AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the third game of a four-game series at the Oakland Athletics tonight...is the first opponent of a seven-game road trip--their final West Coast trip of the year--which also features a three-game series at Seattle from Monday-Wednesday...went 5-1 on their just-completed six-game homestand, taking two of three games from Los Angeles-AL and sweeping a three-game set vs. Toronto...after this road trip, will play 16 of 23 games from 7/27-8/19 at home...are in a stretch of 13 consecutive days with games immediately following the All-Star break.

- ▶ At 57-36 (.613), own the best record in the Majors...are 21 games over .500, two shy of their season high-water mark.
- ▶ Are 26-11 since 6/8, 31-13 since 5/30 and 36-15 since 5/22...have gone 10-2-1 over their last 13 series dating to 6/1.

AT THE TOP: Today marks the 39th consecutive day the Yankees will be in sole possession of first place in the AL East...marks their longest such stretch since a 43-day span from 6/21-8/2/10.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees suffered a 3-2, "walk-off" loss at Oakland...came back from a 2-0 deficit to tie in the ninth...snapped a franchise-record streak 43 straight game scoring at least 3R...**2B Robinson Cano** (2-for-4) extended his hitting streak to 23 games and hit the game-tying solo HR in the ninth...**C Russell Martin** (1-for-3) provided the Yankees' other run with a solo HR in the eighth...**RHP Ivan Nova** limited the A's to 2ER in 6.2IP (9H, 1BB, 6K) in the no-decision...**RHP Cody Eppley** allowed the game-winning run in the ninth for the loss.

BIRTHDAY BOY: LHP CC Sabathia is celebrating his 32nd birthday today...made his final start as a 31-year-old in Tuesday's win vs. Toronto, recording the victory...with 186 career wins, marks the most victories by a pitcher prior to their 32nd birthday since Catfish Hunter compiled 210 wins before his 32nd birthday in 1978...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the last eight pitchers with at least 186 wins before turning 32 are all in the Hall of Fame: Bob Feller (208, 1950), Hal Newhouser (200, 1953), Robin Roberts (206, 1958), Don Drysdale (202, 1968), Juan Marichal (191, 1969), Ferguson Jenkins (191, 1975), Jim Palmer (194, 1977) and Hunter.

- ▶ Earned his 10th win of the season in Tuesday's victory vs. Toronto...became the fifth pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to record at least 10 wins in each of his first 12 Major League seasons, joining Tom Seaver, Don Sutton, Carl Hubbell and Eddie Plank.

NEED A FREEBIE: The Yankees have not drawn a walk in either of the first two games of this series, the first time they have gone consecutive games without a free pass since 9/12-13/11...have not gone three games without drawing at least one walk since 6/12-14/91.

RADAR BLIP: The Yankees have lost consecutive games for the first time since 7/2-3 at Tampa Bay...have not lost three straight games since 6/19-22...are the only team in the Majors this season that has yet to lose more than three consecutive games.

COUNT TO THREE: The Yankees' 3-2 loss on Friday at Oakland snapped a franchise-record streak of 43 straight games since 5/30 in which they scored at least 3R...their previous single-season record was 38 straight games in 1933 - see chart to left)...only one other Major League team scored three runs-or-more in more consecutive games in one season during the Modern Era (since 1900): the 1994 Cleveland Indians (48 games).

THREEDOM: The Yankees are 39-3 (.929) this season when holding their opponent to three-or-fewer runs, marking the second-best such winning percentage in Baseball in 2012 (Mets-.946, 35-2).

- ▶ The 3-2 loss on Friday at Oakland marked their first loss when holding an opponent to three runs or less since 4/24 at Texas (a 2-0 shutout loss)...all three such losses in 2012 have occurred on the road (also 4/8 at Tampa Bay, 3-0 loss).

LEADER OF THE PACK: The Yankees have an 8.0-game lead in the AL East, marking the largest division lead in the Majors...is two games shy of their season-high lead...had a 10.0-game lead entering play on Friday, their first double-digit lead in the division in July since 1998, which is also the last time the Yankees led the AL East by at least 10.0G within the first 91 games of a season (were up 14.0G after game 91 on 7/18/98).

- ▶ According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the Yankees have never blown a division lead of more than 6.0 games.

