BOSTON RED SOX (42-39) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (40-42)

AWAY FOR THE HOLIDAY: Today marks the 12th time in the last 18 years (beginning in 1995) that the Red Sox have played on the road on Independence Day...Boston last was away from home on July 4 in 2008 when they won a 6-4 decision against the Yankees in New York...All-time, the Red Sox are 89-66 on Independence Day.

RECENT RESULTS: The Red Sox have dropped 4 of their 1st 6 games on their current road trip, including a 3-2 loss in Oakland last night, the 3rd time they have lost in walk-off fashion on the trek...Despite the slide, the Sox are 11-6 (.647) since 6/16, the 4th-best mark in the Majors during that span...The club is 13-7 (.650) since 6/12, tied for 3rd in the ML (also the Yankees at 13-7) in that time behind the Rangers (15-5, .750) and A's (14-7, .667).

SERIES TALK: With losses in the 1st 2 games of the current set in Oakland, Boston has dropped just its 4th set in its last 17 series dating back to 5/10...The Sox have won 11 series in that time and split 2.

STAND AND DELIVER: At 42-39, the Sox are in 4th place in the AL East...They had held a share of 3rd place each of the last 6 days, their highest place in the standings this year...Boston is 6.5 games behind the division-leading Yankees, 1.5 behind the 2nd-place Orioles, and 1.0 game shy of the 3rd-place Rays.

HALF-WAY THERE: Last night's game marked the half-way point of the regular season...2012 is the 15th consecutive year that Boston has had a winning record through 81 games.

SINCE MID-MAY: Boston has won 30 of its last 50 games (.600), tied for the 4th-best mark in the Majors since 5/11... Of the Sox 20 losses in that time, they have been by 2 runs or less on 10 occasions and 1-run defeats 7 times.

TAKING OFF: Following a 4-10 start to the season, Boston has gone 38-29 (.567) since 4/23, the 4th-best win percentage in the AL during that span behind the Yankees (39-26, .600), Angels (39-26, .600) and Rangers (37-28, .569).

WEST COAST SWING: The Red Sox today conclude a 7-day, 7-game west coast trip with the last tilt of a 3-game set in Oakland after dropping the 1st 2 games of the series...The club began the trek with 4 contests in Seattle (2-2)...The Sox return to the west coast from 8/28-9/5 for 9 games against the Angels, A's and Mariners.

♣ The Sox are hitting just .234 (104-for-4445) against AL West opponents this year, their worst mark vs. any division, and are averaging 3.46 runs per game (45 R/13 G) in those contests...Red Sox batters are hitting .215 (45-for-209) over the 6 games on the current trip with 12 runs scored.

♣ Boston's .385 win pct. (5-8) against the West is their worst this year against a single division.

HOME BEFORE THE BREAK: Following today's game, the Red Sox will head back home for an off day tomorrow followed by a 4-game series with the Yankees over the weekend, including a day-night doubleheader on Saturday (make-up from 4/22)...The weekend series will lead right into the All-Star break.

ROAD RUN: The Red Sox are 21-18 (.538) on the road, the 6th-best mark in the AL...They have posted a Major League-leading 20-13 (.606) road mark in 33 tilts away from home since 4/23 and have won 12 of their last 20 road contests.

♣ Prior to dropping the current series with the A's, the Sox had not lost a road set since dropping 2 of 3 in Kansas City from 5/7-9...They won 5 road series and split 2 in between...Boston is looking for a win today to avoid being swept on the road for the 1st time since losing their 1st 3 games of 2012 in Detroit.

VS. OAKLAND: The Red Sox and A's conclude a 3-game series in Oakland today...The A's hold a 4-1 advantage in the season series thus far...Boston will return to Oakland for 3 games from 8/31-9/2.

♣ Boston has won just 7 of its last 26 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06...The Sox are looking for a victory today to avoid being swept by the A's for the 1st time since 5/23-25/08 in Oakland (0-3).

