The A's trail in the season series, 3-4...lost the first meeting in Oakland last night after going 3-3 in Minnesota...have won just one season series over the previous six years and are 27-34 (.443) against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-289 against Minnesota...that includes 152-126 in Oakland and 124-163 in Minnesota...are 333-358 all-time against the Twins and have a 980-994 record against the Twins/Senators.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in the A's game against Chicago on August 11...in the eighth inning, take away the hit from Céspedes and charge an error to Ramirez...this makes one of the runs to Thornton in the inning unearned...the change is reflected in today's statistics.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1983 Rickey Henderson steals the 399th base of his career, breaking Bert Campaneris' Oakland record of 398...in 1997 Jason Giambi, Ernie Young, Jason McDonald and Jose Canseco all homer in the third inning of the A's 13-6 win over Boston...the four home runs in an inning sets an Oakland record...in 2002 Cory Lidle tosses his second complete game one-hitter of the season in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland, extending his scoreless streak to 31 innings...in 2006 the A's tie what was then an Oakland record to defeat Toronto, 12-10...Dan Haren allows eight runs in the first two innings and nine runs total, setting an Oakland record for runs allowed in a win.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their four-game winning streak snapped last night and are 12-12 over the last 24 contests after going 16-2 over the previous 18 games...are 28-14 (.667) since the start of July, which is the **best record in the American League** and third best in the majors...are 22-13 (.629) since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the AL...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by six games...are third in the Wild Card race, ½ game behind second place Baltimore...have not held at least a share of a playoff spot since August 11...had a season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1 but have gone 43-26 (.623) since then, which is the **best record in the American League** and third best in the majors...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 50 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...went 19-5 (.792) in July to set a franchise record for winning percentage in July.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.29 ERA (107 er in 224.2 ip) over the last 24 games after logging a 2.52 ERA over the previous 34 contests from June 14 to July 25...now have a 3.52 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...rank second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.378) and fewest home runs allowed (109) and third in opponents batting average (.246) and on-base percentage (.307)...have the third fewest strikeouts (830)...A's starting pitchers are 6-10 with a 4.68 ERA (73 er in 140.1 ip) over the last 24 games after going 15-6 with a 2.47 ERA over the previous 34 contests from June 14 to July 25...now have a 3.83 ERA (310 er in 728.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the AL.

**DON'T WALK:** The A's have issued 35 walks in 166.2 innings in August, an average of 1.89 per nine innings...averaged 1.97 walks per nine innings in July and that marked the **first time since at least 1916** that the A's issued fewer than two walks per nine innings in a month of at least 15 games...A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 17 games...that is the second longest streak this year (19, July 3-28) and third longest in Oakland history (20, August 13-September 3, 2006)...have walked just 193 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied with Cincinnati for second fewest in the majors (Philadelphia, 179).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank last in the majors with a .231 batting average...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982 and the A's have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...are second in the majors with 1014 strikeouts (Houston, 1015)...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1226 strikeouts set in 2008...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.305), the second fewest runs scored (492), the third lowest slugging percentage (.387) and third fewest doubles (184)...rank second in walks (412) and third in triples (25)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit 92 home runs in 67 games since June 4, which is tied for third most in the majors...have 134 home runs overall, which is already their most in a season since 2009 (135)...have seven players with 10 or more home runs, which is the most since 2005 when they also had seven.

**SHUTOUTS:** The A's have two shutouts in the last five games and 11 for the season, which ranks third in the American League...however, have been shut out 14 times, which is the most in the majors...the 14 shutouts are tied for the fourth highest single season total in Oakland history...since 1980, the only time the A's have been shutout more times in a season was last year when they were blanked 15 times.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's pitching staff leads the American League in pickoffs (19)...opponents have been successful in just 75 of 115 (65.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest mark in the AL...the offense is tied for fourth in stolen bases (97)...have been caught stealing just 26 times and rank second in stolen base percentage (78.9%).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat and lead the majors in last at bat wins...those are the most last at bat wins by an A's team since they had 26 in 2004...have lost each of their last two one-run decisions after winning 11 of the previous 12...are 19-15 (.559) in one-run games overall...are tied for second in the American League in one-run wins and have the third best record...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL, the second best record and are tied for the second most games...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...are 25-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

