Mariners will use rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus... Rick Rizzs, Dave Sims and Mike Blowers will work nearly all games, while Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner and Dan Wilson will mix .tonigh Rizzs and Blowers will be in the radio booth, with Sims and Henderson calling the action on TV.

TONIGHT'S TILT... the Mariners conclude the first half of the season with the 2nd of 3 games against American League West rival the Oakland Athletics (0-1)...Seattle recently concluded a 3-team, 10-game homestand hosting the A's (1-2), Red Sox (2-2) and Orioles (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT Sports in high definition and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...lost yesterday...4 of the of last 8 games to be decided in final inning (SEA 2-3, w/2 walk-off wins)...dropped 8 of last 12 games, including 3 ShO...are 8-17 over last 25 games...1-4 in July after finishing June 11-16...16-25 at Safeco Field; 19-25 on the road.

- Batting Around -- Sent 10+ batters to the plate 6 times: last twice 5/30 at TEX (2nd & 3rd innings).
- Blown Leads -- Mariners have held a lead in 23 of 50 losses, leading the Majors
- Home vs. Road -- Batting .258 (410x1592) on the road (44 G) and .195 (249x1274) at home (41 G). **2-Out RBI** -- **Kyle Seager** is 1st in AL with 26 2-out RBI (2nd in Majors behind Andre Ethier/31).
- Brendan Ryan leads AL shortstops with a .993 FLD% (2 E, 306 TC); 12.8 UZR & 20 runs saved.
- Steals -- Mariners successful on 39 of last 49 steal attempts (79.6%) since May 15...started 17-for-27.
- Home ERA -- Rank 4th in AL in home ERA (3.14); 2nd-lowest in club history behind 3.04 mark in 2001.
- vs. AL West -- Mariners are 13-15 vs. their AL West opponents: OAK (6-5), LAA (2-5), TEX (5-5).

SEATTLE VS. OAKLAND...tonight is the 12th (6-5) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2012...the Mariners lead the series 6-5, going 3-3 in Seattle, 2-1 in Oakland and 1-1 in Tokyo...the Mariners went 10-9 against the A's last season, including 4-5 at Oakland Coliseum...Seattle is 59-47 vs. Oakland since 2007, which is the Mariners highest winning percentage vs. any AL team over that stretch...Mariners trail the all-time series 223-297, including a 95-165 mark at Oakland Coliseum.

BRIGHT SIDE OF THE BAY...Ichiro is batting .357 (154x431) at Oakland Coliseum, ranking first all-time (min. 120 PA)...in his career Ichiro is batting .326 (293x898) in 212 games vs. the Athletics, which ranks 3rd amongst all active players (min. 120 PA)...**Chone Figgins**' .319 (81x259) career average at OAK currently ranks T5th amongst active players (min. 120 PA).

ADDING HARDWARE...catcher Mike Zunino, the Mariners first selection (3rd overall) in this year's MLB First-Year Player Draft, was named the winner of the 2012 USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award... he was a consensus first-team All-American after batting .322 with 19 home runs and 67 RBI as a junior for the University of Florida Gators...Zunino, who signed his first professional contract on Tuesday, joined fellow catcher Buster Posey (2008) as the only player to collect the Golden Spikes Award, the Dick Howser Trophy and the Johnny Bench Award in the same campaign...the only other catchers to win the Golden Spikes, presented since 1978, are Bryce Harper (2010), Buster Posey (2008) and Jason Varitek (1994).

LATE INNING DECISIONS...after losing yesterday, the Mariners are 11-7 in games decided in their final at-bat...have lost three straight in last at-bat (last: 7/2 vs. BAL) after winning 6 straight in last at-bat situation.

GOING INTO THE BREAK...the Mariners are 35-50 with 2 games remaining before the All-Star break...have been under .500 at the break each of the last 3 seasons...marks the 13th season Seattle has finished with at least 50 losses at the break (last: 2010, 53)...batting .230 (672x3001), which is the 2nd-lowest pre-ASG average in franchise history (.225 in 2011).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...Felix Hernandez will represent the Mariners for the 3rd time, becoming just the 6th Mariners player to make at least three appearances in the All-Star Game...he was selected to the AL team in 2009 (St. Louis) and 2011 (Arizona)...tossed 1.0 shutout inning in his only ASG appearance in 2009 (DNP last season)...the 2012 Major League Baseball All-Star Game will air on Tuesday, July 10th beginning at 7:30 ET, 4:30 PT on FOX.

SEAGER BELIEVER...Kyle Seager leads the team with 49 RBI this season, with 34 coming on the road...his 34 RBI on the road currently rank 4th in the Majors this season on the road: 1.) Josh Hamilton, TEX: 38; 2.) Jose Bautista, TOR: 37; 3rd.) Mark Teixeira, NYY, 36...overall Seager is batting .318 (50x157) with 25 runs, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs and 34 RBI in 39 games on the road.

