HALF-WAY THERE: Tonight's game marks the half-way point of the regular season...It will be the 15th consecutive year that Boston has had a winning record through 81 games.

RECENT RESULTS: The Red Sox have dropped 3 of their 1st 5 games on their current road trip, including a 6-1 loss in Oakland last night, but have won 11 of their last 16 contests (.688) since 6/16, tied for the 3rd-best mark in the Majors during that span...The club is 13-6 (.684) since 6/12, tied for 2nd in the ML (also the Yankees at 13-6) in that time behind only the Rangers (15-4, .789).

SERIES TALK: The Sox split their last series, in Seattle, 2-2... Boston has won 11 of its last 16 sets dating back to 5/10 and has lost just 3 sets in that time with 2 splits.

♣ With the split, it snapped a stretch of 5 straight series wins, the Sox longest streak since 6 straight, 7/1-24/11.

STAND AND DELIVER: At 42-38, the Sox fell back to 4 games over .500 after being a season-high tying 5 games over after Sunday's win (3rd time)...They are tied with the Rays for 3rd place in the AL East after holding sole possession of that spot for the 1st time this year after play on Sunday, their highest place in the standings in 2012... Boston is 6.5 games behind the division-leading Yankees and 0.5 behind the 2nd-place Orioles.

SINCE MID-MAY: Boston has won 30 of its last 49 games (.612), tied for the 3rd-best mark in the Majors since 5/1... Last night's 6-1 loss was the 1st in that time to be by more than 4 runs... Of the 19 losses, they have been by 2 runs or less on 9 occasions and 1-run defeats 6 times.

TAKING OFF: Following a 4-10 start to the season, Boston has gone 38-28 (.576) since 4/23, the 4th-best win percentage in the AL during that span behind the Yankees (39-25, .609), Angels (39-25, .609) and Rangers (37-27, .578).

DOING THE MATH: The Red Sox have scored 52 more runs than they have allowed, the 3rd-best differential in the AL behind Texas (+100) and New York (+60)...In the NL, only St. Louis (+63) has scored at least 52 more runs than allowed.

WEST COAST SWING: The Red Sox tonight continue a 7-day, 7-game west coast trip with the 2nd tilt of a 3-game set in Oakland...The club began the trek with 4 contests in Seattle (2-2)...The Sox return to the west coast from 8/28-9/5 for 9 games against the Angels, A's and Mariners.

♣ The Sox are hitting just .235 (97-for-413) against AL West opponents this year, their worst mark against any division, and are averaging 3.58 runs per game (43 R/12 G) vs. AL West foes...The Red Sox .417 win pct. (5-7) against the West is also their worst this year against a single division.

ROAD RUN: The Red Sox are 21-17 (.553) on the road, the 5th-best mark in the AL...They have posted a Major League-leading 20-12 (.625) road mark in 32 tilts away from home since 4/23 and have won 12 of their last 19 road contests.

♣ The Sox have not lost a road series since dropping 2 of 3 in Kansas City from 5/7-9...The have won 5 road series since and split 2.

VS. OAKLAND: The Red Sox and A's continue a 3-game series in Oakland tonight after the Sox dropped the series opener, 6-1...The 2 clubs met at Fenway from 4/30-5/2 with the A's taking 2 of those 3 contests...Boston will return to Oakland for 3 games from 8/31-9/2.

♣ Boston has won just 7 of its last 25 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06.

ALL-STAR AGAIN: It was announced by MLB Sunday that David Ortiz has been elected to start the All-Star Game in Kansas City for the AL after leading fan balloting at DH... Ortiz received 4,986,979 votes, 5th-most in the Majors...It marks his 8th overall All-Star selection (also 2004-08, '10-11), and his 6th nod as a starter (elected to start 4 straight from 2005-08 and again in 2011; did not play in 2008 due to injury)...Overall this year's selection is his 5th as a DH (also 2005, 2008 and 2010-11), becoming the 1st player to win fan balloting at designated hitter on 4 occasions.

400 FEVER: David Ortiz leads the Sox with 21 homers, 6th-most in the AL...He is 1 home run shy of 400 career and would become the 8th active player to reach the mark...He is currently tied with Andres Galarraga and Al Kaline for 49th on baseball's all-time home run list at 399.

GONZO STREAK: Adrian Gonzalez has hit .345 (19-for-55) with 7 RBI and 7 runs scored over his season-high 13-game hit streak, the longest active hit streak in the Majors...It is the 2nd-longest hit streak for a Sox batter this season behind Dustin Pedroia's 14-gamer, 4/29-5/13, and his 4th longest career (last longer, 14-games, 7/20-8/4/11).

