WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 2-game series in Oakland tonight, the 2nd stop on this 8-game, 10-day road trip to Seattle (2-1), Oakland, and Anaheim (3 games) to begin the 2nd half...Texas has won 4 of 5, but is just 4-6 in July...club has won 20 of 29 and 21 of 31, the longer span beginning June 8...club is 39-31 since a 15-4 start...Texas has won 9 of its last 10 series, including 7 straight from June 8-July 1...club is 19-9-1 overall in series in 2012...rank 2nd in majors with both 54 wins and a .607 (54-35) winning pct. (see note below)...own team's best record ever after 89 games, and will also hold best 90-game mark regardless of Tuesday's outcome...club was a season-high 21 games above .500 (50-29) on July 1...own majors' best winning pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .623 (99-60).

AMONG THE BEST: Texas enters Tuesday's games with the 2nd-best record in the major leagues, trailing only the Yankees (see above)...Rangers have had majors' best record for 12 days overall since June 1 (5 straight, June 20-24; 7 straight, June 28-July 4)...marks first time for the club to ever have sole possession of best mark in ML after June 1...Rangers became 1st ML team to 50 wins on June 30 in game no. 79, joining the 2009 Dodgers as only teams to reach 50 wins in as few as 79 games over the last 6 seasons.

IN THE LEAD: The Rangers' lead in the A.L. West increased to 5.5 games with the Angels' loss on Monday, the largest since July 1 (5.5 GA)...it is the 2nd largest advantage of any division leader to the Yankees' 9.0 lead in the A.L. East...Texas has led by at least 4.0 games for the last 32 days beginning June 15 with an advantage of 3.5 or more games for 87 of last 91 days beginning April 17...have had outright possession of A.L. West lead for last 99 days and have held at least a share of the West lead for 100 of 102 days in 2012 and 236 of last 238 days beginning May 16, 2011...beg. June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 386 of 402 days...club's 4.0-game lead at the All-Star break marked just 4th time to have a lead that large at the break...the others: 1999 (+5.0 GA), 2010 (+4.5), and 1996 (+4.0).

ON THE ROAD: Texas has dropped 4 of the last 6 road games but has captured 6 of 10 beginning June 10...at 25-19 (.568), the Rangers have the 3rd best away winning percentage in the A.L. behind the Yankees at .614 (27-17) and White Sox at .581 (25-18)....club has matched 1977 and 1999 for its **best road mark ever after 44 road games**...best record after 45 road games is 26-19 in both 1977 and 1999...team was 21-23 after 44 road games in 2011.

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers makes their 2nd of 3 trips to the Coliseum this season...the clubs have split 10 games in 2012 with Texas having a 3-game winning streak snapped in the last meeting on July 1 in Arlington...the Rangers have won 17 of 24 vs. the A's beginning May 10, 2011 and have captured 5 of the last 6 season's series beginning 2006...Texas was just 1-3 in its 1st 2012 trip to Oakland, June 4-7, losing the last 2 games and was outscored in the series, 24-8...Texas has lost 4 of last 5 in Oakland, but is 6-4 in last 10 at the Coliseum and 10-7 in last 17 games since Sept. 24, 2010...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 312-297 with A's holding a 159-145 edge in Oakland. VS. A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 15-14 in their own division in 2012, 5-8 on the road...club has lost 9 of 16, 10 of 18, and 12 of last 21 to A.L. West opponents overall...the Rangers had dropped their 1st 3 road series to A.L. West clubs in 2012 before going 2-1 in Seattle over the weekend...the Rangers and Yankees are the only clubs with winning records against all 3 A.L. divisions.

SHUTOUTS AND SUCH: Matt Harrison's complete game on Sunday was the Rangers' 7th shutout of the season, T5th in the A.L...was the team's 1st since June 13 vs. Arizona and 1st on the road since June 10 at San Francisco...Harrison owns both of Texas' CG SHO in 2012....his effort was the Rangers' 6th complete game of the year, tying the White Sox for the A.L. lead, one shy of the ML-leading Reds.

<u>BARTOLO COLON</u> is one of just 2 opponents to start a shutout win over Texas in 2012 (6/6 at OAK)...the other was Felix Hernandez' CG SHO Sat.

