THE LATEST: Happy 21st Birthday today to rookie Mike Trout... Tonight, the Angels play the ninth game of a 10-game (4-4) road trip against three of the A.L.'s top teams: Texas (2-2), Chicago (1-2) and Oakland (8/6-8; 1-0)...LAA is 4-6 in last 10 games and 11-13 since the All-Star break...Since April 28th, Halos are 53-37, best record in A.L. in span...LAA is 41-27 over last 68 contests (18-24 over first 42 games)...Following this road trip, 29 of Halos' next 44 games will be at Angel Stadium...34 of Angels' last 52 games are against American League contenders.

<u>BLANKED:</u> Last night's 4-0 win marked Angels' MLB-best 15th shutout victory of 2012... 15 shutouts are most by <u>Angels since 20 blankings by the 1989 team</u>...Club record is 28 shutouts by the 1964 Halos.

THE ACE: Last night marked Jered Weaver's sixth career shutout, his eighth start this year without allowing a run... He has set a career-best winning each of his last 10 decisions (12 starts), ranking second in franchise history to Jarrod Washburn who won 12 consecutive decisions in 2002...Weaver has won nine straight starts (1.60 ERA in span), second longest win streak in MLB this season (Dickey, 11 straight), and leads MLB in wins (15) and ERA (2.13)...Halos are 17-3 in Weaver's 20 starts in 2012...Only five other pitchers in the expansion era have won 15 of their first 16 decisions in a season: Dave McNally (1969), Gaylord Perry (1974), Ron Guidry (1978), Roger Clemens (2001) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010) – ELIAS.

<u>PLAYER OF THE WEEK:</u> Yesterday, Albert Pujols was named American League Player of the Week for period ending August 5th...<u>Marks 12th weekly honor in Pujols' career (first W/ LAA)</u>...For the week, he batted .424 (14-for-33) with five doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI and nine runs scored in seven games played.

BULLPEN STRUGGLES: Halos' bullpen has been touched for a 9.70 ERA (21.1 IP – 23 ER) through eight games this road trip (7 outings)...The 'pen has posted a 6.02 ERA (64.1 IP – 43 ER) in 24 games since the All-Star Break (3.16 ERA before ASB)...Halos' last four losses have been charged to the bullpen.

TORIID: Torii Hunter has hits in 14 of last 15 games with an AB, hitting .397 (25/63) with 15 RBI in the stretch.

<u>FLYING MACHINE:</u> Pujols has six home runs & 13 RBI through eight games this trip...Since the ASB, he is tied for MLB lead with 10 HRs and ranks second in span with 25 RBI...Since May 1, Pujols leads MLB with 72 RBI and ranks T3rd in MLB in span with 24 HRs.

ELITE COMPANY: Pujols has 1,405 career RBI, just the fourth player in MLB history to reach 1,400 RBI thru first 12 campaigns (Joe DiMaggio, Al Simmons and Lou Gehrig).

@ OAKLAND: 2012 season series is knotted 5-5 with nine matchups remaining...LAA has won last three games in Oakland and five of last six here...Angels are 13-9 in last 22 meetings at Angel Stadium vs. A's...LAA was 8-11 vs. A's in 2011, just second season series loss to the club since 2003 (9-10 in 2007).

CATCH OF THE MONTH: Mike Trout (.392, 32 R, 10 HR, 23 RBI) was named A.L. Player of the Month and A.L. Rookie of the Month for July...Trout is the first A.L. player ever to win Player of the Month & Rookie of the Month in the same month...Marked Trout's third consecutive monthly rookie honor...Only other player to win three straight Rookie of the Month awards was Ichiro Suzuki in April, May & June 2001...With 32 runs scored last month, Trout tied Hal Trosky (CLE, 1934) for the all-time MLB rookie runs record for July (32)...Trout set the A.L. record for July home runs (10) by a rookie and tied the Angels' club record for rookie HRs in any month by Wally Joyner in May 1986...Trout's .804 slugging pct. in July led MLB.

<u>SLIPPERY FISH:</u> Trout has swiped 27 consecutive stolen bases to set a new club record previously held by **Gary Pettis** (1985, 22 straight)...**Trout** was last caught stealing 6/4 vs. Seattle and leads MLB with 36 SBs.

