RAY MATTER—Tampa Bay has won 3 of their last 4 games and are 5-3 on this 9-game, 3-city road trip (2-1 at BAL, 2-1 at LAA and 1-1 here) which ends today...last night's 8-0 win was the Rays 10th shutout, 3rd shutout of the trip, all coming in the last 4 games...Rays have pitched to a 1.78 ERA (75.2-IP, 48-H, 15-ER, 90-SO) and have been scored upon in only 8 innings of the trip...they have held the opposition to one run or less in all 5 wins...the Rays are batting .214 (60-for-281) on the trip...Rays are trying to win 3 consecutive series for the first time since winning 5 straight series, April 17-May 3.

- + The Rays were a season-high 10.5 games out of first place on July 18, but have picked up 4.0 games since then while going 7-5 and are now 6.5 GB, the closest they have been to first place since July 4...the Rays have pitched to a 1.70 ERA (116.2-IP, 68-H, 22-ER, 140-SO) during the last 12 games.
- The Rays are 19-25 since they were last in first place on June 11 and 35-41 since they were a season-high 11 games over .500 (19-8) on May 4.
- The Rays are 19-14 on the road since May 13...they are 15-22 at home during that same span.

MORE ON THE ROAD TRIP —The Rays are trying to do something they have done only 3 times in their history: win 3 series on a road trip, and they have never done it vs. 3 teams above .500.

NO SLOUCHES HERE -On this road trip the Rays have defeated 5 starters all with winning records who were a combined 37-22 (.627) before facing the Rays: Baltimore's Wei-Yin Chen (8-5) and Miguel Gonzalez (2-1); Los Angeles' C.J. Wilson (9-6) and Zack Greinke (9-3) and Oakland's Tommy Milone (9-7)...in the 5 wins, the Rays have allowed 2 runs, walked 4 and struck out 53...the Rays pitching lines from the 5 wins on the trip:

JULY WRAP.—The Rays finished July 13-13 (despite hitting .225) and didn't win or lose more than 2 in a row the entire month...their 3.03 ERA (240.2-IP, 81-ER) was their lowest ERA of any month in club history, besting the 3.06 ERA in August 2011, and ranked 3rd in the majors.

- + Rays pitchers finished July with a major-league-high 241 strikeouts in 240.2 innings...since 1921, only one team has more strikeouts in the month of July: the 1964 Indians who fanned 264 behind Sam Mc-Dowell's 44...James Shields (46 SO) and David Price (44) finished 2nd and 3rd in the majors in strikeouts in July behind Francisco Liriano (47), and marked the 2 highest July tallies in club history.
- The Rays were also one of two teams in the majors since 1921 with more strikeouts than innings pitched in the month of July...the other? The Brewers, also this July, with 238 SO in 234.1 IP.
- The Rays hit a major-league-low .225 in July...in club history, the Rays have had 3 months in which they batted under .230-and all 3 have come in the last 3 months: May (.227), June (.222) and July.

PUNCHOUTS APLENTY—The Rays have struck out 10 or more batters in 9 of the last 12 games and 12 of the last 17, for a total of 181 in 161.2 innings pitched...last night James Shields' 11-strikeout effort was the 10th time this season a Rays starter has struck out 10 or more, tops in MLB.

The Rays have fanned 32 batters in the first 2 games of this series, setting the club record for most strikeouts in consecutive games.

SHIELDS AND SHUTOUTS—Last night MOST SHUTOUTS, MLB. James Shields extended his club record with his career 7th shutout, all coming in the last 5 years...it was the first he has had in which he didn't allow a runner past first base...it's only the 5th time a Ray has not allowed a runner

past first base in a complete game...last time was Matt Garza's no-hitter on July 26, 2010 vs. DET...finally, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first Ray to to throw complete game with 3 hits or less, 10 strikeouts or more and no walks.

