A's vs. YANKEES

The season series is even at three games each...the A's have won the first three games of this series after being swept in a three-game series in Oakland in late May...are 6-5 against the Yankees over the last 11 games but are 7-20 over the last 27...have lost 13 of the games in Oakland...have lost four consecutive season series to the Yankees and are 10-30 (.250) against New York since 2008 that is the worst record by an American League team against the Yankees over span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 224-264 against the Yankees...that includes 123-121 in Oakland and 101-143 in New York...all-time, the A's are 765-1130 against Yankees/Orioles

TODAY'S TIDBITS

With a win today, the A's would sweep a four-game series: against New York for just the second time since 1914 (July 14-16, 1972 at New York); against the team with the best record in baseball for the first time since September 26-28, 1977 against Kansas City; in Oakland for the first time September 17-20, 2009 (Cleveland); against any team for the first time since September 30-October 3, 2010 at Seattle.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1905 Weldon Henley no hits the St. Louis Browns, 6-0...it is one of just four wins for Henley all year...in 1996 Mark McGwire singles off Kevin Tapani in the second inning of the A's 6-5 win at Chicago for his 1000th career hit...he becomes the eighth Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight and eight of the last nine games to improve to six games over .500 for the first time since July 18, 2008 (51-45)...have not been seven games over .500 since July 13, 2008 (51-44)...are 7-1 since the All-Star Break, which is tied with San Francisco for the best record in the majors...are 13-2 in July, which is the best record in the majors ahead of Detroit (13-4)...the last time the A's went 13-2 over a 15-game stretch was in 2006...are 28-14 (.667) over the last 42 games (since June 2) after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...the mark since June 2 is second best in the majors behind the Yankees (29-14, .674)...are in third place in the American League West for the 36th consecutive day and trail Texas by 6½ games for the second consecutive day...that is the closest the A's have been to first place in the West since May 25 when they were six back (were five back on May 24)...with the win last night, the A's moved into a tie for the second Wild Card with Baltimore and Chicago...it marks the first time the A's have held at least a share of a playoff spot after the All-Star Break since winning the West in 2006...are just ½ game behind Los Angeles for the first Wild Card...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 47 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's defeated the Yankees 2-1 last night and have now won each of the last four games by one run...that matches the Oakland record for consecutive wins, all by one run (fourth time, last: August 6-10, 1997)...now have a seven-game winning streak in one-run games, which is the A's longest since June 3-23, 2006 when they also won seven straight...have not won more than seven straight over the course of one season since they had an Oakland record 11-game streak in 2000 (May 31-July 17)...14 of the A's last 24 games have been decided by one run...had just 13 one-run decisions over the first 70 games...are 15-12 (.556) in one-run games for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...eight of the A's last 12 losses have been by one run.

"WALK-OFF" WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Brandon Moss had the game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth inning Friday night...have five "walk-off" wins in the last 10 home games, seven in the last 15 and a Major League leading 10 for the season...10 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI...including five by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...the A's combined for nine "walk-off" wins over the previous two seasons...are 19-10 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 15-9 in the last at bat...are tied with Baltimore for the most last at bat wins in the majors...are 6-2 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the third best record.

