OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics recorded their **Major League leading** 13th walk-off win of the season...that is the second highest single season total in Oakland history...the record is 15 in 2004...have the first Wild Card Spot, 1½ games ahead of Los Angeles and two games ahead of Detroit and Tampa Bay...have had at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 14 days...are 3-2 on this 10-game homestand against Tampa Bay (1-2), Toronto (2-0) and Los Angeles (three games).
- Tonight's 15-inning game matched the A's longest this season (also Monday vs. Tampa Bay, 4-3 win).
- The A's hit two home runs and now have 116 for the season, which is two more than their season total from last year.
- Dan Straily** was selected from Triple-A Sacramento today and made his Major League debut...became the 11th rookie pitcher to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is one short of the Oakland record of 12 set in 2009.
- Yoenis Cespedes** (2 for 3) left the game in the eighth inning with a right wrist sprain.
- Coco Crisp** (2 for 5) hit a walk-off sacrifice fly, his second this season and his third game-ending RBI of the year...it is his fifth career game-ending RBI.
- Brandon Inge** (1 for 6) extended his hitting streak to 13 games, which is an on-going A's season high and matches his career high (Sept. 3-17, 2004 and April 13-28, 2005)...is 15 for 57 (.263) with four home runs and 11 RBI during his current streak.

- The Toronto Blue Jays are on a six-game losing streak, their longest since losing nine in a row May 19-27, 2009...are 3-5 in extra inning games...are 23-32 on the road this season...are 0-5 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (0-3), Oakland (0-2) and Tampa Bay (three games).
- Tonight's 15-inning game was the Blue Jays second longest this year (April 5 at Cleveland, 16 innings, 7-4 win).
- Brett Cecil** is 0-3 with a 4.56 ERA (12 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts since the All-Star Break.
- Edwin Encarnacion** (0 for 4) had a career-high tying three walks (third time, last: Aug. 16, 2011 at Seattle)...is 2 for 19 (.105) on the road trip.
- Brett Lawrie** (0 for 1) was removed from the game in the first inning with tightness in his rib cage.
- Jeff Mathis** (1 for 5) hit a game-tying three-run homer in the ninth inning...of his 26 hits this year, 14 are for extra bases (eight doubles, six home runs).