RAYS NO. 1 SINCE THE BREAK—Since the All-Star break, Rays pitchers lead the majors in team ERA (2.53), strikeouts (190) and lowest opponents batting average (.202) and are 9-9...in their last 37.1 innings the Rays bullpen has allowed only 2 runs and struck out 54...Rays relievers have worked 58.2 innings since the All-Star break and have been scored upon in only 5 of those innings...their 1.53 ERA (58.2-IP, 10-ER) since the break is tops in majors.

HITS ARE SCARCE—In the last 10 games (5-5), the Rays and their opponents have combined to hit .197 (133-for-674)...the Rays have batted .209 (72-for-344) and their opponents .184 (61-for-330)...overall, Rays opponents are batting just .238, lowest in the AL...Rays also led the AL in lowest opp avg. in 2010 and 2011...the last team to lead the AL in that category for three consecutive seasons was the 1983-85 Tigers.

RAYS DUBIOUS STREAK CONTINUES-

Last night was the Rays 25th game (19-6) of 10-plus hits, fewest in the majors...the Rays are batting .209 (72-for-344) over their

last 10 and are batting .231 on the season, 29th in the majors...the Rays rank between Oakland (.230) and Seattle (.233) as the bottom 3 teams in the majors in batting...in the DH era (since 1973), there has never been a season when the AL had the three lowest-hitting teams in the majors, and the 1981 Blue Jays (.226) are the only AL team to finish with a lower average...the were 6-for-14 with RISP last night after batting .188 (26-for-138) in the previous 17 games...Rays have 18 steals in their last 13 games and are on top of the AL for the 5th straight season.

BACK HOME—The Rays open a 6-game homestand on Friday against AL East foes Baltimore and Toronto...at 23-18 the Rays have the best interdivisional record among the AL East teams...Tampa Bay is 11-6 at home vs. the AL East...the Rays are 15-24 in their last 39 home games after starting the season 13-1 at Tropicana Field.

RAYS vs. A's - Rays are 2-3 this season... Oakland Coliseum is historically the Rays toughest AL port...the Rays are 20-47 (299) all-time here... they were 6-30 here prior to Manager Joe Maddon's arrival, but are 14-17 since...their overall mark vs. the A's of 50-84 (.373) is also the lowest winnning pct. vs. an AL foe, but the 2 teams are 25-25 since the start of the 2007 season.

RODNEY WHERE NO MAN HAS GONE BEFORE—Fernando Rodney has 30 saves and a 0.76 ERA...since the save became an official statistic

in 1969, no major league pitcher has ever finished the month of July with his current combination of saves and ERA...the closest to doing so were ATL John Smoltz (40, 0.81) in 2003 and Dennis Eckersley (32, 0.81) in 1990.

LIFE WITHOUT LONGO — 3B Evan Longoria (partially torn left hamstring) did not play in Durham's game last night and the Bulls are off today...he is next scheduled to play Thursday when the Bulls host Gwinnett (Braves)... he has played in 4 games for Durham on his current rehab assignment—all as the DH-and is 2-for-12 with 4 walks and 2 RBI...the Rays are 39-42 since Longoria has been out...they were 15-8 at the time he went on the DL...Rvan Roberts is the 8th different Ray to play 3B in Longoria's absence and the 9th overall, most by an AL team since the 2007 Blue Jays.

