## OAKLAND NOTES

The Oakland Athletics have "walk-off" wins in back-to-back home games for the first time this year, in three of the last four contests and nine of the last 17...according to Elias, it is the first time a team has had "walk-off" wins in nine of 17 home games since the 1974 Dodgers (May-June)...have a Major League leading 12 for the season ... are 8-2 in extra inning games ... are 19-4 (.826) in the month of July, which is the best mark in the majors ... it is currently the best July by any team since the Yankees went 25-4 (.862) in 1941...it is the best July in Athletics history and currently the fourth best record in any month in Athletics history...are 1-0 on this 10-game homestand against Tampa Bay (1-0), Toronto (four games) and Los Angeles (three games).

Tonight's game was the A's longest of the season in both innings (previous: 14, April 25 vs. Chicago) and time of game 5:09 (previous: 4:15, June 23 vs. San Francisco)...it is the longest game in the Coliseum by time since July 3, 1983 against Texas (5:19).

A's hitters struck out 21 times, which is a franchise record (previous: 19, June 24, 1997 at Seattle).

Jemile Weeks (0 for 7) hit a sacrifice fly in the 15<sup>th</sup> inning, his first career "walk-off" RBI.

## TAMPA BAY NOTES

The Tampa Bay Rays are 3-3 in extra inning games...are 8-9 since the All-Star Break and 12-13 in the month of July...are 19-47 all-time against the A's in Oakland...are 4-3 on this nine-game road trip to Baltimore (2-1), Los Angeles (2-1) and Oakland (0-1).

Tonight's game was the Rays longest road game in franchise history (previous: 14 innings, twice)...it matched their longest game this season (also June 16 vs. Miami).

Rays pitchers recorded 21 strikeouts, their most in a game in franchise history.

The Rays allowed two runs in the second inning, snapping a 24-inning streak in which they did not allow a run...that matches the longest scoreless streak in team history (also May 8-11, 2008).

David Price did not factor in the decision and is 6-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13 er in 56.1 ip) over his last eight starts...has tossed seven or more innings in each of those last eight starts, the longest such streak of his career...is 2-1 with a 3.66 ERA (16 er in 39.1 ip) in six career starts against the A's.