UPCOMING PROBABLES, TIMES & BROADCASTS

LOW RUNS: The Rangers have scored 4-runs-or-less in 10 straight games, the team's longest such streak since 10 in a row from June 13-22, 1999...that is the only other such streak for the team of 10+ games since Texas scored 4 or fewer runs in the 1st 15 games of 1988, April 4-22...it also matches the longest streak in the A.L. this season and ties the 2nd longest in the majors to 12 games for Miami, June 5-17...through May 31, the Rangers led the majors with 291 runs in 51 games (5.7 R/G), 21 more runs than the next-closest team...since June 1, the Rangers have scored 159 runs in 38 games (4.2 R/G), 2nd fewest in A.L. to Tampa Bay (158), 5th fewest in majors.

HARRISON'S SUNDAY SUMMARY: Matt Harrison blanked Seattle on 5 hits in his 1st start of the 2nd half on Sunday at Safeco Field...notes from game: --was his 12th victory, tying David Price, R.A. Dickey, and Gio Gonzalez for the ML lead...lowered his ERA to 2.87, 6th in the A.L.

-Joined Brandon Morrow (3) and Felix Hernandez (2) as the only A.L. pitchers with multiple CG SHO in 2012...became just the 6th Texas lefthander with as many as 4 career CG SHO: 6--Kenny Rogers; 5--Derek Holland and Rick Honeycutt; 4--Jon Matlack and Jim Umbarger.

--Harrison walked 4 and fanned 3 on Sunday...it was just the 2nd CG SHO in club history with 4+ walks and 3 or fewer strikeouts...Pete Broberg walked 5 and fanned 2 in a 4-hit shutout on April 22, 1972 vs. California, Texas' 2nd game ever at Arlington Stadium.

--Harrison has now won 8 consecutive starts against the Mariners dating to May 1, 2010, ... it is the 3rd-longest such streak against one opponent in Texas history behind Charlie Hough's 13 vs. Cleveland from 1984-88 and 9 against Minnesota from 1981-84.

--overall Harrison has won his last 9 decisions over 15 games/10 starts vs. the M's since a loss in his 1st start ever vs. Seattle on July 31, 2008...is the longest winning streak against the Mariners since Pedro Martinez won 13 straight decisions from 1998-04.

--Harrison is 5-1, 2.70 in 7 starts vs. the A.L. West in 2012 and 17-5 career.

HALF DOZEN WITH DOUBLE DIGITS: Ian Kinsler connected for his 10th homer on Sunday, giving the Rangers 6 players with at least 10 long balls in 2012 (27--Hamilton; 16--Beltre; 12--Napoli; 11--Cruz; 10--Kinsler; 10--Moreland)...David Murphy has 9 HR...the only team with more players at 10+ homers is the Yankees with 7...the Orioles, Red Sox, White Sox, Reds, Rockies, A's, Cardinals, and Blue Jays all have 5...Texas had 8 players with 10+ homers in 2011.

YOUNG AND THE A'S: Michael Young has more career runs (129), hits (258), doubles (47), and RBI (109) against Oakland than any other club...he also ranks in the top 4 all-time in runs, hits, and doubles vs. the A's since that franchise moved to Oakland in 1968.

ROSS' STREAK: Robbie Ross has yet to appear in the second half, but continues to rank 2nd among qualifying A.L. relievers with a 0.95 ERA behind Fernando Rodney (0.89)...that figure was the 4th-lowest rookie ERA ever at the All-Star break (min 40.0 IP, since 1933) to Jonathan Papelbon (0.59 in 2006), Hideki Okajima (0.83 in 2007), and Jeff Zimmerman (0.86 in 1999)...Ross' current 23.0-inning scoreless streak is the 2nd-longest in ML.

SHORTS: The Rangers-Angels game on Monday, July 30 has been selected for national telecast by ESPN with the starting time changed from 7:05 to 6:05 p.m. CT...the game will be carried in the DFW area on FSSW and ESPN...this is the 1st time that Texas has had 2 scheduled off-days in a 4 day span since it occurred 3 times in 2010 (May 24-27; Aug. 9-12; Sept. 13-16)...prior to that had not happened since 2004...Neftali Feliz threw 40 pitches at AA Frisco in 1st rehab start on Monday (2.0, 1 H, 1 sR, 0 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO)...he is scheduled to pitch 3.0 innings for Round Rock on Friday.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#44 Roy Oswalt, RHP (2-1, 6.26)

