2011 SEASON

- + Spent the entire season with the Braves and appeared in 92 games, including 12 starts (7-3B, 5-2B)...also appeared in a game at 1B.
- + Hit .292/.393/.500 (7-for-24) against left-handed pitchers compared to .203/.304/.354 (16-for-79) vs. RHP.
- + Eight of his 23 hits and 2 of his 4 HR came in the month of June...went 8-for-19 (.421) in June but hit only .179 (15-for-84) the rest of the season.
- + Three of his 4 HR came as a pinch-hitter...was 13-for-62 (.210) as a pinch-hitter...on May 25 at PIT, delivered a pinch-hit 2-run homer in the 11th inning to win the game, 4-2...on June 16 vs. NYM, tagged Francisco Rodriguez for a pinch-hit, game-tying, 2-run homer in the 9th and the Braves won 9-8 in the 10th.
- + Non-tendered by Atlanta on Dec 12 and signed a minor league deal with Milwaukee on Jan 9, 2012.
- + Seven of his 8 HR came in the 7th inning or later, 6 of those coming in the 8th and 9th innings.
- + Twenty of his 39 hits went for extra bases...compiled a .487 slugging pct.
- + Became the first in Braves history to deliver two pinch-hit grand slams in one season...on May 20 vs. CIN—a game Atlanta trailed by 6 heading into the 9th inning—hit a pinch-hit, walk-off grand slam off Francisco Cordero for a 10-9 win...according to Elias, he became the first major leaguer to hit a pinch-hit, walk-off grand slam since HOU Gregg Zaun on June 27, 2002 vs. ARI and the first rookie to do so since CLE Ron Lolic on April 22, 1973 vs. BOS.
- + On July 24 at FLA slugged another pinch-hit grand slam, this time off Burke Badenhop...the blast was part of an 8-run 8th inning in a 10-5 victory.
- + Was named MLB Clutch Performer of the Month for May, batting .250 (6-for-24) with 3 HR, 9 RBI and 1 2B.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Of his 14 career home runs, 7 have come as a pinch-hitter..8 have come in the 8th inning or later...8 have either tied the game or taken the lead.
- + Is a career .289 (26-for-90) hitter with runners in scoring position.
- + In **2010** with Atlanta spent his first full season in the majors and made his first Opening Day roster...played in a career-high 103 games and set career highs in virtually every offensive category, including 8 HR and 33 RBI...made 24 starts (22-3B, 2-2B).
- + **POSTSEASON:** Appeared in all 4 games of the NLDS vs. the Giants...started Games 1, 2 and 3 at 2B in place of the injured Martin Prado...went 1-for-11 and committed 4 errors, including 3 miscues in Game 3.
- + In **2009** played in 30 games over two stints with the Braves after signing as a minor league free agent the previous November...had his contract purchased on July 3 and was optioned July 23...recalled on Sep 1 and remained in the majors through season's end...appeared in 12 games in the field (11-2B, 1-3B).

- + In his Braves debut on July 3 at WAS—the night he was called up—delivered a pinch-hit, 3-run homer off Jesus Colome in the 7th inning, breaking a 5-5 tie...it was his first career home run in his first plate appearance as a Brave...became the first Brave to knock a pinch-hit homer in his first plate app with the team since Chuck Tanner on April 12, 1955 vs. CIN.
- + Became the third rookie in Atlanta Braves history to homer in his first plate app for the team, joining Jordan Schafer (April 5, 2009 at PHI) and Jermaine Dye (May 17, 1996 vs. CIN).
- + Spent the remainder of the season with Triple-A Gwinnett, where he was named an International League All-Star.
- + Made his major league debut with Oakland in **2008** in his eighth professional season after signing a minor league deal with the A's the previous December...from July 21-31 appeared in 6 games for the A's, all starts (4-3B, 2-2B)...optioned on Aug 1 and spent the rest of the season with Triple-A Sacramento where he hit a career-high 28 HR.
- + Made his major league debut on July 21 at Tropicana Field, going 0-for-3 and starting at third base...recorded his first major league hit on July 25 vs. TEX, a single off Vicente Padilla.
- + Named Sacramento's Most Versatile Player and Best Teammate...led the club in homers, RBI, runs, doubles, triples, games and at-bats.
- + In **2007** spent his 7th and final season in the Astros system and played the entire year for Triple-A Round Rock...appeared in 123 games at 2B, 13 games at 3B and also made his pro debut as catcher...hit 22 HR and 70 RBI...led the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (144).
- + In **2006** with Triple-A Round Rock, led all of minor league baseball with 79 extra-base hits, including 40 2B, 15 3B and 24 HR...tied for 2nd in the minors in triples, ranked 4th in total bases (284) and tied for 9th with 100 runs scored...led the PCL in triples and runs scored...his 94 RBI tied a career high.
- + Split the **2005** season between Triple-A Round Rock (113 games) and Double-A Corpus Christi (22 games), batting a combined .259 with 23 HR and 68 RBI in 135 games...added a career-high 68 walks and 20 SB overall...in **2004** was named team MVP for Double-A Round Rock...was a midseason and postseason Texas League All-Star...led the TL in doubles (38) and sac flies (12), ranked 2nd in extra-base hits (57) and 4th in RBI (83).
- + Began the **2003** season at Class-A Lexington and was promoted to Class-A Salem on May 13...led Salem with 61 RBI...combined to hit .256 (124-for-485) with 14 HR, 72 RBI and

29 2B in 137 games...named a **2002** Midwest League All-Star for Class-A Michigan after hitting .287 (143-for-499) with 14 HR and 94 RBI...led MWL in triples (14) and tied for the lead in runs scored (94)...made his pro debut in **2001** with Short-A Pittsfield of the New York-Penn League...was named team MVP.