ROOKIES: A rookie pitcher has recorded the victory in each of the A's last seven wins, including each of the last four games and all three games of this series...according to Elias, the last team to win three in a row, all against the Yankees, with a rookie getting the decision in each, was the Indians in August 1916 (Gould, Covelski, Lambeth)...rookies have 26 of the A's 50 wins...have used 10 rookie pitchers, which is tied for second most in Oakland history...the record is 12 in 2009...have employed 17 rookies total, which is the most in the majors and three more than the A's season total from last year...currently have 10 rookies on the roster.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this six-game homestand against the two teams with the best record in the majors: Texas (1-1) and New York (3-0)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Boston (3-0) and Seattle (2-1) and have won 17 of the last 22 home games...are 28-21 at home for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the American League...leave tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (three games)...went 3-0 on the last road trip to Minnesota and are 22-23 on the road...the pitching staff has a 2.85 ERA (145 er in 457.2 ip) at home compared to 3.99 (172 er in 387.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is the lowest in the AL while the road ERA ranks sixth.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starter today and in each of the three games at Toronto...five of the A's last seven losses and seven of the last 10 have come in games started by a left-hander...are 13-17 (.433) in games started by a lefty compared to 37-27 (.579) against right-handers.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.59 ERA (81 er in 281.0 ip) and .213 (217 for 1020) opponents batting average over the last 31 games and have a 22-9 record over that span...have a 3.38 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average (.241) and slugging percentage (.370) in the AL and have surrendered the fewest home runs (76)...have the second lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307) and are tied for second in shutouts (8)...have the second fewest strikeouts (613)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 24 of the last 31 games...are 13-6 with 12 no decisions, a 2.48 ERA (54 er in 195.2 ip) and .223 (160 for 718) opponents batting average over that span and have allowed just 12 home runs...have a 3.67 ERA (232 er in 568.2 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League**...also have the fewest home runs (54).

THE LONG BALL: The A's are tied for second in the majors in home runs since the All-Star Break (15) and tied for fourth in home runs in July (22)...have hit 49 home runs in 33 games since June 12, which is third most in the majors behind the Yankees (56) and Pirates (55)...have 98 home runs in 94 games for the season...had just 51 home runs after 94 games last year (did not homer in game 95)...A's right fielders have hit 22 home runs after combining for 20 over the previous two seasons...A's first baseman have hit 18 home runs after combining for 19 over the previous two seasons.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.228), have the third fewest runs scored (357), the third lowest on-base percentage (.303) and the sixth lowest slugging percentage (.376)...have the second fewest grounded into double plays in the American League (60), are tied for third in stolen bases (72) and rank fourth in walks (313)...however, have the fourth most strikeouts (750)...have been shut out 11 times, which is tied for the Major League lead...however, have not been blanked since June 3...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.97).

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 3-0 in this stretch of 17 consecutive games against American League East teams that began on Thursday...following this four-game series with New York, the A's travel to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (three games) before returning home to face Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (four games)...are 12-8 against the East this year, which is the second best record by any AL team (Texas, 12-6)...went 20-23 last year and have not finished with a winning record against the East since 2006 (29-15).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season, his fourth since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 9-9 (.500) in his starting assignments and his teams are 206-163 (.559) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in nine of his 18 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 11

BRIEFLY: Is 2-3 with a 2.89 ERA (14 er in 43.2 ip) and .256 (43 for 168) opponents batting average over his last seven starts since June 1...went 3-2 with a 2.53 ERA and .214 opponents batting average over his first six starts in March and April and was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in 12 of his 18 starts and his season run support

average of 3.15 (39 rs in 111.1 ip) is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Volquez, SD 2.60)...has received two runs of support or fewer in all eight of his losses and has six runs of support total in those games (6 rs in 42.1 ip, 1.28 RSA)...is 5-0 in six starts with three runs of support or more...the A's have been shutout in three of his starts.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked one batter or fewer in 13 of his 18 starts and has issued just 18 free passes for the season...is averaging 1.46 walks per nine innings, which is second lowest in the American League (Lewis, TEX 1.20)...walked Ian Kinsler in his last start, his first non-intentional walk of a righthanded hitter since September 27, 2011 against Tampa Bay (Longoria)...has issued 16 of his 18 walks to left-handed hitters...has 68 strikeouts and his 3.78 strikeout to walk ratio ranks sixth in the AL

