AMONG THE BEST: Texas enters Wednesday's games with the 2nd-best record in the major leagues, trailing only the Yankees (see above)...Rangers have had majors' best record for 12 days overall since June 1 (5 straight, June 20-24; 7 straight, June 28-July 4)...marks first time for the club to ever have sole possession of best mark in ML after June 1...Rangers became 1st ML team to 50 wins on June 30 in game no. 79, joining the 2009 Dodgers as only teams to reach 50 wins in as few as 79 games over the last 6 seasons.

IN THE LEAD: The Rangers' lead in the A.L. West has been 5.5 games for the last 2 days, the largest since July 1 (5.5 GA)...it is the 2nd largest advantage of any division leader to the Yankees' 9.5 lead in the A.L. East... Texas has led by at least 4.0 games for the last 33 days beginning June 15 with an advantage of 3.5 or more games for 88 of last 92 days beginning April 17...have had outright possession of A.L. West lead for last 100 days and have held at least a share of the West lead for 101 of 103 days in 2012 and 237 of last 239 days beginning May 16, 2011...beg. June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 387 of 403 days...club's 4.0-game lead at the All-Star break marked just 4th time to have a lead that large at the break...the others: 1999 (+5.0 GA), 2010 (+4.5), and 1996 (+4.0).

ON THE ROAD: Texas has won consecutive road games for the 1st time since a 4-game win streak, June 10-20...club has captured 7 of 11 away from home beginning June 10...at 26-19 (.578), the Rangers have the 4th best away winning percentage in the majors. behind the Yankees at .614 (27-17), Braves at .605 (26-17), and White Sox at .591 (26-18)....club has matched 1977 and 1999 for its best road mark ever after 45 road games...best record after 46 road games is 27-19 in 1977 ...team was 22-23 after 45 road games in 2011.

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers have won 4 of the last 5 meetings to take a 6-5 edge in the 2012 season's series...Texas has won 18 of 25 vs. the A's beginning May 10, 2011 and have captured 5 of the last 6 season's series beginning 2006...Texas is 2-3 here in Oakland this season and has lost 4 of last 6 here...Texas is 11-7 in last 18 games at the Coliseum since Sept. 24, 2010...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 313-297 with A's holding a 159-146 edge in Oakland...this is the last series between the teams until they meet in 7 of the year's last 10 games (9/24-27 at TEX; 10/1-3 at OAK)

VS. A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 16-14 in their own division in 2012, 6-8 on the road...club has lost 10 of 17, 11 of 19, and 13 of last 22 to A.L. West opponents overall...the Rangers had dropped their 1st 3 road series to A.L. West clubs in 2012 before going 2-1 in Seattle over the weekend...the Rangers and Yankees are the only clubs with winning records against all 3 A.L. divisions.

TWO-GAME SETS: Today concludes Texas' last scheduled 2-game series of the season...club won 2 in Boston, April 17-18, lost 2 to Kansas City, May 14-15, and split with Oakland, May 16-17...Rangers have also won every game of a 3-game series 4 times in 2012, last June 18-20 at San Diego.

ON THE MOUND: The Rangers have allowed 10 hits and one run in 18.0 innings the last 2 games while posting a 2.38 ERA (19 ER/72.0 IP) over the past 8 games, allowing 3 or fewer ER 7 times, to lower ERA from season-high 3.82 to 3.67, 2nd in A.L. behind the A's (3.43)...starters have allowed 8 earned runs in 29.1 innings over the last 4 games, issuing one of fewer runs 3 times, with a 2.62 ERA (16 ER/55.0 IP) in last 8 G to drop from 4.15 to 4.00...the bullpen has issued just 2 runs in 17.0 innings in its last 5 games and has a 1.97 ERA (7 ER/32.0 IP) in its last 10 games to drop from 3.14 to 2.98, 2nd in A.L. to Oakland (2.76).

A STREAK ENDS AT THE PLATE: With 6 runs on Tuesday. Texas snapped a string of scoring 4-runs-or-less in the previous 10 games, the team's longest such streak since 10 in a row from June 13-22, 1999 and matching the longest streak in the A.L. this season...it was the Rangers' most runs scored since a 7-2 win versus Oakland on June 30...it marked just the 2nd time in the last 15 road games that Texas has tallied more than 5 runs, the other a 7-3 victory on June 19 in San Diego...the Rangers have scored multiple runs in 2 of the last 16 innings after doing so just twice in the previous 68

HALF DOZEN WITH DOUBLE DIGITS: Josh Hamilton connected for his 28th homer on Tuesday, tying the White Sox' Adam Dunn for the major league lead...it is the 2nd most homers ever by a Ranger in the team's 1st 90 games in a season behind 31 for Alex Rodriguez in 2002...Hamilton had a pair of RBO on Tuesday to increase his ML lead to 78, 4 more than the Tigers' Miguel Cabrera...Josh is just 3-for-27 in his last 8 games, 2 of the hits being homers...Hamilton is batting .316 (25-79) with 6 HR and 19 RBI in 21 day games in 2012 after having a .220 average with 1 HR and 12 RBI in 33 day games in 2011.

LEFTIES HAVE BEEN LARGE: Entering this afternoon's outing versus A's southpaw Travis Blackley, opposing left-handers have won their last 4 starts against the Rangers, issuing just 4 runs in 29.0 innings...last lefty starter to lose to Texas was the A's Tommy Milone on June 30...overall, the Rangers are 16-13 in games started by opposing LH in 2012.

--Texas has 4 players among the A.L.'s top 14 in batting average vs. left-handers: Craig Gentry, 3rd at .360; Michael Younf, 12th at .330; Ian Knsler,

13th at .327; and Nelson Cruz, 14th at .326.

ROSS' STREAK: Robbie Ross failed to retire a batter for the 1st time in his major league career on Tuesday, but continues to rank 2nd among qualifying A.L. relievers with a 0.95 ERA behind Fernando Rodney (0.86)...Ross' current 23.0-inning scoreless streak tied 2nd-longest in ML and is tied for the 3rd longest overall in the A.L. in 2012...it is the longest scoreless innings streak for a Ranger since a 26.1 innings span for Darren O'Day, June 3-August 13, 2010.

TODAY: The 32-year-old right-hander is expected to be activated from the disabled list in time to make his 16th start in the finale of this brief 2-game set with Oakland...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 26 (retroactive to June 24) with tendinitis in his right forearm...the disabled list trip was the first for the right-hander, who had combined to make 79 starts for the club since his return from Japan prior to the start of the 2010 campaign...has not started since a he lost on June 23 vs. Colorado (4.0 IP, 12 H, 8 R-7 ER)...had ranked among A.L. leaders in complete games (T4th, 2), innings (6th), and strikeouts (T7th, 90) at the time of his trip to the disabled list...also owned the majors' lowest rate of walks-per-9-innings at 1.08 and his 7.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio was the best of any pitcher in 2012...had complete games in 2 of his last 4 starts prior to the disabled list stint...allowed 2-ER-or-less in 4 of his 5 June starts.
