A's vs. RANGERS

The season series is tied 4-4...the A's have lost three of four in Texas following last night's loss and are 3-1 in Oakland...have lost five of the previous six season series and are 55-67 (.451) against Texas over that span (since 2006)...are 296-311 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 159-145 in Oakland and 137-166 in Texas...have an all-time record of 393-393 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook ranks second among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.109) and opponents slugging percentage (.164) and is tied for eighth in ERA (1.59).

Yoenis Cespedes is 12 for 37 (.324) with four runs, a double, three home runs, nine RBI and four walks over his last 10 games...is 12 for 20 (.600) with two doubles, one triple, one home run and seven RBI in six games against Texas this year.

Coco Crisp has batted leadoff in each of his last 14 games and is 19 for 54 (.352) with 10 runs, two doubles, one home run, five RBI, seven walks, seven stolen bases and six multiple hit games over that span.

Jonny Gomes is batting .324 (11 for 34) with three doubles, three home runs and seven RBI in 16 games in June after hitting .222 with three doubles, one home run and seven RBI in 22 games in May.

Josh Reddick has 18 homers and is the second Athletic since 2003 with at least 18 homers by the end of June (Swisher, 19 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1995 Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in 2001 Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the past eight games after winning eight of the previous nine...however, are now 11-6 (.647) since June 12, which is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...are 15-11 over the last 26 games after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...are in third place in the American League West for the 18th consecutive day and trail Texas by a season-high 12 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 29 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...have lost the first two games of this series after winning four of the previous five series...that includes a three-series winning streak June 12-21 against Colorado, San Diego and Los Angeles (NL), which marked the first time the A's won three straight series since Sept. 3-12, 2010.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost yesterday, 4-3, and each of their last seven losses have been by one run, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 6, May 14-24, 1969)...each of their five games this road trip have been decided by one run (2-3) and they are now 8-12 (.400) in one-run games for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...are 4-2 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 12-10 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-9 in the last at bat...have five "walk-off" wins this year, which is two more than last year...however, have four losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied with Miami for the most such losses in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.73 ERA (40 er in 132.0 ip) and .185 (85 for 460) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...now have a 3.57 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have tossed eight shutouts, which is tied for second...have allowed the second fewest home runs (62) and have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.373)...however, have the fourth most walks (260) and second fewest strikeouts (493)...A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 2.03 ERA (21 er in 93.1 ip) and .169 (54 for 320) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...have allowed three hits or fewer in nine of those games and one run or fewer nine times...now have a 3.84 ERA (199 er in 466.1 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the American League.

THE LONG BALL: The A's had five straight hits that were home runs between Wednesday and Thursday (Crisp, Cespedes on Wednesday; Reddick, Norris, Pennington on Thursday)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that marked the fourth time in Oakland history that the A's had five or more consecutive hits that were home runs, the first time since Sept. 22-23, 2001 (Hernandez, Chavez, Tejada on Sept. 22; Dye, Myers on Sept. 23)...the record is six straight, June 15-16, 1971...won Wednesday, 2-1, and scored both of their runs on solo home runs (Crisp, Cespedes)...it was the first time in Oakland history that the A's won a game with two hits and both hits being home runs...won their second 1-0 game of the season Monday...the lone run scored on a Seth Smith home run, the 12th 1-0 win in Oakland history in which the lone run scored on a home run (last: Erubiel Durazo on Sept. 12, 2004 vs. Cleveland).

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.225), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.365) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.303)...have scored the fewest runs in the American League (295) and have been shut out a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shut out in a season since 1979 (17)...rank second in the American League in stolen bases (62)...have grounded into one or more double plays in each of the past six games (nine total) but are tied for the third fewest grounded into double plays in the AL for the season (52)...are batting .335 (64 for 191) with runners in scoring position over the last 24 games after hitting .209 over the first 54 contests...have hit 75 home runs after tallying just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break last year...35 of the A's 75 home runs have come with two outs, which is tied for third most in the AL...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.00).

A's IN JUNE: The A's are 15-12 (.556) in the month of June with one game to play...will finish June with a winning record for the first time since 2008 (16-10)...the 15 wins are their most in any month since going 16-12 in May, 2010...went 10-12 in April and 11-16 in May this year and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years...A's hitters are tied for the American League lead in strikeouts (223) this month, rank second in walks (101) and triples (6), fourth in extra base hits (84), tied for fourth in home runs (33) and fifth in runs scored (131), doubles (44), slugging percentage (.427) and on-base percentage (.330)...the pitching staff has the lowest opponents batting average (.227) and slugging percentage (.335) and has the third lowest ERA (3.36)...however, has allowed 91 walks, which ranks first.