ALL-STAR AGAIN: It was announced by MLB Sunday that David Ortiz has been elected to start the All-Star Game in Kansas City for the AL after leading fan balloting at DH...Ortiz received 4,986,979 votes, 5th-most in the Majors...It marks his 8th overall All-Star selection (also 2004-08, '10-11), and his 6th nod as a starter (elected to start 4 straight from 2005-08 and again in 2011; did not play in 2008 due to injury)...Overall this year's selection is his 5th as a DH (also 2005, 2008 and 2010-11), becoming the 1st player to win fan balloting at designated hitter on 4 occasions.

400 FEVER: David Ortiz leads the Sox with 21 homers, 6th-most in the AL...He is 1 home run shy of 400 career and would become the 8th active player to reach the mark...He is currently tied with Andres Galarraga and Al Kaline for 49th on baseball's all-time home run list at 399.

GONZO STREAK: Adrian Gonzalez has hit .356 (21-for-59) with 7 RBI and 7 runs scored over his season-high 14-game hit streak, the longest active hit streak in the Majors... It is tied for the 2nd-longest hit streak for a Sox batter this season along with Dustin Pedroia's 14-gamer, 4/29-5/13, and tied for his 3rd longest career (also 14-games, 7/20-8/4/11) behind 2, 17-game stretches in 2006.

QUITE A CATCH: Jarrod Saltalamacchia hit his 16th home run last night, matching his career single-season high set last year... His 16 homers top all Major League catchers.

INHERITANCE: Boston relievers have allowed just 36 of 140 inherited runners to score for the 3rd-best rate in the AL at 25.7 percent...Vicente Padilla's 5.3 percent of inherited runners scored (1 of 19) is the best rate in the Majors while Andrew Miller is 2nd in the AL at 11.1 (2 of 18).

SWEET RELIEF: Since 4/23, Boston's bullpen paces the Majors with a 2.03 ERA (47 ER/208.2 IP)...Sox relievers have lowered their combined ERA from 8.44 to 3.12 in that time.

EXTRA BASES: The Sox lead the Majors with 295 extra-base hits, including an ML-high 193 doubles... They have 21 more XBH and 29 more doubles than the next-highest total for any teams (TEX, 274 XBH and WSH, 164 2B).

♣ David Ortiz paces the AL with 45 extra-base hits, 2nd in the Majors behind Cincinnati's Joey Votto (47).

REHAB UPDATES: OF Carl Crawford, on the 60-day DL recovering from left wrist surgery, continued his rehab stint last night with Double-A Portland vs. Trenton (NYY), starting in LF (played 7.0 innings) and going 1-for-2 with a run, 2 walks and a stolen base...He is 4-for-16 with a double, 3 runs and 7 walks over 6 rehab contests, including 5 with the GCL Sox.

♣ OF Jacoby Ellsbury, on the 60-day DL with a right shoulder subluxation, is scheduled to play tonight for Double-A Portland at NH (TOR)...He went 2-for-10 with a double, homer, 3 RBI, 3 runs and 4 walks in his 4 rehab outings with the GCL Red Sox, including 2 in CF and 2 as the DH.

♣ OF Scott Podsednik, on the 15-day DL with a left groin strain, continued a rehab assignment with Triple-A Pawtucket last night vs. Rochester (MIN), starting in LF and going 1-for-2 with an RBI and 2 walks, and recorded an outfield assist...It marked his 4th rehab game with the PawSox (2-for-13, R, RBI, 3 BB).

BOBBY AT THE HELM: Bobby Valentine, in his 1st season as Red Sox manager, ranks 4th among active ML skippers in games (2,270) and 5th in wins (1,159)...He is 43rd on the all-time managerial wins list with John McNamara next at 1,160.

MAKING AN IMPACT: Short-A Lowell catcher J.T. Watkins, who was recently drafted by the Sox in the 10th round out of the United States Military Academy, notched his 1st professional hits in his 2nd game with the Spinners, going 2-for-4 in a 7-2 loss last night.