INHERITANCE: Boston relievers have allowed just 36 of 139 inherited runners to score for the 3rd-best rate in the AL at 25.9 percent...Vicente Padilla's 5.6 percent of inherited runners scored (1 of 18) is tied for the best rate in the Majors while Andrew Miller is 2nd in the AL at 11.1 (2 of 18).

SWEET RELIEF: Since 4/23, Boston's bullpen paces the Majors with a 2.00 ERA (46 ER/206.2 IP)...Sox relievers have lowered their combined ERA from 8.44 to 3.10 in that time.

♣ Over the last 6 games in which they have appeared, the Sox bullpen has tossed 24.0 innings and yielded 3 runs for a 1.13 ERA while holding opponents to a .147 AVG.

EXTRA BASES: The Sox lead the Majors with 294 extra-base hits, including an ML-high 193 doubles...They have 22 more XBH and 35 more doubles than the next-highest total for any teams (TEX, 272 XBH and CIN/WSH, 158 2B).

♣ David Ortiz paces the AL with 45 extra-base hits, 2nd in the Majors behind Cincinnati's Joey Votto (47).

REHAB UPDATES: OF Carl Crawford, on the 60-day DL recovering from left wrist surgery, is slated to continue his rehab stint tonight with Double-A Portland as they host Trenton (NYY)...He was 3-for-14 with a double, 2 runs and 5 walks over 5 rehab contests with the GCL Red Sox, with 4 starts in LF and 1 at DH.

♣ OF Jacoby Ellsbury, on the 60-day DL with a right shoulder subluxation, played his 4th game of a rehab stint with the GCL Sox today and went 0-for-4 as the DH at the GCL Orioles... Ellsbury is 2-for-10 with a double, homer, 3 RBI, 3 runs and 4 walks in his 4 rehab outings, including 2 in CF and 2 as the DH.

♣ OF Scott Podsednik, on the 15-day DL with a left groin strain, continued a rehab assignment with Triple-A Pawtucket last night vs. Rochester (MIN), starting in CF and going 1-for-4 with a run scored...It marked his 3rd rehab game with the PawSox (1-for-11, R, BB).

BOBBY AT THE HELM: Bobby Valentine, in his 1st season as Red Sox manager, ranks 4th among active ML skippers in games (2,269) and 5th in wins (1,159)...He is 43rd on the all-time managerial wins list with John McNamara next at 1,160.

ON THE DOUBLES: With 3 doubles last night, High-A Salem 1B Travis Shaw brought his season total to 26, the most by any current Carolina League player and tied for the most in the CL overall this year with former teammate Jackie Bradley.

ACTS OF KINDNESS MONTH: The Red Sox and the Red Sox Foundation yesterday announced that July is "Acts of Kindness" month, and will embark on a month-long series of charitable initiatives as part of the "100 Acts of Kindness."

1942: The Red Sox hosted the 1st Major League twilight game in Boston history, a 6:00 p.m. start at Fenway Park...Some 21,296 turned out, but saw the Sox go down 5-3 to the Yankees...With lights still 5 years away, it was imperative to play efficiently as darkness crept in...The game got in at 1:58.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

31-JON LESTER, LHP

2012: 5-5, 4.53 ERA (51 ER/101.1 IP) in 16 GS
CAREER: 81-39, 3.63 ERA (427 ER/1,059.0 IP) in 171 G, 170 GS
CAREER on ROAD: 43-21, 3.69 ERA (225 ER/549.1 IP) in 89 GS

LAST START: Earned his 5th win of the season on 6/27, a 10-4 Red Sox victory over Toronto at Fenway... Allowed 4 runs on 7 hits over 7.0 innings...Did not walk a batter for the 3rd time this season...Fanned 4 while tossing 100 pitches...Exited with a 6-run lead and Mark Melancon and Clayton Mortensen tossed 2.0 perfect innings in relief...The Red Sox scored 6 runs off Jays' starter Ricky Romero in the 1st inning.

FINDING HIS FORM: Is 5-3 with a 4.07 ERA (35 ER/77.1 IP) over his last 12 starts since 4/28...Has given up 1 earned run or less in 4 starts overall in 2012 and 3 earned runs or less 10 times.

🔴 Surrendered 7 runs in 2 separate starts this season: 2.0 IP on 4/17 vs. TEX and 4.0 IP on 5/25 vs. TB... Has a 3.49 ERA (37 ER/95.1 IP) in his other 14 outings combined.

