AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the final game of a four-game series at the Oakland Athletics today...wraps up the first opponent of a seven-game road trip—their final West Coast trip of the year—which also features a three-game series at Seattle from Monday-Wednesday...went 5-1 on their just-completed six-game homestand, taking two of three games from Los Angeles-AL and sweeping a three-game set vs. Toronto...after this road trip, will play 16 of 23 games from 7/27-8/19 at home, beginning with a nine-game homestand vs. Boston, Baltimore and Seattle...are in a stretch of 13 consecutive days with games immediately following the All-Star break.

- ▶ At 57-37 (.606), own the best record in the Majors...are 20 games over .500, three shy of their season high-water mark.
- ▶ Are 26-12 since 6/8 and 36-16 since 5/22...are now 10-3-1 over their last 14 series since 6/1.

AT THE TOP: Today marks the 40th consecutive day the Yankees will be in sole possession of first place in the AL East...marks their longest such stretch since a 43-day span from 6/21-8/2/10.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost their third straight game, falling 2-1 at Oakland...held Oakland batters to just 4H, marking the first time they limited an opponent to 4H or less and lost since 5/11/11 vs. Kansas City...had won their previous 17 such games...RHP Phil Hughes (7.2IP, 4H, 2ER, 2BB, 6K, 2HR) suffered the loss, allowing a go-ahead solo home run in the eighth...LF Raul Ibanez (1-for-3) had a two-out single in the fourth to drive in the Yankees' lone run...2B Robinson Cano (0-for-4) saw his 23-game hitting streak come to an end

ONE OFF: The Yankees have lost each of their last three games, each by one run...marks the first such streak for the Yankees against the same opponent since 7/2-4/93 (also at Oakland; 4-3, 5-4 and 7-6 losses).

KEEP YOUR BROOMS: The Yankees today will look to avoid being swept for the third time this season (also 4/6-8 at Tampa Bay-3G and 5/16-17 at Toronto-2G)...have not been swept in a four-game series since 5/22-25/03 vs. Toronto...have not been swept by Oakland in a series of any length since 6/9-11/06 (3G) at the original Yankee Stadium and have not been swept in a four-game series by the A's since 7/14-16/72...have never been swept in a four-game series at the Coliseum.

BIRTHDAY BOY: LHP CC Sabathia celebrated his 32nd birthday on Saturday...made his final start as a 31-year-old in Tuesday's win vs. Toronto, recording the victory...with 186 career wins, marks the most victories by a pitcher prior to their 32nd birthday since Catfish Hunter compiled 210 wins before his 32nd birthday in 1978...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last eight pitchers with at least 186 wins before turning 32 are all in the Hall of Fame: Bob Feller (208, 1950), Hal Newhouser (200, 1953), Robin Roberts (206, 1958), Don Drysdale (202, 1968), Juan Marichal (191, 1969), Ferguson Jenkins (191, 1975), Jim Palmer (194, 1977) and Hunter.

- ▶ Earned his 10th win of the season in Tuesday's victory vs. Toronto...became the fifth pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to record at least 10 wins in each of his first 12 Major League seasons, joining Tom Seaver, Don Sutton, Carl Hubbell and Eddie Plank.

BROOM BREAKER: LHP CC Sabathia is 4-1 with a 3.93 ERA (36.2IP, 16ER) in five starts in which the Yankees were in danger of being swept in a series of at least three games, with the only loss coming on 6/9/11 vs. Boston...recorded wins on 8/2/09 at Chicago-AL, 9/13/09 vs. Baltimore, 7/1/10 vs. Seattle and 5/29/11 at Seattle.

NEED A FREEBIE: The Yankees have drawn 1BB over the first three games of this series...did not walk in either of the first two games of this series, the first time they did so in consecutive games since 9/12-13/11...the 1BB marks their fewest over a three-game span since 9/1-4/98 (also 1BB).

