<u>THE LATEST</u>: Tonight, Angels play the eighth game of a 10-game (3-4) road trip against three of the A.L.'s top teams: **Texas** (2-2), **Chicago** (1-2) and **Oakland** (8/6-8)...Since pulling within -3.0 of Texas, Angels have dropped four of five games to fall to -6.0 back...**Angel pitchers have surrendered 43 runs over last five games (12 HRs)**...LAA is 3-6 in last nine games and 10-13 since the All-Star break...<u>Since April 28th, Halos are 52-37, second best record in A.L. in span</u>...**LAA is 40-27 over last 67 contests (18-24 over first 42 games)**...<u>Following this road trip, 29 of Halos' next 44 games will be at Angel Stadium</u>...35 of Angels' last 53 games are against American League contenders.

<u>BATTING BITS:</u> LAA has 10 or more hits in 54 games (56 such games in '11)...<u>LAA ranks third in MLB in '12 batting</u> .271...**Halos have totaled 16 HRs last seven games**...LAA has 131 HRs in 2012 (totaled 155 HRs in 2011).

<u>PLAYER OF THE WEEK:</u> Today, Albert Pujols was named American League Player of the Week for period ending August 5th...<u>This marks the 12th weekly honor in Pujols' career (first W/ LAA)</u>...For the week, he batted .424 (14-for-33) with five doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI and nine runs scored in seven games played.

<u>BULLPEN STRUGGLES:</u> Halos' bullpen has been touched for a 9.70 ERA (21.1 IP - 23 ER) through seven games this <u>road trip</u>...The 'pen has posted a 6.02 ERA (64.1 IP - 43 ER) in 23 games since the All-Star Break (3.16 ERA before ASB)...Halos' last four losses have been charged to the bullpen.

<u>THE ACE</u>: Jered Weaver (14-1, 2.29) has won eight straight starts, second longest win streak in MLB this season (Dickey, 11 games)...Weaver has matched a career-best with nine consecutive victories (11 starts), originally set at start of his career, May 27-Aug. 18, 2006...<u>Halos are 16-3 in his 19 starts in 2012.</u>

<u>TORIID</u>: Torii Hunter has hits in 13 of last 14 games with an AB...He is batting .414 (24/58) with 13 RBI in the stretch...His current .294 season average is highest since May 6 (.294).

<u>FLYING MACHINE</u>: Pujols has six home runs & 13 RBI through seven games this trip...Since the ASB, he leads MLB with 10 HRs and ranks second in span with 25 RBI...Since May 1, Pujols leads MLB with 72 RBI and ranks T3rd in MLB in span with 24 HRs.

ELITE COMPANY: Pujols has 1,405 career RBI, just the fourth player in MLB history to reach 1,400 RBI thru first 12 campaigns (Joe DiMaggio, Al Simmons and Lou Gehrig).

<u>@ OAKLAND:</u> A's lead 2012 season series 5-4 with 10 matchups remaining...<u>LAA has won last two games in Oakland and four of last five here</u>...Angels are 13-9 in last 22 meetings at Angel Stadium vs. A's but are 5-7 in last 12 games at Oakland...LAA was 8-11 vs. A's in 2011, just second season series loss to the club since 2003 (9-10 in 2007).

CATCH OF THE MONTH: Mike Trout (.392, 32 R, 10 HR, 23 RBI) was named A.L. Player of the Month and A.L. Rookie of the Month for July...Trout is the first A.L. player ever to win Player of the Month & Rookie of the Month in the same month...Marked Trout's third consecutive monthly rookie honor...Only other player to win three straight Rookie of the Month awards was Ichiro Suzuki in April, May & June 2001...With 32 runs scored last month, Trout tied Hal Trosky (CLE, 1934) for the all-time MLB rookie runs record for July (32)...Trout set the A.L. record for July home runs (10) by a rookie and tied the Angels' club record for rookie HRs in any month by Wally Joyner in May 1986...Trout's .804 slugging pct. in July led MLB.

<u>SLIPPERY FISH:</u> Trout has swiped 24 consecutive stolen bases to set a new club record previously held by **Gary Pettis** (1985, 22 straight)...**Trout** was last caught stealing 6/4 vs. Seattle and leads MLB with 33 SBs.

ROOK OF AGES: LAA was 6-14 when Trout joined team on April 28th, LAA is 52-37 since....He leads A.L. rookies in every offensive category and MLB rookies in most as well...Since May 1st, the 20 year-old leads MLB with 86 runs (21 multi-run games) and ranks second in MLB in hits (120) and times on base (159)...Trout is averaging 1.0 runs per game - only two qualifying players in their age-20 season (or younger) have ever finished a season with a run-scoring rate at least as .95 runs per: Alex Rodriguez in 1996, and John McGraw in 1893...Trout scored a run in 15 consecutive games (July 5-23)...The streak tied the modern MLB rookie record and set a new A.L. rookie mark...The streak also established an Angels' franchise record...Trout is just the second player in MLB history to hit .350 or above with at least 15 HR and 30 SB before Aug. 1 (ended month at .353 with 18 HRs and 31 SBs)...Rickey Henderson (1985) is only other player to do so (.352, 16 HR, 47 SBs)...Trout is currently leading the A.L. in average (.346) and stolen bases (33)...Only two players in the last 63 years have led a league in both categories: Ichiro Suzuki in 2001 and Jackie Robinson in 1949...No MLB player has ever had a .340 BA. 20 HR. 40 SB in one season. all well within reach for Trout (ESPN STATS).

