# A's vs. WHITE SOX

The season series is tied 2-2...the A's lost last night after taking two of three games in Oakland in April...lost the season series last year, 6-4...it marked just the second time in the previous 11 seasons the A's lost the season series to Chicago...are now 62-39 (.614) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the second best record by any American League team over that span (New York, 49-30, 620)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 289-269 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 153-130 in Oakland and 136-139 in Chicago...including 54-41 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 966-1024 against Chicago

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the past six games...however, are 23-10 (.697) since the start of July, which is the best record in the American League and second best in the majors (Washington, 26-11)...trailed Texas by a season-high 13 games at the start of July but the Rangers have gone 15-17 since then and the A's have gained 7½ games in the standings...are in second place in the American League West and trail Texas by 5½ games...are tied with Tampa Bay for third place in the Wild Card, ½ game behind Detroit and Baltimore...have held at least a share of a playoff spot 19 of the last 21 days...are 7-1-2 over the last 10 series...had a season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1 but have gone 38-22 (.633) since then, which is the best mark in the AL and second best in the majors over that span...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 41 days in second, 10 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...went 19-5 (.792) in July to set a franchise record for winning percentage in July.

THE LONG BALL: Chris Carter hit a home run on Wednesday, becoming the seventh Athletic to reach double figures in home runs...the last time the A's had seven players with 10 or more home runs was in 2005...have seven home runs in the last three games and 124 for the season, which is already their most in a season since 2009 (135)...A's right fielders have combined for 25 home runs, which is five more than the combined total over the previous two seasons...A's first basemen have combined for 22 home runs, which is three more than combined total from the previous two seasons...the pitching staff has allowed nine home runs over the past two games, including five in Wednesday's 9-8 win over Los Angeles...it marked just the second time in Oakland history the A's allowed five or more home runs and won (6, April 23, 1985 at California)...however, have allowed the second fewest home runs in the American League for the season (102).

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK**: The A's are 17-9 (.654) since the All-Star Break, which is the **best record in the American League** ahead of Detroit (17-10)...the pitching staff has issued the fewest walks in the majors (57) and has the third most strikeouts (224)...ranks third in the AL with a 3.73 ERA (103 er in 248.2 ip)...the offense is tied for the AL lead in triples (10), is second in home runs (41) and third in walks (92) but leads the league in strikeouts (246).

**PITCHING:** The A's rank second in the American League with a 3.48 ERA...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.378) in the AL and third lowest batting average (.245) and on-base percentage (.308)...rank third in the AL in shutouts (9) but have the third fewest strikeouts (779)...A's starting pitchers rank second in the AL with a 3.77 ERA (283 er in 676.0 ip) and have allowed the second fewest home runs.

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank last in the majors with a .230 batting average...lead the American League in strikeouts (929), have the second fewest runs scored (452), the second lowest on-base percentage (.305) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.385)...have been shut out a Major League leading 13 times, which is second most by an A's team over the last 18 years...were shut out 15 times last year...have been shut out twice in the last 10 games after a streak 48 consecutive games with at least one run.

**ONE-RUN GAMES:** The A's lost to Chicago last night 4-3...however, have won 11 of their last 13 one-run games...that includes a streak of 10 straight from July 3-August 3, which fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive one-run wins...11 of the A's last 14 home wins have been by one run...are 19-14 (.576) in one-run games for the season...are tied for second in the AL in one-run wins and have the third best record.

**EXTRA INNINGS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's played three extra inning games on the last homestand, including a pair of 15 inning games...played 104 innings on the homestand, which was the longest 10-game homestand by innings in Oakland history...the previous long was 98 innings (April 24-May 3, 1987)...the average time of game on the homestand was 3 hours and 23 minutes, which was the fifth longest homestand of any length by time in Oakland history...are 9-3 (.750) in extra innings games, which are the A's most extra inning wins since they had 11 in 2007...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the second best record...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...that is the second best total in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 15 set in 2004...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat and **lead the majors in last at bat wins** (BAL and LAD, 17)...are 23-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this seven-day, six-game road trip to Chicago (0-1) and Kansas City (three games)...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Toronto (2-1) and Baltimore (2-1) and have won eight of the last 11 road games...play 30 of their final 51 games on the road, a span that started last night...went 5-5 on the last homestand, their longest of the season, against Tampa Bay (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Los Angeles (2-1)...are 24-11 over the last 35 home games...are 34-26 (.567) at home compared to 26-26 (.500) on the road...the pitching staff has a 3.01 ERA (192 er in 573.2 ip) at home compared to 4.08 (203 er in 448.1 ip) on the road...the home ERA is second lowest in the AL while the road ERA ranks seventh.