MORE LEADERS: Was charged with his eighth loss of the season in his last start, which is tied for seventh in the American League...is averaging 14.1 pitches per inning, which is the lowest mark in the majors (Dickey, NYM 14.2).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-6 with a 4.55 ERA (30 er in 59.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 4-2 with a 3.12 ERA (18 er in 52.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in home losses and ranks seventh in the American League in road ERA...over the last two years, he is 6-11 with a 4.55 ERA (67 er in 132.1 ip) in 23 games in his home ballparks compared to 8-7 with a 3.33 ERA (53 er in 143.1 ip) in 24 games on the road.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 14 home runs...however, all of his home runs have been solo shots as have 41 of his 48 over his last three seasons ...11 have been hit by left-handed hitters as have 36 of his 48 over his last three years...nine have been hit by a batter leading off a inning.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with a strained right oblique...it was his ninth career stint on the DL...was reinstated July 3 and is 0-1 with a 2.53 ERA (6 er in 21.1 ip) in three starts since his return.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .230 (35 for 152) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .338 (48 for 142) the second time and .259 (38 for 147) after that...has allowed a .329 (23 for 70) average with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .412 (21 for 51) batting average to the opponents number three hitter, which is the second highest mark in the American League (Pavano, MIN .433).

ACTIVE LEADERS: Ranks fifth among active pitchers in complete games (32), tied for seventh in shutouts (9), eighth in wins (167), ninth in strikeouts (1810) and 10th in game started (369).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 167 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (369), innings pitched (2352.1) and strikeouts (1810).

39 YEARS OLD: Celebrated his 39th birthday on May 24...is just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to start a game at age 39 or older...the other four are Tommy John (42 in 1985), Tom Candiotti (41 in 1999), Don Sutton (40 in 1985) and Jim Perry (39 in 1975).

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Yielded seven earned runs in an 8-7 loss to Seattle April 7, his most since July 6, 2007 at New York (AL)...combined with Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three hits while walking one...combined with De Los Santos on a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...tossed eight innings and allowed all four of the hits...threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point, the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss to Chicago April 23 in Oakland...blanked the White Sox on three walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to 18.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Baltimore *April* 29...left with a 2-0 lead and one out in the ninth inning with runners on first and second but Balfour blew the save and took the loss...combined with Brian Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas June 6 in Oakland...left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Texas on Tuesday...retired the first eight batters before allowing a run in the third inning on an Andrus RBI single...surrendered three runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Beltre and RBI singles by Napoli and Gentry...Oswalt and four Rangers relievers limited the A's to a run on five hits.

COLÓN vs. NEW YORK: Is 4-6 with a 6.30 ERA (75.2 ip, 82 h, 59 r, 53 er, 34 bb, 67 so, 20 hr) in 14 career appearances, 13 starts...the ERA is his highest against any American League team...is 2-4 with a 7.07 ERA (33 er in 42.0 ip) in eight games, seven starts, in his home ballparks and was 2-2 with a 5.35 ERA (20 er in 33.2 ip) in six starts in Old Yankee Stadium...pitched for New York last year and went 4-5 with a 4.68 ERA (38 er in 73.0 ip) in 13 games, 11 starts, at Yankee Stadium...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 9-2 A's loss in Oakland on May 26...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the second, a RBI single to Jeter in the third and a solo home run to Teixeira in the fourth...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a Rodriguez sacrifice fly and a two-run single by Teixeira.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Travis Blackley (2-2, 2.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and ninth start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...is 2-0 with a 2.23 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his last six games, including five starts...is tied for the American League lead in pickoffs (6)...has not allowed a home run in his last eight games, 45.2 innings and 179 batters faced...has allowed just one home run in 61.2 innings this year...opponents are 11 for 59 (.186) with three walks (.226 on-base percentage) when leading off inning...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win over Texas on Wednesday (5.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against the Blue Jays, a 12-4 Seattle loss on July 7, 2004 at Toronto (5.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 5 so).