MEN OF THE MIDWAY: In his first 81 games, Trout scored 80 runs...With 55 RBI, combined for 135 runs plated in 81 games...<u>The last rookie</u> to do this was **DiMaggio** (87, 83) in 1936 (ELIAS)...Only one other player since 1920 has had as many hits (116), RBI (55) and SBs (31) in his first 81 games of a season as **Trout** has had through his first 81 George Sisler in 1922 (ELIAS).

<u>CUBAN MISSLES:</u> On Monday at Texas, **Kendrys Morales** became *just the third player in MLB history* to homer from both sides of the plate in the same inning when he did so in the sixth frame (2-run & slam)...The other are **Carlos Baerga** (CLE, 1993) and **Mark Bellhorn (BOS**, 2002).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP JERED WEAVER

14-1, 2,29

In search of 10th *straight victory*

- Earned ninth straight win in last start, July 31st at Texas, his eighth victory in as many starts, setting a new career-best passing the mark he set in his first seven big league starts in 2006.
- Went 6-0 in August, becoming just the 8th AL pitcher since 1921 to go 6-0 or better in July...First Angel pitcher to win 6+ games in a calendar month since Chuck Finley won seven games in July of 1997.
- Has registered the victory in all eight starts since returning from the DL (Missed 19 games May 29-June 20, lower back strain and spasms)... Angels are 11-0 in his last 11 starts and 16-3 overall.
- Among league leaders, ranks tied for first in wins (Price), first in ERA and second in opponents average (.202).
- Owns an 8-0 record with a 0.92 ERA at home, compared to a 6-1 mark with a 3.55 ERA on the road.
- Allowed two earned runs or less in 10 of last 11 starts and 15 of 19 starts overall.
- VS. OAKLAND: Making 23rd career start vs. Oakland, third start of 2012...Is 1-0 with a 0.61 ERA in 2011...In last seven starts, owns a 4-1 record with a 1.20 ERA (52.2 IP - 7 ER)...Is 7-7 lifetime with a 2.63 ERA (144 IP - 42 ER).
- APPROACHING 100: Weaver sits four wins shy of becoming just the sixth pitcher in Angels history to win 100 games with the club...With just 48 losses, his current .667 winning percentage is on pace to lead the group at the time of his 100th victory (Lackey currently leads at .588).

FIRST-HALF RECAP:

- Finished first-half 10-1 with a 1.96 ERA, becoming first pitcher since Sandy Koufax (1963-64) to tally 10+ firsthalf wins and a sub 2.00 ERA in consecutive seasons.
- Earned third consecutive All-Star selection, becoming first Halo to get nod three straight seasons since V. Guerrero (2005-07)...Pitched one scoreless frame (1 BB).
- Registered two scoreless inning streaks of 20+ IP (21.2 IP; April 21-May 7 & 20.2 IP; June 27 July 7)
- Recorded 90th career victory, June 27th at Baltimore, becoming just the sixth Halo to reach plateau with the club...At 90-48, his .652 winning percentage is the highest by any Angel at the time of their 90th win.
- Tossed first career no-hitter, May 2nd vs. Minnesota (see box below) and earned first career American League Player of the Week Award.
- Became just third Angels' pitcher in club history to not allow a single ER in four of first six starts of a season, joining Nolan Ryan ('78) and Rudy May ('73) Stats.
- On April 16, defeated Oakland 6-0, striking out Josh Reddick in sixth inning for 1,000th career strikeout, becoming just the eighth Angel to record 1,000+ strikeouts with the club...Joined brother Jeff as just sixth brother tandem in MLB history to record 1,000 strikeouts each.
- CAREER NOTES: His 1,069 strikeouts are 8th on the Angels' all-time list behind teammate Ervin Santana (1,115)...ls 96-48 with nine complete games, five shutouts and a 3.21 ERA in 193 starts...Married this offseason to Kristin Travis, November 12, 2011.

-WEAVER SPINS A NO-NO-

On May 2nd, Jered Weaver tossed his first career no hitter vs. the Minnesota Twins at Angel Stadium.

- 10th overall and ninth individual no-no in Angels history.
- First Angels no-hitter since Ervin Santana, July 27, 2011 in Cleveland.
- Sixth Angels no-hitter thrown at Angel Stadium, first since a combined no-hitter by Mark Langston and Mike Witt, April 11, 1990 vs. Seattle.
- First individual no-no at the Big A since Nolan Ryan, June 5, 1975 vs. Baltimore
- Second no-hitter in MLB this season (Humber perfect game) and 250th in MLB regular season history.