CAPTAIN'S LOG: SS Derek Jeter ranks second in the AL (fourth in the Majors) with 1 22H...trails Melky Cabrera (129), Andrew McCutchen (125) and Miguel Cabrera (123)...ranks third in the Majors with 37 multi-hit games (had 45 all of last year)...is batting .351 (71-for-202) on the road this season, sixth-highest average in the Majors and second in the AL to only Mike Trout (.358).

- ▶ Is batting .404 (36-for-89) with 4HR leading off the game in the first inning in 2012.
- ▶ Is tied with Eddie Collins for 15th place on Baseball's all-time runs list with 1,822R...ranks third on the franchise's all-time list behind Ruth (1,959) and Gehrig (1,888).

JUST FOR KICKS: On Sunday at 7:00 p.m., Yankee Stadium will host its first-ever soccer match as **Chelsea FC**, 2012 winners of the European Champions League and four-time winners of England's top division, face 2012-13 French Ligue 1 favorites **Paris-Saint Germain**...tickets for this match, along with Yankee Stadium's other soccer event this summer--**Real Madrid vs. A.C. Milan** on Wed., 8/8 - are available at www.yankees.com/soccer.

GO, GO CANO: 2B Robinson Cano is riding a career-high 23-game hitting streak since 6/24, batting .400 (36-for-90) with 15R, 7 doubles, 7HR, 22RBI and 12 multi-hit games over the stretch...is the longest active hitting streak in the Majors and the longest by a Yankee since Derek Jeter hit safely in 25 in-a-row from 8/20-9/16/06...owns the Yankees' longest single-season hitting streak in each of the club's last four seasons (also 17G in 2011, 17G in 2010 and 18G in 2009)...is the longest single-season hitting streak by a Yankee whose primary position is second base since Joe Gordon hit safely hit safely in 29 in-a-row from 5/13-6/14/42.

- ▶ Since 1942 (the year after DiMaggio's record 56-game hitting streak), only three Yankees have fashioned a single-season hitting streak of more than 23 games: Joe Gordon (29G, 5/13-6/14/42), Derek Jeter (25G, 8/20-9/16/06) and Don Mattingly (24G, 8/30-9/26/86).
- ▶ Has reached base safely in a career-high 26 consecutive gms since 6/20...leads the Majors with 51 extra-base hits and ranks third in total bases (212)...leads all MLB second basemen with 21HR and 55RBI in 2012.

BOMB SQUAD: The Yankees have hit a Major League-high 149HR in 2012, including 48HR over their last 26G...marks the highest total through 93 games in franchise history and the fifth-highest total for any team all time through their first 93G of a season...are on pace for 260HR this season...the club record is 244, set in 2009, and the all-time record is 264 (1997 Mariners)...the Yankees have a ML-high eight players with at least 10HR (Cano, Granderson, Ibanez, Jones, Martin, Rodriguez, Swisher and Teixeira) - two shy of their franchise record set in 1998.

- ▶ Have homered in 11 straight games, matching their season-high streak...have not compiled a longer streak since August 2009 (14 in-a-row).
- ▶ The Yankees are 55-22 this year when hitting at least 1HR and 38-10 when hitting multiple homers...are 2-14 in games in which they fail to homer.

BACKUP SANDMAN: RHP Rafael Soriano is 114-for-135 (84.4%) in career save opportunities, including 24-for-25 this season...his 45 saves with Tampa Bay in 2010 led the AL...has converted 26-of-27 career save opportunities with the Yankees that have occurred in the ninth inning or later, combining to allow just 3ER in 24.2IP (19H, 23K, 6BB).

- ▶ Has converted 15 consecutive save chances, the second-longest active streak this season behind Texas' Joe Nathan (17).

HIRO OF THE DAY: RHP Hiroki Kuroda has won each of his four daytime starts this season, holding opponents scoreless in 30.0 combined innings pitched under the sun.

- ▶ Kuroda's win on Wednesday vs. Toronto was his fifth start this season in which he has tossed at least 7.0 scoreless IP...is tied with the Mets' R.A. Dickey and Milwaukee's Zack Greinke for the most such starts in the Majors this season...only one Yankee has compiled more scoreless starts of at least 7.0IP in a season since 1981 - Mike Mussina, 7 in 2001.

ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM: The Yankees had their nine-game winning streak at Oakland's O.co Coliseum come to an end with Thursday's loss...was their first loss in Oakland since 4/20/10...was their longest winning streak there since the opening of the Coliseum in 1968...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, it marked the Yankees' longest road winning streak against the Athletics since winning 10 in-a-row at Kansas City's Municipal Stadium from 8/31/55-9/11/56.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Yankees have scored in the first inning of 11 of their last 18 games (since 6/29), tallying 31 combined first-inning runs...their 75R in the first inning are their most scored in any frame this year, and are tied for the most first-inning runs by any team in the Majors (also Colorado).

