AND THE 'PEN

The Mariners bullpen is 9-4, 2.13 with 8 saves (in 11 save opportunities) in its last 30 games (since June 2)...pen has tossed 109.2 innings, & allowed 26 ER, while striking out 113...only bullpen in the Majors to toss at least 4.0 hitless inning in relief 3x this season (June 16 vs. SF and July 2 & 4 vs. BAL).

Tom Wilhelmson has not allowed run in last 21.0 innings over last 17 games (7-for-8 in save ops) during scoreless streak is limiting opponents to .153 (11x72) average while striking out 23...among AL relievers ranks 2nd in strikeouts (52) and in innings pitched (44.1) & T8th in games (39).

The Mariners are a combined 17-26 in games decided by 2 or fewer runs, going 10-14 in 1-run games and 7-12 in 2-run affairs...18 of last 26 losses have been by 3 or fewer runs.

100 HOMERS

Ichiro's next home run will be 100th of Major League career...will become 12th player to hit 100 HR as Mariner.

ON THE AIR

Mariners will use rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus... **Rick Rizzs**, **Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** will work nearly all games, while Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner and Dan Wilson will mix in...tonigh **Rizzs** and **Blowers** will be in the radio booth, with **Sims** and **Henderson** calling the action on TV.

TODAY'S TILT... the Mariners conclude the first half of the season with the final game of a 3-game series vs. the Oakland Athletics (1-1)...Seattle recently concluded a 3-team, 10-game homestand hosting the A's (1-2), Red Sox (2-2) and Orioles (1-2)...the Mariners will open the second half of the season with a 3-game homestand vs. the Texas Rangers on Friday night at Safeco Field...today's game will be televised on ROOT Sports in high definition and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won yest...4 of the of last 9 games to be decided in final inning (SEA 2-3, w/2 walk-off wins)...dropped 8 of last 13 games, including 3 ShO...are 9-17 over last 26 games...2-4 in July after finishing June 11-16...16-25 at Safeco Field; 20-25 on the road.

- **Batting Around** -- Sent 10+ batters to the plate 6 times: last twice 5/30 at TEX (2nd & 3rd innings).
- **Blown Leads** -- Mariners have held a lead in 23 of 50 losses, leading the Majors.
- **Home vs. Road** -- Batting .258 (419x1627) on the road (45 G) and .195 (249x1274) at home (41 G).
- **2-Out RBI** -- **Kyle Seager** is 1st in AL with 29 2-out RBI (2nd in Majors behind Andre Ethier/31).
- **Brendan Ryan** leads AL shortstops with a .999 FLD% (2 E, 314 TC); 12.8 UZR & 20 runs saved.
- **Steals** -- Mariners successful on 40 of last 50 steal attempts (80%) since May 15...started 17-for-27.
- **Bases Loaded** -- Mariners currently rank 2nd in the Majors with a .356 (21x59) average with the base loaded...only Tampa Bay has a higher average (.358/24x67).
- **Home ERA** -- Rank 4th in AL in home ERA (3.14); 2nd-lowest in club history behind 3.04 mark in 2001.
- **vs. AL West** -- Mariners are 14-15 vs. their AL West opponents: OAK (7-5), LAA (2-5), TEX (5-5).

AFTER THE BREAK WORKOUT...the Mariners will will work out on Thursday, July 12 at Safeco Field beginning at 4:00 pm...Seattle opens the second half of the season with a 3-game homestand vs. the Texas Rangers on Friday, July 13.

SEATTLE VS. OAKLAND...today is the 13th (7-5) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2012...the Mariners lead the series 7-5, going 3-3 in Seattle, 2-2 in Oakland and 1-1 in Tokyo...the Mariners went 10-9 against the A's last season, including 4-5 at Oakland Coliseum...Seattle is 60-47 vs. Oakland since 2007, which is the Mariners highest winning percentage vs. any AL team over that stretch... Mariners trail the all-time series 224-297, including a 96-165 mark at Oakland Coliseum.