- + He and his wife, Jessie, reside in Gilbert, Ariz., with their son, Jaxon, and daughter, Reese.
- + Attended Arizona State University, where he played baseball from 1999-2001...hit .336 with 10 HR and 67 RBI as a sophomore as the Sun Devils reached the first round of the College World Series.
- + Spent two summers (1999, 2000) playing for the Alaska Goldpanners of Fairbanks...while there helped conduct baseball camps for Fairbanks kids.
- + Graduated from Monte Vista (Calif.) High School, where he played baseball and basketball.

X-RAY REPORT

- + In 2011 was chosen as the Diamondbacks recipient of the MLBPA Heart and Hustle Award for his passion, desire and work ethic both on and off the field.
- + Has more than 30 tattoos...his wife, Kim, bought him a tattoo machine for his birthday, although most of his body ink has been done by professionals...his nickname "Tatman" began last year when a D-backs fan held up a sign with the name, which Kim saw on TV and thought was perfect...the Japanese characters on the left side of his neck mean "family."
- + During a stint with the Reno Aces (Arizona's Triple-A affiliate) in 2010, he lived in the home clubhouse for several weeks to save money.

2012 SEASON

- + Acquired by the Rays from Arizona on July 24 in exchange for minor league 2B Tyler Bortnick... had been designated for assignment by the D-backs before the trade.
- + Hit .250/.306/.357 (63-for-252) with 6 HR, 34 RBI and 6 SB in 83 games for Arizona, including 63 starts (57-3B, 6-2B)...before the trade, batted .438 (7-for-16) in 9 games after the All-Star break and .344 (11-for-32) in July...hit only .236/.282/.359 (52-for-220) in 67 games through the end of June.
- + Hit .333 (6-for-18) as a pinch-hitter for Arizona, which ranked 7th in the NL at the time of the trade.
- + Is a career .333 hitter (9-for-27) with 1 HR, 3 2B and 22 RBI with the bases loaded.

2011 SEASON

- + Spent the entire year with Arizona and set career highs in several offensive categories, including doubles (25), home runs (19), RBI (65), slugging pct. (.427) and stolen bases (18)... played in a career-high 143 games (104 starts, 102-3B, 2-LF) and appeared in one game at SS.
- + Ranked 4th among NL third basemen in homers, trailing CHC Aramis Ramirez (26), SF Pablo Sandoval (21) and ATL Chipper Jones (18)...his .354 OBP was the third-highest mark ever by a D-backs third baseman.
- + On Sep 27 vs. LAD with Arizona trailing 6-3 in the 10th inning, hit his first career grand slam and first walk-off home run...according to Elias, he became the fourth player in major league history to hit an extra-inning grand slam with his team trailing by 3 runs...joined NYY Babe Ruth (1925), STL Roger Freed (1979) and NYY Jason Giambi (2002).
- + Batted .462 (6-for-13) with 15 RBI with the bases loaded, 10th best in the NL.
- + **POSTSEASON:** Hit .350 (7-for-20) with 2 HR and 6 RBI in the NLDS vs. MIL, starting all 5 games at 3B...hit the 2nd playoff grand slam ever by a D-backs player in Game 4, a 1st-inning blast off Randy Wolf...also homered in Game 1 off Yovani Gallardo.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Split the **2010** season between Triple-A Reno (94 games) and the D-backs (36 games)...recalled from Reno on May 25, optioned June 21 and recalled for a second time on Aug 24.

- + Delivered a walk-off, pinch-hit single on June 4 vs. COL.
- + Appeared at 6 different positions between the majors and minors, with the exception of CF, 1B and pitcher.
- + His 16 SB for Reno were a career high at the time.
- + In **2009** made his first Opening Day roster to begin his first season with Arizona, after signing a minor league deal the previous November...spent the entire season in the majors except for a 10-game stint in Reno, July 4-19...played in 110 games for the D-backs, including 72 starts (45-2B, 19-3B, 12-LF).
- + Hit .279 (85-for-305) with 17 doubles, 7 HR and 40 RBI with 7 SB.
- + Reached base via hit or walk in 15 consecutive games from Aug 22–Sep 7, batting .327 (18-for-55).
- + Appeared in one major league game for Texas in **2008** after signing as a free agent the previous November...played the remainder of the season for Triple-A Oklahoma City, where he hit .300 (136-for-453) with 10 HR, 66 RBI, 15 SB and 28 doubles...tied for 6th in the PCL with 8 triples.
- + Struck out in his only big league at-bat, on July 29 vs. SEA, part of a 3-day stint with the Rangers.
- + Hit 2 HR with 7 RBI, including a grand slam, on July 26 at Colorado Springs (Rockies).
- + Spent the majority of the **2007** season with Triple-A Syracuse (Blue Jays)...had two stints with Toronto, totaling 8 games, in April and May.
- + In **2006** was recalled by Toronto on July 30 and made his major league debut that day in Oakland as a defensive replacement at 2B...went 0-for-1...collected his first hit on Aug 3 at NYY, a solo homer off Cory Lidle...appeared in 9 games for the Blue Jays and was optioned on Aug 27...spent the remainder of the season with Syracuse, where he was named Toronto's Minor League Star of the Month in July.

- + Opened the **2005** season with Class-A Dunedin and was promoted to Double-A New Hampshire in May...combined to hit 24 HR with 79 RBI... named an Eastern League midseason All-Star and Toronto's Minor League Star of the Month for July and August.
- + In **2004** was named a South Atlantic League midseason All-Star for Class-A Charleston (WV.) and was promoted to Dunedin June 22... named Toronto's organizational Player of the Month for April...hit a combined 20 HR and collected a career-high 91 walks.
