#### A's vs. YANKEES

The A's trail in the season series, 1-3...won the first game of this series last night after being swept in a three-game series in Oakland in late May...the win last night snapped the A's nine-game Coliseum losing streak against the Yankees, which is the A's longest ever against New York...have lost 20 of their last 25 games against the Yankees, including 13 of the last 15 in Oakland...have lost four consecutive season series to the consecutive season can Yankees and are 8-30 against New York 8-30 (.211) against 2008...that is the worst record by an American League team against Yankees over span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 222-264 against the Yankees...that includes 121-121 in Oakland and 101-143 in York...all-time, the A's are against 763-1130

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1969, at the age of 19 years, 357 days, Vida Blue becomes the first Oakland teenage pitcher to start a game...he takes the loss in the A's 7-3 decision at California (5.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...in 1973 Jim Hunter becomes the first Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he defeats the Cleveland Indians 6-5 in the Coliseum...he allows 11 hits but goes the distance...in 2008 Justin Duchscherer allows two runs in a 2-1 loss at New York to set an Oakland record for a starting pitcher with 11 consecutive starts of two runs or less...in 2009 the bottom of the third inning but come back to win 14-13, setting an Oakland record for biggest come-from-behind victory...in 2011 Hideki Matsui homers at Detroit for the 500<sup>th</sup> home run in professional career.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won six of the last seven games to improve to four games over .500 for the first time since May 31, 2010 (28-24)...have not been five games over .500 since April 17, 2010 (9-4)...are 11-2 in the month of July, which is the best record in the majors ahead of Detroit (11-4)...are 26-14 (.650) over the last 40 games (since June 2) after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...the mark since June 2 is second best in the majors behind the Yankees (29-12, .707)...are in third place in the American League West for the 34<sup>th</sup> consecutive day and trail Texas by 7½ games...however, are just ½ game behind Detroit for the second Wild Card spot and 1½ games behind Los Angeles for the first spot...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 45 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in each of the six games since the All-Star Break and have 13 home runs total, which is tied with the Yankees for second most in the majors (Angels, 14)...have also homered in 23 of the last 24 games (35 home runs total)...have hit 47 home runs over the last 31 games since June 12, which is third most in the majors over that span (NYY 54, PIT 53)...have 96 home runs in 92 games this year...had just 50 home runs after 92 games last year (hit one home run in game 93)...A's right fielders have hit 22 home runs this year after combining for 20 over the previous two seasons...A's first baseman have hit 18 home runs this year after combining for 19 over the previous two seasons.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won each of their last two games by a score of 4-3...12 of the A's last 22 games have been decided by one run...had just 13 one-run decisions over the first 70 games...are 13-12 (.520) in one-run games for the season...eight of the A's last 12 losses have been by one run...Brandon Hicks hit the A's fifth "walk-off" home run of the season Wednesday...the Oakland record for game-ending home runs in a season is six in 2004...the A's now have four "walk-off" wins in their last eight home games, six in the last 13 and a Major League leading nine for the season...are 17-10 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 13-9 in the last at bat...the 13 last at bat wins rank third in the majors (BAL, 15; LAD 14)...are 6-2 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the third best record...were 15-28 (.349) in extra innings over the previous three seasons.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.67 ERA (78 er in 263.0 ip) and .213 (203 for 954) opponents batting average over the last 29 games...have a 3.42 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average (.242) and slugging percentage (.371) in the AL and have surrendered the fewest home runs (74)...are tied for second in shutouts (8) and have the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308)...have the second fewest strikeouts (594).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have a 4.53 ERA (25 er in 49.2 ip) and .303 (61 for 201) opponents batting average over the last eight games...however, have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 22 of the last 29 contests...are 12-6 with 11 no decisions, a 2.64 ERA (53 er in 180.2 ip) and .224 (149 for 664) opponents batting average over that span and have allowed just 12 home runs...have a 3.75 ERA (231 er in 553.2 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League**...also have the fewest home runs (54).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.227), have the fourth fewest runs scored (352), the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.302) and the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.374)...have the second fewest grounded into double plays in the American League (59), are tied for third in stolen bases (70) and rank fourth in walks (308)...however, have the third most strikeouts (735)...have been shut out 11 times, which is tied for the Major League lead...however, have not been blanked since June 3...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.97).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Yoenis Céspedes had the 20<sup>th</sup> assist by an A's outfielder last night, which is second most in the American League (Kansas City, 25)...A's outfielders had 21 assists last year.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** The A's began a stretch of 17 consecutive games against American League East teams last night...following this four-game series with New York, the A's travel to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (three games) before returning home to face Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (four games)...are 10 against the East this year...went 20-23 last year and have not finished with a winning record against the East since 2006 (29-15).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game homestand against the two teams with the best record in the majors: Texas (1-1) and New York (1-0)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Boston (3-0) and Seattle (2-1) and have won 15 of the last 20 home games...this homestand concludes a 15-game stretch from July 2-22 where the A's will play 12 games at home...swept a three-game series at Minnesota last weekend in the only road games over that stretch...are also in a stretch where they play 22 of 31 at home from July 2-August 8...have a 26-21 record at home compared to 22-23 on the road...the pitching staff has a 2.91 ERA (142 er in 439.2 ip) at home compared to 3.99 (172 er in 387.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is the lowest in the American League while the road ERA ranks sixth.