SWEEPING SENSATION: The Yankees on Sunday completed their eighth series sweep of the season (one shy of last year's total)...was their third sweep at home (also 6/8-10 vs. the Mets and 6/25-27 vs. Cleveland).

- ▶ Scored 6R in each of the three games vs. Toronto, marking the first time the Yankees swept a series of at least three games and scored at least 6R in each contest since 5/19-21/09 vs. Baltimore.

TEIX DRIVE: Over his last 14 games since 7/2, **1B Mark Teixeira** is batting .340 (16-for-47) with 12R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 6HR and 20RBI...has driven in multiple runs in five of his last 12 games.

HOMEWARD BOUND: The Yankees are 18-6 at Yankee Stadium since 5/22...their .638 (30-17) home winning percentage is fourth highest in the Majors (second in the AL behind Texas - 29-16, .644).

GOOD FORTUNE: The Yankees have scored at least 4R in a game in a Major League-high 64 games this season, and are 52-12 (.813) in such contests, marking the second-best such winning percentage among AL teams behind Tampa Bay (41-8, .837).

BACK ON THE JOBA: RHP Joba Chamberlain pitched 2.0 innings relief on Friday in his fourth rehab appearance (first with Single-A Tampa), allowing 2H, 2R (1ER), BB, 1K, 1HR and took the loss at Bradenton...has combined in his four outings (the first three w/the GCL Yankees) to toss 6.0IP (2H, 3R, 1ER, 1BB, 7K, 1HR).

- ▶ **C Austin Romine** is currently on a rehab assignment with the GCL Yankees...went 1-for-1 with 2BB on Friday at the Pirates, starting at C and playing 5.0 innings defensive at catcher...overall, has gone 4-for-15 with 2 doubles and 3RBI in six games (1GS at DH).

CLOSE CALLS: Since 5/22 - while the team has gone 36-15 - the Yankees have had 32 of the 51 games decided by 3R or less, going 22-10 in those contests...opened the season 9-12 in games decided by 3R or fewer.

CLAYMATION: LHP Clay Rapada has not allowed an earned run over his last 20 appearances dating to 6/9/12 (10.1IP, 5H, 1R, 2BB, 15K), while holding hitters to a .139 (5-for-36) batting average over the stretch.

JUMPIN' JULY: The Yankees have recorded a winning record in the month of July in each of the last 19 seasons (1993-2011)...are 10-6 thus far in 2012...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, marks the longest winning stretch of Julys in Major League history...the previous record was 15, held by Pittsburgh (1899-1913).

SUUNDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER at OAKLAND: LHP CC SABATHIA (10-3, 3.27)

LHP CC Sabathia, 32 from nearby Vallejo, Calif., will make his 17th start of the season on Sunday vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum...will be his 24th career start vs. Oakland and second this season...**last started** on 7/17 vs. Toronto and earned the win in the 6-1 Yankees' victory, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 6K)...was his first start since being placed on the 15-day disabled list with a left groin strain on 6/28...the win marked the ninth straight season that he has earned a win vs. Toronto, matching Scott McGregor (1978-86) as the only pitchers to accomplish the feat (credit: *Elias*).

MR. CONSISTENCY: Is one win shy of recording 11 victories in each of his first 12 seasons in the Majors (2001-12)...with a victory today, will become just one of four pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to accomplish the feat: also Don Sutton (first 17 seasons, 1966-82), Eddie Plank (first 16 seasons, 1901-16) and Tom Seaver (first 13 seasons, 1967-79).

TONIGHT'S STARTER: RHP PHIL HUGHES (9-7, 4.22 ERA)

RHP Phil Hughes, 26, will make his 19th start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum...will be his eighth career game (fifth start) vs. Oakland and first this season...**last started** on 7/16 vs. Toronto and did not draw a decision for just the second time this year (also 5/28 at Los Angeles-AL), limiting the Blue Jays to 2ER on 4H in 7.0IP (3BB, 4K, 1HR, 1WP)...his home run allowed to Adam Lind was his first since surrendering 4HR on 6/20 vs. Atlanta...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (23rd overall) of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft...is signed through the 2012 season.
