Ichiro's next home run will be 100th of Major League career...will become 12th player to hit 100 HR as Mariner.

ON THE AIR

Mariners will use rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus... Rick Rizzs, Dave Sims and Mike Blowers will work nearly all games, while Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner and Dan Wilson will mix in...tonigh Rizzs and Blowers will be in the radio booth, with Sims and Henderson calling the action on TV.

TONIGHT'S TILT... the Mariners conclude the first half of the season with a three-game roadtrip with American League West rival the Oakland Athletics (0-0)...Seattle recently concluded a 3-team, 10-game homestand hosting the A's (1-2), Red Sox (2-2) and Orioles (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT Sports in high definition and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...lost Wednesday...4 of the of last 7 games to be decided in final inning (SEA 2-2, w/2 walk-off wins)...dropped 7 of last 11 games, including 3 ShO...are 14-20 over last 34 games...1-3 in July after finishing June 11-16...16-25 at Safeco Field; 19-24 on the road.

- Batting Around -- Sent 10+ batters to the plate 6 times: last twice 5/30 at TEX (2nd & 3rd innings).
- Blown Leads -- Mariners have held a lead in 22 of 49 losses, leading the Majors.
- Home vs. Road -- Batting .259 (403x1553) on the road (43 G) and .195 (249x1274) at home (41 G).
- 2-Out RBI -- Kyle Seager is T1st in AL with 25 2-out RBI (T2nd in Majors behind Andre Ethier/31).
- Brendan Ryan leads AL shortstops with a .993 FLD% (2 E, 302 TC); 12.8 UZR & 20 runs saved. Steals -- Mariners successful on 38 of last 48 steal attempts (79.2%) since May 15...started 17-for-27.
- Home ERA -- Rank 4th in AL in home ERA (3.14); 2nd-lowest in club history behind 3.04 mark in 2001.
- vs. AL West -- Mariners are 13-14 vs. their AL West opponents: OAK (6-4), LAA (2-5), TEX (5-5).

SEATTLE VS. OAKLAND...tonight is the 10th (6-4) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2012...the Mariners and A's split a pair of games to open the season in Japan (March 28-29), Seattle swept two games April 6-7 in Oakland, and then split series in Seattle April 13-15 and June 25-27... the Mariners went 10-9 against the A's last season, including 4-5 at Oakland Coliseum...Seattle is 59-46 vs. Oakland since 2007...Mariners trail the all-time series 223-296, including a 95-164 mark at Oakland Coliseum.

COWBOY CAPITAL OF THE WORLD...Ichiro is batting .362 (154x426) at O.co Coliseum, ranking first all-time (min. 120 PA)...in his career Ichiro is batting .328 (293x893) in 211 games vs. the Athletics in his career, which ranks 3rd amongst all active players (min. 120 PA)... Chone Figgins' .319 (81x259) career average at OAK currently ranks T5th amongst active players (min. 120 PA).

ROSTER UPDATE...The Mariners recalled OF Carlos Peguero yesterday from AAA Tacoma and optioned RHP Hector Noesi to the Rainiers...Peguero was 13-for-his-last-38 (.342) over his last 10 games with Tacoma, including homering 6 times in last 5 games...overall he hit .293 (55x188) with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 18 home runs and 41 RBI in 49 games with the Rainiers...despite only appearing in 49 games in Tacoma ranked thrid in the PCL with 18 home runs.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...John Jaso is hitting .280 (35x125) with 12 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs with .378 OBP and .464 slugging...16 of his 35 hits (45.7%) have been for extra bases...of American League players who have at least 15 extra-base hits, no player has done it is fewer at-bats than Jaso...Daniel Nava (BOS) is 2nd with 19 XBH in 154 at-bats.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...Felix Hernandez will represent the Mariners for the 3rd time, becoming just the 6th Mariners player to make at least three appearances in the All-Star Game...he was selected to the AL team in 2009 (St. Louis) and 2011 (Arizona)...tossed 1.0 shutout inning in his only ASG appearance in 2009 (DNP last season)...the 2012 Major League Baseball All-Star Game will air on Tuesday, July 10th beginning at 7:30 ET, 4:30 PT on FOX.

