ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won a season-high tying five consecutive games (third time, also: June 12 to 16, July 1 to 6) and nine of the last 10 contests to improve to seven games over .500 for the first time since July 13, 2008 (51-44)...have not been eight majors over .500 since July 12, 2008 (51-43)...are 8-1 since the All-Star Break, which is the **best record in the majors** ahead of Cincinnati (9-2)...are 14-2 in July, which is the **best record in the majors** ahead of Detroit (14-4)...are 29-14 (.674) over the last 43 games (since June 2) after losing a season-high nine consecutive contests...the mark since June 2 is the **best in the majors** ahead of the Yankees (30-15, .667)...are in third place in the American League West for the 38th consecutive day and trail Texas by six games...lead the second Wild Card by a ½ game over Baltimore and Chicago and are just a game behind Los Angeles for the first Wild Card...first moved into a tie for the second Wild Card following Saturday's win, marking the first time the A's had held at least a share of a playoff spot after the All-Star Break since winning the West in 2006...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 49 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

"WALK-OFF" WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Coco Crisp had the game-winning single in the bottom of the 12th inning Sunday afternoon...the A's have two "walk-off" wins in the last three home games, six in the last 11, eight in the last 16 and a **Major League leading 11** for the season...10 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI...including five by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...the A's combined for nine "walk-off" wins over the previous two seasons...are 20-10 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 16-9 in the last at bat...are 7-2 (.778) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the second best record.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's defeated the Yankees 5-4 Sunday afternoon and have now won each of the last five games by one run...it is the **first time in franchise history** (since 1901) that the A's have won five consecutive games, all by one run...now have an eight-game winning streak in one-run games, which is their longest since they had an Oakland record 11-game streak in 2000 (May 31-July 17)...15 of the A's last 25 games have been decided by one run...had just 13 one-run decisions over the first 70 games...are 16-12 (.571) in one-run games for the season, which is the third best record in the American League...eight of the A's last 12 losses have been by one run.

FOUR-GAME SWEEP: With Sunday's win, the A's swept a four-game series: against New York for just the second time since 1914 (July 14-16, 1972 at New York); against the team with the best record in baseball for the first time since September 26-28, 1977 against Kansas City; in Oakland for the first time September 17-20, 2009 (Cleveland); against any team for the first time since September 30-October 3, 2010 at Seattle.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (three games) today...went 5-1 on their last homestand against the two teams with the best records in the majors, Texas (1-1) and New York (4-0)...went 3-0 on the last road trip to Minnesota and are 22-23 on the road compared to 28-21 at home...the home record is fourth best in the American League...the pitching staff has a 2.86 ERA (149 er in 469.2 ip) at home compared to 3.99 (172 er in 387.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is the lowest in the AL while the road ERA ranks sixth.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starter in each of the three games at Toronto...five of the A's last seven losses and seven of the last 10 have come in games started by a left-hander...are 14-17 (.452) in games started by a lefty compared to 37-27 (.579) against right-handers.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 4-0 in this stretch of 17 consecutive games against American League East teams that began on Thursday...following this three-game series in Toronto, the A's travel to Baltimore (three games) before returning home to face Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (four games)...are 13-8 against the East this year, which is the second best record by any AL team (Texas, 13-6)...went 20-23 last year and have not finished with a winning record against the East since 2006 (29-15).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.61 ERA (85 er in 293.0 ip) and .213 (228 for 1068) opponents batting average over the last 32 games and have a 23-9 record over that span...have a 3.37 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average (.241) and slugging percentage (.369) in the AL and have surrendered the fewest home runs (77)...have the second lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306) and are tied for second in shutouts (8)...have the second fewest strikeouts (625)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 24 of the last 32 games...are 13-6 with 13 no decisions, a 2.58 ERA (58 er in 202.1 ip) and .226 (168 for 745) opponents batting average over that span and have allowed just 13 home runs...have a 3.69 ERA (236 er in 575.1 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League**...also have the fewest home runs (55).

THE LONG BALL: The A's are **tied for the Major League lead** in home runs since the All-Star Break (18) and are fourth in home runs in July (25)...have hit 52 home runs in 34 games since June 12, which is third most in the majors behind the Yankees (58) and Pirates (56)...have 101 home runs in 95 games for the season...had just 51 home runs after 95 games last year (homered once in game 96)...A's right fielders have hit 22 home runs after combining for 20 over the previous two seasons...A's first baseman have hit 18 home runs after combining for 19 over the previous two seasons.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.228), have the fourth fewest runs scored (362), the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.302) and the sixth lowest slugging percentage (.377)...have the second fewest grounded into double plays in the AL (60), are third in stolen bases (73) and fourth in walks (314)...however, have the fourth most strikeouts (764)...have been shut out 11 times, which is tied for the Major League lead...however, have not been blanked since June 3...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.97).

