BOSTON RED SOX (42-37) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-42)

SOX ON A ROLL: The Red Sox took a 2-1 decision in 10 innings yesterday in Seattle, their 1st extra-inning win in 6 tries, and have now won 11 of their last 15 contests (.733) since 6/16, the 2nd-best mark in the Majors during that span behind Texas (12-3, .800)...The club is 13-5 (.722) since 6/12, tied for 2nd in the ML (also the Yankees at 13-5) in that time behind only the Rangers (15-4, .789).

SERIES TALK: The Sox split their series in Seattle, 2-2...Boston has won 11 of its last 16 sets dating back to 5/10 and has lost just 3 sets in that time with 2 splits.

With the split, it snapped a stretch of 5 straight series wins for the Red Sox, their longest streak since 6 straight series victories, 7/1-24/11.

STAND AND DELIVER: At 42-37, the Sox are a season-high tying 5 games over .500 for the 3rd time...They are in sole possession of 3rd place in the AL East, their highest place in the standings this year, and are 6.5 games behind the division-leading Yankees and 0.5 behind the 2nd-place Orioles.

SINCE MID-MAY: Boston has won 30 of its last 48 games (.625), 3rd-best in the Majors since 5/11...All 18 losses in that span have been by 4 runs or less, including 1-run defeats 6 times and 2 runs or less on 9 occasions.

Boston has outscored opponents 241-170 in its 48 games since 5/11...Starters have allowed 2 ER or less 28 times in the stretch and the bullpen has a 2.32 ERA (34 ER/131.2 IP).

TAKING OFF: Following a 4-10 start to the season, Boston has gone 38-27 (.585) since 4/23, the 3rd-best win percentage in the Majors during that span behind the Yankees (39-24, .619) and Angels (38-25, .603).

DOING THE MATH: The Red Sox have scored 57 more runs than they have allowed, the 3rd-best differential in the AL behind Texas (+100) and New York (+61)...In the NL, only St. Louis (+57) has scored at least 57 more runs than allowed.

WEST COAST SWING: The Red Sox tonight continue a 7-day, 7-game west coast trip with the 1st tilt of a 3-game set in Oakland...The club began the trek with 4 contests in Seattle (2-2)...The Sox return to the west coast from 8/28-9/5 for 9 games against the Angels, A's and Mariners.

ROAD RUN: The Red Sox are 21-16 (.568) on the road, the 4th-best mark in the AL...They have posted a Major League-leading 20-11 (.645) road mark in 31 tilts away from home since 4/23 and have won 12 of their last 18 road contests.

The Sox have not lost a road series since dropping 2 of 3 in Kansas City from 5/7-9...The have won 5 road series since and split 2.

VS. OAKLAND: The Red Sox and A's begin a 3-game series in Oakland tonight...The 2 clubs met at Fenway from 4/30-5/2 with the A's taking 2 of those 3 contests...Boston will return to Oakland for 3 games from 8/31-9/2.

The Sox have taken 7 of 11 games against the A's since the start of 2011 for a .636 winning percentage...The Red Sox have won or split the season series with the A's in 4 of the last 5 years with the only exception being 2010 (4-5).

Boston has won just 7 of its last 24 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06.

GOING ON 50: With a victory tonight, Daisuke Matsuzaka will pick up his 50th career Major League win...He would be the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to reach the mark, joining Hideo Nomo (123) and Tomo Ohka (51) (Hiroki Kuroda is also 1 win shy of the mark).

STARTING SOMETHING: Boston starters posted a 1.03 ERA (3 ER/26.1 IP) over this past weekend's 4-game series in Seattle, including 22.0 straight scoreless innings, from the 1st inning on Thursday night through the 5th Saturday night...It marked the longest stretch of scoreless frames for Sox starters this season.

ALL-STAR AGAIN: It was announced by MLB yesterday that David Ortiz has been elected to start the All-Star Game in Kansas City for the AL after leading fan balloting at DH...Ortiz received 4,986,979 votes, 5th-most in the Majors...It marks his 8th overall All-Star selection (also 2004-08, '10-11), and his 6th nod as a starter (elected to start 4 straight from 2005-08 and again in 2011; did not play in 2008 due to injury)...Overall this year's selection is his 5th as a DH (also 2005, 2008 and 2010-11), becoming the 1st player to win fan balloting at designated hitter on 4 occasions.

400 FEVER: David Ortiz hit his team-leading 21st home run last Wednesday, 6th-most in the AL...He is 1 home run shy of 400 career and would become the 8th active player to reach the mark...He is currently tied with Andres Galarraga and Al Kaline for 49th on baseball's all-time home run list at 399.