**WALK-OFF WINS:** The A's have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...that is the second best total in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 15 set in 2004...have eight "walk-off" wins since July 3...five of the "walk-off" wins have been by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...11 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Minnesota (0-1)...had their five-game home winning streak snapped last night but are 26-11 (.703) in the Coliseum since June 6...for the season, are 37-27 (.578) at home compared to 28-29 (.491) on the road...have the third best home record in the American League...have a 3.07 ERA (208 er in 609.2 ip) at home compared to 4.07 (222 er in 490.1 ip) on the road...rank third in the AL in home ERA and seventh in road ERA...leave following the game tomorrow for an eight-day, seven-game road trip to Tampa Bay (three games) and Cleveland (four games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-2) and Kansas City (1-2).

**ROOKIES:** The A's have used 18 rookies this year, which is the most in the majors and tied with the 1983 club for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the 18 have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have combined to pitch 197 games, which is third most in Oakland history (232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Donaldson, Doolittle, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 20 times and currently have eight players on the DL (Braden, Carignan, Devine, Griffin, Inge, Norberto, Sizemore, Sogard)...the 20 players have combined to miss 780 games (39.0 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL every day since June 6.

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the disabled list yesterday and is scheduled to make his first start of the season...began the season on the 60-day disabled list as he continued his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow...will be making his first Major League start since June 5, 2011 at Boston, a loss (5.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...his last ML win came on May 26, 2011 at Los Angeles (AL).

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 4.62 ERA during a six-start rehab assignment...walked just five batters in 25.1 innings (1.78 per nine innings)...allowed a .301 opponents batting average, including .294 (20 for 68) by right-handers and .314 (11 for 35) by left-handers...issued all five of his walks to righties.

**LAST MINOR LEAGUE START:** He was the losing pitcher in Sacramento's 3-0 loss

at New Orleans last Wednesday...struck out a season-high seven batters in 5.0 innings...allowed RBI singles to Chase Lambin and Jose Duarte in the second and a solo home run to Luke Montz in the third...the River Cats were shutout on three hits by Elih Villanueva and Evan Reed.

**ANDERSON vs. MINNESOTA:** Is 2-2 with a 3.29 ERA (27.1 ip, 27 h, 10 r, 10 er, 2 bb, 19 so, 2 hr) in four career starts...is 1-1 with a 1.84 ERA (3 er in 14.2 ip) in two starts at Target Field, 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (2 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in the Metrodome and 0-1 with a 7.94 ERA (5 er in 5.2 ip) in one start in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 2-1 A's loss at Minnesota April 11...the A's scored a run in the first and he shutout the Twins on four hits over the first seven innings...then allowed two runs in the eighth on RBI singles by Span and Mauer.

**2011 RECAP:** Was limited to just 13 starts and was 3-6 with a 4.00 ERA when he underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow July 14...was originally placed on the disabled list June 7...received a Platelet Rich Plasma injection into his elbow June 13 before the decision was made to have surgery...went 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA over his first five starts and did not allow a home run in 34.2 innings...then went 1-5 with a 5.73 ERA over his final eight starts, yielding eight home runs in 48.2 innings...had four walks and 27 strikeouts over his first five starts compared to 21 walks and 34 strikeouts over his final eight...matched his career high by hitting seven batters.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .270 opponents batting average and .335 on-base percentage, both the highest of his three seasons...his opponents average included a .252 (53 for 210) mark against right-handed hitters and .303 (33 for 109) against left-handers...issued just three of his 25 walks to lefties...his opponents average dropped to .221 with runners in scoring position...now has a .223 (40 for 179) average with RISP over the last two seasons after allowing a .314 mark in 2009...held opponents to a .216 batting average the first time through the lineup, .245 the second time and .342 after that...surrendered seven of his eight home runs with runners on base.