**BOB MELVIN:** Earned his 600<sup>th</sup> win as a Major League manager on Wednesday...he has guided the A's to a 107-104 (.507) record since he was named manager June 9, 2011...Oakland started the 2011 season 27-36 (.429)...is 600-612 (.495) in nine seasons as a manager, which also includes stints with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09), where he was named NL Manager of the Year in 2007.

**ROOKIES:** The A's have used 18 rookies this year, which is the most in the majors and tied with the 1983 club for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the 18 have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009)...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Doolittle, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner, Straily)...the average age of the A's 25 players is 28.5, which is eighth youngest in the majors.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 18 times and currently have eight players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, Griffin, Sizemore, Smith, Sogard)...the 18 players have combined to miss 698 games (38.8 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL every day since June 6.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17<sup>th</sup> appearance and 11<sup>th</sup> start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his 21<sup>st</sup> appearance overall this year...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments and his teams are 9-9 (.500) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in five of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 3-3 with a 3.62 ERA (24 er in 59.2 ip) in 10 starts and 1-0 with a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) in 10 relief appearances...first batters

faced are 2 for 9 (.222) with a sacrifice hit in his relief appearances and he has allowed 1 of 2 inherited runners to score...had eight career appearances entering this season and all were starts...is 4-6 with a 5.72 ERA (60 er in 94.1 ip) in 18 career starts.

**PICKED OFF:** Is tied with Toronto's Romero for the American League lead in pickoffs (7) and is tied for second in the majors (Cueto, CIN 8)...opponents are 2 for 6 (33.3%) in stolen base attempts...has been charged with two balks, which is tied for second in the AL.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued 20 walks, all to right-handed hitters...has allowed four home runs in his last four games (17.0 ip) after surrendering just one home run over his first 16 contests (61.2 ip).

**ALMOST EIGHT YEARS:** Was the winning pitcher June 15 against San Diego, his first Major League win since he defeated Seattle in his Major League debut July 1, 2004...the span of seven years, 350 days between wins is the longest since Vicente Romo went 8 years and 3 days between victories from July 16, 1974 to July 19, 1982...it is the fourth longest streak by a pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) behind Jim Bouton (8 years, 65 days), Romo and Joe Grzenda (7 years, 362 days)...the win snapped a career-high five-game losing streak dating back to July 7, 2004.

**BRIEFLY:** Began the season at Triple-A Fresno and was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, before he was selected by San Francisco May 1...posted a 9.00 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four relief appearances with San Francisco before he was designated for assignment May 13...was claimed off waivers by the A's May 15 and did not allow an earned run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip) before making his first start May 28...made seven consecutive starts before pitching in relief in the second to last game before the All-Star Break...returned to the rotation July 18 and went 1-1 with a 4.67 ERA before moving to the bullpen August 3 when Straily was promoted.

2012 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Minnesota May 28...left with a 3-1 lead but Norberto allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was his first Major League start since September 29, 2007...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas *June 5* in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven hits...retired the first six batters before the Rangers scored three times in the third inning on a two-run double by Kinsler and a RBI double by Hamilton...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Torrealba in the fourth and a RBI triple to Young in the fifth...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona June 10...allowed three runs, two earned, in the first inning on a fielders choice and a tworun single by Hill...the A's scored twice in the fourth to make the score 3-2 but he allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over San Diego June 15 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Quentin in the first inning but the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first...also allowed a RBI single to Denorfia in the second but retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) June 21 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...retired each of the first 10 batters before Herrera doubled with one out in the fourth...one out later, Rivera had a RBI single...retired 12 of the final 13 hitters he faced...Kershaw limited the A's to a run over eighth innings and Blackley was relieved by Cook to start the ninth with the scored tied at 1-1...Céspedes hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle June 26...retired six of the first seven batters he faced before the Mariners scored twice in the third inning on a Gutierrez RBI double and a Seager sacrifice fly...faced the minimum over his final four innings thanks to a pickoff and grounded into double play...the A's scored twice in the seventh inning to tie the game but Miller allowed a run in the eighth for the loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Texas July 1...allowed a career-high tying seven hits...had two pickoffs...surrendered just one run on an Andrus RBI single in the third inning...retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored single runs in the fifth, sixth and seventh innings for the win...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Texas July 18 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 11.0 innings...allowed a RBI double to Gentry in the fifth inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the inning...allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth and was relieved by Balfour with runners on first and second and one out...Balfour allowed one more run to score...the A's tied the game with two in the seventh to get him off the hook and Hicks homered in the ninth for the win...extended his winning streak to a career-high three games in the A's 7-2 win at Toronto July 24...struck out a career-high eight batters...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Snider in the bottom of the third...it was his first home run allowed since May 28...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Baltimore July 24...allowed four runs in the third inning on a Jones RBI double and a Wieters three-run home run...also allowed a run to score in the fifth inning on an error by Carter...the A's were held to a run on seven hits by Chen and the Orioles bullpen.