GONZO STREAK: Adrian Gonzalez has hit .353 (18-for-51) with 7 RBI and 7 runs scored over his season-high 12-game hit streak, the longest active hit streak in the Majors...It is the 2nd-longest hit streak for a Sox batter this season behind Dustin Pedroia's 14-gamer, 4/29-5/13.

TOP BACKSTOP: Jarrod Saltalamacchia hit his 15th home run Friday night, tops among all Major League catchers...His 28 extra-base hits lead AL backstops (T-2nd in ML) and he paces AL catchers with a .537 SLG (min. 150 PA).

INHERITANCE: Boston relievers have allowed just 35 of 137 inherited runners to score for the 3rd-best rate in the AL at 25.5 percent...Vicente Padilla's 5.6 percent of inherited runners scored (1 of 18) is tied for the best rate in the Majors while Andrew Miller is 2nd in the AL at 11.1 (2 of 18).

Matt Albers has entered a game an American League-high (tied for most in Majors) 5 times with the bases loaded, including yesterday at Seattle when he came in with bases loaded and 1 out in the 5th and induced a double play...He has allowed runs to score twice (3 total runs) in those situations.

SWEET RELIEF: Since 4/23, Boston's bullpen paces the Majors with a 2.03 ERA (45 ER/199.2 IP)...Sox relievers have lowered their combined ERA from 8.44 to 3.16 in that time.

EXTRA BASES: The Sox lead the Majors with 293 extra-base hits, including an ML-high 192 doubles...They have 21 more XBH and 34 more doubles than the next-highest total for any teams (TEX, 272 XBH and CIN, 158 2B).

David Ortiz paces the AL with 45 extra-base hits, 2nd in the Majors behind Cincinnati's Joey Votto (47)...Ortiz and Adrian Gonzalez are both tied for 3rd in the AL with 24 doubles.

REHAB UPDATES: OF Carl Crawford, on the 60-day DL recovering from left wrist surgery, is slated to continue his rehab stint tomorrow night with Double-A Portland as they host Trenton (NYY)...He was 3-for-14 with a double, 2 runs and 5 walks over 5 rehab contests with the GCL Red Sox, with 4 starts in LF and 1 at DH.

OF Jacoby Ellsbury, on the 60-day DL with a right shoulder subluxation, played his 3rd game of a rehab stint with the GCL Sox today and went 1-for-2 with a 2-run homer, 2 runs scored and a walk while playing 6 innings in CF against the GCL Orioles...Ellsbury is 2-for-6 with a double, homer, 3 RBI, 3 runs and 4 walks in his 3 rehab outings, including 2 in CF and 1 as the DH.

OF Scott Podsednik, on the 15-day DL with a left groin strain, will continue a rehab assignment with Triple-A Pawtucket tonight vs. Rochester (MIN)...It will mark his 3rd rehab game with the PawSox, also playing CF on Saturday night and DH on Friday night (0-for-7, BB).

BOBBY AT THE HELM: Bobby Valentine, in his 1st season as Red Sox manager, ranks 4th among active ML skippers in games (2,268) and 5th in wins (1,159)...He is 43rd on the all-time managerial wins list with John McNamara next at 1,160.

CENTER OF ATTENTION: Double-A Portland CF Jackie Bradley has hit safely in 9 of the 11 games he has played with the Sea Dogs, including 6 multi-hit contests, since his promotion from Single-A Salem on 6/21...He's batting .364 (16-for-44) with 4 doubles, a triple, 6 walks and 5 RBI.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

18-DAISUKE MATSUZAKA, RHP

2012: 0-2, 4.91 ERA (12 ER/22.0 IP) in 4 GS
CAREER: 49-32, 4.27 ERA (306 ER/644.2 IP) in 110 G, 109 GS
CAREER on ROAD: 24-14, 3.79 ERA (135 ER/320.1 IP) in 54 GS

LAST START: Allowed 1 run over 5.2 innings in a 5-1 Sox win over the Jays at Fenway on 6/26 but did not earn a decision...Gave up 6 hits and 1 walk with 8 K's...Permitted only run in the opening frame but held the Jays scoreless over his next 4.2 frames before leaving in the 6th with 2 out and 2 runners on, both of whom were stranded by Scott Atchison...Boston was held scoreless by Toronto starter Aaron Laffey (6.0 IP) but scored 3 times in the 7th and twice in the 8th off Jays relievers.