THAT'S CHARLIE WITH A K...LHP Charlie Furbush has recorded at least one strikeout in each of his last 19 appearances...that's the T3rd-longest streak by a Mariners reliever in club history, and longest since a 21-G streak by Rafael Soriano in 2003...since May 13, Furbush has struck out 34 in 25.0 innings over 19 G, while posting a 2-1, 0.72 (2 ER) mark...he's appeared in 30 G this season (35.2 IP), and has at least one K in 26 games (46 total K's) for a 11.61 K/9.0 IP ratio (ranks 9th in K/9.0 IP among AL

LEFT ON LEFT...Mariners LH relievers Charlie Furbush and Lucas Luetge have combined to hold LH batters to a .156 batting average (15x96) with 40 strikeouts...Furbush has limited lefties to a .161 mark (9x56) with 26 K's, while Luetge has a .150 opponent average (6x40) with 15 K's...duo has also combined to strand 31 of 40 inherited runners (Luetge, 18 of 21, Furbush, 13 of 19).

IN A PINCH...The Mariners pinch hitters are currently batting .302 (13x34) with 4 runs scored, 4 extrabase hits (2-2B, 3B, HR), 10 RBI and 4 walks this season...their .302 aveage currently leads the American League, while ranking 2nd in the Majors (Chicago-NL, .315)...on pace to finish with the 2nd-highest pinch hitting average in franchis history since batting .320 in 2001...John Jaso lead the Mariners with 4 hits as a pinch hitter (.400/4x10, 3 RBI, BB).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...Since May 29, the Mariners are 7-7 in their last 14 road games, batting a collective .282/.344/.471 with 33 doubles and 22 home runs (1.57 per game) and scored a total of 97 runs (6.93 per game)...Mariners pitchers have recorded a 5.93 ERA (81 ER, 123.0 IP)...Through May 28, Seattle was 12-17 on the road, batting .248/.293/.394 with 29 home runs (1.0 per game) and scored a total of 114 runs (3.9 per game)...In those 29 games, the team pitched to a 4.45 ERA (125 ER, 252.2 IP)...Seattle currently lead the American League with 211 runs scored on the road and 2nd in the Majors behind only St. Louis (214)...the Mariners also rank 4th in the Majors with 51 homers on the road (3rd in American League).

AS YOU KNOW...Kyle Seager leads the team with 48 RBI this season... BUT DID YOU KNOW?... that Seager has collected 33 of his 48 RBI (68.8%) this season on the road?...his 33 RBI on the road currently rank T3rd in the Majors this season on the road: 1.) Josh Hamilton, TEX: 38; 2.) Jose Bautista, TOR: 37; T3rd.) Seager & Prince Fielder, DET, 33...overall Seager is batting .316 (48x152) with 25 runs, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs and 33 RBI in 38 games on the road.

ABOUT KEVIN...37-year-old right-hander is making his 16th start of the season & the 431st (439th app.) of his ML career tonight vs. the A's.

- 1993 graduate of Bessemer City (NC) High School, where he played baseball, football & basketball, graduating with honors.

 Winner of Rangers 2007 Jim Sundberg Community Achievement
 Award for his contributions with Texas Rangers Foundation and Habitat for Humanity...donated bulk of cost to build the Kevin Millwood Texas Rangers Ballpark as part of Boys & Girls Clubs of Arlington's National Semiconductor Sports Complex.
- Veteran of 15 ML seasons (in 16th MLB season) with Braves (1997-2002), Phillies (2003-04), Indians (2005), Rangers (2006-09), Orioles (2010) and Rockies (2011). Originally selected by Atlanta in the 11th round of the 1993 June draft. Ranks 62nd in MLB history with 2,038 career strikeouts...among active pitchers,
- ranks 4th in innings pitched (2,642.2), strikeouts (2,038) and games started (430),
- 10th in wins (166) and 11th in complete games (22). Threw a no-hitter April 27, 2003 against San Francisco with Philadelphia. volved in the Mariners combined no-hitter June 8, 2012 vs. LA Dodgers (6.0 IP) is 27-26 with 4.21 ERA (188 ER, 402.0 IP) in 69 G, 67 GS in career in July.