ROOKIES: A's rookie pitchers have recorded 26 of the team's 51 wins...have used 10 rookie pitchers, which is tied for second most in Oakland history...the record is 12 in 2009...have now employed 17 rookies total, which is the most in the majors and three more than the A's season total from last year...currently have 10 rookies on the roster.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The season series is even at one game each...split a two-game series in Oakland May 8-9...split the season series last year, 5-5...the A's have not won a season series since 2007 and are 16-22 against the Blue Jays since 2008...all-time, the A's are 199-173 against the Blue Jays...that includes 97-89 in Oakland, 102-82 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp recorded his 100th stolen base in his A's career Sunday, becoming the 11th player in Oakland history to steal 100 bases...is 17 for 44 (.386) with five multiple hit games over his last 10 games, which has lifted his average to a season-high .248.

Sean Doolittle has a 13.1-inning scoreless streak over his past 10 games.

Brandon Inge has homered in back-to-back games and now has three home runs in his last five games after going homerless in 27 consecutive contests.

Kurt Suzuki snapped his career-high 79-game homerless streak dating back to last year Sunday.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in **1999** Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBIs...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and ninth start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his 17th appearance overall this year...the A's are 5-3 (.625) in his starting assignments and his teams are 8-8 (.500) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

LAST SIX GAMES: Is 2-0 with a 2.23 ERA (36.1 ip, 27 h, 9 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 22 so, 0 hr) and .213 (27 for 127) opponents batting average over his last six games, including five starts...the winning streak is the first of his career...has run support of one, two and one in his three no decisions as a starter during this stretch.

PICKED OFF: Is tied with Toronto's Romero for the American League lead in pickoffs (6)...is tied for second in the majors (Cueto, CIN 7)...opponents are 1 for 5 in stolen base attempts...has been charged with two balks, which is tied for third in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in his last eight games, 45.2 innings and 179 batters faced...has allowed just one home run in 61.2 innings this year, a solo shot in his first start on May 28 at Minnesota (Plouffe)...the one home run is tied for the fewest among Major League pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-2 with a 3.40 ERA (18 er in 47.2 ip) in eight starts and 0-0 with a 3.21 ERA (5 er in 14.0 ip) in eight relief appearances...first batters faced are 0 for 7 with a sacrifice hit in his relief appearances and he has allowed 1 of 2 inherited runners to score...had eight career appearances entering this season and all were starts...is 3-5 with a 5.90 ERA (54 er in 82.1 ip) in 16 career starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 11 for 59 (.186) with three walks (.226 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has issued all 12 of his walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed a .211 (31 for 147) batting average with the bases empty compared to .288 (23 for 80) with runners on...opponents are hitting .326 (15 for 46) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .370 (10 for 27) batting average to the opponents number four hitter and .220 (44 for 200) against everyone else.

ALMOST EIGHT YEARS: Was the winning pitcher June 15 against San Diego, his first Major League win since he defeated Seattle in his Major League debut July 1, 2004...the span of seven years, 350 days between wins is the longest since Vicente Romo went 8 years and 3 days between victories from July 16, 1974 to July 19, 1982...it is the fourth longest streak by a pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) behind Jim Bouton (8 years, 65 days), Romo and Joe Grzenda (7 years, 362 days)...the win snapped a career-high five-game losing streak dating back to July 7, 2004.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Triple-A Fresno and was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, before he was selected by San Francisco May 1...posted a 9.00 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four relief appearances with San Francisco before he was designated for assignment May 13...was claimed off waivers by the A's May 15 and did not allow an earned run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip) before making his first start May 28...made seven consecutive starts before pitching in relief in the second to last game before the All-Star Break...returned to the rotation July 18.

2012 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Minnesota **May 28**...left with a 3-1 lead but Norberto allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was his first Major League start since September 29, 2007...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas **June 5** in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven hits...retired the first six batters before the Rangers scored three times in the third inning on a two-run double by Kinsler and a RBI double by Hamilton...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Torrealba in the fourth and a RBI triple to Young in the fifth...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona **June 10**...allowed three runs, two earned, in the first inning on a fielders choice and a two-run single by Hill...the A's scored twice in the fourth to make the score 3-2 but he allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over San Diego **June 15** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Quentin in the first inning but the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first...also allowed a RBI single to Denorfia in the second but retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) **June 21** in Oakland...struck out a career-high six batters in a career-high 8.0 innings...retired each of the first 10 batters before Herrera doubled with one out in the fourth...one out later, Rivera had a RBI single...retired 12 of the final 13 hitters he faced...Kershaw limited the A's to a run over eighth innings and Blackley was relieved by Cook to start the ninth with the score tied at 1-1...Céspedes hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle **June 26**...retired six of the first seven batters he faced before the Mariners scored twice in the third inning on a Gutierrez RBI double and a Seager sacrifice fly...faced the minimum over his final four innings thanks to a pickoff and grounded into double play...the A's scored twice in the seventh inning to tie the game but Miller allowed a run in the eighth for the loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Texas **July 1**...allowed a career-high tying seven hits...had two pickoffs...surrendered just one run on an Andrus RBI single in the third inning...retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored single runs in the fifth, sixth and seventh innings for the win.