TODAY'S START & 2012 NOTES

- + 24-year-old makes his 13th start of the season, 22nd of his career...it will be his 6th start on the road this year.
- **+** Last start: On Fri at LAA, only allowed 3 runs in 7 innings but still took the loss opposite Dan Haren in a 3-1 defeat for the Rays...his line: 7 IP, 8 H, 3 R/ER, 0 BB, 3 SO, 93 pitches, 65 strikes...allowed all 3 runs in the 3rd inning, surrending 4 straight 2-out hits...retired 13 of the final 15 batters he faced.
- + Since winning his first 2 starts, has gone 2-8 with a 5.49 ERA (57.1-IP, 35-ER) over his last 10 starts.
- + During his current 3-game losing streak, the Rays offense has scored only 1 run with him on the mound...in his 8 losses this year, the Rays have only scored 8 total runs of support (1 run or less in 6 of those starts).
- + On June 17 vs. MIA, struck out 10 in 7 scoreless innings...in 6 starts since then, has gone 1-5 with a 6.25 ERA (31.2-IP, 22-ER), 43 hits and 11 BB...has allowed 1st-inning runs in 4 of those 6 starts.
- + Throws his change-up 39.3 pct. of the time, the highest rate among all pitchers in the majors...James Shields currently leads all qualifying AL pitchers but even he only throws it 30.0 pct. of the time.
- + Opposing lineups are batting .329 (23-for-70) against him with runners in scoring position this year...has held opponents to a .238 (36-for-151) avg. with the bases empty compared to a .342 (39-for-114) avg. with runners on base.
- + Has a 3.05 groundball/flyball (GB/FB) ratio, which leads the majors since his debut on May 19...though 60.2 pct. of the balls hit off him are groundballs, opposing lineups still have a .327 average on balls put in play (BAPiP), which would rank 5th-highest in the AL if he qualified.
- + Has only allowed 6 HR in 21 career major league starts (122 IP)...has never allowed a home run to a right-handed batter (214 PA).
- + Has given up multiple runs in an inning (2 or more) in 10 of his 12 starts this year including his last 6.
- + Has held the top half of the order (batters 1-thru-5) to a .264 avg. (42-for-159) this season...however the bottom half of the order (batters 6-thru-9) is batting .311 (33-for-106) against him.
- + On July 21 vs. SEA, left the game after the 2nd inning with a lower right leg contusion...X-rays were negative...the Rays bullpen threw 7 scoreless innings but the Mariners still won, 2-1.
- + On May 25 at BOS beat Jon Lester, 7-4...it was the first career start at Fenway Park for Cobb, who was born in Boston.
- + Made his season debut on May 19 vs. ATL, earning the win opposite Randall Delgado.
- + Was recalled from Triple-A Durham on May 19 to take injured Jeff Niemann's place in the rotation.
- + Was 1-4 with a 4.14 ERA (41.1-IP, 19-ER) in 8 starts at Triple-A Durham this season...allowed 2 runs or less in 6 of his 8 starts but had two outings where he allowed 6 ER on April 24 (4-IP, 6-ER) and May 9 (1.2-IP, 7-R, 6-ER) that significantly raised his ERA.
- + Recalled on April 15 and flew to Boston to join the big league club as a member of the team's bullpen...James Shields pitched 8.1 innings on April 16 and Cobb was optioned back to the minors the next day.

2011 & CAREER NOTES

- + Broke into the majors in 2011 by making 9 starts for the Rays over three stints...was unbeaten (3-0) over his first 7 ML starts, the first AL pitcher to do so since MIN Kevin Slowey in 2007 (8 starts) and the only Ray to do it.
- + Made his final start on Aug 6 vs. OAK and was removed after 4.1 IP with discomfort in his right hand, later found to be thoracic outlet syndrome... underwent season-ending surgery Aug 18 to remove a blood clot and blockage in the area of his first right rib.
- + Was selected in the fourth round of the 2006 June Draft...the Vero Beach, Fla., native served as a Dodgers bat boy during spring training for three years in high school.

COBB vs. ATHLETICS

In his only previous start against the A's, made his final start of the 2011 season on Aug 6 vs. OAK and was removed after 4.1 IP with discomfort in his right hand, later found to be thoracic outlet syndrome...allowed 5 R/ER in that start and saw his season ERA go from 2.79 to a season-ending 3.42... the Rays were shut out 8-0 as Brandon McCarthy threw 8 shutout innings...Cobb underwent season-ending surgery on Aug 18 to remove a blood clot and blockage in the area of his first right rib.

