RAY MATTER—The Rays are 4-2 on this 9-game, 3-city road trip (2-1 at BAL and 2-1 at LAA) despite scoring 3 runs or less in 5 of the 6 games... Tampa Bay has pitched to a 1.90 ERA (52-IP, 11-ER) in the 6 games... yesterday's 2-0 win at Los Angeles gave the Rays back-to-back series wins for the first time since May 21-27 when they took 2 of 3 from Toronto and Boston...tonight, the Rays are seeking their first 3-game win streak since June 7-10 when they won 4 straight...Rays are 6-4 in their last 10 games while pitching to a 1.74 ERA (93-IP, 18-ER) and allowing only 55 hits, striking out 108 and walking only 20.

- + The Rays are 8-8 since the All-Star break while pitching to a 2.69 ERA (147-IP, 44-ER) with a major-league-high 158 strikeouts...Rays pitchers have fanned 10 or more batters in 10 of the last 15 games.
- + The Rays are 12-12 in July, 18-24 since they were last in first place on June 11 and 34-41 since they were a season-high 11 games over .500 (19-8) on May 4.
- + The Rays have won 5 of the last 7 road games and since May 13, are 18-13 in their last 31 road games...they are 15-22 at home during that same span

RAYS ONE SNY OF CLUB SCORELESS INNINGS STREAK—In taking 2 of 3 games from the Angels over the weekend the Rays beat C.J. Wilson 3-0 on Saturday and Zack Greinke 2-0 on Sunday...23-year-old Matt Moore beat Wilson and 25-year-old Jeremy Hellickson bested Greinke... it is the 5th time in club history the Rays have thrown back-to-back team shutouts, first time since May 9-10, 2008 (also vs. the Angels) and first time on the road since May 19-21, 2002 (at Baltimore, Seattle)...in the Angels series, the Rays held the Angels scoreless in 25 of 26 innings and allowed 3 runs, 17 hits and 2 walks while striking out 24...the Rays have gone 23 innings since they last allowed a run, one shy of the club record for consecuitve scorless innings...the mark of 24 consecuive scoreless innings was established May 8-11, 2008.

RAYS HAND GREINKE RARE HOME DEFEAT—In yesterday's 2-0 win at Los Angeles, the Rays handed **Zack Greinke** his first regular-season home loss in a little more than 2 years...Grienke had won his previous 19 home decisions since losing to the Twins, 19-1—yes, 19-1—on July 26, 2010... courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau.

RAYS BULLPEN MAJORS' 2ND BEST SINCE THE BREAK—In their last 29.2 innings the bullpen has allowed only one run and struck out 44...Rays relievers have worked 51.0 innings since the All-Star break and have been scored upon in only 4 of those innings...their 1.59 ERA (51-IP, 9-ER) since the break is tops in the AL and is 2nd in the majors behind the Reds (1.39).

PITCHING, PITCHING AND MORE PITCHING—In the last 8 games, the Rays and their opponents have combined to hit .200 (101-for-504)...the Rays have batted .208 (53-for-255) and their opponents .193 (48-for-249)... overall, Rays opponents are batting just .239, lowest in the AL...Rays also led the AL in lowest opp avg. in 2010 and 2011...the last team to lead the AL in that category for three consecutive seasons was the 1983-85 Tigers.

THE PRICE IS RIGHT—Tonight's starter David Price (14-4, 2.57) was the majors' first 14-game winner and will be going for his major-league-high 15th...he became the first Ray to lead the majors outright in wins after the first month of the season...if he was to get No. 15 tonight it would come in the Rays 103rd game...only 3 AL pitchers in the 2000s have reached 15 wins faster: TOR David Wells in 2000 (88 games); CWS Jon Garland in 2008 (95 games) and NYY CC Sabathia in 2011 (101 games).

