The A's lead the season series, 3-2...split a two-game series in Oakland in May and won two of three in Toronto last week...have not won a season series since 2007 and are 18-24 against the Blue Jays since 2008...all-time, the A's are 201-174 against the Blue Jays...that includes 97-89 in Oakland, 104-83 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last 11 games and 10.1 innings pitched...he is tied for fifth in the American League in games pitched (49).

Yoenis Céspedes is batting 427 (32 for 75) with 16 runs, five home runs and 18 RBI since the All-Star Break...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in batting since the break...is tied for the AL lead in hits since the break, tied for second in runs, ranks third in RBI and tied for seventh in home runs.

Brandon Inge has an A's seasonhigh 11-game hitting streak...he is 13 for 48 (.271) with four home runs, nine RBI and 18 strikeouts during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1924** Joe Hauser becomes the second American Leaguer to hit three home runs in a game...he also adds a double for a then-record 14 total bases...in **1933** Mickey Cochrane hits for the cycle for the second time in his career but the A's lose to New York, 16-3...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a five-hit shutout as the A's defeat Kansas City 5-0...it follows a three-hit shutout by Ken Holtzman, which followed a two-hit shutout by Vida Blue.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last two games, their first losing streak since June 28-30 when they dropped three in a row...dropped two of three to Tampa Bay to start the homestand after going 6-0-1 over the previous seven series...had not lost a series since losing three of four at Texas June 28-July 1...have lost three of the last four games but are 19-6 since the start of July...trailed Texas by a season-high 13 games at the start of July but the Rangers have gone 10-14 over the stretch and the A's have gained 8½ games in the standings...are currently in third place in the American League West, 4½ games behind Texas...have the second Wild Card spot, trailing Los Angeles by ½ game but leading third place Baltimore, Detroit and Tampa Bay by 1½ games...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 12 days...had a season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1 but have gone 34-18 (.654) since then, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span...are 56-48 for the season, which is the A's best record after 104 games since 2005 when they were 58-46 (won game 105 in 2005)...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 33 days in second, 10 days tied for second, 53 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...had their season-high seven-game winning streak snapped a week ago today in Toronto.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 13-5 since the All-Star Break, which is the **best record in the American League** and second best in the majors (Cincinnati, 16-3)...the pitching staff has issued the fewest walks in the majors (39) and has the second most strikeouts in the AL (152)...ranks third in the AL with a 3.73 ERA (70 er in 169.0 ip)...the offense ranks second in triples (6), third in home runs (30) and slugging (.453) and fourth in runs (96)...also has the most strikeouts (178).

IN JULY: The A's finished July with a 19-5 (.792) record to set a **franchise record for winning percentage in July**...the previous mark was .788 (26-7) by the 1931 Philadelphia A's...it was the fourth best record in any month in Oakland history and the eighth best in franchise history...it was the best record in July by an AL team since New York went 23-6 (.793) in 1956...it was the best month by any team since St. Louis went 20-5 (.800) in July, 2004 and the best record in any month by an AL team since the A's went 24-4 (.857) in August, 2002...the 19 wins were the A's most in a month since going 21-6 in August, 2006...the A's tied for second in the AL in triples this month (7) and ranked third in home runs (36), slugging (.437) and strikeouts (225)...the home runs were the A's most in one month since hitting 36 in August, 2007...the pitching staff issued the fewest walks in the AL in July (50) and ranked third in ERA (3.14)...averaged 1.97 walks per nine innings, marking the **first time since at least 1916** that the A's issued fewer than two walks per nine innings in a month of at least 15 games...had 201 strikeouts, the ninth time in Oakland history the A's struck out at least 200 in a month.