ACTS OF KINDNESS MONTH: The Red Sox and the Red Sox Foundation announced on Monday that July is "Acts of Kindness" month...Among the charitable initiatives taking place this month is complimentary tours of Fenway Park for uniformed military personnel today from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. while many crew members are in town for U.S. Navy Week.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

35-AARON COOK, RHP

2012: 2-1, 4.32 ERA (8 ER/16.2 IP) in 3 GS
CAREER: 74-69, 4.52 ERA (668 ER/1,329.0 IP) in 241 G, 209 GS
CAREER on ROAD: 37-36, 4.33 ERA (308 ER/640.0 IP) in 117 G, 103 GS

LAST START: Tossed a complete-game shutout in a 5-0 Red Sox victory at Seattle on 6/29...Allowed just 2 hits and did not surrender a walk...Fanned 2 while tossing 81 pitches...Boston plated 3 runs in the 5th inning on 3 solo homers including back-to-back knocks by Will Middlebrooks and Cody Ross and then added 2 more in the 6th on a 2-run blast Jarrod Saltalamacchia.

It was his 12th career complete game (last 6/26/10 in 8.0 IP at LAA w/ COL), his 1st 9.0-inning complete game since 4/24/10 (2) vs. FLA with COL and his 3rd career shutout (last 5/21/09 at ATL w/ COL).

Threw just 81 pitches, the 3rd-lowest total of pitches he has used in a complete game, after 74 on 7/25/07 and 79 on 7/1/08, both against SD while with COL...The 81 pitches were the fewest thrown in a complete game in the Majors so far this season.

The 2 hits allowed were the fewest he has given up in any of his complete games.

Red Sox starters have tossed 4 CG's in 2012, including 2 shutouts (also Clay Buchholz, 6/27 vs. BAL)

FINDING HIS FORM: Is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) and no walks allowed in his last 2 starts, including a .163 opponent average (8-for-49).

TOUGH ON RIGHTIES: Has held right-handed opponents to a .095 average (2-for-21) this season.

VS. THE ATHLETICS: Is making his 3rd career appearance against Oakland, his 1st since 6/28/09 with COL...Is 4-1 with a 1.72 ERA (9 ER/47.0 IP) and .181 opponent AVG in 5 career starts against the AL West.

PREVIOUS START: Returned from the 15-day disabled list to earn the win over ATL on 6/24...It was his 1st win of the season, 1st as a Red Sox and 1st overall since 8/17/11 vs. FLA with COL...Went 5.0 innings, allowing 3 runs (2 ER) on 6 hits...Did not tally a walk or strikeout while tossing 79 pitches...It was the 4th time in his career that he did not record a K or walk in a start (last 8/6/09 at PHI with COL)...Held the Braves scoreless over the 1st 4 innings...Exited with a 7-3 lead after giving up 3 runs in the 5th inning.

It was the 3rd time in his career that he has not recorded a strikeout in consecutive starts (also 6/9-15/10 and 6/17-23/07, both with COL).

ON THE FARM: Is 3-0 with a 2.41 ERA (10 ER/37.1 IP) in 6 starts for Triple-A Pawtucket in 202...Began the season with Pawtucket and started 5 games before being promoted to the Majors on 5/4...Made 1 start with Boston on 5/5 but was placed on the DL the following day with a left knee laceration...Appeared in 1 rehab game with the PawSox on 6/18 before being activated on 6/24.

Did not factor in the decision in his rehab start with Pawtucket on 6/18 at Syracuse (WSH)...Pitched 4.0 innings, allowing 3 runs on 7 hits and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts in an 11-7 loss.

Signed as a minor league free agent on 1/11/12...Was 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA (7 ER/33.1 IP) in 5 starts with Pawtucket at the time of his call-up on 5/4...At that time, ranked among qualifiers in ERA, placing 3rd in the International League and 6th overall in Triple-A...Also paced Triple-A with 2 complete games, each 7.0 innings in length and was among IL leaders in innings (3rd)...Also at the time of his call up on 5/4, led Pawtucket in complete games and innings pitched and paced team qualifiers in ERA...Tied for the club lead in wins and starts...Yielded 3 or fewer runs over 5.0 innings or more in all 5 starts, including 3 outings with 1 run or less.