RAYS vs. A's—Oakland Coliseum is historically the Rays toughest AL port...the Rays are 19-46 (292) all-time here...they were 6-30 here prior to Manager Joe Maddon's arrival, but are 13-16 since...their overall mark vs. the A's of 49-83 (.371) is also the lowest winning pct. vs. an AL foe, but the two teams are 24-24 since the start of the 2007 season...A's took 2 of 3 from the Rays at Tropicana Field, May 4-6.

<u>THREE RUNS OR LESS</u>—Tonight's starter **David Price** has allowed 3 runs or less in 17 starts this season, tied with **C.J. Wilson** for most in the AL...the only other AL pitcher with 16 is **Jeremy Hellickson**.

RAYS AND THE 1914 YANKEES -For the first time this season, the Rays are last in the majors in hitting after batting .208 (53for-255) in their last 8 games...the Rays continue to lead the majors in walks... only once in major league history has a team led the majors in walks while finishing last in batting...that team was the 1914 Yankees...the Yanks batted .229 and drew 577 walks...the 1960 Tigers were close, finshing just .0002 ahead of the Phillies in team batting average (.239) while drawing a league-high 636 walks...Rays rank just below Oakland and Seattle (both at .232)... in the DH era (since 1973), there has never been a season when the AL had the three lowest-hitting teams in the majors, and the 1981 Blue Jays (.226) are the only AL team to finish with a lower average...the Rays are batting .188 (26-for-138) with runners in scoring position since the All-Star break.

TIGHTEST AL WILD CARD RACE SINCE 2005—Presently, eight teams are within 5.5 games of the AL's first Wild Card slot... since the Wild Card format began in 1994, there has only been one season in which the AL Wild Card race has been this tight this late...in 1995 there were 8 teams within 5.0 games as late as Aug 3.

AL EAST IS A BEST—All 5 teams in the AL East enter play today .500 or better...that's

the latest into the season that has ever happened...in fact, since the current divisional format began in 1994, only one other time has a division had 5 teams .500 or better this deep into the season: 2005 NL East (all 5 teams finished the season .500 or better) .

FIELDING: SECOND HALF TURNAROUND—After making 71 errors in 86 games before the All-Star break (2nd most in the majors), they have made only 6 in the first 16 games since the break...Rays have been errorless in 10 of their last 12 games, but their 77 errors are already 4 more than they made all of last season...Rays have allowed only 3 unearned runs in the last 32 games after allowing a ML-high 40 in their first 76 games.

LIFE WITHOUT LONGO—In the 3rd game of his current rehab asssignment, 3B **Evan Longoria** (partially torn left hamstring) was 1-for-3 with a walk in Triple-A Durham's 8-7 loss to Norfolk (Orioles) yesterday...in 3 games with Durham he is 1-for-9 with 3 walks and an RBI...the Rays are 38-41 since Longoria has been out...they were 15-8 at the time he went on the DL...last Wed at BAL, **Ryan Roberts** became the 8th different third Ray to play 3B in Longoria's absence and the 9th overall, most by an AL team since the 2007 Blue Jays.

RODNEY QUICKEST TO 30—Rays closer Fernando Rodney earned his 30th save yesterday at LAA in the Rays 103rd game...he is the quickest to 30 saves in club history surpassing the mark of Rafael Soriano in 2010 (104th game)...he is just the 4th pitcher since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to earn 30 saves and have a sub-1.00 ERA on this date... he joins OAK Dennis Eckerlsey in 1990 (32 saves and a 0.81 ERA), ATL John Smoltz in 2003 (39 saves, 0.83 ERA) and SEA J.J. Putz in 2007 (31 saves, 0.89 ERA)...the Rays 30-save pitchers:

TONIGHT'S START & 2012 NOTES

- + The 26-year-old makes his 21st start of the season, 11th on the road.
- + Last start: On Wed at BAL, the Rays offense gave him 10 runs of support and he became the first 14-game winner in the majors this year as the Rays beat the Orioles, 10-1...his line: 7 IP, 7 H, 1 R/ER, 0 BB, 10 SO, 1 WP, 105 pitches, 68 strikes...became the first Ray to lead the majors in outright in wins after the first month of the season...David reached 14 wins in the Rays 98th game...only 4 AL pitchers in the 2000s have reached 14 wins faster: TOR David Wells in 2000 (83 games); CWS Jon Garland in 2008 (89), NYY CC Sabathia in 2011 (91); and TOR Roy Halladay in 2003 (96).
- + Is aiming to become the first in club history with two seasons of 15 or more wins...won 19 games in 2010... James Shields and Matt Garza each recorded one season of 15-plus victories.
- + Has won his last 6 decisions, a new career high and 1 shy of the Rays record for most consecutive wins (in decisions)...a 7-game winning streak has been achieved four times by a starter in Rays history, most recently by Jeff Niemann from June 20–Aug 16, 2011...Price's 6-win streak is currently the 2nd-longest active winning streak in the AL behind only LAA Jered Weaver at 8.
- During the 7-start span where he has gone 6-0 (since June 19 at WAS), has posted a 1.82 ERA (49.1-IP, 10-ER) with 52 SO and only 34 hits and 13 BB allowed while averaging 14.9 pitches per inning...the streak came after his worst start of the season, when he allowed 7 runs on 9 hits in a loss to R.A. Dickey and the Mets on June 13 vs. NYM.
- + Is tied with NYM R.A. Dickey for most wins in the majors.
- + AL Ranks: 2nd in ERA (2.57), 6th in SO (130), 10th in IP (133), 5th in opponents' SLG (.329), 5th in opponents' OPS (.626) and 6th in GB/FB ratio (2.03)...entered the year with a career 1.20 GB/FB ratio...Price and Justin Verlander are the only AL pitchers to rank in the top 6 in wins, SO and ERA.
- + This year, has gone 10-3 in 15 starts against teams with a .500 record or better (going into the game)...14 of his last 16 starts have come against teams .500 or better (going into the game), and he has gone 11-3 in those games...among others, this year has beaten DET Justin Verlander, NYY CC Sabathia and PHI Cole Hamels in head-to-head match-ups.
- + The Rays are 14-6 (.700) in games started by him this season compared to 38-43 (.469) in all other games.
- + Has worked 7 innings or more in his last 7 starts (longest streak of hsi career) and 13 of his last 15...his 14 starts of 7 IP or more this year are tied for 2nd-most in the majors...James Shields (3x) is the only other Rays starter to have a streak that long since the start of the 2003 season...Shields' streak of 11 starts with 7 IP or more from Aug 3–Sep 26, 2011 is the Rays record.
- + Has stranded 82.1 pct. of his baserunners this year (2nd in AL behind Jeremy Hellickson-82.2 pct.) compared to 73.3 pct. last year.
- + According to FanGraphs, has the 2nd-highest avg. fastball velocity in the majors (95.5 mph) after WAS Stephen Strasburg (95.8)...is throwing his fastball less frequently than last season (61.6 pct. of pitches this year, 70.5 in 2011) but with more velocity (94.8 in 2011)...is throwing a cutter for the first time in his career (13.9 pct. of his total pitches).
- + Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 14 of his 20 starts this season and 3 runs or less in 17 of 20 starts, both tied for most in the AL this year.
- + Has pitched to a 1.78 ERA (81-IP, 16-ER) in 12 starts this season when Jose Molina is behind the plate compared to a 3.88 ERA (51-IP, 22-ER) in 8 starts with Jose Lobaton (6) or Chris Gimenez (2) behind the plate...(Stephen Vogt caught 1 scoreless inning in relief of Molina on May 20 vs. ATL).
- + All-Star Game: Threw a scoreless 3rd inning in the 2012 All-Star Game in Kansas City. was named to his third consecutive All-Star Team, joining Evan Longoria (2008-10) as the only Rays to be so honored in three straight seasons.