**ON THE BASES:** Tied for seventh in the American League with a career-high five pickoffs and now has 13 in his career...opponents were successful in just 5 of 12 (41.7%) stolen base attempts and are 13 for 22 (59.1%) over the last two years after going 14 for 18 (77.8%) during his rookie campaign.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 2.31 ERA over the first three innings of a game and 5.48 ERA from the fourth inning on...was 2-4 with a 3.42 ERA in eight starts during the day, compared to 1-2 with a 4.99 ERA in five starts at night...his career numbers are 10-8 with a 3.17 ERA (56 er in 159.0 ip) in 26 starts during the day, 11-15 with a 4.03 ERA (95 er in 212.0 ip) in 36 starts at night...received run support of two runs or fewer in seven of his 13 starts and was 0-4 in those games...is now 2-19 in 32 career starts with support of less than three runs, 19-4 with run support of three or more...the A's were 5-8 (.385) in his starting assignments and are 27-35 (.435) in his career...tossed six or more innings seven times, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

MORE FROM 2011: Tossed his second career complete game in his second start of the season but took the loss in a 2-1 decision at Minnesota April 8...earned his first win April 19 against Boston when he combined with Breslow and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in a 5-0 A's win...tossed 8.0 innings, allowed four of the hits and struck out a season-high eight...also won his next start April 24 at Seattle, allowing one earned run in 7.0 innings...was 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA following the start against Seattle, but then went 0-3 with a 5.04 ERA over his next five starts...began the losing streak by allowing seven runs on nine hits in 5.0 innings in an 11-2 loss to Texas April 30...matched his career highs by allowing three home runs and issuing four walks...it was his first of three four-walk games in 2011 (May 10 at Texas, May 16 vs. Los Angeles)...matched his career high by tossing 9.0 innings May 5 against Cleveland, but had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 12-inning loss...snapped his three-game losing streak by tossing 8.0 shutout innings in a 4-3 win at Los Angeles May 26...then allowed a career-high 10 runs on a career-high 11 hits in his next start, a 10-3 loss to New York May 31...allowed two home runs, both to left-handed hitters (Granderson and Cano)...those were his first home runs allowed to a lefty since Aug. 25, 2009 at Seattle (Branyan)...allowed five runs on nine hits in 5.0 innings in his final start, a 6-3 loss at Boston June 5...was placed on the disabled list June 7 with left elbow soreness...received a Platelet Rich Plasma injection after he was examined by Dr. James Andrews at the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Fla. June 13...was examined again a month later and it was determined that his injury required surgery...Dr. Andrews performed successful reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his left elbow, July 14...was transferred to the 60-day DL July 31.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Tommy Milone (9-9, 4.03 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 24<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 0-3 with a 7.50 ERA and .316 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the losing streak is the longest of his career...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last 10 starts and ranks third in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings for the season (1.80)...ranks fifth among AL rookies with nine wins...needs one more to become the ninth rookie in Oakland history to win 10 games...is 5-3 with a 2.47 ERA and .220 opponents average in 11 starts at home compared to 4-6 with a 5.77 ERA and .313 opponents batting average in 12 starts on the road...has the seventh lowest home ERA in the AL and the sixth highest road ERA...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-4 A's win over Cleveland on Friday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against the Twins, a 9-3 A's win at Minnesota earlier this year on July 14 (6.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

The A's bullpen is 4-2 with a 3.34 ERA (23 er in 62.0 ip) and .247 (58 for 235) opponents batting average in the month of August after going 9-0 with a 2.24 ERA and .189 batting average in July...the 13 wins are the most in the majors since the start of July...for the season, leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in wins (23)...ranks second in the AL and fourth in the majors with a 2.91 ERA...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.214) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.299) and slugging percentage (.342)...has issued the second most walks (153) in the AL...has 221 strikeouts in 218.0 innings over its last 71 games (9.1 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings)

- Recorded his 11th save of the season in his last appearance Saturday and now has 21 in his career...that is the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher (previous: Graeme Lloyd, 17).
- Has not allowed a run in 17 of his last 18 outings (1 er in 17.2 ip, 0.51 ERA)...now has a 1.49 ERA (6 er in 36.1 ip) and .123 (15 for 122) opponents average over his last 35 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Is third among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.164), tied for fifth in games pitched (56) and is eighth in innings pitched (56.1) and opponents slugging percentage (.272).
- Has a 0.82 ERA (3 er in 33.0 ip) in 31 appearances at home compared to a 5.01 ERA (13 er in 23.1 ip) in 25 outings on the road.