🔴 Shares the Red Sox lead with Josh Beckett with 9 quality starts this season.

ROAD WARRIOR: Has a 3.28 ERA (17 ER/46.2 IP) in 7 starts on the road and a 5.60 ERA (34 ER/54.2 IP) in 9 starts at home this season...Ranks 8th in the American League in road ERA in 2012...Has also held batters to a .238 average (41-for-172) and .360 slugging on the road while opponents have posted a .305 average (68-for-223) and .493 slugging at Fenway Park.

🔴 Has compiled a .672 road winning percentage (43-21) in his career, the best mark among American League hurlers since 2006 (min. 60 decisions), and the 2nd-highest mark in the Majors in that span behind MIA's Carlos Zambrano (.712, 52-21)...Since 1921, only Pedro Martinez (.756, 59-19) has a better career winning percentage on the road as a Boston hurler (min. 60 decisions).

VS. THE ATHLETICS: Is making his 1st start of 2012 against Oakland...Last faced the A's on 8/27 (2), earning the win after tossing 6.0 innings (2 R, 1 ER, 3 H)...Has a 4.53 ERA (25 ER/49.2 IP) in his career against Oakland, his 4th-worst mark versus an American League opponent.

JULY: In 2011, posted a 1.56 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) over 3 July starts while going 1-0, the 4th-lowest ERA in the month among AL hurlers with at least 3 starts.

SHAKY SUPPORT: Has received 4.88 runs of support per 9.0 innings (55 RS/101.1 IP) in 2012, the 3rd-lowest run support of any Red Sox starting pitcher...From 2006-11, ranked 2nd among Major League qualifiers with 5.93 runs of support per 9.0 IP (631 RS/957.2 IP), behind only Vicente Padilla (6.30 RSA).

THE K-ZONE: Is 9th on the Red Sox all-time list with 973 strikeouts after passing Bill Monbouquette (969 K's) on 6/27...Smoky Joe Wood is next with 986 strikeouts... Has the 2nd-most K's by a left-hander in Sox history behind Bruce Hurst (1,043)...His 16 games with at least 10 K's are the most double-digit strikeout tilts by a Sox lefty and 4th-most overall by a Boston hurler behind Pedro Martinez (72), Roger Clemens (68) and Joe Wood (18).

🔴 His ratio of 8.27 strikeouts per 9.0 innings with Boston ranks 3rd in team history behind Pedro Martinez (10.95) and Roger Clemens (8.40) (min. 1,000.0 IP).

🔴 Recorded his 900th career strikeout on 4/11 at Toronto when he fanned J.P. Arencibia in the 5th inning...Became the 2nd Red Sox left-hander (also Bruce Hurst) and 10th Boston hurler overall to reach that milestone.

RED SOX MILESTONES: Trails Bill Dinneen (174 GS) by 4 starts for 17th on the Red Sox all-time games started list with 170...George Winter is next on the list with 176...Has passed Dutch Leonard (161st start on 5/4 vs. BAL), Jim Lonborg (164th start on 5/25 vs. TB) and Bill Lee (168th start on 6/16 at CHC) so far this season.

🔴 Became the 41st hurler to toss 1,000.0 IP as a member of the Sox on 5/14 vs. SEA...Is the 10th lefty to reach the milestone with Boston, 1st since Bruce Hurst.

WINNING WAYS: Owns a 81-39 record in 171 career games (170 GS) for a .675 winning percentage, the 8th-highest mark in modern Major League history (since 1900, min. 75 decisions)...Went 76-34 (.691) from 2006-11, the 6th-highest win percentage by an AL pitcher in his 1st 6 ML seasons since 1901 (min. 100 decisions).

CONTINUED SUCCESS: Since the start of the 2008 season, is 3rd in the American League with 70 wins behind NYY's CC Sabathia (74) and DET's Justin Verlander (80)...Also ranks among circuit leaders during that time (min. of 500.0 IP) in winning percentage (3rd, .654, 70-37), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (4th, 8.49), strikeouts (3rd, 863), ERA (9th, 3.46), opponent average (10th, .243), innings pitched (6th, 914.2) and starts (T-4th, 144).

PREVIOUS START: Took the loss after allowing 3 runs over 7.0 innings vs. Atlanta on 6/22...Gave up a season-high-tying 10 hits, walked 1 intentionally and hit a batter...Fanned 5 while tossing 118 pitches...Surrendered 2 runs in the 4th inning and 1 in the 6th frame...Exited with the Red Sox down 3-0...Boston managed just 3 hits off Braves starter Jair Jurrjens.