IN CLOSING: The Yankees are 20-10 in series finales...have won six of the last seven series finales and nine of the last 11.

RADAR BLIP: The Yankees have lost three straight games, matching their season high, sixth time, first since 6/19-22...are the only team in the Majors this season that has yet to lose more than three consecutive games.

- ▶ Have lost three straight road games, also matching their season high, fourth time, first since 5/15-17.

THREEDOM: The Yankees are 39-4 (.907) this season when holding their opponent to three-or-fewer runs, however have lost their last two such games...marks their first consecutive losses when holding an opponent to 3R or less since 4/25-26/11 vs. Chicago-AL.

LEADER OF THE PACK: The Yankees have a 7.0-game lead in the AL East, marking the largest division lead in the Majors...is three games shy of their season-high lead...had a 10.0-game lead entering play on Friday, their first double-digit lead in the division in July since 1998, which is also the last time the Yankees led the AL East by at least 10.0G within the first 91 games of a season (were up 14.0G after game 91 on 7/18/98).

- ▶ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Yankees have never blown a division lead of more than 6.0 games.

CAPTAIN'S LOG: SS Derek Jeter ranks second in the AL (fourth in the Majors) with 123H...trails Melky Cabrera (131), Andrew McCutchen (126) and Miguel Cabrera (124)...ranks third in the Majors with 37 multi-hit games (had 45 all of last year)...is batting .350 (72-for-206) on the road this season, sixth-highest average in the Majors and second in the AL to only Mike Trout (.358).

- ▶ Is batting .411 (37-for-90) with 4HR leading off the game in the first inning in 2012.
- ▶ Is tied with Eddie Collins for 15th on Baseball's all-time runs list with 1,822R...ranks third on the franchise's all-time list behind Ruth (1,959) and Gehrig (1,888).
- ▶ Is batting .361 (26-for-72) in July, hitting safely in 15 of 17 games this month.

JUST FOR KICKS: Tonight at 7:00 p.m. (ET), Yankee Stadium will host its first-ever soccer match as Chelsea FC, 2012 winners of the European Champions League and four-time winners of England's top division, face 2012-13 French Ligue 1 favorites Paris-Saint Germain...is the first of two soccer events at the Stadium this summer—also Real Madrid vs. A.C. Milan on Wed., 8/8...see pg 384 of the Yankees 2012 Media Guide for information on other events at the current Yankee Stadium and pg. 394 for the history of soccer at the original Yankee Stadium.

- ▶ Yankees RHP Mariano Rivera will conduct tonight's ceremonial pregame coin flip.

GO, GO CANO: **2B Robinson Cano** had his career-high 23-game hitting streak come to an end in Saturday's loss at Oakland...batted .400 (36-for-90) with 15R, 7 doubles, 7HR, 22RBI and 12 multi-hit games over the stretch from 6/24-7/20...was the longest hitting streak by a Yankee since Derek Jeter hit safely in 25 in-a-row from 8/20-9/16/06...was the longest single-season hitting streak by a Yankee whose primary position is second base since Joe Gordon hit safely in 29 in-a-row from 5/13-6/14/42...owns the Yankees' longest single-season hitting streak in each of the club's last four seasons (also 17G in 2011, 17G in 2010 and 18G in 2009).

- ▶ Since 1942 (the year after DiMaggio's record 56-game hitting streak), only three Yankees have fashioned a single-season hitting streak longer than Cano's: Joe Gordon (29G, 5/13-6/14/42), Derek Jeter (25G, 8/20-9/16/06) and Don Mattingly (24G, 8/30-9/26/86).
- ▶ Also snapped a career-high streak of reached base safely in 26 consecutive games dating back to 6/20...leads the Majors with 51 extra-base hits and ranks third in total bases (212).