#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- + Ejected July 18 vs. CLE in the 7th inning by home plate umpire Dan lassogna, his first of the season and 24th as a Ray, extending his club record.
- + Is the longest-tenured and winningest manager in Rays history at 549-527 (.510)...has a 422-330 (.561) record since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival...overall is 568-537 (.514) in his career, including a 19-10 interim stint with the Angels in 1999.
- Two-time AL Manager of the Year (2008, 2011) is in his 7th season as Rays skipper...only three current major league managers have been at their posts longer: LAA Mike Scioscia (2000), MIN Ron Gardenhire (2002) and PHI Charlie Manuel (2005)...April 16 at BOS marked his 500th career win with the Rays...is 1 of 5 active managers with 500 wins with their current team...also Manuel, Scioscia, Gardenhire and DET Jim Leyland.
- Managed his 1,000th game with the Rays on May 5...became the 5th manager in the modern era to manage at least 1,000 games for one team without ever playing in the majors, joining BAL Earl Weaver, NYY Joe McCarthy, PIT Jim Leyland and PHI Danny Ozark.
- Earned 26 of 28 first-place votes from the BBWAA last fall in the Manager of the Year balloting...finished 3rd in 2010.

- + Recorded 3 hits yesterday for the second time in 7 games this season after being activated from the disabled list July 24...overall has gone 9-for-23 with 2 doubles, 2 RBI, 3 runs scored and a stolen base in 7 games (5 starts)...missed 96 games while recovering from surgery to repair ligaments in his right wrist...underwent surgery on April 3 and was expected to be out 4-5 months but came back in less than 3.
- Made 10 rehab appearances between Class-A Charlotte (5) and Triple-A Durham (5), hitting a combined .161 (5-for-31) with a double and 5 BB.
- Appeared in 9 spring training games and hit .217 (5-for-23) with 5 R, 5 BB and 2 SB before being sidelined with a right wrist injury on March 23.
- The 30-year-old spent his first full season in the majors in 2011, batting .240/.313/.360 (74-for-308) with 18 doubles, 5 triples and 20 stolen bases in 105 games...led the AL with 6 pinch-hits and led all AL pinch-hitters with 6 BB, 6 runs and a .571 OBP, all franchise records...his 21 plate apperances as a pinch-hitter were 2nd-most in the AL, behind only CWS/TOR Mark Teahen (27).
- + Was 1 of 3 finalists among AL left fielders for a Gold Glove in 2011 despite only making 76 outfield starts (68-LF, 4-CF, 4-RF).

- + Has just 5 hits in 29 at-bats (.172) in his last 7 starts since returning to the leadoff spot...despite the average, had a career-long 11-game on-base streak from July 18-29...of the 21 major league players with 200 or more at-bats out of the leadoff spot, ranks 18th in batting average (.228), 17th in OBP (.300) and 18th in SLG (.350)...was 10-for-30 in his previous 9 games (July 14-22) all from the 7-slot.
- Hit his 3rd career lead-off home run and second this season July 24 at BAL...it was his 2nd on the first pitch of the game (also Aug 28, 2011 at TOR).
- Tied for the team lead with 19 SB this season and ranks T-6th in the AL...his 95.0 SB pct. FRIDAY'S START & 2012 NOTES

