A's vs. ROYALS

The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2008 as they trail 5-3 entering the final game today...are 1-4 in Kansas City and 2-1 in Oakland...the four losses in Kansas City are the A's most since going 1-5 in 1999...have been shutout in four of the five losses and have scored just 17 runs in the eight games...in Oakland history, the fewest runs the A's have scored against a team in a season series of nine or more games is 19 in 11 games against Baltimore in 1978...alltime, the A's are 299-248 against the Royals...that breaks down to 165-109 in Oakland and 134-139 in Kansas City.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** Lefty Grove wins his 20th game of the season, defeating St. Louis, 4-2...in **1983** Chris Codirol shutout against California, the A's third consecutive shutout...the shutout comes as part of an Oakland record 37 consecutive scoreless innings...in **1991** Dennis Eckersley strikes out Chili Davis at Minnesota for his 2000th career strikeout...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits two home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Boston, the A's 199th and 200th of the season...that broke the A's franchise record of 199 and Oakland would go on to hit 243 home runs.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and four of the last five games and are now 8-11 over the last 19 contests...have not lost more than three in a row since the season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1...have gone 39-25 (.609) since that losing streak, which is the second best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...have lost back-to-back series and are 1-3-1 over the last five series after going 6-0-1 over the previous seven...are 24-13 (.649) since the start of July, which is the **best record in the American League** and fourth best in the majors...are in a tie for second place in the AL West and trail Texas by six games...are tied for fourth place in the Wild Card race, 1½ games behind second place Tampa Bay...have not been farther than 1½ games back since they were 2½ out at the All-Star Break...held at least a share of a playoff spot in 20 of 22 days from July 21 to August 11 but have been out of a playoff spot in each of the last four days...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 45 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...went 19-5 (.792) in July to set a **franchise record for winning percentage in July**.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last two one-run decisions after winning 11 of the previous 12...are 19-15 (.559) in one-run games overall...are tied for second in the American League in one-run wins and have the third best record...11 of the A's last 14 home wins have been by one run...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games, which are the A's most extra inning wins since they had 11 in 2007...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the second best record...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...that is the second best total in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 15 set in 2004...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat and **lead the majors in last at bat wins**...are 24-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 18-12 (.600) since the All-Star Break, which is the **best record in the American League**...the pitching staff has issued the fewest walks in the majors (65) and is tied for the sixth most strikeouts (249)...ranks fourth in the AL with a 3.90 ERA (122 er in 281.2 ip)...the offense is tied with Kansas City for the AL lead in triples (10), tied for second in home runs (46) and ranks third in walks (101)...leads the majors in strikeouts (292).

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out nine or more times in each of the last five games (56 strikeouts total), matching the longest streak in Oakland history (also August 29-September 2, 1985 and June 22-26, 2012)...lead the American League and rank second in the majors with 975 for the season (Houston, 986)...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1226 strikeouts set in 2008...rank last in the majors with a .230 batting average...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982 and the A's have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.304), the second fewest doubles (174) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.385)...rank third in triples (24) and walks (396)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.97).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.56 ERA (91 er in 179.2 ip) and .270 (192 for 710) opponents batting average over the last 19 games...however, have a 3.53 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the AL...also rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.380) and third in opponents batting average (.246) and on-base percentage (.308)...are tied for third in shutouts (9) and have the third fewest strikeouts (804)...A's starting pitchers are 3-9 with a 5.09 ERA (62 er in 109.2 ip) over the last 19 games but have a 3.86 ERA (299 er in 698.0 ip) overall, which ranks second in the AL...have issued the fewest walks (188).