**LAST TWO RELIEF APPEARANCES:** Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief for the win in the A's 5-4, 15-inning win over Toronto August 3 in Oakland (1 h, 2 bb, 2 so)...then allowed three runs on three hits in 2.0 innings in his last outing last Tuesday against Los Angeles (1 bb, 2 so)...surrendered two home runs.

BLACKLEY vs. CHICAGO: Is making his first career appearance and start.

WITH FRESNO: Was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, with Triple-A Fresno in the San Francisco organization...walked just three batters in 23.1 innings (1.16 per nine innings) and allowed one home run...allowed a .163 opponents batting average, including .153 (9 for 59) against right-handed hitters and .190 (4 for 21) against left-handed hitters...opponents were 1 for 27 (.037) with runners on base, including 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Bartolo Colon (9-8, 3.38 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23<sup>rd</sup> start of the season...picked up his ninth win in his last start, which is his most since posting a career-high 21 wins with Los Angeles (AL) in 2005...is 39 years old and needs one more win to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to win 10 games in a season at age 36 or older...Don Sutton had 13 wins in 1985 at age 40 and Tom Candiotti had 11 wins in 1998 at age 40...is 5-3 with a 2.28 ERA (18 er in 71.0 ip) and .248 (69 for 278) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts since June 1...allowed an unearned run in the seventh inning of his last start, snapping his scoreless streak at a career-high 22.1 innings...has not allowed an earned run since July 22 and has a 23.1-inning streak without allowing an earned run, which is also a career-high...is 10-7 with a 3.89 ERA (136.1 ip, 134 h, 66 r, 59 er, 48 bb, 96 so, 14 hr) in 21 career appearances, all starts, against the White Sox...is 5-4 with a 2.77 ERA (26 er in 84.1 ip) in 12 starts in his home ballparks and 5-3 with a 5.71 ERA (33 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts at U.S. Cellular Field as a visiting pitcher...pitched for the White Sox in 2003 and 2009 and is 15-13 with a 4.33 ERA (96 er in 199.1 ip) in 31 career starts at U.S. Cellular Field.

The A's bullpen is 11-2 with a 2.71 ERA (34 er in 113.0 ip) and .210 (88 for 420) opponents batting average since the start of July...the wins are the most in the majors over that span and the ERA and batting average are second best in the American League...for the season, leads the AL and ranks third in the majors with a 2.91 ERA...has the lowest opponents batting average (.211) in the majors, the third lowest on-base percentage (.299) and fifth lowest slugging percentage (.341)...leads the AL and ranks third in the majors in wins (21)...is tied for the third fewest home runs (32) in the AL but has issued the second most walks (149)...has 200 strikeouts in 192.2 innings over its last 62 games (9.3 per nine innings) after anning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings)

- Allowed a home run to Trumbo in his last outing Wednesday against Los Angeles, snapping his scoreless streak at 13.1 innings.
- Is fifth among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.173), seventh in innings pitched (53.0), tied for seventh in games pitched (52) and is 10<sup>th</sup> in opponents slugging percentage (.286)...is tied for the fifth most walks (22).
- Has a 1.64 ERA (6 er in 33.0 ip) and .134 (15 for 112) opponents batting average over his last 31 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Has a save and a blown save in two outings against Chicago (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so).
  Has a 0.85 ERA (3 er in 31.2 ip) in 29 appearances at home compared to a 5.48 ERA (13 er in 21.1 ip) in 23 outings on the road.
- His last save was May 5 and it was the 17<sup>th</sup> of his career, tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in opponents on-base percentage (.266).