PRICE vs. A'S

- + Makes his 6th career start vs. Oakland...is 2-1 with a 3.62 ERA (32.1-IP, 13-ER) and 34 SO.
- + Last start: On May 4 vs. OAK allowed only 1 run on 3 hits in 8 IP, with a season-high 12 strikeouts in a 7-2 win opposite Tyson Ross...his final line: 8 IP, 3 H, 1 R/ER, 1 BB, 12 SO, 106 pitches, 75 strikes...it was Price's 4th career game with 12 or more strikeouts and a season high for a Rays starter...fanned every A's hitter at least once...retired 19 of his last 21 batters faced, yielding 1 hit and 1 walk over his final 6 frames.
- + Is 1-1 with a 3.66 ERA (19.2-IP, 8-ER) in 3 career starts at the Coliseum...has allowed 4 runs in each of his last 2 starts there...in his last start at OAK, the Rays lost, 6-1, in a match-up against Brandon McCarthy on July 26, 2011.

#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- + Ejected July 18 vs. CLE in the 7th inning by home plate umpire Dan lassogna, his first of the season and 24th as a Ray, extending his club record.
- + Is the longest-tenured and winningest manager in Rays history at 548-525 (.511)...has a 421-328 (.562) record since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival...overall is 567-535 (.515) in his career, including a 19-10 interim stint with the Angels in 1999.
- + Two-time AL Manager of the Year (2008, 2011) is in his 7th season as Rays skipper...only three current major league managers have been at their posts longer: LAA Mike Scioscia (2000), MIN Ron Gardenhire (2002) and PHI Charlie Manuel (2005)...April 16 at BOS marked his 500th career win with the Rays...is 1 of 5 active managers with 500 wins with their current team...also Manuel, Scioscia, Gardenhire and DET Jim Leyland.
- + Managed his 1,000th game with the Rays on May 5...became the 5th manager in the modern era to manage at least 1,000 games for one team without ever playing in the majors, joining BAL Earl Weaver, NYY Joe McCarthy, PIT Jim Leyland and PHI Danny Ozark.
- + Earned 26 of 28 first-place votes from the BBWAA last fall in the Manager of the Year balloting...finished 3rd in 2010.

- + Has only started 7 of the last 26 games...during that span, has gone 3-for-36 with 19 SO and only 2 XBH and 1 BB...went 7-for-20 with 1 HR, 3 2B and 6 RBI in his first 7 games (5 starts) for the Rays.
- + Of his 18 career HR, 9 either tied the game or gave his team the lead, 9 have come in the 8th inning or later and 6 have come as a PH.
- + Batting .175/.217/.368 with 2 HR, 9 RBI and 5 2B in 23 games since joining the Rays...has appeared at 3B (13 games, 8 starts) and 2B (8 games, 4 starts)....hit .075 (3-for-40) with 2 HR and 6 RBI in 25 games for the Brewers.
- + Matched his career high with 4 RBI in Game 2 of the doubleheader June 24 at PHI (4x-last July 24, 2010 at FLA, with ATL).
- + Made his Rays debut June 23 at PHI and hit a 2-out, game-tying single off PHI Jonathan Papelbon in the 9th after striking out as a PH in the 8th.
- + 32-year-old infielder was claimed off waivers from MIL on June 21 and added to the active roster June 22...the Rays are his 5th organization since he was selected by Houston in the 8th round of the 2001 June Draft and his 3rd in the last 3 seasons.

- + Yesterday did not record a hit for the first time in 5 games since being activated from the disabled list Tue...missed 96 games while recovering from surgery to repair ligaments in his right wrist...underwent surgery on April 3 and was expected to be out 4-5 months but came back in less than 3.
- + Made 10 rehab appearances between Class-A Charlotte (5) and Triple-A Durham (5), hitting a combined .161 (5-for-31) with a double and 5 BB.
- + Appeared in 9 spring training games and hit .217 (5-for-23) with 5 R, 5 BB and 2 SB before being sidelined with a right wrist injury on March 23.