BOMB SQUAD: The Yankees have hit a Major League-high 149HR in 2012...marks the highest total through 94 games in franchise history and is tied with the 2000 Angels for the fifth-highest total for any team all time through their first 94G of a season...are on pace for 257HR this season...the club record is 244, set in 2009, and the all-time record is 264 (1997 Mariners)...the Yankees have a ML-high eight players with at least 10HR (Cano, Granderson, Ibanez, Jones, Martin, Rodriguez, Swisher and Teixeira) - two shy of their franchise record set in 1998.

- ▶ Did not homer in Saturday's loss at Oakland snapping their season-high-tying 11-game stretch with at least 1HR.
- ▶ The Yankees are 55-22 this year when hitting at least 1HR and 38-10 when hitting multiple homers...are 2-15 in games in which they fail to homer.

BAYSIDE BOMBERS

The Yankees had their streak of homering in 12 straight games at Oakland come to an end last night...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, was the longest home run streak for any visiting team since the Tigers homered in 13 straight games at the Coliseum from 1984-86.

ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM: The Yankees had their nine-game winning streak at Oakland's O.co Coliseum come to an end with Thursday's loss...was their first loss in Oakland since 4/20/10...was their longest winning streak there since the opening of the Coliseum in 1968...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, it marked the Yankees' longest road winning streak against the Athletics since winning 10 in-a-row at Kansas City's Municipal Stadium from 8/31/55-9/11/56.

TEIX DRIVE: Over his last 15 games since 7/2, **1B Mark Teixeira** is batting .333 (17-for-51) with 12R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 6HR and 20RBI...has driven in multiple runs in five of his last 13 games.

BACKUP SANDMAN: **RHP Rafael Soriano** is 114-for-135 (84.4%) in career save opportunities, including 24-for-25 this season...his 45 saves with Tampa Bay in 2010 led the AL...has converted 26-of-27 career save opportunities with the Yankees that have occurred in the ninth inning or later, combining to allow just 3ER in 24.2IP (19H, 23K, 6BB).

- ▶ Has converted 15 consecutive save chances, the second-longest active streak this season behind Texas' Joe Nathan (17).

BACK ON THE JOBA: **RHP Joba Chamberlain** pitched 2.0 innings relief on Friday in his fourth rehab appearance (first with Single-A Tampa), allowing 2H, 2R (1ER), BB, 1K, 1HR and took the loss at Bradenton...has combined in his four outings (the first three w/the GCL Yankees) to toss 6.0IP (2H, 3R, 1ER, 1BB, 7K, 1HR).

- ▶ **C Austin Romine** is currently on a rehab assignment with the GCL Yankees...went 0-for-4 as the DH on Saturday vs. the Pirates...overall, has gone 4-for-19 (.211) with 2 doubles and 3RBI in seven games (2GS at DH).

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will play the finale of a four-game series at Oakland tonight...swept a three-game set at Oakland from 5/25-27 and will welcome the A's to Yankee Stadium from 9/21-23...have lost three straight games vs, the A's for the first time since dropping five in-a-row from 5/14/06-4/13/07...however, have won 30 of their last 40 games between these two teams since the start of the 2008 season, including a 16-6 mark in the last 22 matchups...have won four straight season series against the A's.

AT O.co COLISEUM: The Yankees are making their second of two trips to Oakland this season...have lost four straight games at the Coliseum since 2001...swept the A's in their first visit to O.co Coliseum 5/25-27...had their nine-game winning streak at the stadium snapped on Thursday...are 24-12 at the A's since the start of 2004...need a win today to record their fifth straight winning road season series at the A's and 11th in the last 15 years (since 1998).

NYY ALL TIME RECORD vs. SEATTLE: 210-166 (.559)

NYY ALL TIME road record at SEA: 103-87 (.542) --- NYY at Safeco Field: 36-25 (.590)

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees and Mariners will begin a three-game series at Safeco Field on Monday...the Yankees have won seven of the last 10 and 10 of the last 14 meetings between the teams...are 26-15 against Seattle since the start of the 2008 season...in 2011, went 5-4 vs. Seattle...in season series play, have won four straight season series (2008-11) and have had nine straight non-losing season series vs. the M's (2003-11).