- Issued each of his first 20 walks to right-handed hitters before walking Adam Dunn on August 11 at Chicago (now has 22 walks).
- Has allowed five home runs in his last six games (27.2 ip) after surrendering just one home run over his first 16 contests (61.2 ip).

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

#### **DARIC BARTON**

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento
  June 2.

#### **JERRY BLEVINS**

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

#### **DALLAS BRADEN**

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

#### **ANDREW CARIGNAN**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he
  was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.
- Had reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow June 19...the surgery
  was performed in New York City by Dr. David Altchek, medical director of the New York Mets.

#### **CHRIS CARTER**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 after batting .279 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI in 72 games with the River Cats.
- Homered in each of his first two games with the A's and three of his first four...including July 6
  against Seattle when he hit the pinch-hit game-ending home run in the 11th inning...is the first
  rookie in Athletics history with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run and the 10th player in Oakland
  history with a pinch-hit game-ending home run...he is the first Athletic with a pinch-hit "walk-off"
  home run in extra innings since Paul Lehner on April 22, 1950 against Boston.
- Had his career-high tying six-game hitting streak snapped August 2 against Toronto (7 for 22, .318).
- Had his first career three hit game August 11 at Chicago.

#### YOENIS CÉSPEDES

Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...
doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.

- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...
  the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched
  the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest
  a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian
  Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.
- Had his first career game-ending hit June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), a three-run "walk-off" home run
- Had the first two four-hit games of his career July 15 at Minnesota and July 20 against New York.
- Was named American Leage Player of the Week July 16 for the week ending July 15 after going 8 for 14 (.571) with five runs, a double, two home runs and six RBI in the three-game series at Minnesota.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from July 8 to 21...was 19 for 33 (.576) with two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, eight runs scored, six multiple hit games and a 1.000 slugging percentage during the streak.
- Batted .344 in July after hitting .343 in June...tied for sixth in the AL in batting and hits (33) in July, ranked eighth in slugging (.573) and tied for eighth in RBI (19).
- Walked three times August 2 against Toronto, the first multi-walk game of his career.

#### **BARTOLO COLÓN**

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to
  make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the
  rotation.
- Threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point during the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...that was
  the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by
  Tim Wakefield in 1998.
- Was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May...based on a
  minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and
  the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest single-month mark of his career and
  the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).
- Left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with the injury... was reinstated July 3.

#### RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.

 Was the only A's player named to the American League All-Star team and pitched a perfect seventh inning, striking out Harper and Wright...it was his first career All-Star selection...he is the seventh Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team, along with Wayne Gross (1977), Matt Keough (1978), Jose Canseco (1986), Mark McGwire (1987), Ben Grieve (1998) and Andrew Bailey (2009).

#### **COLLIN COWGILL**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0 for 4 with three walks in three games before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- · Was recalled by Oakland May 11
- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 with a sprained left ankle...began a rehab assignment
  with Single-A Stockton July 9 and went 1 for 8 (.125) in two games before he was transferred to
  Sacramento July 12...went 3 for 18 (.167) with a RBI in four games with the River Cats before he
  was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 17.

#### COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.
- Stole three bases June 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was his fifth career game of three or more steals, his fourth with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (45) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more three-steal games.
- Was caught stealing after being picked off in the first inning June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), his
  first caught stealing since July 10, 2011 at Texas...that ended his Athletics record streak of 36 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing (caught stealing became an official stat in 1920)...
  broke the previous mark of 28 set by Stan Javier (May 31-October 1, 1995).
- Led off the game with a home run June 27 at Seattle and July 3 against Boston...now has four lead-off home runs as an Athletic and six in his career...the four with the A's are tied for fourth most in Oakland history.
- Finished the game July 3 with a "walk-off" sacrifice fly...it was the 21st game-ending sacrifice fly
  in Oakland history, the first since Dan Johnson on May 15, 2007 against Kansas City...is the first
  Athletic with a leadoff home run and walk-off RBI in the same game since Rickey Henderson on
  August 12, 1992 against Chicago.
- Had the game-ending RBI single July 22 agianst New York.
- Had his third career two-homer game July 25 at Toronto.
- Batted .342 in July, which is his best single-month batting average since hitting .375 in September, 2008...it ranked eighth in the AL.
- Had his second game-ending sacrifice fly of the season August 3 against Toronto (July 3 vs. Boston)...is the second player in Oakland history with two "walk-off" sacrifice flies in one season (Rickey Henderson, 1992)...it was his third game-ending RBI of the season and the fifth of his career.

#### **FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).
- Was traded to Milwaukee July 29 for George Kottaras.

#### **JOEY DEVINE**

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

#### **JOSH DONALDSON**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.
- Drew his first walk of the season June 13 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 30 consecutive games without a walk dating back to September 22, 2010...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Scott Hemond had a 31-game streak from May 3 to July 2, 1994...it was his first walk since September 19, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Was batting .182 in 19 games during his second stint with the A's when he was optioned to Sacramento June 21.

#### **SEAN DOOLITTLE**

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

#### **PEDRO FIGUEROA**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings that day against San Diego before he
  was optioned back to Sacramento June 21.
- Was recalled a third time July 13 when Jim Miller went on the paternity list but was optioned back to Sacramento July 16 without appearing in a game.

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).
- Had a 2.84 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first 19 appearances through May 27...
  then went 0-2 with a save, two blown saves, a 19.50 ERA and .452 opponents batting average over
  his final seven outings.
- Was designated for assignment on July 3 and released July 11.

#### **GRAHAM GODFREY**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

#### **JONNY GOMES**

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits
  for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home
  runs.

- Hit the game-winning pinch-hit two-run home run in the seventh inning June 16 against San Diego, his third career pinch hit home run (last: June 28, 2008 at Pittsburgh)...it snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter and was his first pinch hit since August 29, 2010 against Chicago (NL).
- Hit his third career grand slam July 13 at Minnesota, his first since August 7, 2007 at Detroit...added
  a RBI single in the ninth inning to finish with five RBI...it was his third career game of five or more
  RBI, his first since June 12, 2010 against Kansas City when he had a career-high six.
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, the seventh time he has reached the 10-home run plateau in his career.
- Homered in three consecutive games from August 7-12, the second time he has done that in his career (April 22-25, 2006).

#### A.J. GRIFFIN

 Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 and made his Major League debut that day with a start against San Francisco.

#### **BRANDON HICKS**

- Was claimed off waivers from Atlanta March 13 and was optioned to Sacramento March 15.
- Recalled by Oakland June 23 after batting .272 with 13 home runs and 48 RBI in 65 games with the
  River Cats... was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in hit by pitches (7) at the time of his promotion...also ranked second in strikeouts (76), fifth in extra base hits (37), tied for sixth in doubles (21),
  eighth in home runs (13), ninth in runs (49) and 10th in RBI (48) and slugging (.548).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts July 13 at Minnesota ...it was the first four strikeout game of his
  career
- Hit his first Major League home run July 18 against Texas, a "walk-off" shot off Michael Kirkman
  in the bottom of the ninth inning...became the fourth player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending
  home run for his first ML home run, the second this year (Derek Norris, June 24)...the other two are
  Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 2.

#### **LUKE HUGHES**

 Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

#### **BRANDON INGE**

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports
  Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over
  a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more
  RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16
  runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was
  his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one
  sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas,
  1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history
  to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24,
  1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player
  in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust
  (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin...
  it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a
  strained left groin.

- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI
  in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his twogame rehab assignment.
- · Was reinstated from the DL May 29.
- Struck out four times July 30 against Tampa Bay, matching his career high (June 21, 2006 at Milwaukee and August 14, 2007 at Cleveland).
- Had a career-high tying 13-game hitting streak from July 20 to August 3...hit .263 (15 for 57), which
  was the lowest batting average during a hitting streak of 12 or more games in Oakland history.

#### **KILA KA'AIHUE**

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

#### **GEORGE KOTTARAS**

- Was acquired from Milwaukee July 29 for right-handed pitcher Fautino De Los Santos.
- Was tied for the National League lead with five pinch walks at the time of the trade.
- Hit his first home run as an Athletic August 8 against Los Angeles, snapping a career-high 46-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on April 13 at Atlanta.

#### **BRANDON MCCARTHY**

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in
  Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008,
  the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining
  Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

#### **JIM MILLER**

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- · Returned to Oakland May 20.
- Was placed on the paternity list July 13 and reinstated July 16.
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 3.

#### **TOMMY MILONE**

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).
- Combined with Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second
  Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings
  and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970).
- Was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles May 21 in Oakland...became the first
  pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum.

#### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Started at first base June 6 against Texas...prior to that he had not started at first base since June 24, 2008 and had just two career appearances at first.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a career-high 49-game homerless streak.
- Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.
- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the
  first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota,
  August 12-14, 1996.
- Matched his career-high with three hits (fifth time, first since June 20, 2009 at Colorado) and three RBI (fourth time, second time this year: June 12 at Colorado) June 14 at Colorado.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).
- Hit six home runs in interleague play, which tied for fifth in the majors and matched the Oakland interleague record set by Miguel Tejada in 2000.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 11-17...batted .348 with
  three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first Player
  of the Week award.
- Committed three errors in the sixth inning June 23 against San Francisco, tying the Major League
  record for most errors by a first baseman in an inning...it was the seventh time, the first since Jack
  Clark did it for St. Louis on May 25, 1987...since 1984, the only other Athletic to commit three errors in an inning is Kurt Abbott on May 10, 1998 vs. Chicago at shortstop.
- The three errors set an Oakland record for errors in a game by a first baseman...is the first Athletics first baseman to commit three errors in a game since Lou Limmer on August 19, 1954 vs. New York
- Tied for eighth in the AL with seven home runs in June.
- Hit his 10th home run in his 24th game on July 4 at Boston...in Athletics history, only Dave Kingman reached 10 home runs in fewer than his first 24 games with the club (19 in 1984).
- Had the game-ending single in the bottom of the ninth inning July 20 against New York, his third career walk-off hit (last: July 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee).

#### **JORDAN NORBERTO**

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod
  Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same
  game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder...
  made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.
- Recorded his first Major League win July 6 against Seattle when he struck out the side in the 11th inning of the A's 4-1 win.

#### **DEREK NORRIS**

- Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut...made his Major League debut with a start at catcher that day against Los Angeles (NL) and went 0 for 3.
- Singled off Madison Bumgarner in the fifth inning June 23 against San Francisco for his first Major League hit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning for his first RBI and first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run June 24 against San Francisco, a three-run "walk-off" shot in
  the bottom of the ninth off Santiago Casilla...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third
  player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run...the other two
  are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 30 streak July 22 against New York (AL).

Was optioned to Sacramento July 30 when George Kottaras reported to Oakland but returned Aug. 3
when Kurt Suzuki was traded to Washington.