SHUTOUTS: The A's were shut out for the 14th time this year Tuesday night, which is the most in the majors...it is tied for the fourth highest single season total in Oakland history...since 1980, the only time the A's have been shutout more times in a season was last year when they were blanked 15 times...have been shut out three times in the last 14 games after a streak 48 consecutive games with at least one run...have scored 466 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have allowed 14 home runs in the last seven games but have yielded just 105 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...the offense has hit 129 home runs, which is already their most in a season since 2009 (135)...have seven players with 10 or more home runs, which is the most since 2005 when they also had seven...A's right fielders have combined for 25 home runs, which is five more than the combined total over the previous two seasons and the most since 2005 (26)...A's first basemen have combined for 22 home runs, which is three more than combined total from the previous two seasons and the most since 2007 (24).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this seven-day, six-game road trip to Chicago (1-2) and Kansas City (0-2)...went 4-2 on the last road trip and are 27-29 (.482) on the road for the season...return home following the game tonight for a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Los Angeles (2-1) and are 24-11 over the last 35 home games...are 34-26 (.567) at home overall...the pitching staff has a 3.01 ERA (192 er in 573.2 ip) at home compared to 4.15 (222 er in 481.1 ip) on the road...rank third in the AL in home ERA and seventh in road ERA.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 18 rookies this year, which is the most in the majors and tied with the 1983 club for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the 18 have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have combined to pitch 190 games, which is third most in Oakland history (232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...currently have 10 rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Donaldson, Doolittle, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner, Straily)...the average age of the A's 25 players is 28.2, which is seventh youngest in the majors.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 19 times and currently have nine players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, Griffin, Inge, Sizemore, Smith, Sogard), which matches the season high...the 19 players have combined to miss 733 games (38.6 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL every day since June 6.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento August 3 and became the 44th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut, the second this year (Griffin, June 24 vs. San Francisco).

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is scheduled to make the 57th start by a rookie this year, but the A's will fall short of the Oakland record of 116 starts by a rookie set in 2009...rookies have 28 of the A's wins...the only times in Oakland history rookies have combined for more wins is in 2009 (44) and 1983 (38).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 5-4 A's win in 15 innings over Toronto August 3 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed just one run on a Davis sacrifice fly in the fourth inning...left with a 4-1 lead but Cook allowed a three-run home run to Mathis in the ninth inning for the blown save...Crisp had a walk-off sacrifice fly in the 15th inning for the win.

LAST START: Had his second consecutive no decision in an A's win, a 9-8 A's victory over Los Angeles August 8 in Oakland...surrendered four home runs...allowed a solo home run to Morales in the second inning but the A's came back with four runs in the bottom of the second...allowed a leadoff home run to Aybar in the third and then yielded two more runs in the fifth inning on a solo home run by Hunter and a two-run home run by Morales...left after 4.2 innings trailing 5-4 but the A's scored five times in the sixth for the win.

STRAILY vs. KANSAS CITY: Is making his first career appearance and start.

MINORS: Combined for an 8-6 record and a 2.60 ERA in 22 starts with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...struck out 175 batters in 138.1 innings, an average of 11.39 per nine innings...was leading all of Minor League Baseball in strikeouts at the time of his promotion...the next closest was John Ely (Albuquerque) with 138...had the most strikeouts by an A's minor leaguer since Rich Harden combined for 187 with Visalia and Midland in 2002...was sixth in the minor leagues in innings pitched (138.1) and tied for eighth in games started...ranked ninth among full season minor leaguers with a .197 season minor leaguers with a .197 opponents batting average...issued 37 walks (2.41 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.73...was 2-4 with a 4.20 ERA and .245 opponents batting average in 11 starts in April and May and 6-2 with a 1.22 ERA and .151 opponents batting average in 11 starts in June and July...tossed six or more innings in 17 of his 22 starts, including each of his last 14...allowed one run or fewer 12 times, walked two batters or fewer 16 times and had more strikeouts than innings pitched 15 times...his teams were 13-9 (.591) in his starting assignments.

MIDLAND: Had not pitched above Single-A in his career prior to starting the season at Double-A Midland...went 3-4 with a 3.38 ERA in 14 starts for the RockHounds...was leading the Texas League with 108 strikeouts when he was promoted to Sacramento June 17 and still ranked fourth in the league at the time of his promotion to Oakland on August 3.

SACRAMENTO: Went 5-2 with a 1.36 ERA in eight starts with Triple-A Sacramento...struck out 67, which was the most in the Pacific Coast League from June 17 until his promotion to Oakland...also had the lowest ERA and opponents batting average (.149) over that span and was tied for third in wins...opponents were 1 for 30 (.033) with runners in scoring position...held right-handed hitters to a .083 batting average.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .197 opponents batting average included a .186 (54 for 290) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (43 for 203) against left-handers...allowed nine home runs in 138.1 innings (0.59 per nine innings) and seven of those came with the bases empty...opponents hit .184 (18 for 98) with runners in scoring position, including .104 (5 for 48) with RISP and two outs.