**LEFT-HANDED STARTERS:** Five of the A's last seven losses and seven of the last 10 have come in games started by a left-handed pitcher...are 13-17 (.433) in games started by a lefty compared to 35-27 (.565) against right-handers.

**PLAYERS AND ROOKIES USED:** The A's have used 43 players, which is tied with Baltimore for second most in the American League to Boston (45)...17 of the 43 are rookies, which is the most in the majors and three more than the A's season total from last year...the A's have used 10 rookie pitchers, which is tied for second most in Oakland history...the record is 12 in 2009...currently have 10 rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Doolittle, Griffin, Miller, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner)...the average age of the 25 players on the A's roster is 28.3 years, which is fourth lowest in the majors.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 15 times and currently have seven players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, McCarthy, Pennington, Sizemore)...three of those players will miss the remainder of the season (Carignan, Devine, Sizemore)...the A's also used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 11-7 (.611) in his starting assignments and his teams are 16-7 (.696) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in nine of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start, which ranks second among American League rookies...needs one more win to become the ninth rookie in Oakland history to win 10 games...is tied for the lead among Major League rookies in complete games (1)...ranks second among AL rookies in innings pitched (114.1), tied for second in games started (18) and fourth in strikeouts (76)...his 3.54 ERA ranks third among AL rookies with 75 or more innings.

runs in his last start after allowing one earned run or fewer in each of his previous four starts...is 3-1 with a 1.32 ERA (5 er in 34.0 ip) and .246 (32 for 130) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has walked just three while striking out 26...however, has allowed 10 runs as he was charged with five unearned runs June 30.

**MORE LEADERS:** His nine wins are tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in the American League...also ranks tied for third in pickoffs (4), sixth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.05) and tied for seventh in unearned runs (7).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 5-1 with a 1.03 ERA (6 er in 52.2 ip) and .177 (33 for 186) opponents average in seven starts at home compared to 4-5 with a 5.69 ERA (39 er in 61.2 ip) and .316 (80 for 253) opponents batting average in 11 starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the majors (Weaver, LAA 0.58)...is tied for seventh in the American League in home wins and tied for third in road losses...has allowed 15 of his 16 home runs on the road and ranks second in the AL in road home runs allowed (Vargas, SEA 19).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .301 (55 for 183) opponents batting average over his first 45 pitches in a game and .227 (58 for 256 after that...has issued 12 walks in 126 plate appearances against left-handed hitters compared to 14 walks in 343 plate appearances against right-handers.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed 24 of his 52 runs in the first two innings…has a 5.75 ERA (23 er in 36.0 ip) and eight home runs over the first two innings of a game and a 2.53 ERA (22 er in 78.1) and eight home runs from the third inning on.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received eight runs of support in his last start after receiving just seven runs over his previous four starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts and is 4-6 with a 2.70 ERA (22 er in 73.1 ip) in those games...is 5-0 with a 5.05 ERA (23 er in 41.0 ip) in seven starts with run support of three runs or more.