The A's bullpen is 6-0 with five saves, one blown save and a 1.44 ERA (7 er in 43.2 ip) in 15 games in the month of July...has allowed a .147 (22 for 150) opponents batting average over that span...for the season, has the lowest opponents batting average (.202) and slugging percentage (.325) in the majors...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.77 ERA...has allowed the second fewest home runs in the AL (22) and is tied for second in wins (16) but has issued the second most walks (125)...has 121 strikeouts in 123.1 innings over its last 44 games since May 29 (8.8 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings)

- Has not allowed a run in seven games and 6.1 innings in July...now has a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) and .131 (11 for 84) opponents batting average over his last 24 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Is tied for fourth in the American League in games pitched (45) and is ninth among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.178).
- First batters faced are hitting .308 (12 for 39) with six walks (.400 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is fifth highest in the AL and the walks are tied for fifth most.
- Has a 0.74 ERA (2 er in 24.1 ip) in 23 appearances at home compared to a 5.66 ERA (13 er in 20.2 ip) in 22 outings on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-2 with a 3.40 ERA (18 er in 47.2 ip) in eight starts and 0-0 with a 3.21 ERA (5 er in 14.0 ip) in eight relief appearances...first batters faced are 0 for 7 with a sacrifice hit in his relief appearances and he has allowed 1 of 2 inherited runners to score...had eight career appearances entering this season and all were starts...is 3-5 with a 5.90 ERA (54 er in 82.1 ip) in 16 career starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 11 for 59 (.186) with three walks (.226 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has issued all 12 of his walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed a .211 (31 for 147) batting average with the bases empty compared to .288 (23 for 80) with runners on...opponents are hitting .326 (15 for 46) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .370 (10 for 27) batting average to the opponents number four hitter and .220 (44 for 200) against everyone else.

ALMOST EIGHT YEARS: Was the winning pitcher June 15 against San Diego, his first Major League win since he defeated Seattle in his Major League debut July 1, 2004...the span of seven years, 350 days between wins is the longest since Vicente Romo went 8 years and 3 days between victories from July 16, 1974 to July 19, 1982...it is the fourth longest streak by a pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) behind Jim Bouton (8 years, 65 days), Romo and Joe Grzenda (7 years, 362 days)...the win snapped a career-high five-game losing streak dating back to July 7, 2004.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Triple-A Fresno and was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, before he was selected by San Francisco May 1...posted a 9.00 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four relief appearances with San Francisco before he was designated for assignment May 13...was claimed off waivers by the A's May 15 and did not allow an earned run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip) before making his first start May 28...made seven consecutive starts before pitching in relief in the second to last game before the All-Star Break...returned to the rotation July 18.

2012 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Minnesota May 28...left with a 3-1 lead but Norberto allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was his first Major League start since September 29, 2007...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas *June 5* in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven hits...retired the first six batters before the Rangers scored three times in the third inning on a two-run double by Kinsler and a RBI double by Hamilton...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Torrealba in the fourth and a RBI triple to Young in the fifth...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona *June 10*...allowed three runs, two earned, in the first inning on a fielders choice and a two-run single by Hill...the A's scored twice in the fourth to make the score 3-2 but he allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over San Diego June 15 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Quentin in the first inning but the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first...also allowed a RBI single to Denorfia in the second but retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) June 21 in Oakland...struck out a career-high six batters in a career-high 8.0 innings...retired each of the first 10 batters before Herrera doubled with one out in the fourth...one out later, Rivera had a RBI single...retired 12 of the final 13 hitters he faced...Kershaw limited the A's to a run over eighth innings and Blackley was relieved by Cook to start the ninth with the scored tied at 1-1...Céspedes hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle June 26...retired six of the first seven batters he faced before the Mariners scored twice in the third inning on a Gutierrez RBI double and a Seager sacrifice fly...faced the minimum over his final four innings thanks to a pickoff and grounded into double play...the A's scored twice in the seventh inning to tie the game but Miller allowed a run in the eighth for the loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Texas *July 1...*allowed a career-high tying seven hits...had two pickoffs...surrendered just one run on an Andrus RBI single in the third inning...retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored single runs in the fifth, sixth and seventh innings for the win.