LAST START...left his last game June 27 vs. Oakland after experiencing discomfort in his right groin...allowed just one hit, a leadoff home run to Coco Crisp in the first inning...retired 8 straight after home run before being replaced with 2 outs in the third inning by Hisashi Iwakuma...Seattle went on to lose 2-1.

WELL RESTED ... will be making tonight's start with 8 days of rest since his last start on June 27...in two starts this season following at least 6 days of rest has a 3.27 ERA (4 ER, 11.0 IP) with 11 strikeouts...in his career when getting 6+ days between starts is 23-19, 3.39 ERA (131 ER, 348.0 IP) with 255 strikeouts.

COMBINED NO-HITTER...pulled off the rare "no-decision for the starter in a no-', in Seattle's 1-0 win vs. the Dodgers on June 8 at Safeco Field...left after 6.0 hitless innings (1 BB, 6 SO) with a strained right groin...5 Mariners relievers combined to work final 3.0 hitless innings...Kevin also threw a individual no-hitter April 27, 2003 with Philadelphia against San Francisco...he is the fourth pitcher to throw a complete-game no-hitter and be part of a combined no-hitter, joining Vida Blue, Mike Witt and Kent Mercker.

QUOTE A ROLL ... was 3-0 with a 0.67 ERA (2 ER, 27.0 IP) over 4 GS May 13-28...earned 1st win of season May 13 at NYY (7.0 IP, 1R, 3 H, 6 K)...followed with CG ShO at COL, tossed 6.0 ShO in 5/23 vs. TEX, allowed 1 ER in 5.0 IP on 5/28 at TEX...during 4-start stretch struck out 20, walked 8 and limited opponents to a .133 batting average (12x90)...overall since May 13, is 3-2, 2.72 (49.2 IP, 15 ER)

THE STREAK...allowed a solo HR (Cruz) on 5/28 at TEX, snapping his scoreless inning streak at 18.0 innings, a string that included his final 2.0 innings 5/13 at NYY, his CG ShO (9.0 IP) 5/18 at COL, his 6.0 ShO IP vs. TEX on 5/23 and 1.0 inning on 5/28 at TEX...tied his career-high scoreless IP streak at 18.0 set in 1999, a string keyed by his 10.0 IP CG shutout 8/28 at STL.

TAKE 2...threw a complete-game, 2-hit shutout May 18 at Colorado in 4-0 win in Interleague opener...struck out 7 and walked only 1 while throwing season-high 113 pitches (75 strikes)... here are some notable facts about Millwood's 2-hitter:

- Tossed his 6th career shutout (in his 423rd career start), but first since Aug. 1, 2003 vs. San Diego (pitching for PHI)...that's a span of 3,213 days between shutouts (8 years, 291 days).
- 3rd pitcher this season to go 8+ years between shutouts: Barry Zito & Jerome Williams.
- Became the 4th-oldest Mariners pitcher to throw a shutout at 37 years, 146 days ...Jamie Moyer had 3 ShO with Seattle at age 37 or older, including June 2, 2006 vs. KC at 43 years, 196 days.
- Became the 9th opposing pitcher (10th time) to throw a CG ShO at Coors Field.

ROAD WARRIOR...has been a completely different pitcher on the road this season, compared to starts at Safeco Field...in 8 starts in the road gray's is 2-4 with a 3.10 ERA (17 ER, 49.1 IP) that compares to a 1-2, 5.29 (20 ER, 34.0 IP) record in 7 home starts...averaging 7.30 K/9.0 IP on the road, and 5.82 K/9.0 IP at Safeco Field.

CLUB 2K...became the 4th active pitcher, and 67th pitcher in Major League history to record 2,000 strikeouts...achieved the historic strikeout May 13 at NYY, striking out Curtis Granderson to lead off the bottom of the 4th inning...joins active pitchers Jamie Moyer (2,441), Andy Pettitte (2,310) and CC Sabathia (2,122) in the 2,000 K club.

EYEING OREL & REUSCHEL... has recorded 2,038 career strikeouts, ranking 62nd on the all-time strikeouts list, ahead of **Rick Reuschel** (2,015)...is 7 behind **Dazzy Vance** (2,045) for 61st on the all-time strikeout list...Fernando Valenzuela ranks 60th with 2074 strikeouts.