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 11.0 innings...allowed a RBI double to Gentry in the fifth inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the inning...allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth and was relieved by Balfour with runners on first and second and one out...Balfour allowed one more run to score...the A's tied the game with two in the seventh to get him off the hook and Hicks homered in the ninth for the win.

BLACKLEY vs. TORONTO: Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 12-4 Seattle loss on July 7, 2004 at Toronto...allowed a RBI single to Berg in the third inning but Seattle scored three times in the fourth...then allowed three runs in the fifth on a two-run home run by Phelps and an error...was also charged with two of the Blue Jays four runs in the sixth inning.

WITH FRESNO: Was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, with Triple-A Fresno in the San Francisco organization...walked just three batters in 23.1 innings (1.16 per nine innings) and allowed one home run...allowed a .163 opponents batting average, including .153 (9 for 59) against right-handed hitters and .190 (4 for 21) against left-handed hitters...opponents were 1 for 27 (.037) with runners on base, including 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (2-0, 2.70 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...has tossed 6.0 innings in each of his five starts and allowed three runs or fewer in each outing...is just the third Athletics pitcher since 1918 to begin his career with five consecutive games of six or more innings and three runs or fewer...the other two are Dave Hamilton (May 29-June 23, 1972) and John Henry Johnson (April 10-May 5, 1978)...is 2-0 in two starts since the All-Star Break, the first two wins of his Major League career...is making his first career appearance and start against Toronto.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

17-9, 2.71 ERA (282.0 ip, 201 h, 92 r, 85 er, 127 bb, 245 so, 22 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 25/36 (69.4%)

The A's bullpen is 7-0 with five saves, one blown save and a 1.29 ERA (7 er in 49.0 ip) in 16 games in the month of July...has allowed a .147 (25 for 170) opponents batting average over that span...for the season, has the lowest opponents batting average (.201) and slugging percentage (.321) in the majors...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.71 ERA...is tied for the fewest home runs in the AL (22) and is second in wins (17) but has issued the second most walks (127)...has 128 strikeouts in 128.2 innings over its last 45 games since May 29 (9.0 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings).

50 RHP GRANT BALFOUR

Inherited Runners/Scored: 17/7

First Hitters: 13-40 (6 bb)

- Has not allowed a run in eight games and 7.1 innings in July...now has a 1.73 ERA (5 er in 26.0 ip) and .146 (13 for 89) opponents batting average over his last 25 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (46), is ninth among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.185) and is tied for 10th in inning pitched (46.0).
- First batters faced are hitting .325 (13 for 40) with six walks (.413 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is fourth highest in the AL and the walks are tied for fifth most.
- Has a 0.71 ERA (2 er in 25.1 ip) in 24 appearances at home compared to a 5.66 ERA (13 er in 20.2 ip) in 22 outings on the road.
- Has faced the Blue Jays once this year, May 8, and earned the win (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...is 2-1 with a save, two blown saves and a 4.18 ERA in 26 appearances in his career (23.2 ip, 25 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 30 so, 3 hr).
- His last save was May 5 and it was the 17th of his career, tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).

13 LHP JERRY BLEVINS

First Hitters: 10-33 (1 bb, 1 sf, 1 hb)

- Earned his career-high third win of the season in his last appearance Sunday (previous: 2, 2010).
- Has not allowed a run in eight of his last 10 games (2 er in 9.1 ip, 1.93 ERA) after surrendering four runs over his previous five contests (5.2 ip, 6.35 ERA).
- Has allowed 8 of 22 (36.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the sixth highest percentage in the American League.
- Has faced Toronto once this year, May 9 (1.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so, 1 hr)...is 0-1 with a blown save and 8.59 ERA in seven career games (7.1 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 8 so, 2 hr)...the ERA is his highest against any AL team.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster last year but had six stints with Oakland...had a 2.86 ERA and .235 opponents average in 26 games...the ERA was the lowest of his career but he allowed 8 of 14 (57.1%) inherited runners to score, which was the highest percentage of his career.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 13/4

First Hitters: 5-36 (6 bb)

- Has allowed a run in each of his past two games (2 er in 2.0 ip, 9.00 ERA), the first time he has allowed runs in back-to-back games all season...the runs snapped an 8.2-inning scoreless streak over his previous nine appearances.
