THE TWINS: The Twins opened their 10-game road trip with three consecutive losses in Seattle...tonight, the Twins will begin a three-game series in Oakland, and look to snap a three game skid vs. the A's...following the series the Twins will travel to Texas (August 23-26) for a four-game series...13 of the Twins next 17 games will be played on the road...they are 26-33 away from Target Field this season.

TWINS SWEPT BY THE MARINERS: The Twins lost to the Mariners yesterday by a score of 5-1...Samuel Deduno (4-1) was the starter and loser as he worked 6.0 innings allowing two runs on five hits but walked six batters...the Twins scattered seven hits but left 11 runners on base and went 0-for-10 with runners in scoring position...Ryan Doumit led the offense going 2-for-4...Trevor Plouffe drove in the Twins lone run with a sacrifice fly.

4 WALKS IN AN INNING - DON'T SEE THAT EVERYDAY: Twins starter Samuel Deduno walked four batters in the third inning yesterday in Seattle...it was the first time a Twins pitcher has done that since Jesse Crain did it on August 7, 2006 at Detroit (7th inning)...in fact, Deduno and Crain are the only two pitchers to walk four batters in an inning since Rick Anderson was named pitching coach in 2002...it's only happened 19 times for the Twins since 1984.

THE SEATTLE SERIES: The Twins lost all three games in Seattle, the first time they had been sweep in Seattle since July 27-29, 2001...during the series with Twins scored just six runs and went 3-for-28 (.107) with runners in scoring position.

TWINS MAKE ROSTER MOVES: The Twins announced today that they have outrighted 8/22 Oak. right-handed pitcher Nick Blackburn and infielder Tsuyoshi Nishioka to Triple-A Rochester...the Twins will make a corresponding roster move on Tuesday...the Twins 40-man roster is now at 38.

THE FIVE GAME SKID: The Twins have lost five straight games, marking their fourth streak of five-or-more losses in a row this season...their season long losing streak is six games done April 21-27.

LOSING STREAK VS. OAKLAND: The Twins have lost three straight games vs. Oakland after sweeping them in three games in May...in fact, the Twins are looking to avoid losing four straight games vs. the A's for the first time since August 8, 2004-August 2, 2005, when they also lost four straight...the last time the Twins lost four straight games to Oakland twice in a season was July 19-September 13, 1998.

TWINS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Infielder Deibinson Romero is the Twins Minor League Player of the Week.. Romero hit .375 (6-for-16) with a double, two home runs and seven rbi in four games for Double-A New Britain (Eastern League)...Romero signed with the Twins as a non-drafted free agent in 2004 and has spent his entire professional career in the Twins organization.

LAST START: Was the loser in the Twins' 8-4 defeat, 8/14 vs. Detroit, opposite Doug Fister...allowed five runs on eight hits in six innings with two walks and a season-high four strikeouts...his four strikeouts were his most since September 24, 2011 at Cleveland...gave up an Andy Dirks solo home run to right field on the first pitch in the sixth inning...was relieved by Casey Fien to start the seventh...threw 91 pitches, 60 strikes.

TWO STARTS AGO ...: Was the loser in the Twins' 6-2 defeat at Cleveland, opposite Justin Masterson...started the final game of a three-game series at Progressive Field...pitched into the seventh inning for the first time this season and had his longest outing since July 9, 2011 at Chicago (AL) as a starter...allowed six runs (four earned) on 11 hits while walking one and striking out three...was relieved by Fien in the eighth... threw a season-high 104 pitches, 71 strikes.

August 2, 2011.

This season, he is 1-6, 6.34 (38.1 ip, 27 er) with opponents batting .339 with seven home runs, eight walks and 19 strikeouts in eight starts.

AS A RELIEVER: He is 4-5, 3.25 (122.0 ip, 44 er) with 111 hits, 45 walks, seven home runs and 74 strikeouts in 92 career relief appearances...this season, he is 1-2, 3.12 (40.1 ip, 14 er) with opponents batting .238 with one home run, 11 walks and 24 strikeouts.

<u>**DEBUT IN OAKLAND:**</u> He is making his fourth career start against the Athletics and eighth career appearance...tonight will be his first career start in The Coliseum...he was handed the loss in his last start July 15 at Target Field after allowing six runs on seven hits (three home runs) in just two innings of work...his last win was August 14, 2010 at home, tossing his first complete-game shutout with just three hits allowed, two walks and four strikeouts...he is 0-0, 5.06 (5.1 ip, 3 er) in three career relief appearances at the Coliseum

SIX-PACK: He has tossed 6.0-plus innings four times this season and in 18 of his 28 starts in 2011... last season, he went 8-7, 3.18 (121.2 ip, 43 er) with 31 walks and 85 strikeouts when tossing 6.0-plus... he is 19-11, 2.88 (249.2 ip, 80 er) in the 37 career games in which he has pitched at least 6.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD: He has gone 10-13, 3.98 (224.0 ip, 99 er) in 75 career road games (29 starts)...last season, he went 3-6, 4.28 (82.0 ip, 39 er) in 15 road games (14 starts)...this season he is 1-3, 3.74 (43.1 ip, 18 er) in 23 games (four starts) away from Target Field...his last road win in a start was July 27, 2011 at Texas, allowing one run on seven hits in 6.2 innings with one walk and six strikeouts...tonight, he looks to snap a five-game road losing streak.

AGAINST THE A.L. WEST: Tonight, he makes his 12th career start and 31st appearance against an A.L. West team...he is 5-8, 4.05 (86.2 ip, 39 er) with one complete game, 31 walks and 64 strikeouts in those games... last season, he went 1-4, 6.66 (24.1 ip, 18 er) in six games (five starts)...this season, he is 0-2, 7.84 (10.1 ip. 9 er) with six walks and seven strikeouts...his last win against an A.L. West team was July 27, 2011 against the Rangers, tossing 6.2 innings allowing just one run on seven hits with one walk and six strikeouts

LOVES LEFTIES: He has held left-handed batters to a .243 (28-for-115) batting average this season with just eight extra-base hits (five doubles and three home runs) and seven walks...one home run was hit by Alejandro De Aza, May 24 at Chicago (AL), Carl Crawford hit the another, August 3 at Boston while Andy Dirks hit the third, August 14...last season, he held lefties to a .217 (38-for-175) batting average with seven extra-base hits out of his total 71 hits allowed.

» Lifetime, left-handed batters are hitting .212 (109-for-514) while right-handed batters are hitting .303 (382-for-1259).

FIRST-HALF WRAP: Went 1-5, 4.11 (46.0 ip, 21 er) with 12 walks and 22 strikeouts in 33 games (three starts).

He is 2-4, 5.04 (64.1 ip, 36 er) in 13 career games (12 starts)...last start was August 15 vs. Detroit (L-4.0-8-4-4-2-2)...he 0-1, 6.30 (10.0 ip, 7 er) in two starts against Oakland in his career...made his Major League Debut on May 24 at CWS...had his contract selected by Minnesota, May 22, 2012...earned his first Major League Victory June 4 at Kansas City (5.0-6-5-4-0-4)...he is the 28th Minnesota native to play for the Twins...went 3-5, 4.37 (70.0 ip, 34 er) in 13 starts for Triple-A Rochester prior to having his contract selected...named Twins' Pitcher of the Week, July 11-18, 2008, while at Single-A Ft.