#### **JARROD PARKER**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over
  the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a
  run in the ninth inning for the blown save.
- Earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

#### **CLIFF PENNINGTON**

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday... is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 20 with left elbow tendinitis...had the lowest slugging
  percentage in the majors (.282) and the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage
  (.259) when he went on the DL.
- Went 5 for 11 (.455) on a three-game rehab assignment with Sacramento from Aug. 4-6 and was reinstated from the DL Aug. 7

#### **ANTHONY RECKER**

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he
was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

#### JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).
- Matched his career-high with four strikeouts June 29 against the Dodgers.
- Had the game-ending RBI double July 8 against Seattle, his second career "walk-off" hit...the other was a single on August 7, 2011 against New York.
- Went 0 for 7 with four strikeouts July 30 against Tampa Bay...is one of 15 players in Oakland history to go hitless in a game with at least seven at bats (last: Matt Holliday, May 3, 2009)...it was his second four-strikeout game of the season (June 19 vs. LAD) and third of his career (August 4, 2009 at Tampa Bay).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak with a first inning single August 2 against Toronto (previous: 20, September 19, 2009-April 20, 2010).

#### **ADAM ROSALES**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned back to Sacramento June 16.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint Aug. 2.
- His double in the seventh inning Aug. 5 against Toronto was his first since July 10, 2010, snapping a 48-game streak without a double...that was the second longest streak by an Athletic since 1993 (58, Frank Menechino from April 30, 2003 to May 9, 2004).

#### TYSON ROSS

 Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.

- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.
- Returned on June 16 to start against San Diego and allowed two runs on one hit and four walks in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint June 23 and went 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA in two starts before he
  was optioned back to Sacramento June 29.

#### **EVAN SCRIBNER**

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 15 against San Diego and recorded his first Major League save in the A's 10-2 win.
- Was optioned to Sacramento June 16 but returned to Oakland June 24.
- · Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 3 but retunred again Aug. 5.

#### SCOTT SIZEMORE

Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left
knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports
Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

#### **SETH SMITH**

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, his fourth consecutive season with double figures in home runs.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI July 27 at Baltimore, despite not entering the game until the sixth inning...became the third player in Oakland history to drive in five runs off the bench (Mickey Tettleton, August 24, 1986 and Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 3 with a strained left hamstring.

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21 but returned to Oakland June 16...appeared in just one game before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 24.
- Recalled a third time July 20 when Pennington went on the disabled list.

#### **KURT SUZUKI**

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).
- Snapped a career-high 78-game homerless streak July 22 against New York...his previous high was 56 games from July 29-October 2, 2010...it was his first homer since September 15, 2011 against Detroit...the home run also snapped a career-high streak of 17 consecutive games without a RBI (previous: 16, July 28-August 14, 2008).
- Was traded to the Washington Nationals with cash for minor league catcher George Freitas, Aug. 3.

#### **MICHAEL TAYLOR**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 4 and went 3 for 16 (.188) in four games before he was
  optioned to Sacramento May 11.
- Returned Aug. 3 and went 0 for 5 in two games before he was sent back to Sacramento Aug. 5.

#### **RICH THOMPSON**

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

#### **NEIL WAGNER**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
- Was claimed off waivers by San Diego May 28.

#### **JEMILE WEEKS**

- Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span...
  since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career
  is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the
  previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
- Went 0 for 3 April 14 at Seattle, snapping a 20-game road hitting streak dating back to August 24 of last year...hit .349 (30 for 86) during the streak, which tied for second longest in Oakland history and fell two short of the record of 22 set by Mike Davis from April 22 to June 17, 1987.
- Stole his 10th base of the season May 15 at Los Angeles (AL)...is the fifth player in Oakland history
  to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first two seasons, the first since Jason McDonald in 1997.
- Had two RBI June 4 against Texas, snapping a career-high 25-game streak without an RBI.
- Had the first three-walk game of his career June 19 against Los Angeles (NL).
- Went a career-high 35 consecutive games without a stolen base from May 16 to June 25.
- Went 0 for 7 July 30 against Tampa Bay but had the "walk-off" sacrifice fly in the bottom of the 15th inning...it was his first career game-ending RBI and the 22nd game-ending sacrifice fly in Oakland history (last: Crisp, July 3, 2012 vs. Boston)...is the second player in Oakland history to go hitless in at least seven at bats but still drive in a run (Matt Holliday, May 3, 2009 at Seattle).
- Had a career-high 31-game errorless streak from June 23 to July 31.