ROOK OF AGES: LAA was 6-14 when Trout joined team on April 28th, LAA is an A.L.-best 53-37 since.....He leads A.L. rookies in every offensive category and MLB rookies in most as well....Since May 1st, he leads MLB with 86 runs (21 multi-run games) and ranks second in MLB in hits (122) and times on base (163)...Trout is averaging 0.99 runs per game - only two qualifying players in their age-20 season (or younger) have ever finished a season with a run-scoring rate at least as .95 runs per: Alex Rodriguez in 1996, and John McGraw in 1893...
Trout scored a run in 15 consecutive games (July 5-23)...<u>The streak tied the modern MLB rookie record and set a new A.L. rookie mark</u>...The streak also established an Angels' franchise record...<u>Trout is just the second player in MLB history to hit .350 or above with at least 15 HR and 30 SB before Aug. 1 (ended month at .353 with 18 HRs and 31 SBs)...Rickey Henderson (1985) is only other player to do so (.352, 16 HR, 47 SBs)...Trout is currently leading the A.L. in average (.348) and stolen bases (36)...Only two players in the last 63 years have lead a league in both categories: Ichiro Suzuki in 2001 and Jackie Robinson in 1949...No MLB player has ever had a .340 BA, 20 HR, 40 SB in one season, all well within reach for Trout (ESPN 5TATS)...In his first 81 games, Trout scored 80 runs...With 55 RB, combined for 135 runs plated in 81 games...The last rookie to do this was DiMaggio (87, 83) in 1936 (ELIAS)...Only one other player since 1920 has had as many hits (116), RBI (55) and SBs (31) in his first 81 games of a season as Trout has had through his first 81 - George Sisler in 1922 (ELIAS).</u>

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER - LHP C.J. WILSON

9-7, 3.27

In search of first win since July 26th

- Winless in last seven starts, posting a 5.36 ERA (43.2 IP 26 ER) to raise ERA from a league leading 2.36 mark to 3.27...In search of first win since June 26th at BAL.
- With next victory, will have recorded three straight seasons with 10+ wins, becoming just the fourth pitcher in MLB history to roll of three straight 10+ win seasons after logging three consecutive double-digit save seasons (Derek Lowe, John Smoltz, Ryan Dempster).
- Has allowed two earned runs-or-less in 11 of 14 road starts, posting a 1.62 ERA (66.2 IP 12 ER) in those starts... Has allowed 15 earned runs in last two road starts (11.1 IP; 11.91 ERA) after allowing just 17 ER in first 12 road starts combined (74 IP; 2.07 ERA)... Owns a 3.37 mark (85.1 IP 32 ER) away from the Big A.
- Posted a 0-3 record in July, marking the first time in his career going winless in a calendar month.
- Took the loss in last start, August 2nd at Texas, allowing a career-high (2nd time) eight runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.1 innings...Gave up multiple home runs for the first time this season and first time since August 27, 2011 vs. Angels (with Texas).
- <u>VS. OAKLAND</u>: Making 40th career appearance, 11th start vs. Oakland, third start of 2012...Earned the win in last start, May 22nd at Oakland, tossing eight shutout innings allowing just one hit...Has thrown 10 consecutive scoreless innings against the A's...Owns a 6-6 career record with five saves and a 3.47 ERA (96 IP 37 ER)...In 17 career appearance, four starts at the Coliseum has registered a 2-2 record with two saves and a 2.61 ERA.
- Finished first-half at 9-5 with a 2.43 ERA, nine wins matching most first-half wins in his career (also 2011)...Selected to second consecutive All-Star game but bowed out due to blister on middle finger of pitching hand.
- Recorded 50th career win, June 8th at Colorado, becoming just the sixth active pitcher with 50+ wins and 50+ saves.
- Made back-to-back starts, May 11-12 at Texas, becoming first Major League pitcher to make starts in consecutive games since Aaron Myette (TEX), Sept. 3-4, 2002 (ejected from first game after two pitches).
- On May 22nd at Oakland, combined with Ernesto Frieri for the eighth combined one-hitter in Angels history, first since Jerome Williams and Jordan Walden accomplished the feat on September 7, 2011.
- Finished 2011 season 16-7 with three CG, one shutout and a 2.94 ERA in 34 starts for the Rangers... Signed a five-year deal with the Angels, December 9, 2011.
- Since becoming a full-time starter in 2010, has compiled a 40-22 record with six complete games, one shutout and a 3.17 ERA (570.1 IP 201 ER) in 90 starts.
- Is 52-42 with six complete games, one shutout, 52 saves and a 3.54 ERA (851 IP 335 ER) in 348 career appearances, 96 starts.
- This season, Smile Generation will be donating funds to the Angels Baseball Foundation for every strikeout made by an Angels pitcher...They will double that amount when Wilson pitches while also donating to C.J. Wilson's Children's Charities.