PITCHING: The A's **lead the American League** and rank fourth in the majors with a 3.46 ERA...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (88), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.373), the third lowest batting average (.243) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.307)...rank third in the AL in shutouts (9) but have the third fewest strikeouts (707)...A's starting pitchers have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (62) and rank second with a 3.77 ERA (264 er in 630.0 ip).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored one run or fewer in three of the last four games and rank last in the American League with 415 runs for the season...have been shutout a Major League leading 12 times, but just once over the last 50 games...have struck out 65 times in the last five games, including an Athletics record 21 on Monday...have 861 for the season, which is second most in the AL...rank last in the majors in batting (.229)...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.303) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.382)...have hit 64 home runs in 43 games since June 12, which is third most in the majors behind the Yankees (73) and Pirates (70)...have 113 home runs for the season, which is four more than the A's season total from 2010 and one short of the season total from last year.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading 12th walk-off win of the season Monday night...that is tied for the second highest single season total in Oakland history...the record is 15 in 2004...have two "walk-off" wins in the last four home games, three in the last six, seven in the last 14 and nine in the last 19...11 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI...that includes five by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...are now 18-9 in games decided in the last at bat and lead the majors in last at bat wins...are 22-20 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND EXTRA INNINGS: Each of the A's last seven home wins and nine of the last 10 have been by one run...have a nine-game winning streak in one-run games, which is their longest since they had an Oakland record tying 11-game streak in 2000 (May 31-July 17)...are 17-12 (.586) in one-run games for the season, which is the third best record in the American League...are tied for third in one-run wins...are 8-2 (.800) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the second best record.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on their longest homestand of the season, a 10-game stand against Tampa Bay (1-2), Toronto (four games) and Los Angeles (three games)...following this homestand, the A's play 30 of their final 51 games on the road...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped Tuesday night...have won 12 of the last 16 home games, 20 of the last 28 and are 30-23 (.566) at home for the season...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Toronto (2-1) and Baltimore (2-1) and have won eight of the last 10 road games...are 26-25 (.510) on the road...the pitching staff has a 2.92 ERA (163 er in 502.2 ip) at home compared to 4.07 (199 er in 439.2 ip) on the road...the home ERA is the lowest in the American League while the road ERA ranks seventh.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 9-4 during this stretch of 17 consecutive games against American League East teams that began July 19 and concludes with this four-game series against Toronto...are 18-12 against the East this year, which is the second best record by any AL team (Texas, 14-7).

ROOKIES: A's rookie pitchers have 27 of the team's 56 wins...the only times in Oakland history rookies have combined for more wins is in 2009 (44) and 1983 (38)...have used 10 rookie pitchers, which is tied for second most in Oakland history...the record is 12 in 2009...have employed 17 rookies total, which is the most in the majors and three more than the A's season total last year...currently have nine rookies on the roster.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season, his sixth since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 11-9 (.550) in his starting assignments and his teams are 208-163 (.561) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in nine of his 20 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 12 times.

BRIEFLY: Went 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA in five starts in July...had the 10th lowest July ERA in the American League...is now 3-3 with a 2.89 ERA (18 er in 56.0 ip) and .264 (58 for 220) opponents batting average over his last nine starts since June 1...went 3-2 with a 2.53 ERA and .214 opponents batting average over his first six starts in March and April and was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last six

starts and 15 of 20 for the season...has walked just 20 batters and his average of 1.46 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...walked Ian Kinsler July 17, his only non-intentional walk of a right-handed hitter since September 27, 2011 against Tampa Bay (Longoria)...has issued 18 of his 20 walks to left-handed hitters...has 78 strikeouts and his 3.90 strikeout to walk ratio ranks fourth in the AL...is averaging 14.2 pitches per innings and 87.8 pitches per game, both of which are second lowest in the AL.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in 12 of his 20 starts and his season run support average of 3.42 (47 rs in 123.1 ip) is second lowest in the American League (Masterson, CLE 3.30)...has received two runs of support or fewer in all eight of his losses and has six runs of support total in those games (6 rs in 42.1 ip, 1.28 RSA)...is 6-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...the A's have been shutout in three of his starts.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 15 home runs...however, all of his home runs have been solo shots as have 42 of his 49 over his last three seasons...12 have been hit by left-handed hitters as have 37 of his 49 over his last three years...nine have been hit by a batter leading off a inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-6 with a 4.64 ERA (34 er in 66.0 ip) in 11 starts at home compared to 5-2 with a 2.81 ERA (18 er in 57.2 ip) in nine starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in home losses...ranks second in the AL in road ERA...over the last two years, he is 6-11 with a 4.66 ERA (72 er in 139.0 ip) in 24 games in his home ballparks compared to 9-7 with a 3.20 ERA (53 er in 149.0 ip) in 25 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .237 (40 for 169) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .340 (54 for 159) the second time and .255 (42 for 165) after that...has allowed a .325 (26 for 80) average with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .393 (22 for 56) batting average to the opponents number three hitter, which is the second highest mark in the American League.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with a strained right oblique...it was his ninth career stint on the DL...was reinstated July 3 and is 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA (10 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts since his return.