SPRING REVIEW: Went 1-0 in 4 games (3 GS) for Boston this spring...Ranked 2nd among Red Sox starters (min. 3 GS) with a 1.88 ERA (3 ER/14.1 IP) this spring...Made 2 of his 3 starts at home...Did not allow more than 2 runs in any outing...Also started a minor league game against TB at Fenway South.

Earned the win in the Sox final spring game of 2012 at JetBlue Park on 4/2 vs. WAS, giving up 1 run on 2 hits and 1 walk over 5.0 innings...Tossed 68 pitches to 19 batters over 5.0 innings while allowing 1 run on 5 hits for Double-A Portland vs. TB minor leaguers on 3/28 at Fenway South...Gave up 2 runs on 4 hits over 4.0 innings in his 2nd start on 3/22 vs. NYY...Allowed 1 hit over 3.1 scoreless innings but did not factor in the decision in his 1st Grapefruit League start on 3/17 at BAL...Pitched 2.0 hitless innings in relief in his 1st appearance of the spring on 3/11 at BAL.

MORE 2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss on 5/5 vs. Baltimore at Fenway in his Red Sox debut and 1st Major League start this season...Did not record a strikeout for the 1st time since 6/15/10 at MIN with COL...Suffered a left knee laceration in the 2nd inning while covering home plate on a passed ball and was placed on the 15-day disabled list the following day...It was his 6th career start recording 8 outs or less, 1st since 7/28/10 vs. PIT with COL (2.1 IP) and matches his most runs allowed in an outing of 2.2 innings or less, also 8/16/09 at FLA with COL (G1)...It was his 1st outing in the American League after spending his 1st 10 ML seasons with Colorado.

GROUND FORCES: Has a 16.9 ground-into-double-play percentage in his career, 1st among active Major League hurlers with at least 1,000.0 innings...Owns a 2.62 ground ball-to-fly ball ratio (2,707 GB/1,033 FB) in 11 seasons, 3rd highest among active pitchers with at least 1,000.0 IP behind CLE's Derek Lowe (3.07) and STL's Jake Westbrook (2.67).

DOUBLE UP: Is 1 of 4 Major League hurlers to induce at least 14 ground into double plays in each season from 2003-11 including MIA's Mark Buehrle, CLE's Derek Lowe and NYY's CC Sabathia...Has 190 career GDP, 9th most in the Majors since 2002.

2011 IN REVIEW: Made 18 appearances for the Rockies...His 6.03 ERA (65 ER/97.0 IP) was the highest of his career, while his 97.0 innings and 17 starts were his fewest since 2005 (83.1 IP, 13 GS).

Missed all of Spring Training and began the season on the 60-day DL due to a fractured right pointer finger...Made 5 rehab starts between Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Colorado Springs from 5/14-6/2, combining to go 1-1 with a 5.65 ERA (18 ER/28.2 IP) in those 5 starts with 18 strikeouts compared to just 5 walks.

LAST START: Allowed 2 runs over 6.0 innings and did not factor in the decision on 6/30 at SEA, his 1st start since being placed on the 15-day disabled list on 6/16 (retroactive to 6/12) with right shoulder inflammation...Gave up 4 hits and walked 3 while striking out 4 over 85 pitches as the Sox fell 3-2 in 11 innings...Surrendered 2 runs in the 6th inning on an RBI double by Jay Jaso...Exited with the game tied 2-2 after Boston scored twice in the bottom of the 6th...Dustin Ackley scored the winning run on a sac fly by Chone Figgins off Alfredo Aceves.

Has made 5 starts without recording a win, tied for the 4th longest such stretch of his career.

VS. THE YANKEES: Is making his 1st start against the Yankees this season...Went 4-0 with a 1.85 ERA (7 ER/34.0 IP) and 38 K's in 5 starts against the Yankees in 2011, becoming the 1st Red Sox with 4 wins vs. NYY in a season since Al Nipper in 1987 (4)...No other Major Leaguer won more than 2 games against NYY in 2011.