**GO THE DISTANCE:** Tossed the first complete game by a Major League rookie this year June 20 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was the first by an A's rookie since Brett Anderson on July 6, 2009 at Boston...it was the first by an A's rookie in the Coliseum since Barry Zito on September 10, 2000 against Tampa Bay.

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle April 14...Noesi and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-6 loss at Boston April 30...allowed a career-high eight runs on eight hits, including a career-high three home runs...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win at Tampa Bay **May 6**...allowed five runs in five innings and walked a career-high four batters...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles **May 21** in Oakland...became the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum...the previous best was three by Tim Hudson in 1999...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to New York May 27 in Oakland...Kuroda and Soriano combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 2-0 loss at Kansas City June 3...Mazzaro, Herrera, Holland and Broxton combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...had his first no decision of the season in the A's 9-8 loss at Arizona June 8...left with an 8-4 lead but Fuentes allowed a three-run home run to Roberts in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 win at Colorado June 13...tossed a career-low 4.0 innings and matched his career highs in runs (8) and walks (4)...tossed a complete game three-hitter in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) in Oakland June 20...allowed just two base runners over the final seven innings...the win snapped a two-game losing streak, the first losing streak of his career...combined with Grant Balfour and Ryan Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Seattle June 25...tossed seven innings and allowed all seven of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Texas June 30...allowed a leadoff home run to Beltre in the second inning, snapping a career-high 15.0 inning scoreless streak...had a no decision in the A's 4-1, 11-inning win over Seattle July 6 in Oakland...struck out a career-high nine batters

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Minnesota last Saturday...allowed a careerhigh 10 hits but was aided by two outfield assists and two double plays...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Dozier in the third...also allowed a RBI single to Morneau in the sixth...loaded the bases with no outs that inning but did not allow another run as he forced a runner at the plate and induced a double play.

**MILONE vs. NEW YORK:** Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a 2-0 A's loss in Oakland earlier this year on May 27...allowed just one run over the first six innings, a lead off home run by Jones in the second inning...also allowed a RBI double to Teixeira in the seventh...Kuroda and Soriano combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (6-4, 3.16 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 16<sup>th</sup> start of the season...has allowed 10 runs in his last two starts (8.44 ERA) after allowing 10 runs over his previous eight starts (1.71 ERA)...his.226 opponents batting average is the lowest among Major League rookies with 75 or more innings and his 3.16 ERA is third lowest...is 2-2 with a 2.45 ERA in eight starts at home compared to 4-2 with a 4.08 ERA in seven starts on the road...has the eighth lowest home ERA in the American League...opponents are 16 for 88 (.182) with seven walks (.242 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is the lowest in the AL and the batting average is second lowest...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-4 A's win at Minnesota last Sunday (6.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 so)...has never faced New York.

The A's bullpen is 5-0 with four saves, no blown saves and a 1.11 ERA (5 er in 40.2 ip) in 13 games in the month of July...has allowed a .138 (19 for 138) opponents batting average over that span...for the season, has the lowest opponents batting average (.202) and slugging percentage (.320) in the majors...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.73 ERA...has allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (20) and is tied for second in wins (15) but has issued the second most walks (125)...has 117 strikeouts in 120.1 innings over its last 42 games since May 29 (8.8 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings)

- Has not allowed a run in seven games and 6.1 innings pitched in July...now has a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) and .131 (11 for 84) opponents batting average over his last 24 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (45) and is eighth among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.178).
- First batters faced are hitting .308 (12 for 39) with six walks (.400 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is fourth highest in the AL and the walks are tied for fifth most.
- Has a 0.74 ERA (2 er in 24.1 ip) in 23 appearances at home compared to a 5.66 ERA (13 er in 20.2 ip) in 22 outings on the road.

opponents batting average (.226) and ninth in ERA (3.16)...has allowed just four home runs for an average of 0.40 per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the AL...is fifth in opponents slugging (.327).

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

#### **DALLAS BRADEN**

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

#### **ANDREW CARIGNAN**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he
  was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.
- Had reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow June 19...the surgery
  was performed in New York City by Dr. David Altchek, medical director of the New York Mets.