PLAYERS USED: Last night, Chris Carter became the 43rd player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is second most in the majors to San Diego (47)...last year, the A's used 48 players, which was their fewest since 2006 (40)...Carter is the 17th rookie, which is the most in the majors and three more than the A's season total from last year...currently have 10 rookies on the roster (Carter, Cespedes, Cook, Doolittle, Griffin, Miller, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this seven-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (0-2)...went 6-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (2-1), Los Angeles (3-0) and San Francisco (1-2) after going 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 19-19 at home compared to 18-22 on the road...the pitching staff has a 2.99 ERA (117 er in 352.2 ip) at home compared to 4.16 (159 er in 343.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is the second lowest in the American League while the road ERA ranks eighth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders recorded two assists Thursday (Crisp, Reddick) and now have 16 assists for the season, which is tied for second in the American League...the A's have turned 83 double plays, which ranks third in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times and currently have eight players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Colón, Cowgill, Devine, McCarthy, Sizemore)...the eight players matches the season high (also May 18-20)...three of those players will miss the remainder of the season (Carignan, Devine, Sizemore)...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season...the A's are 9-6 (.600) in his starting assignments and his teams are 14-6 (.700) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in eight of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

LAST TWO STARTS: Tossed seven shutout innings in his last start on Monday in a 1-0 victory at Seattle after firing a three-hitter in a 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) on June 20...the two-game winning streak matches his career high...has a 14.0-inning scoreless streak, which is also a career-high.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his eighth win of the season in his last start, which is second most among American League rookies and tied for eighth among all AL pitchers...is the first rookie in Oakland history with eight wins before the All-Star Break (previous best: 7, Rick Langford in 1977)...is tied for the lead among Major League rookies in complete games (1)...leads American League rookies in innings pitched (96.1), is tied for the lead in games started (15) and ranks sixth in strikeouts (57)...is tied for second among all AL pitchers in pickoffs (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-4 with a 6.39 ERA (36 er in 50.2 ip) and .311 (64 for 206) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road compared to 5-1 with a 0.99 ERA (5 er in 45.2 ip) and .169 (27 for 160) opponents average in five starts at home...has the fifth highest road ERA in the majors and the second lowest home ERA (Weaver, LAA 0.70)...has allowed 12 of his 13 home runs on the road...ranks second in the American League in road home runs allowed (Vargas, SEA 16)...won each of his first four career starts at the Coliseum before taking the loss May 27...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum...the previous best was three by Tim Hudson in 1999.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .293 (36 for 123) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .250 (31 for 124) the second time and .202 (24 for 119) after that...has issued 11 walks and allowed five home runs in 96 plate appearances against left-handed hitters compared to 13 walks and eight home runs in 298 plate appearances against right-handers.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 22 of his 43 runs in the first two innings...has a 6.30 ERA (21 er in 30.0 ip) and seven home runs over the first two innings of a game and a 2.71 ERA (20 er in 66.1) and six home runs from the third inning on.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed the first complete game by a Major League rookie this year June 20 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was the first by an A's rookie since Brett Anderson on July 6, 2009 at Boston...it was the first by an A's rookie in the Coliseum since Barry Zito on September 10, 2000 against Tampa Bay.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up the win June 20 against Los Angeles (NL) to snap a two-game losing streak, the first losing streak of his career...the A's were shutout in each of his two losses during the streak and have been blanked in three of his 14 starts this year.

2012 START-BY-START: He combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City **April 9** in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle **April 14**...faced just one batter over the minimum over the first five innings but that was a solo home run by Montero in the second inning...then allowed three runs in the sixth...Noesi and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win at Los Angeles **April 19**...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first three innings before allowing his only two runs in the fourth...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago **April 24** in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-6 loss at Boston **April 30**...allowed a career-high eight runs on eight hits, including a career-high three home runs...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win at Tampa Bay **May 6**...allowed five runs in five innings and walked a career-high four batters...won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-4 win over Detroit **May 11** in Oakland...struck out a career-high six batters in 7.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Texas **May 16**...surrendered a career-high nine hits...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles **May 21** in Oakland...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first four innings before allowing his only run on a Trout RBI double in the fifth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to New York **May 27** in Oakland...Kuroda and Soriano combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 2-0 loss at Kansas City **June 3**...matched his career-high with six strikeouts...Mazzaro, Herrera, Holland and Broxton combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...had his first no decision of the season in the A's 9-8 loss at Arizona **June 8**...allowed a career-high tying nine hits...left with an 8-4 lead but Fuentes allowed a three-run home run to Roberts in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 win at Colorado **June 13**...tossed a career-low 4.0 innings and matched his career highs in runs (8) and walks (4)...left trailing 8-5 but the A's scored single runs in the sixth and seventh and three times in the ninth for the win...tossed a complete game three-hitter in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) in Oakland **June 20**...retired 14 in a row at one point and allowed just two base runners over the final seven innings.

LAST START: He combined with Grant Balfour and Ryan Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Seattle last Monday...tossed seven innings and allowed all seven of the hits...allowed only two base runners to advance into scoring position...retired 10 of the 11 batters he faced...Seth Smith homered in the second inning for the only run of the game.

MILONE vs. TEXAS: Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 4-1 A's loss at Texas May 16...allowed four runs in 7.0 innings pitched and all four runs came in the fourth inning...allowed a two-run home run to Beltre, a RBI single to Gentry and a RBI single to Andrus...surrendered a career-high nine hits.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Travis Blackley (1-2, 3.05 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and seventh start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...is 1-0 with a 2.14 ERA (5 er in 21.0 ip) and .186 (13 for 70) opponents batting average over his last three starts...picked off his fourth base runner of the season in his last start, which is tied for the American League lead (Romero, TOR)...did not allow a home run in 30.1 innings in June and has allowed just one home run in 46.1 innings this year...the home run was a solo shot in his first start on May 28 at Minnesota (Plouffe)...is 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA (10.1 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts, against Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-3 A's loss in Oakland June 5...allowed five runs a career-high tying seven hits in 4.2 innings.