- + Turned 23 on June 18...will be making 21st start this season, 13th at home.
- + Since June 3, has gone 6-2 with a 3.32 ERA (62.1-IP, 23-ER) in 10 starts...was 1-5 with a 4.76 ERA (56.2-IP, 30-ER) in 10 starts prior to that, and had lost 4 straight decisions entering June.
- **+** Last start: On Sat at LAA, combined with Jake McGee, Joel Peralta and Fernando Rodney to shut out the Angels, 3-0...The Rays scored a run in each of the first 3 innings off C.J. Wilson and Moore threw 6.1 scoreless innings...his final line: 6.1 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 6 SO, 1 HBP, 103 pitches, 72 strikes...held Mike Trout and Albert Pujols hitless in 5 AB.
- His 112 SO are 2nd among major league rookies behind TEX Yu Darvish (138)...only 6 other left-handers have ever finished their rookie season with a SO/9 IP ratio of 8.4 or higher: CLE Herb Score in 1955 (9.70), NYY Al Downing in 1963 (8.76), LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981 (8.42), STL Rick Ankiel in 2000 (9.98), CLE CC Sabathia in 2001 (8.53) and TB Scott Kazmir in 2005 (8.42).
- + When he throws at least 65 pct. of his pitches for strikes, he is 4-2 while the Rays are 5-3...when he throws less than 65 pct. of his pitches for strikes, he is 3-6 while the Rays are 4-8.
- + Is averaging 4.3 BB/9 IP, 5th-highest rate in the AL...has averaged 17.1 pitches per inning this year, 6th most in the AL
- + Has allowed 24 of his 57 walks this year with 2 outs, tied for 2nd-most two-out walks allowed in the AL behind only CLE Ubaldo Jimenez (29) and 1 ahead of teammate Jeremy Hellickson (23)...has walked every batter that has gotten to a 3-0 count against him this year (14 PA).
- + Opponents are hitting only .188 (29-for-154) with 0 outs in an inning but .268 (38-for-142) with 2 outs.
- + Since May 12, has held left-handed batters to a .172 avg. (11-for-64), 3rd-lowest among AL lefties in that span behind only BAL Brian Matusz (.169) and teammate David Price (.170)...prior to May 12, lefties were batting .429 (15-for-35) against him, highest in the majors among lefties.
- + According to FanGraphs.com, has averaged 94.6 mph on his fastball this season, 2nd highest among AL starters and 2nd among ML lefties behind teammate David Price (95.6 mph)...this ranks 4th among all ML starters behind WAS Stephen Strasburg (95.8), Price and CHC Jeff Samardzija (95.0)...has thrown fastballs 66.8 pct. of the time, 5th-highest mark in the AL.
- + Opponents swing and miss at 11.5 pct. of his total pitches, 3rd-highest mark in the AL behind only MIN/CWS Francisco Liriano (13.4) and DET Max Scherzer (11.8) and ahead of DET Justin Verlander (11.2) and NYY CC Sabathia (11.1).
- **Last home start:** On July 22 vs. SEA, took the loss despite only allowing 2 runs in 8 IP opposite Blake Beavan in a 2-1 loss...tossed a career-high 8 innings...after Jesus Montero's single with 1 out in the 3rd inning, retired 17 batters in a row to finish his outing...it his first career start without a walk...his final line: 8.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R/ER, 0 BB, 7 SO, 104 pitches, 72 strikes...recorded 7 SO, 3 with his change-up and 3 with his curveball.

- + Will make his 3rd career start vs. BAL (4th app)...is 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA (11.2-IP, 8-R, 4-ER).
- + Made his major league debut at Camden Yards last Sep 14, pitching 1.1 innings of relief and giving up 2 runs on 3 hits with 2 strikeouts.
- + On May 12 at BAL, took the loss after pitching a career-low 4.1 innings in a 5-3 defeat opposite Brian Matusz at Camden Yards...his line: 4.1 IP, 4 H, 4 R, 1 ER, 4 BB, 6 SO, 101 pitches, 56 strikes...the Rays defense committed 5 errors behind him.
- **+ Last start:** On June 3 vs. BAL, defeated Jake Arrieta, 8-4, for his first win since May 1...had gone 0-4 in his previous 5 starts...totaled 6 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 3 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 93 pitches, 62 strikes...fell behind 1-0 when Matt Wieters led off the 2nd with a homer...an unearned run scoerd in the 5th on Mark Reynolds' RBI single, scoring Endy Chavez who reached on an error by Elliot Johnson...exited with an 8-2 lead.