#### **CHRIS CARTER**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 after batting .279 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI in 72 games with the River Cats.
- Homered in each of his first two games with the A's and three of his first four...including July 6 against Seattle when he hit the pinch-hit game-ending home run in the 11th inning...is the first rookie in Athletics history with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run and the 10th player in Oakland history with a pinch-hit game-ending home run...he is the first Athletic with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run in extra innings since Paul Lehner on April 22, 1950 against Boston.

#### **YOENIS CÉSPEDES**

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...
  doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs,

NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.

- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...
  the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched
  the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest
  a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian
  Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.
- Had his first career game-ending hit June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), a three-run "walk-off" home run.

#### BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to
  make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the
  rotation.
- Threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point during the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...that was
  the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by
  Tim Wakefield in 1998.
- Was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May...based on a
  minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and
  the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest single-month mark of his career and
  the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).
- Left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with the injury... was reinstated July 3.

#### **RYAN COOK**

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.
- Was the only A's player named to the American League All-Star team and pitched a perfect seventh inning, striking out Harper and Wright...it was his first career All-Star selection...he is the seventh Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team, along with Wayne Gross (1977), Matt Keough (1978), Jose Canseco (1986), Mark McGwire (1987), Ben Grieve (1998) and Andrew Bailey (2009).

#### COLLIN COWGILL

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0 for 4 with three walks in three games before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Was recalled by Oakland May 11
- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 with a sprained left ankle...began a rehab assignment
  with Single-A Stockton July 9 and went 1 for 8 (.125) in two games before he was transferred to
  Sacramento July 12...went 3 for 18 (.167) with a RBI in four games with the River Cats before he
  was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 17.

#### **COCO CRISP**

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.
- Stole three bases June 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was his fifth career game of three or more steals, his fourth with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (45) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more three-steal games.
- Was caught stealing after being picked off in the first inning June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), his
  first caught stealing since July 10, 2011 at Texas...that ended his Athletics record streak of 36 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing (caught stealing became an official stat in 1920)...
  broke the previous mark of 28 set by Stan Javier (May 31-October 1, 1995).
- Led off the game with a home run June 27 at Seattle and July 3 against Boston...now has four leadoff home runs as an Athletic and six in his career...the four with the A's are tied for fourth most in
  Oakland history.
- Finished the game July 3 with a "walk-off" sacrifice fly, his third career game-ending RBI (last: August 14, 2007 against Tampa Bay)...it was the 21st game-ending sacrifice fly in Oakland history, the first since Dan Johnson on May 15, 2007 against Kansas City...is the first Athletic with a leadoff home run and walk-off RBI in the same game since Rickey Henderson on August 12, 1992 against Chicago.

#### **FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

#### **JOEY DEVINE**

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

#### **JOSH DONALDSON**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this
  season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.
- Drew his first walk of the season June 13 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 30 consecutive games
  without a walk dating back to September 22, 2010...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since
  Scott Hemond had a 31-game streak from May 3 to July 2, 1994...it was his first walk since September 19, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Was batting .182 in 19 games during his second stint with the A's when he was optioned to Sacramento June 21.

#### **SEAN DOOLITTLE**

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

#### **PEDRO FIGUEROA**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings that day against San Diego before he
  was optioned back to Sacramento June 21.
- Was recalled a third time July 13 when Jim Miller went on the paternity list but was optioned back to Sacramento July 16 without appearing in a game.

#### **BRIAN FUENTES**

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).
- Had a 2.84 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first 19 appearances through May 27...
  then went 0-2 with a save, two blown saves, a 19.50 ERA and .452 opponents batting average over
  his final seven outings.
- Was designated for assignment on July 3 and released July 11.

#### **GRAHAM GODFREY**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

#### **JONNY GOMES**

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits
  for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home
  runs.
- Hit the game-winning pinch-hit two-run home run in the seventh inning June 16 against San Diego, his third career pinch hit home run (last: June 28, 2008 at Pittsburgh)...it snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter and was his first pinch hit since August 29, 2010 against Chicago (NL).

#### A.J. GRIFFIN

 Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 and made his Major League debut that day with a start against San Francisco.