STRONG PERIPHERALS: Has held opponents to 1 walk in 3 of his 4 starts this year, and is averaging just 2.45 walks per 9.0 IP (6 BB/22.0 IP) compared to 5.54 in 2011 (23 BB/37.1 IP)...With 20 strikeouts, is averaging 8.18 K's per 9.0 inning thus far in 2012, which would be his best mark since 2009 (8.19 54 K's/59.1 IP).

50 WINS: Is 1 win shy of picking up the 50th of his career in his 111th Major League game...Would become the 5th-fastest Red Sox hurler to reach 50 wins since 1918 after Jon Lester, Tex Hughson, Dave Ferriss and Roger Clemens...Would become the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to reach the 50-win mark in the Major Leagues along with Hideo Nomo (123) and Tomo Ohka (51).

WINLESS STRETCH: Has made 5 starts since his last win on 5/8/11 vs. MIN, tied for the 2nd longest stretch of his career (also 9/28/08-5/27/09)...The only longer streak of his career was 7 games from 9/7/10-4/11/11...His 4 games without a win in 2012 are tied for his most to begin a season (also 2009).

JAPANESE-BORN LEADERS: Has 588 Major League strikeouts, 2 shy of tying Tomo Ohka (590) for 2nd all-time among Japanese-born pitchers, behind only Hideo Nomo (1,918)...Also ranks 3rd among Japanese-born pitchers with 49 career wins, trailing Nomo (123) and Ohka (51)...Is 5th among pitchers born in Japan with 109 starts and 6th with 644.2 innings.

SHAKY SUPPORT: The Red Sox have not scored a run of support in 3 of his 4 outings including a 14.0-inning drought over his 1st 3 starts...His 1.23 runs of support per 9.0 innings (3 RS/22.0 IP) is the lowest rate on the Red Sox and the 4th-lowest mark for a Major League qualifier since 6/9.

HARD TO HIT: Has held left-handed batters to a .171 average (7-for-41) this season, the best mark among Red Sox starters in 2012.

♣ Has .242 opponent batting average (588-for-2,431) in his Major League career, 6th among qualifying American League pitchers since 2007 (min. 600.0 IP).

THE K-MAN: Averaging 8.21 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (588 K's/644.2 IP) in his Major League career, 10th among AL hurlers since 2007 (min. 600.0 IP).

♣ Tallied 8.33 K's per 9.0 innings (542 K's/585.1 IP) from 2007-10, the 6th-best rate in American League history through a pitcher's 1st 4 seasons (min. 500.0 IP).

ROAD WARRIOR: Is 24-14 (.632) with a 3.79 ERA (135 ER/320.1 IP) in 54 career road starts compared to 25-18 (.581) with a 4.75 mark (171 ER/324.1 IP) in 56 home games (55 starts)...Has posted a lower ERA on the road than at home in all 5 of his previous Major League seasons from 2007-11.

VS. THE ATHLETICS: Has not lost in his last 6 starts against OAK since 2008 with a win in 4 of his last 5 outings...Is averaging 10.15 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (44 K/39.0 IP) against the A's, his highest career mark against any American League club.

PREVIOUS START: Did not factor in the decision in a 6-5 Red Sox win over the Marlins on 6/21 at Fenway Park...Allowed 4 runs in 6.1 innings...Gave up 4 hits and walked 1 while striking out 4 over 101 pitches...Retired 14 in a row after a 2-out RBI single by Omar Infante in the 1st inning until a solo home run by Giancarlo Stanton with 1 out in the 6th...Exited with the Sox trailing by a run...Boston scored 3 runs in the bottom of the 8th inning to complete the come-from-behind victory.

ON REHAB: Posted a 3.54 ERA (15 ER/37.0 IP) with 30 strikeouts over 8 rehab starts between High-A Salem (1 GS), Double-A Portland (1 GS) and Triple-A Pawtucket (6 GS) since 4/23...Made 5 starts from 4/23-5/17 before he was removed from his 1st rehab stint on 5/19 due to a right trapezius strain...Began a 2nd rehab stint on 5/26 and allowed just 2 runs in 11.2 IP (1.54 ERA) with 6 hits, 3 walk and 8 K's in 3 starts with the PawSox.

♣ Allowed 1 run in 1.1 inning for Triple-A Pawtucket vs. IND (PIT) in his final rehab start on 6/5...Gave up 3 hits and 2 walks while tallying 2 strikeouts on 40 pitches.

MORE 2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Dropped his 2nd straight game at Chicago (NL) on 6/15...Fanned 8 batters, his most strikeouts since tallying 9 on 4/23/11 at LAA, but suffered the loss in his 2012 debut on 6/9 vs. Washington...Made his 2012 debut exactly 365 days after undergoing season-ending Tommy John Surgery on 6/10/11.