BRIGHT SIDE OF THE BAY...**Ichiro** is batting .358 (156x436) at Oakland Coliseum, ranking first all-time (min. 120 PA)...in his career Ichiro is batting .327 (295x903) in 213 games vs. the Athletics, which ranks 3rd amongst all active players (min. 120 PA)...**Chone Figgins'** .319 (81x259) career average at OAK currently ranks T5th amongst active players (min. 120 PA).

TURN BACK THE CLOCK...the Mariners and Athletics will Turn-Back-the-Clock to the 1950s today...both teams will be decked out in the retro uniforms of two old Pacific Coast League powerhouses, the Seattle Rainiers and the Oakland Oaks from 1955...marks the second times this season the Mariners have Turned-Back-the-Clock to become the 1955 Rainiers (also: 5/26 vs. LAA at Safeco Field)...the 1955 Rainiers were led by manager Fred Hutchinson and won the PCL Title with a 95-77 record.

THE FUTURE IS NOW...the 14th annual SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game will be played today in Kansas City...Mariners minor leaguers pitchers LH **Danny Hultzen** (9-3, 1.75 ERA, 94 K w/TAC & JXN) with Triple-A Tacoma (spent most of season with Double-A Jackson) and RH **Taijuan Walker** (5-4, 4.50 ERA, 71 K) off the Jackson roster will suit up for the U.S. Squad in the game...7 players on the Mariners current 40-man roster have played in the Futures Game: **Franklin Gutierrez** (2003), **Felix Hernandez** (2004), **Jesus Montero** (2008-09), **Hector Noesi** (2010), **Miguel Olivo** (2000), **Carlos Peguero** (2010) and **Michael Saunders** (2007)...**Hernandez** is the only player on the current roster to play in both the All-Star and Futures Game.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...**Felix Hernandez** will represent the Mariners for the 3rd time, becoming just the 6th Mariners player to make at least three appearances in the All-Star Game...he was selected to the AL team in 2009 (St. Louis) and 2011 (Arizona)...tossed 1.0 shutout inning in his only ASG appearance in 2009 (DNP last season)...the 2012 Major League Baseball All-Star Game will air on Tuesday, July 10th beginning at 7:30 ET, 4:30 PT on FOX.

SEAGER BELIEVER...**Kyle Seager** leads the team with 52 RBI this season, with 37 coming on the road...his 37 RBI on the road currently rank 4th in the Majors: 3.) Mark Teixeira, NYY, 39 2.) Josh Hamilton, TEX: 38; T3.) Seager and Jose Bautista, TOR: 37...overall Seager is batting .317 (51x161) with 25 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs and 37 RBI on 40 games on the road.

FINAL GAME OF THE HALF...the Mariners have won 9 of their last 12, including 5 of the last 7 in the final game before the All-Star break...since 2000 the Mariners have only lost three times in the last game before the All-Star break (2010 vs. NYY, 2004 CWS and 2011 at LAA)...Seattle is 21-13 all-time in these games.

GOING INTO THE BREAK...the Mariners are 36-50 with 1 game remaining before the All-Star break...have been under .500 each of the last 3 seasons...marks the 13th season Seattle has finished with at least 50 losses at the break (last: 2010, 53)...batting .230 (668x2901), which is the 2nd-lowest pre-ASG average in franchise history (.225 in 2011).

LEFT ON LEFT...Mariners LH relievers **Charlie Furbush** and **Lucas Luetge** have combined to hold LH batters to a .156 batting average (15x96) with 40 strikeouts...Furbush has limited lefties to a .161 mark (9x56) with 26 K's, while Luetge has a .150 opponent average (6x40) with 15 K's...duo has also combined to strand 31 of 40 inherited runners (Luetge, 18 of 21, Furbush, 13 of 19).

AS YOU KNOW...**Jason Vargas** induced four double plays last night in Mariners 7-1 win over the Athletics...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...Vargas tied a club record for double plays in a game by a single pitcher...it marks the 9th time in club history (last: Felix Hernandez, 7/22/11 at BOS)...4 DP's in a single game (9.0 inn.) is one short of the team record 5 (last: 5/1/80 vs. CAL).