ACTIVE LEADERS: Ranks fifth among active pitchers in complete games (32), eighth in wins (168), tied for eighth in shutouts (9), ninth in strikeouts (1820) and 10th in game started (371).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 168 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (371), innings pitched (2364.2) and strikeouts (1820).

39 YEARS OLD: Celebrated his 39th birthday on May 24...is just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to start a game at age 39 or older...the other four are Tommy John (42 in 1985), Tom Candiotti (41 in 1999), Don Sutton (40 in 1985) and Jim Perry (39 in 1975).

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Yielded seven earned runs in an 8-7 loss to Seattle *April* **7**, his most since July 6, 2007 at New York (AL)...combined with Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Seattle *April* **13**...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three hits while walking one...combined with De Los Santos on a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles *April* **18**...tossed eight innings and allowed all four of the hits...threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point, the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss to Chicago *April* **23** in Oakland...blanked the White Sox on three walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to 18.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Baltimore *April* **29**...left with a 2-0 lead and one out in the ninth inning with runners on first and second but Balfour blew the save and took the loss...combined with Brian Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas *June* **6** in Oakland...left his start *June* **17** against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Baltimore last Saturday...scattered seven hits over 5.2 innings but did not allow a run...had a runner in scoring position in four of his six innings but allowed just one runner as far as third base...left with a 5-0 lead and Scribner allowed a Markakis home run in the ninth.

COLÓN vs. TORONTO: Is 9-5 with a 4.35 ERA (147.0 ip, 149 h, 82 r, 71 er, 45 bb, 124 so, 16 hr) in 23 career appearances, all starts...that includes 5-3 with a 4.60 ERA (38 er in 74.1 ip) in 12 starts in Toronto and 4-2 with a 4.09 ERA (33 er in 72.2 ip) in 11 starts in his home ballparks...has not faced the Blue Jays this year...went 1-2 with a 7.99 ERA (23.2 ip, 32 h, 26 r, 21 er, 10 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in five starts last year with New York...last faced Toronto September 17 at Rogers Centre and had a no decision in a 7-6 Yankees win...allowed four runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Rasmus, a RBI groundout by Lawrie, a RBI double by Molina and a McCoy sacrifice...yielded two more runs in the fourth on a two-run double by McCoy and left after four innings trailing 6-1...New York scored four times in the sixth and twice in the seventh for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Dan Straily (0-0, --- ERA): Is scheduled to be selected from Triple-A Sacramento tomorrow and make his Major League debut...will become the 44th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut, the second this year (Griffin, June 24 vs. SF)...combined for an 8-6 record and a 2.60 ERA in 22 starts with Double-A Midland and Sacramento...struck out 175 batters in 138.1 innings, an average of 11.39 per nine innings...leads all of Minor League Baseball in strikeouts...ranks ninth among full season minor leaguers with a .197 opponents batting average...was 3-4 with a 3.38 ERA in 14 starts with Midland and 5-2 with a 1.36 ERA in eight starts with Sacramento...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...is 34-25 with a 3.68 ERA in 94 games, 87 starts, over four professional seasons...has 544 strikeouts in 506.0 innings, an average of 9.68 per nine innings

HLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Save/Save Opportunities: 25/37 (67.6%) The A's bullpen leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.82 ERA...has the lowest opponents batting average (.206) and slugging percentage (.330) in the majors and has the third lowest on-base percentage (.296)...leads the AL in wins (19) and has allowed the second fewest home runs (26) but has issued the second most walks (137)...has 160 strikeouts in 159.0 innings over its last 54 games since May 29 (9.1 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings).

BRETT ANDERSON

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

DARIC BARTON

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento June 2.

JERRY BLEVINS

• Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.
- Had reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow June 19...the surgery
 was performed in New York City by Dr. David Altchek, medical director of the New York Mets.

CHRIS CARTER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 after batting .279 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI in 72 games with the River Cats.
- Homered in each of his first two games with the A's and three of his first four...including July 6
 against Seattle when he hit the pinch-hit game-ending home run in the 11th inning...is the first
 rookie in Athletics history with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run and the 10th player in Oakland
 history with a pinch-hit game-ending home run...he is the first Athletic with a pinch-hit "walk-off"
 home run in extra innings since Paul Lehner on April 22, 1950 against Boston.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field... doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs,

NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.

- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career... the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.
- Had his first career game-ending hit June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), a three-run "walk-off" home run.
- Had the first two four-hit games of his career July 15 at Minnesota and July 20 against New York.
- Was named American Leage Player of the Week July 16 for the week ending July 15 after going 8 for 14 (.571) with five runs, a double, two home runs and six RBI in the three-game series at Minnesota.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from July 8 to 21...was 19 for 33 (.576) with two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, eight runs scored, six multiple hit games and a 1.000 slugging percentage during the streak.

BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.
- Threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point during the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...that was the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998.
- Was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May...based on a minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest single-month mark of his career and the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).
- Left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with the injury... was reinstated July 3.

RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.
- Was the only A's player named to the American League All-Star team and pitched a perfect seventh inning, striking out Harper and Wright...it was his first career All-Star selection...he is the seventh Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team, along with Wayne Gross (1977), Matt Keough (1978), Jose Canseco (1986), Mark McGwire (1987), Ben Grieve (1998) and Andrew Bailey (2009).

COLLIN COWGILL

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0 for 4 with three walks in three games before he was optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Was recalled by Oakland May 11
- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 with a sprained left ankle...began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 9 and went 1 for 8 (.125) in two games before he was transferred to Sacramento July 12...went 3 for 18 (.167) with a RBI in four games with the River Cats before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 17.

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.
- Stole three bases June 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was his fifth career game of three or more steals, his fourth with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (45) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more three-steal games.
- Was caught stealing after being picked off in the first inning June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), his first caught stealing since July 10, 2011 at Texas...that ended his Athletics record streak of 36 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing (caught stealing became an official stat in 1920)... broke the previous mark of 28 set by Stan Javier (May 31-October 1, 1995).
- Led off the game with a home run June 27 at Seattle and July 3 against Boston...now has four leadoff home runs as an Athletic and six in his career...the four with the A's are tied for fourth most in Oakland history.
- Finished the game July 3 with a "walk-off" sacrifice fly, his third career game-ending RBI (last: August 14, 2007 against Tampa Bay)...it was the 21st game-ending sacrifice fly in Oakland history, the first since Dan Johnson on May 15, 2007 against Kansas City...is the first Athletic with a leadoff home run and walk-off RBI in the same game since Rickey Henderson on August 12, 1992 against Chicago.
- · Had his third career two-homer game July 25 at Toronto.

FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).
- Was traded to Milwaukee July 29 for George Kottaras.

JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.
- Drew his first walk of the season June 13 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 30 consecutive games without a walk dating back to September 22, 2010...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since

Scott Hemond had a 31-game streak from May 3 to July 2, 1994...it was his first walk since September 19, 2010 at Minnesota.

• Was batting .182 in 19 games during his second stint with the A's when he was optioned to Sacramento June 21.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

• Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings that day against San Diego before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 21.
- Was recalled a third time July 13 when Jim Miller went on the paternity list but was optioned back to Sacramento July 16 without appearing in a game.

BRIAN FUENTES

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).
- Had a 2.84 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first 19 appearances through May 27... then went 0-2 with a save, two blown saves, a 19.50 ERA and .452 opponents batting average over his final seven outings.
- Was designated for assignment on July 3 and released July 11.

GRAHAM GODFREY

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.
- Hit the game-winning pinch-hit two-run home run in the seventh inning June 16 against San Diego, his third career pinch hit home run (last: June 28, 2008 at Pittsburgh)...it snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter and was his first pinch hit since August 29, 2010 against Chicago (NL).
- Hit his third career grand slam July 13 at Minnesota, his first since August 7, 2007 at Detroit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning to finish with five RBI...it was his third career game of five or more RBI, his first since June 12, 2010 against Kansas City when he had a career-high six.
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, the seventh time he has reached the 10-home run plateau in his career.

A.J. GRIFFIN

• Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 and made his Major League debut that day with a start against San Francisco.

BRANDON HICKS

- · Was claimed off waivers from Atlanta March 13 and was optioned to Sacramento March 15.
- Recalled by Oakland June 23 after batting .272 with 13 home runs and 48 RBI in 65 games with the River Cats... was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in hit by pitches (7) at the time of his promotion...also ranked second in strikeouts (76), fifth in extra base hits (37), tied for sixth in doubles (21), eighth in home runs (13), ninth in runs (49) and 10th in RBI (48) and slugging (.548).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts July 13 at Minnesota ... it was the first four strikeout game of his career.
- Hit his first Major League home run July 18 against Texas, a "walk-off" shot off Michael Kirkman in the bottom of the ninth inning...became the fourth player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run, the second this year (Derek Norris, June 24)...the other two are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).