WITH FRESNO: Was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, with Triple-A Fresno in the San Francisco organization...walked just three batters in 23.1 innings (1.16 per nine innings) and allowed one home run...allowed a .163 opponents batting average, including .153 (9 for 59) against righthanded hitters and .190 (4 for 21) against left-handed hitters...opponents were 1 for 27 (.037) with runners on base, including 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

DARIC BARTON

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento
 June 2.

JERRY BLEVINS

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he
 was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.
- Had reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow June 19...the surgery
 was performed in New York City by Dr. David Altchek, medical director of the New York Mets.

CHRIS CARTER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 after batting .279 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI in 72 games with the River Cats.
- Homered in each of his first two games with the A's and three of his first four...including July 6
 against Seattle when he hit the pinch-hit game-ending home run in the 11th inning...is the first
 rookie in Athletics history with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run and the 10th player in Oakland
 history with a pinch-hit game-ending home run...he is the first Athletic with a pinch-hit "walk-off"
 home run in extra innings since Paul Lehner on April 22, 1950 against Boston.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...
 doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs,

NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.

- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...
 the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched
 the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest
 a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian
 Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.
- Had his first career game-ending hit June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), a three-run "walk-off" home run.

BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to
 make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the
 rotation.
- Threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point during the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...that was
 the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by
 Tim Wakefield in 1998.
- Was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May...based on a
 minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and
 the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest single-month mark of his career and
 the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).
- Left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with the injury... was reinstated July 3.

RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.
- Was the only A's player named to the American League All-Star team and pitched a perfect seventh inning, striking out Harper and Wright...it was his first career All-Star selection...he is the seventh Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team, along with Wayne Gross (1977), Matt Keough (1978), Jose Canseco (1986), Mark McGwire (1987), Ben Grieve (1998) and Andrew Bailey (2009).

COLLIN COWGILL

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0 for 4 with three walks in three games before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Was recalled by Oakland May 11
- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 with a sprained left ankle...began a rehab assignment
 with Single-A Stockton July 9 and went 1 for 8 (.125) in two games before he was transferred to
 Sacramento July 12...went 3 for 18 (.167) with a RBI in four games with the River Cats before he
 was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 17.

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.
- Stole three bases June 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was his fifth career game of three or more steals, his fourth with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (45) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more three-steal games.
- Was caught stealing after being picked off in the first inning June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), his
 first caught stealing since July 10, 2011 at Texas...that ended his Athletics record streak of 36 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing (caught stealing became an official stat in 1920)...
 broke the previous mark of 28 set by Stan Javier (May 31-October 1, 1995).
- Led off the game with a home run June 27 at Seattle and July 3 against Boston...now has four leadoff home runs as an Athletic and six in his career...the four with the A's are tied for fourth most in
 Oakland history.
- Finished the game July 3 with a "walk-off" sacrifice fly, his third career game-ending RBI (last: August 14, 2007 against Tampa Bay)...it was the 21st game-ending sacrifice fly in Oakland history, the first since Dan Johnson on May 15, 2007 against Kansas City...is the first Athletic with a leadoff home run and walk-off RBI in the same game since Rickey Henderson on August 12, 1992 against Chicago.

FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this
 season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles
 and RBI were all career highs.
- Drew his first walk of the season June 13 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 30 consecutive games
 without a walk dating back to September 22, 2010...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since
 Scott Hemond had a 31-game streak from May 3 to July 2, 1994...it was his first walk since September 19, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Was batting .182 in 19 games during his second stint with the A's when he was optioned to Sacramento June 21.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings that day against San Diego before he
 was optioned back to Sacramento June 21.
- Was recalled a third time July 13 when Jim Miller went on the paternity list but was optioned back to Sacramento July 16 without appearing in a game.

BRIAN FUENTES

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).
- Had a 2.84 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first 19 appearances through May 27...
 then went 0-2 with a save, two blown saves, a 19.50 ERA and .452 opponents batting average over
 his final seven outings.
- Was designated for assignment on July 3 and released July 11.