- Allowed double-digit hit totals in 4 straight outings from June 28–July 15, totaling 45 hits in 26.2 IP...it was the longest streak by an AL pitcher since OAK Dan Haren did it in 4 straight starts from Sep 1-17, 2007...it was tied for the 2nd-longest streak ever by a Rays pitcher, as Tanyon Sturtze also went 4 straight outings with 10-plus hits from Aug 23–Sep 9, 2002...the Rays record is 6 straight starts by Albie Lopez from May 19–June 16, 2001.
- + Has allowed 10-plus hits 6 times this year...the rest of the Rays staff combined has only done that 3 times (Matt Moore, Alex Cobb and David Price).
- + Through his first 6 starts was 5-0 with a 3.05 ERA, but in 15 starts since then is 3-7 with a 5.16 ERA (96-IP, 55-ER)...the Rays were 6-0 in his first 6 starts but are 6-9 in his last 15 starts.
- + According to FanGraphs, is throwing his fastball only 27.9 percent of the time, far less than any other AL pitcher...next closest is LAA Dan Haren (38.6) and the only pitcher in MLB who throws the fastball less is NYM R.A. Dickey (13.8)...coming into the year, averaged 45.2 pct. fastballs for his career... throws his change-up for 30.0 percent of his total pitches, most in the AL.
- + Has already allowed 13 unearned runs this season, most in the majors and a new career high...only allowed 5 unearned runs all of last year...the record for unearned runs in a season for a Rays pitcher is Wilson Alvarez with 17 in 1999.
- + Has thrown 6 or more innings in 47 of his last 54 starts dating back to the start of 2011...has not finished the 8th inning since April 21, averaging 6.1 IP per outing over his last 16 starts since then...worked 8 innings or more in 18 of his previous 33 starts dating back to April 19 last year.
- + Has not finished the 8th inning since April 21 vs. MIN...led the majors with 11 CG last year...the last pitcher to record as many or more complete games and go the entire next season without a CG (min. 20 starts) was MIN Roger Erickson, who had 14 CG in 1978 and 0 in 21 starts next year...no other pitcher in history has had 11 or more complete games in one season and then gone 22 starts without a complete game the next year.
- + Has averaged 16.9 pitches per inning this year, 7th highest in the AL...averaged a league-low 14.3 pitches per inning when he led the league with 11 CG last year.
- + When he is ahead in the count, opposing hitters are batting only .198 (39-for-197)....when he is behind, they hit .374 (55-for-147).
- + Opponents batting average in pitches 1-25: .312 (34-for-109)...Pitches 26-50: .241 (33-for-137)...Pitches 51-75: .271 (35-for-129)...Pitches 76-100: .352 (43-for-122).
- + On June 28 vs. DET, allowed a career-high 14 hits, tying the club record, in a 5-2 loss opposite Max Scherzer...his line: 7.2 IP, 14 H, 4 R/ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 123 pitches, 84 strikes...took his first career loss against the Tigers, the only AL team he was still undefeated against (5-1).

- + Makes his 12th career start vs. Oakland...is 4-3 with a 4.58 ERA (72.2-IP, 37-ER)
- Is 1-2 with a 6.46 ERA (30.2-IP, 22-ER) in 5 career starts at the Coliseum.
- + On Mother's Day (May 9) 2010 at OAK, pitched opposite Dallas Braden who threw a perfect game and the A's won, 4-0...his line: 6 IP, 11 H, 4 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 108 pitches, 72 strikes.
- + Last start: On July 27, 2011 at OAK, lost to Trevor Cahill and the A's 13-4...his line: 4 IP, 12 H, 10 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR, 80 pitches, 51 strikes... gave up 12 hits in 22 AB to Oakland hitters including 3 2B and 2 HR...14 of the 25 batters he faced reached safely...saw his ERA rise half a run (2.53 to 3.03).