LUKE HUGHES

• Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin... it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his two-game rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008,

the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.
- Was placed on the paternity list July 13 and reinstated July 16.

TOMMY MILONE

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).
- Combined with Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970).
- Was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles May 21 in Oakland...became the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum.

BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.
- Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.
- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota, August 12-14, 1996.
- Matched his career-high with three hits (fifth time, first since June 20, 2009 at Colorado) and three RBI (fourth time, second time this year: June 12 at Colorado) June 14 at Colorado.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).
- Hit six home runs in interleague play, which tied for fifth in the majors and matched the Oakland interleague record set by Miguel Tejada in 2000.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 11-17...batted .348 with three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first Player of the Week award.
- Committed three errors in the sixth inning June 23 against San Francisco, tying the Major League
 record for most errors by a first baseman in an inning...it was the seventh time, the first since Jack
 Clark did it for St. Louis on May 25, 1987...since 1984, the only other Athletic to commit three errors in an inning is Kurt Abbott on May 10, 1998 vs. Chicago at shortstop.
- The three errors set an Oakland record for errors in a game by a first baseman...is the first Athletics first baseman to commit three errors in a game since Lou Limmer on August 19, 1954 vs. New York.
- Tied for eighth in the AL with seven home runs in June.
- Hit his 10th home run in his 24th game on July 4 at Boston...in Athletics history, only Dave Kingman reached 10 home runs in fewer than his first 24 games with the club (19 in 1984).

• Had the game-ending single in the bottom of the ninth inning July 20 against New York, his third career walk-off hit (last: July 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee).

JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder... made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.
- Recorded his first Major League win July 6 against Seattle when he struck out the side in the 11th inning of the A's 4-1 win.

DEREK NORRIS

- Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut...made his Major League debut with a start at catcher that day against Los Angeles (NL) and went 0 for 3.
- Singled off Madison Bumgarner in the fifth inning June 23 against San Francisco for his first Major League hit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning for his first RBI and first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run June 24 against San Francisco, a three-run "walk-off" shot in the bottom of the ninth off Santiago Casilla...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run...the other two are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).

JARROD PARKER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over
 the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a
 run in the ninth inning for the blown save.
- Earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

CLIFF PENNINGTON

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday... is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 20 with left elbow tendinitis...had the lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.282) and the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage (.259) when he went on the DL.

ANTHONY RECKER

• Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).
- Matched his career-high with four strikeouts June 29 against the Dodgers (August 4, 2009 at Tampa Bay).
- Had the game-ending RBI double July 8 against Seattle, his second career "walk-off" hit...the other was a single on August 7, 2011 against New York.

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned back to Sacramento June 16.

TYSON ROSS

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.
- Returned on June 16 to start against San Diego and allowed two runs on one hit and four walks in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint June 23 and went 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA in two starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 29.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 15 against San Diego and recorded his first Major League save in the A's 10-2 win.
- · Was optioned to Sacramento June 16 but returned to Oakland June 24.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, his fourth consecutive season with double figures in home runs.

ERIC SOGARD

- · Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21 but returned to Oakland June 16...appeared in just one game before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 24.
- · Recalled a third time July 20 when Pennington went on the disabled list.

KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).
- Snapped a career-high 78-game homerless streak July 22 against New York...his previous high was 56 games from July 29-October 2, 2010...it was his first homer since September 15, 2011 against

Detroit...the home run also snapped a career-high streak of 17 consecutive games without a RBI (previous: 16, July 28-August 14, 2008).

RICH THOMPSON

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

NEIL WAGNER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
- Was claimed off waivers by San Diego May 28.

JEMILE WEEKS

- Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span... since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
- Went 0 for 3 April 14 at Seattle, snapping a 20-game road hitting streak dating back to August 24 of last year...hit .349 (30 for 86) during the streak, which tied for second longest in Oakland history and fell two short of the record of 22 set by Mike Davis from April 22 to June 17, 1987.
- Stole his 10th base of the season May 15 at Los Angeles (AL)...is the fifth player in Oakland history
 to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first two seasons, the first since Jason McDonald in 1997.
- Had two RBI June 4 against Texas, snapping a career-high 25-game streak without an RBI.
- Had the first three-walk game of his career June 19 against Los Angeles (NL).
- Went a career-high 35 consecutive games without a stolen base from May 16 to June 25.