GRAHAM GODFREY

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits
 for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home
 runs.
- Hit the game-winning pinch-hit two-run home run in the seventh inning June 16 against San Diego, his third career pinch hit home run (last: June 28, 2008 at Pittsburgh)...it snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter and was his first pinch hit since August 29, 2010 against Chicago (NL).
- Hit his third career grand slam July 13 at Minnesota, his first since August 7, 2007 at Detroit...added
 a RBI single in the ninth inning to finish with five RBI...it was his third career game of five or more
 RBI, his first since June 12, 2010 against Kansas City when he had a career-high six.

A.J. GRIFFIN

 Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 and made his Major League debut that day with a start against San Francisco.

BRANDON HICKS

- Was claimed off waivers from Atlanta March 13 and was optioned to Sacramento March 15.
- Recalled by Oakland June 23 after batting .272 with 13 home runs and 48 RBI in 65 games with the
 River Cats... was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in hit by pitches (7) at the time of his promotion...also ranked second in strikeouts (76), fifth in extra base hits (37), tied for sixth in doubles (21),
 eighth in home runs (13), ninth in runs (49) and 10th in RBI (48) and slugging (.548).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts July 13 at Minnesota ...it was the first four strikeout game of his
 career.

LUKE HUGHES

 Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports
 Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over
 a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more
 RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16
 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was
 his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one
 sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas,
 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history
 to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24,
 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player
 in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust
 (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin...
 it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a
 strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI
 in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his twogame rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in
 Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008,
 the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining
 Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.
- Was placed on the paternity list July 13 and reinstated July 16.

TOMMY MILONE

• Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a career-high 49-game homerless streak.
- Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.
- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the
 first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota,
 August 12-14, 1996.
- Matched his career-high with three hits (fifth time, first since June 20, 2009 at Colorado) and three RBI (fourth time, second time this year: June 12 at Colorado) June 14 at Colorado.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).
- Hit six home runs in interleague play, which tied for fifth in the majors and matched the Oakland interleague record set by Miguel Tejada in 2000.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 11-17...batted .348 with
 three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first Player
 of the Week award.
- Committed three errors in the sixth inning June 23 against San Francisco, tying the Major League
 record for most errors by a first baseman in an inning...it was the seventh time, the first since Jack
 Clark did it for St. Louis on May 25, 1987...since 1984, the only other Athletic to commit three errors in an inning is Kurt Abbott on May 10, 1998 vs. Chicago at shortstop.
- The three errors set an Oakland record for errors in a game by a first baseman...is the first Athletics first baseman to commit three errors in a game since Lou Limmer on August 19, 1954 vs. New York
- Tied for eighth in the AL with seven home runs in June.
- Hit his 10th home run in his 24th game on July 4 at Boston...in Athletics history, only Dave Kingman reached 10 home runs in fewer than his first 24 games with the club (19 in 1984).

JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod
 Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same
 game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder...
 made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.
- Recorded his first Major League win July 6 against Seattle when he struck out the side in the 11th inning of the A's 4-1 win.

DEREK NORRIS

- Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut...made his Major League debut with a start at catcher that day against Los Angeles (NL) and went 0 for 3.
- Singled off Madison Bumgarner in the fifth inning June 23 against San Francisco for his first Major League hit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning for his first RBI and first multiple hit game.

Hit his first Major League home run June 24 against San Francisco, a three-run "walk-off" shot in
the bottom of the ninth off Santiago Casilla...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third
player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run...the other two
are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).

JARROD PARKER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over
 the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a
 run in the ninth inning for the blown save.
- Earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...Norberto recorded the
 save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe
 Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

CLIFF PENNINGTON

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday... is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 20 with left elbow tendinitis...had the lowest slugging
 percentage in the majors (.282) and the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage
 (.259) when he went on the DL.

ANTHONY RECKER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he
was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).
- Matched his career-high with four strikeouts June 29 against the Dodgers (August 4, 2009 at Tampa Bay).

- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21 but returned to Oakland June 16...appeared in just one game before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 24.
- Recalled a third time July 20 when Pennington went on the disabled list.