TONIGHT: The 34-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 5th start and appearance of the season in tonight's series opener in Oakland...has had 8 days off since his last outing, a no decision in start July 8 vs. MIN, the first "half" finale...Rangers are 3-1 in his 4 starts and he has permitted just one run in 2 of those 4 outings...opponents are batting .385 and he has a 2.00 WHIP, allowing 9+ hits in 3 of 4 starts...will be making just his 2nd road start, the other on July 3 at Chicago-AL, when he permitted a career-high 11 runs...won each of his first 2 starts with Texas...won his first 2 starts of a season for the 2nd straight year and 3rd time in his career (also 2002 and 2011)...agreed to minor league contract with Texas on May 29 and combined to go 1-1 with a 5.87 ERA (10 ER/15.1 IP) over 4 starts at the minor league level last month with Triple-A Round Rock and Double-A Frisco before contract was purchased June 22 for his Rangers debut that night vs. Colorado.

LAST START: Took a no decision in the Rangers' 4-3, 13-inning walk-off win on July 8 vs. MIN (5.2 IP, 5 H, 1 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 0 HR, 102 pitches/64 strikes)...took a shutout into the 6th inning, but permitted RBI single to Justin Morneau, his final batter faced, and exiting trailing 1-0...gave up 5 hits after he had allowed 9+ hits in each of his first 3 starts...had allowed at least one hit in 15-of-18 innings entering the start, but allowed hits in only 3-of-6 frames in the outing...Rangers scored 3 in the 9th to tie it and won on lan Kinsler's walk-off RBI single in the 13th...club did not score with Oswalt in the game for a 2nd straight start, this after 15 runs of support in his first 2 outings.

VS. OAKLAND: IS 0-1, 5.40 (7 ER/11.2 IP) in 2 games/starts in his career against Oakland...took loss 6/7/02 at the Coliseum, his only career start at this park (5.2 IP, 8 H, 5 R-4 ER, 5 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 119 pitches)...gave up 2 HR to Terrance Long in that contest, matchup with Mark Mulder...took ND in other start on 6/12/07 at Minute Maid, an 11-inning 5-4 Astros win (6.0 IP, 6 H, 3 R-ER, 3 BB, 10 SO, 0 HR, 111 pitches...exited with a 4-3 lead in position to win, but Brad Lidge gave up a game-tying solo HR to Mark Kotsay.

2012: Rangers are 3-1 in his 4 starts...is 1-1, 7.94 (10 ER/11.1 IP) in 2 starts with Torrealba behind plate; 1-0, 4.63 (6 ER/11.2 IP) in 2 starts with Napoli...all 3 HR allowed came in first inning of his start 7/3 at CWS...opponents have .346 (9-26) avg. w/ RISP...opponents are batting .485 (16-33) with 2 outs...hitters leading off an inning are just 5-for-22 (.227) with 2 walks and 6 K's...won each of his first 2 starts while allowing 9-or-more hits in each victory, June 22 and 27...only other ML pitcher to win consecutive starts with 9+ hits allowed since start of 2011 was SD's Aaron Harang, Aug. 5 and 10, 2011.

OTHER STARTS: Earned the victory in his Texas debut on 6/22 vs. COL (6.2 IP, 9 H, 1 R-ER)...held the Rockies scoreless on 6 hits through his first 6 innings before an RBI double by Marco Scutaro in the 7th inning ... at 34 years, 298 days, became the oldest pitcher to win a start for Texas since Kenny Rogers (40 years, 317 days) on 9/23/05...he was the oldest RHP to start for Texas since Pedro Astacio (36.178), 5/25/05...earned win on 6/27 vs. Detroit to take rubber game and secure club's 6th straight series win (6.0 IP, 13 H, 5 R-ER)...the 13 hits set new career high and matched the most ever allowed by an individual in a victory in Rangers history, first such win in 32 years...other 3 pitchers with a 13-hit win for Texas: Nellie Briles, 6/17/77 vs. SEA-G2; Jon Matlack, 8/15/80 at DET; and Doc Medich, 9/7/80 at MIL...none of those 3 allowed as many as 5 runs in their victories...in fact, Oswalt was the first big league pitcher to allow at least 5 runs and 13 hits in a win since Milwaukee's Manny Parra on 8/13/09 vs. San Diego...issued a career-high 11 runs in in loss 7/3 at CWS (4.2 IP, 13 H, 11 R-9 ER)...it marked the 5th time in club history that a Texas starter allowed at least 11 runs in a game...allowed 3 HR - all in the 1st inning to Youkilis, Dunn, and Rios...the Sox lead grew to 19-0 before Texas scored twice in the 8th to escape the shutout