#### **BRANDON HICKS**

- Was claimed off waivers from Atlanta March 13 and was optioned to Sacramento March 15.
- Recalled by Oakland June 23 after batting .272 with 13 home runs and 48 RBI in 65 games with the
  River Cats... was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in hit by pitches (7) at the time of his promotion...also ranked second in strikeouts (76), fifth in extra base hits (37), tied for sixth in doubles (21),
  eighth in home runs (13), ninth in runs (49) and 10th in RBI (48) and slugging (.548).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts July 13 at Minnesota ...it was the first four strikeout game of his
  career.

#### **LUKE HUGHES**

 Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

#### **BRANDON INGE**

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports
  Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over
  a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more
  RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16
  runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was
  his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one
  sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas,
  1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history
  to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24,
  1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player
  in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust
  (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin...
  it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a
  strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI
  in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his twogame rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

#### **KILA KA'AIHUE**

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

#### **BRANDON MCCARTHY**

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in
  Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008,
  the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining
  Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

#### JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.
- Was placed on the paternity list July 13 and reinstated July 16.

#### TOMMY MILONE

• Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

#### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.
- Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.
- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the
  first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota,
  August 12-14, 1996.
- Matched his career-high with three hits (fifth time, first since June 20, 2009 at Colorado) and three RBI (fourth time, second time this year: June 12 at Colorado) June 14 at Colorado.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).
- Hit six home runs in interleague play, which tied for fifth in the majors and matched the Oakland interleague record set by Miguel Tejada in 2000.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 11-17...batted .348 with
  three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first Player
  of the Week award.
- Committed three errors in the sixth inning June 23 against San Francisco, tying the Major League
  record for most errors by a first baseman in an inning...it was the seventh time, the first since Jack
  Clark did it for St. Louis on May 25, 1987...since 1984, the only other Athletic to commit three errors in an inning is Kurt Abbott on May 10, 1998 vs. Chicago at shortstop.
- The three errors set an Oakland record for errors in a game by a first baseman...is the first Athletics first baseman to commit three errors in a game since Lou Limmer on August 19, 1954 vs. New York.
- Tied for eighth in the AL with seven home runs in June.
- Hit his 10th home run in his 24th game on July 4 at Boston...in Athletics history, only Dave Kingman reached 10 home runs in fewer than his first 24 games with the club (19 in 1984).

#### **JORDAN NORBERTO**

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder...
  made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.
- Recorded his first Major League win July 6 against Seattle when he struck out the side in the 11th inning of the A's 4-1 win.

#### **DEREK NORRIS**

- Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut...made his Major League debut with a start at catcher that day against Los Angeles (NL) and went 0 for 3.
- Singled off Madison Bumgarner in the fifth inning June 23 against San Francisco for his first Major League hit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning for his first RBI and first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run June 24 against San Francisco, a three-run "walk-off" shot in
  the bottom of the ninth off Santiago Casilla...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third
  player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run...the other two
  are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).

#### **JARROD PARKER**

Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-in-ning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over

- the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save.
- Earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...Norberto recorded the
  save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe
  Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

#### **CLIFF PENNINGTON**

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday...is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 20 with left elbow tendinitis...had the lowest slugging
  percentage in the majors (.282) and the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage
  (.259) when he went on the DL.

#### **ANTHONY RECKER**

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he
was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

#### **JOSH REDDICK**

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in
  a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in
  May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).
- Matched his career-high with four strikeouts June 29 against the Dodgers (August 4, 2009 at Tampa Bay)
- Had the game-ending RBI double July 8 against Seattle, his second career "walk-off" hit...the other
  was a single on August 7, 2011 against New York.

#### **ADAM ROSALES**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned back to Sacramento June 16.

#### **TYSON ROSS**

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.
- Returned on June 16 to start against San Diego and allowed two runs on one hit and four walks in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint June 23 and went 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA in two starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 29.

#### **EVAN SCRIBNER**

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 15 against San Diego and recorded his first Major League save in the A's 10-2 win.
- Was optioned to Sacramento June 16 but returned to Oakland June 24.

#### **SCOTT SIZEMORE**

Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left
knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports
Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

#### **SETH SMITH**

- · Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21 but returned to Oakland June 16...appeared in just one game before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 24.
- Recalled a third time July 20 when Pennington went on the disabled list.

#### **KURT SUZUKI**

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).
