying just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break last year...34 of the A's 74 home runs have come with two outs, which is fourth most in the AL...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.00).

PLAYERS USED: On Sunday, A.J. Griffin became the 42nd player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied with Boston for second most in the majors to San Diego (47)...last year, the A's used 48 players, which was their fewest since 2006 (40)...Griffin is the 16th rookie, which is the most in the majors and two more than the A's season total from last year...currently have 11 rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Doolittle, Griffin, Miller, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (0-1)...went 6-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (2-1), Los Angeles (3-0) and San Francisco (1-2) after going 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 19-19 at home compared to 18-21 on the road...the pitching staff has a 2.99 ERA (117 er in 352.2 ip) at home compared to 4.16 (155 er in 335.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is the lowest in the American League while the road ERA ranks eighth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders recorded two assists last night (Crisp, Reddick) and now have 16 assists for the season, which is tied for second in the American League...the A's have turned 83 double plays, which ranks third in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times and currently have eight players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Colón, Cowgill, Devine, McCarthy, Sizemore)...the eight players matches the season high (also May 18-20)...three of those players will miss the remainder of the season (Carignan, Devine, Sizemore)...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Posey in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings...retired 13 consecutive batters before walking Posey to lead off the seventh inning...was relieved by Doolittle with the A's trailing 2-1...Derek Norris hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to get him off the hook...became the 43rd pitcher in Oakland history to start in his Major League debut.

GRIFFIN vs. TEXAS: Is making his first career appearance and start.

MINORS: Combined for a 6-3 record and a 2.66 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Midland Double-A and Triple-A Sacramento...ranked third in the A's farm system in ERA and strikeouts (84) and tied for fourth in wins at the time of his promotion...began the year at Midland and was 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA in seven starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento May 11...then went 3-2 with a 2.81 ERA in eight starts with the River Cats...his teams were 9-6 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 11 of his 15 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked one batter or fewer 13 times.

DON'T WALK: Walked one batter or fewer in 13 of his 15 starts, including no walks four times...issued seven walks at each minor league stop for a total of 14 walks in 94.2 innings (1.33 per nine

innings)...struck out 84 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 6.0.

LAST FIVE MINOR LEAGUE STARTS: Went 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (34.1 ip. 22 h. 9 r. 5 er. 3 bb. 27 so. 1 hr) over his final five starts with Sacramento...allowed a .177 (22 for 124) opponents batting average over that stretch and walked just three batters in 34.1 innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .208 opponents batting average, including .180 (30 for 167) against left-handed hitters compared to .235 (42 for 179) against right-handers...surrendered just six home runs in 94.2 innings, an average of 0.57 per nine innings...five of the home runs were hit by right-handers...allowed just one home run over his final seven starts and 45.1 innings...opponents hit .300 (18 for 60) with runners in scoring position.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed back-to-back complete games June 8 at Colorado Springs and June 13 at Fresno...the two complete games were tied for the Pacific Coast League lead and tied for third most in the minors at the time of his promotion.

HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season with a 16.0 inning scoreless streak at Midland but had three no decisions over that span in three RockHounds losses...did not allow a hit in his second start April 10 at Springfield, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings and 78 pitches...struck out a season-high nine in 5.2 innings in his third start April 16 against Springfield...then won each of his next three starts from April 22 to May 2 (2.61 ERA)...was the losing pitcher in his final Double-A start May 7 at Frisco when he allowed four runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings...also lost his first two decisions at Sacramento...walked a season-high three batters in his first start with the River Cats May 13 against lowa...allowed a season-high runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in his second start at Albuquerque May 19 but had a no decisions...tossed back-to-back complete games June 8 and 13 and won each of his final three Triple-A starts.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 18-11 with a 3.10 ERA (97 er in 281.2 ip) in 66 games, including 42 starts, over three seasons in the minors...struck out 273 and walked just 53 in 281.2 innings...has a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.15 and averages 1.69 walks per nine innings...pitched exclusively in relief in his first season in 2010 and has been used exclusively as a starter the last two years...finished third in the A's farm system in saves in 2010 (15) and tied for first in strikeouts in 2011 (156)...had made just nine career starts at the Triple-A level...was originally drafted by the A's in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...is the first A's draft pick from the last four years (2009-2012) to reach the majors...is the second 13th round pick by the A's to reach the majors with Oakland (Jeff Jones, 1977).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (0-0, 3.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season...tossed seven shutout innings in his last start on Monday in a 1-0 victory at Seattle after firing a three-hitter in a 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) on June 20...the two-game winning streak matches his career high...has a 14.0-inning scoreless streak, which is also a career-high...picked up his eighth win of the season in his last start, which is second most among American League rookies and tied for eighth among all AL pitchers...is the first rookie in Oakland history with eight wins before the All-Star Break (previous best: 7, Rick Langford in 1977)...is 3-4 with a 6.39 ERA (36 er in 50.2 ip) and .311 (64 for 206) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road compared to 5-1 with a 0.99 ERA (5 er in 45.2 ip) and .169 (27 for 160) opponents average in five starts at home...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against the Rangers, a 4-1 A's loss at Texas May 16...allowed four runs in 7.0 innings pitched and all four runs came in the fourth inning...allowed a two-run home run to Beltre, a RBI single to Gentry and a RBI single to Andrus.

- Has not allowed a run over his past 10 games and has an 11.2-inning scoreless streak over that span...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings (twice, last: June 16-July 31, 2011).
- Is tied for second in the American League in games pitched (37), ranks fifth among AL relievers in innings pitched (38.0) and is tied for ninth in walks (15).
- Has a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) in 18 appearances at home compared to a 4.26 ERA (9 er in 19.0 ip) in 19 outings on the road. First batters faced are 9 for 31 (.290) with six walks for a .405 on-base percentage...the six walks are tied for second most among AL relievers
- and the on-base percentage ranks sixth highest. Has not allowed a run in three games against the Rangers this year (3.1 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA in 29 appearances in his

- Has allowed 6 of 16 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the sixth highest percentage in the AL.

- Ranks second among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.102) and opponents slugging percentage (.139) and is ninth in ERA (1.60, 6 er in 33.2 ip)...has allowed 21 walks, which is tied for the most, and is tied for eighth in losses (2).
- Has not allowed a run in 26 appearances with one or more days rest (28.1 ip)...has allowed six runs in 5.1 innings (10.13 ERA) in seven games with no rest.
- Has not allowed a home run and his 33.2 innings pitched are the most among AL pitchers with no home runs.
- First batters faced are .074 (2 for 27), which is the third lowest average in the AL...however, has allowed six first batter walks, which is tied for second most.
- Opponents are 4 for 49 (.082) with runners on, including 3 for 32 (.094) with runners in scoring position and 0 for 15 with RISP and two outs.

- · Has struck out 18 in 10.1 innings, an average of 15.7 per nine innings.
- Was originally drafted by the A's as a compensation pick following the first round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...began his career as a first baseman but knee injuries limited him to 28 games in 2009, no games in 2010 and one game last year. Combined to post a 0.72 ERA in 16 relief appearances with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...allowed a .091