INNING BY INNING: Did not allow a run in the first inning in any of his 22 starts...had a 0.61 ERA (3 er in 44.0 ip) and .153 (23 for 150) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game compared to a 3.53 ERA (37 er in 94.1 ip) and .216 (74 for 343) opponents batting average from the third inning on.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 34-25 with a 3.68 ERA (207 er in 506.0 ip) in 94 games, 87 starts, over four professional seasons...has 544 strikeouts in 506.0 innings, an average of 9.68 per nine innings...ranked third among A's minor leaguers in strikeouts last year at Single-A Stockton (154) and second in 2010 at Single-A Kane County (149)...was originally drafted by the A's in the 24th round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft...is the first A's signing from that draft to reach the majors.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (9-9, 3.91 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season, his first since August 5, a loss in a 6-5 decision over Toronto in Oakland (6.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...was given extra rest with the A's having off days August 9 and 13...has lost each of his last three starts, which is the longest losing streak of his career...has a 7.58 ERA and .316 opponents batting average during the losing streak...is tied for fourth among American League rookies with nine wins...needs one more to become the ninth rookie in Oakland history to win 10 games...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last nine starts...ranks third in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (1.80) and ninth in strikeout to walk ratio (3.61)...is 5-3 with a 2.13 ERA and .212 opponents average in 10 starts at home compared to 4-6 with a 5.77 ERA and .313 opponents batting average in 12 starts on the road...has the sixth lowest home ERA in the American League and the sixth highest road ERA...has never faced Cleveland in his career.



BRETT ANDERSON

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

DARIC BARTON

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento June 2.

JERRY BLEVINS

• Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.
- Had reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow June 19...the surgery
 was performed in New York City by Dr. David Altchek, medical director of the New York Mets.

CHRIS CARTER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 after batting .279 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI in 72 games with the River Cats.
- Homered in each of his first two games with the A's and three of his first four...including July 6
 against Seattle when he hit the pinch-hit game-ending home run in the 11th inning...is the first
 rookie in Athletics history with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run and the 10th player in Oakland
 history with a pinch-hit game-ending home run...he is the first Athletic with a pinch-hit "walk-off"
 home run in extra innings since Paul Lehner on April 22, 1950 against Boston.
- Had his career-high tying six-game hitting streak snapped August 2 against Toronto (7 for 22, .318).

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field... doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.

- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career... the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.
- Had his first career game-ending hit June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), a three-run "walk-off" home run.
- Had the first two four-hit games of his career July 15 at Minnesota and July 20 against New York.
- Was named American Leage Player of the Week July 16 for the week ending July 15 after going 8 for 14 (.571) with five runs, a double, two home runs and six RBI in the three-game series at Minnesota.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from July 8 to 21...was 19 for 33 (.576) with two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, eight runs scored, six multiple hit games and a 1.000 slugging percentage during the streak.
- Batted .344 in July after hitting .343 in June...tied for sixth in the AL in batting and hits (33) in July, ranked eighth in slugging (.573) and tied for eighth in RBI (19).
- Walked three times August 2 against Toronto, the first multi-walk game of his career.

BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.
- Threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point during the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...that was the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998.
- Was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May...based on a
 minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and
 the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest single-month mark of his career and
 the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).
- Left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with the injury... was reinstated July 3.

RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.
- Was the only A's player named to the American League All-Star team and pitched a perfect seventh inning, striking out Harper and Wright...it was his first career All-Star selection...he is the seventh Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team, along with Wayne Gross (1977), Matt Ke-

ough (1978), Jose Canseco (1986), Mark McGwire (1987), Ben Grieve (1998) and Andrew Bailey (2009).

COLLIN COWGILL

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0 for 4 with three walks in three games before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Was recalled by Oakland May 11
- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 with a sprained left ankle...began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 9 and went 1 for 8 (.125) in two games before he was transferred to Sacramento July 12...went 3 for 18 (.167) with a RBI in four games with the River Cats before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 17.

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.
- Stole three bases June 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was his fifth career game of three or more steals, his fourth with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (45) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more three-steal games.
- Was caught stealing after being picked off in the first inning June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), his
 first caught stealing since July 10, 2011 at Texas...that ended his Athletics record streak of 36 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing (caught stealing became an official stat in 1920)...
 broke the previous mark of 28 set by Stan Javier (May 31-October 1, 1995).
- Led off the game with a home run June 27 at Seattle and July 3 against Boston...now has four leadoff home runs as an Athletic and six in his career...the four with the A's are tied for fourth most in Oakland history.
- Finished the game July 3 with a "walk-off" sacrifice fly...it was the 21st game-ending sacrifice fly in Oakland history, the first since Dan Johnson on May 15, 2007 against Kansas City...is the first Athletic with a leadoff home run and walk-off RBI in the same game since Rickey Henderson on August 12, 1992 against Chicago.
- Had the game-ending RBI single July 22 agianst New York.
- Had his third career two-homer game July 25 at Toronto.
- Batted .342 in July, which is his best single-month batting average since hitting .375 in September, 2008...it ranked eighth in the AL.
- Had his second game-ending sacrifice fly of the season August 3 against Toronto (July 3 vs. Boston)...is the second player in Oakland history with two "walk-off" sacrifice flies in one season (Rickey Henderson, 1992)...it was his third game-ending RBI of the season and the fifth of his career.

FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).
- Was traded to Milwaukee July 29 for George Kottaras.

JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

JOSH DONALDSON

 Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.

- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.
- Drew his first walk of the season June 13 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 30 consecutive games without a walk dating back to September 22, 2010...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Scott Hemond had a 31-game streak from May 3 to July 2, 1994...it was his first walk since September 19, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Was batting .182 in 19 games during his second stint with the A's when he was optioned to Sacramento June 21.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

• Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings that day against San Diego before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 21.
- Was recalled a third time July 13 when Jim Miller went on the paternity list but was optioned back to Sacramento July 16 without appearing in a game.
- Returned to Oakland for his fourth stint Aug. 5 and did not allow a run over two appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 3 so) before he was sent back to Sacramento Aug. 7.

BRIAN FUENTES

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).
- Had a 2.84 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first 19 appearances through May 27... then went 0-2 with a save, two blown saves, a 19.50 ERA and .452 opponents batting average over his final seven outings.
- Was designated for assignment on July 3 and released July 11.

GRAHAM GODFREY

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.
- Hit the game-winning pinch-hit two-run home run in the seventh inning June 16 against San Diego, his third career pinch hit home run (last: June 28, 2008 at Pittsburgh)...it snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter and was his first pinch hit since August 29, 2010 against Chicago (NL).

- Hit his third career grand slam July 13 at Minnesota, his first since August 7, 2007 at Detroit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning to finish with five RBI...it was his third career game of five or more RBI, his first since June 12, 2010 against Kansas City when he had a career-high six.
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, the seventh time he has reached the 10home run plateau in his career.

A.J. GRIFFIN

• Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 and made his Major League debut that day with a start against San Francisco.

BRANDON HICKS

- Was claimed off waivers from Atlanta March 13 and was optioned to Sacramento March 15.
- Recalled by Oakland June 23 after batting .272 with 13 home runs and 48 RBI in 65 games with the River Cats... was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in hit by pitches (7) at the time of his promotion...also ranked second in strikeouts (76), fifth in extra base hits (37), tied for sixth in doubles (21), eighth in home runs (13), ninth in runs (49) and 10th in RBI (48) and slugging (.548).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts July 13 at Minnesota ... it was the first four strikeout game of his career.
- Hit his first Major League home run July 18 against Texas, a "walk-off" shot off Michael Kirkman in the bottom of the ninth inning...became the fourth player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run, the second this year (Derek Norris, June 24)...the other two are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 2.

LUKE HUGHES

• Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin... it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his twogame rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.
- Struck out four times July 30 against Tampa Bay, matching his career high (June 21, 2006 at Milwaukee and August 14, 2007 at Cleveland).

• Had a career-high tying 13-game hitting streak from July 20 to August 3...hit.263 (15 for 57), which was the lowest batting average during a hitting streak of 12 or more games in Oakland history.

KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

GEORGE KOTTARAS

- Was acquired from Milwaukee July 29 for right-handed pitcher Fautino De Los Santos.
- Was tied for the National League lead with five pinch walks at the time of the trade.
- Hit his first home run as an Athletic August 8 against Los Angeles, snapping a career-high 46-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on April 13 at Atlanta.

BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.
- Was placed on the paternity list July 13 and reinstated July 16.
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 3.

TOMMY MILONE

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).
- Combined with Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970).
- Was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles May 21 in Oakland...became the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum.

BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Started at first base June 6 against Texas...prior to that he had not started at first base since June 24, 2008 and had just two career appearances at first.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.
- · Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.

- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota, August 12-14, 1996.
- Matched his career-high with three hits (fifth time, first since June 20, 2009 at Colorado) and three RBI (fourth time, second time this year: June 12 at Colorado) June 14 at Colorado.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).
- Hit six home runs in interleague play, which tied for fifth in the majors and matched the Oakland interleague record set by Miguel Tejada in 2000.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 11-17...batted .348 with three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first Player of the Week award.
- Committed three errors in the sixth inning June 23 against San Francisco, tying the Major League
 record for most errors by a first baseman in an inning...it was the seventh time, the first since Jack
 Clark did it for St. Louis on May 25, 1987...since 1984, the only other Athletic to commit three errors in an inning is Kurt Abbott on May 10, 1998 vs. Chicago at shortstop.
- The three errors set an Oakland record for errors in a game by a first baseman...is the first Athletics first baseman to commit three errors in a game since Lou Limmer on August 19, 1954 vs. New York.
- Tied for eighth in the AL with seven home runs in June.
- Hit his 10th home run in his 24th game on July 4 at Boston...in Athletics history, only Dave Kingman reached 10 home runs in fewer than his first 24 games with the club (19 in 1984).
- Had the game-ending single in the bottom of the ninth inning July 20 against New York, his third career walk-off hit (last: July 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee).

JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder... made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.
- Recorded his first Major League win July 6 against Seattle when he struck out the side in the 11th inning of the A's 4-1 win.

DEREK NORRIS

- Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut...made his Major League debut with a start at catcher that day against Los Angeles (NL) and went 0 for 3.
- Singled off Madison Bumgarner in the fifth inning June 23 against San Francisco for his first Major League hit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning for his first RBI and first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run June 24 against San Francisco, a three-run "walk-off" shot in the bottom of the ninth off Santiago Casilla...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run...the other two are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 30 streak July 22 against New York (AL).
- Was optioned to Sacramento July 30 when George Kottaras reported to Oakland but returned Aug. 3
 when Kurt Suzuki was traded to Washington.

JARROD PARKER

Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over
the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a
run in the ninth inning for the blown save.

• Earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

CLIFF PENNINGTON

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday... is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 20 with left elbow tendinitis...had the lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.282) and the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage (.259) when he went on the DL.
- Went 5 for 11 (.455) on a three-game rehab assignment with Sacramento from Aug. 4-6 and was reinstated from the DL Aug. 7

ANTHONY RECKER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he
was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).
- Matched his career-high with four strikeouts June 29 against the Dodgers.
- Had the game-ending RBI double July 8 against Seattle, his second career "walk-off" hit...the other was a single on August 7, 2011 against New York.
- Went 0 for 7 with four strikeouts July 30 against Tampa Bay...is one of 15 players in Oakland history to go hitless in a game with at least seven at bats (last: Matt Holliday, May 3, 2009)...it was his second four-strikeout game of the season (June 19 vs. LAD) and third of his career (August 4, 2009 at Tampa Bay).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak with a first inning single August 2 against Toronto (previous: 20, September 19, 2009-April 20, 2010).

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- · Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned back to Sacramento June 16.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint Aug. 2.
- His double in the seventh inning Aug. 5 against Toronto was his first since July 10, 2010, snapping a 48-game streak without a double...that was the second longest streak by an Athletic since 1993 (58, Frank Menechino from April 30, 2003 to May 9, 2004).

TYSON ROSS

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.
- Returned on June 16 to start against San Diego and allowed two runs on one hit and four walks in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint June 23 and went 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA in two starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 29.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 15 against San Diego and recorded his first Major League save in the A's 10-2 win.
- Was optioned to Sacramento June 16 but returned to Oakland June 24.
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 3 but retunred again Aug. 5.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, his fourth consecutive season with double figures in home runs.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI July 27 at Baltimore, despite not entering the game until the sixth inning...became the third player in Oakland history to drive in five runs off the bench (Mickey Tettleton, August 24, 1986 and Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 3 with a strained left hamstring.

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21 but returned to Oakland June 16...appeared in just one game before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 24.
- Recalled a third time July 20 when Pennington went on the disabled list.

KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).
- Snapped a career-high 78-game homerless streak July 22 against New York...his previous high was 56 games from July 29-October 2, 2010...it was his first homer since September 15, 2011 against Detroit...the home run also snapped a career-high streak of 17 consecutive games without a RBI (previous: 16, July 28-August 14, 2008).
- Was traded to the Washington Nationals with cash for minor league catcher George Freitas, Aug. 3.

MICHAEL TAYLOR

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 4 and went 3 for 16 (.188) in four games before he was
 optioned to Sacramento May 11.
- Returned Aug. 3 and went 0 for 5 in two games before he was sent back to Sacramento Aug. 5.

RICH THOMPSON

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