THAT'S CHARLIE WITH A K...LHP Charlie Furbush snapped a string of 19 consecutive appearances with at least one strikeout last night at Oakland...the streak is tied for the 3rd-longest streak by a Mariners reliever in club history, and longest since a 21-G streak by Rafael Soriano in 2003...from May 13-July 3, Furbush has struck out 34 in 25.0 innings over 19 G, while posting a 2-1, 0.72 (2 ER) mark.. he's appeared in 31 G this season (36.0 IP), and has at least one K in 26 games (46 total K's) for a 11.50 K/9.0 IP ratio (ranks 9th in K/9.0 IP among AL relievers).

LEFT ON LEFT...Mariners LH relievers Charlie Furbush and Lucas Luetge have combined to hold LH batters to a .156 batting average (15x96) with 40 strikeouts...Furbush has limited lefties to a .161 mark (9x56) with 26 K's, while Luetge has a .150 opponent average (6x40) with 15 K's...duo has also combined to strand 31 of 40 inherited runners (Luetge, 18 of 21, Furbush, 13 of 19).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...Since May 29, the Mariners are 9-9 in their last 18 road games, batting a collective .277/.334/.462 with 38 doubles and 26 home runs (1.44 per game) and scored a total of 116 runs (6.44 per game)...through May 18, Seattle was 10-16 on the road, batting .244/.289/.381 with 25 home runs (0.96 per game) and scored a total of 96 runs (3.7 per game)...Seattle currently leads the American League with 212 runs scored on the road and 2nd in the Majors behind only St. Louis (214)... the Mariners also rank 4th in the Majors with 51 homers on the road (3rd in AL).

AS YOU KNOW...Casper Wells singled with one out in the first inning...BUT DID YOU KNOW?... before that, the Mariners were hitless in 29 straight at-bats in the first inning, the longest such streak in the Majors this season...the last team without a hit in 30 or more consecutive first-inning at-bats was the Giants, who had a 31-AB drought in the opening frame in May 2010.

- Made ML debut w/1.0 shutout inning of relief 7/14/05 at PHI (with FLA)...first ML start 7/18/05 at Arizona (5.0,4,3.2.4.3).
- Did not pitch during 2008 season, spending year recovering from surgery to repair the labrum in left hip...had surgery March 17, 2008 & spent summer rehabbing at Mets minor league facility in Port St. Lucie, FL.
- Played in college at LSU (2002), Cypress JC (2003) and Long Beach State (2004)...as junior at LBSU, went 7-4, 4.14 on mound & hit .354 with 14 doubles, 5 home runs as the DH.

LAST START...ND in SEA's 1-2 (10-inning) loss vs. BOS despite allowing just 1 ER in 8.0 IP...allowed only a solo HR (Pedroia) in 8th inning and left game tied 1-1 after 8...8th career start tossing at least 8.0 innings while allowing 1 or fewer runs (2x this season)...has allowed at least one HR in last 10 GS, and in 14 of 18 GS this season.

WE'LL JUST CALL TODAY JUNE 37th...Vargas has compiled a career mark of 2-11, 5.85 (76 ER, 117.0 IP) in the month of July in 25 games, 18 starts...is 0-0, 1.13 in 1 GS in 2012...was 1-5, 5.09 in 6 GS in July 2011.

NOT THE RECORD YOU WANT ... allowed 11 home runs in month of June to match the club record...joins Gaylord Perry (May, 1982), Scott Bankhead (May, 1987) & Jamie Moyer (May, 2004) as one of only four Mariners to allow 11 HR in a calendar month...Vargas' June included a 5 HR allowed day (also matching a club record) 6/20 @Arizona.

LONG BALL WOES...has allowed 22 home runs this season, most in the Majors (tie-2 w/20: Ervin Santana, LAA; Tommy Hunter, BAL; Hector Noesi).

RUN SUPPORT...Mariners have scored 8 or more runs in 4 of his last 9 starts, including three, 10-run games...Seattle scored 8 runs only once in Vargas' previous 50 starts dating back to a 9-run outburst Aug. 21, 2010 at NYY...has still received 2 or fewer runs of support in 26 of his last 50 starts...since start of 2009, has the 4th-lowest run support average (min: 400 IP) in the Majors (2nd-lowest in AL) at 3.67 runs per game...only Doug Fister (3.46) has lower RSA by AL pitcher since '09.

TOUGH GUY ... ranks 10th in the Majors (4th in AL) for opponent batting average by a left-handed pitcher vs. right-handed batters at .232

26-vear-old right-hander is scheduled make his 18th start of the season tomorrow vs. the A's...named to the AL All-Star team for 3rd time in his career...ND 7/3 vs. BAL (5.1,8,4,4,0,8); tossed 5.0 ShO before allowing 4 consecutive hits to begin the 6th...W#6 6/28 vs. Boston, throwing a shutout in 1-0 victory (9.0,5,0,0,1,13); tied his career-high in strikeouts...recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout performances (10 6/23 at SD)...over last 4 starts is 2-0, 1.91 (6 ER, 28.1 IP) with 38 strikeouts...has allowed 2 ER or less in 10 of 17 GS...among AL starters ranks 2nd in strikeouts (122), 9th in ERA (3.26) and 3rd in innings pitched (116.0)...