AT SAFECO FIELD: The Yankees will make their only visit to Safeco Field with this three-game series from Monday-Wednesday...went 3-3 at Seattle in 2011...have won six of their last 10 games since the start of the 2010 season...the Yankees' .590 winning pct. (36-25) is the second-highest of any AL team at Safeco Field behind Cleveland (.607, 34-22)...have recorded three straight non-losing road season series vs. Seattle.

NOTEABLE: **1B Mark Teixeira** and **3B Eric Chavez** each have 15 career home runs at Safeco, tied for second-most there by a player who never appeared for Seattle (trailing only Rafael Palmeiro-17HR)

MONDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER at SEATTLE: RHP HIROKI KURODA (9-7, 3.46)

RHP Hiroki Kuroda, 37, will make his 20th start of the season on Monday vs. the Seattle Mariners at Safeco Field...will be his third career start vs. Seattle and second as a Yankee...**last started** on 7/18 vs. Toronto and earned the win in a complete-game, rain-shortened 6-0 Yankees' victory, limiting the Jays to 4H with no walks and 5K in 7.0 shutout innings...has lost just once over his last 10 starts and has thrown at least 7.0IP in seven of his last nine outings...signed a one-year contract with the Yankees on 1/26/12.

OF LATE: Is undefeated in eight of his last 10 starts since 5/27, going 6-1 with a 2.61 ERA (69.0IP, 20ER) with 60K and 13BB...during that time span, has lowered his season ERA from 4.56 to 3.46...prior to that stretch, was 3-6 with a 4.56 ERA (53.1IP, 27ER) with 34K and 20BB over his first nine starts of the season.

LHP CC Sabathia, 32 from nearby Vallejo, Calif., will make his 17th start of the season today vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum...will be his 24th career start vs. Oakland and second this season...**last started** on 7/17 vs. Toronto and earned the win in the 6-1 Yankees' victory, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 6K)...was his first start since being placed on the 15-day disabled list with a left groin strain on 6/28...the win marked the ninth straight season that he has earned a win vs. Toronto, matching Scott McGregor (1978-86) as the only pitchers to accomplish the feat (credit: *Elias*)...is in the fourth year of an eight-year contract (with a vesting option for 2017) re-signed with the Yankees on 10/31/11.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 8-8 with a 4.84 ERA (145.0IP, 78ER) in 23 career starts vs. Oakland...since 5/14/08, is 6-1 with a 2.62 ERA (68.2IP, 20ER) in his last nine starts against the Athletics, with his team going 7-2 in those outings.
 ◦ **Last started vs. Oakland** on 5/26/12 at O.co Coliseum and earned the win in the 9-2 Yankees' victory, allowing 2ER on 7H in 7.0IP (2BB, 4K, 1HR).

MR. CONSISTENCY: Is one win shy of recording 11 victories in each of his first 12 seasons in the Majors (2001-12)...with a victory today, will become just one of four pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to accomplish the feat: also Don Sutton (first 17 seasons, 1966-82), Eddie Plank (first 16 seasons, 1901-16) and Tom Seaver (first 13 seasons, 1967-79).

30 IS THE NEW 20: Celebrated his 32nd birthday yesterday...made his final start as a 31-year-old in his last outing on 7/17 vs. Toronto, recording the win...with 186 career wins, marks the most victories by a pitcher prior to their 32nd birthday since Catfish Hunter compiled 210 wins before his 32nd birthday in 1978...according to *Elias*, the last eight pitchers with at least 186 wins before turning 32 are all in the Hall of Fame: Bob Feller (208, 1950), Hal Newhouser (200, 1953), Robin Roberts (206, 1958), Don Drysdale (202, 1968), Juan Marichal (191, 1969), Ferguson Jenkins (191, 1975), Jim Palmer (194, 1977) and Hunter.
