LAST START: Was the loser in the Twins' 5-1 defeat, August 15 vs. Detroit, opposite Max Scherzer...tossed 4.0 innings, allowing four runs on eight hits, with two walks and three strikeouts..allowed multiple home runs for the third time this season and in his career...the first home run was a solo home run by Miguel Cabrera in the first inning...the second was a two-run home run by Delmon Young in the fourth inning...he was relieved by Jeff Manship after allowing three hits and getting no outs in the fifth inning...threw 84 pitches, 50 strikes.

TWO STARTS AGO ...: Was the loser in the Twins' 12-6 loss, August 10 against Tampa Bay, opposite Jeremy Hellickson...tossed a career-low, 1.1 innings, allowing eight runs (seven earned) on seven hits...did not issue a walk and struck out one...allowed a two run home run to Matt Joyce with one out in the first inning. was relieved in the second inning by Manship after getting one out and facing seven batters...threw 40 pitches, 26 strikes

<u>GETTING INDECISIVE</u>: He has not factored into the decision in six of his 12 starts so far this season, including five of his last eight starts...since his only relief appearance on July 4, he has gone 0-3, 5.66 (41.1 ip, 26 er) in eight starts...in 12 starts, he has left the game trailing just four times.

TRAVELIN' MAN: Currently in his third stint with the Twins, he has split his time between Minnesota and Rochester, going 5-9, 4.69 (134.1 ip, 70 er) in 24 starts and one relief appearance (MLB)...he has struck out 96 batters and walked just 24 between Minnesota and Rochester this season.

SIX IS IT: De Vries is 1-0, 1.41 (32.0 ip, 5 er) when he pitches six or more innings, with 25 strikeouts and a WHIP of 0.906...he has reached the sixth inning five times...in games where he pitches less than six innings, he is 1-4, 8.63 (32.1 ip, 31 er) with 20 strikeouts and a WHIP of 1.670.

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT NOTES: Was the loser in the Twins' 11-8 defeat, May 24 at Chicago (AL), opposite Philip Humber...allowed three solo home runs to A.J. Pierzynski, Paul Konerko and Alex Rios

- » He became the second Twin to be make his Major League debut this season, the other being infielder Brian Dozier, May 7 vs. Los Angeles (AL).
- First Twins pitcher to make his ML debut since Liam Hendriks, September 6, 2011 vs. Chicago (AL).
- » One of just nine Twins pitchers to toss 96-plus pitches in their debut.
- First ever Minnesota-born pitcher to start in his ML debut for the Twins.
- At 27 years and 102 days old, he became the third oldest Twin to make his professional debut as a starting pitcher, younger than only Matt Fox and Les Straker. Fox was 27 years, 273 days old on September 10, 2010 when he debuted and Straker was 27 years, 183 days when he debuted on April 11, 1987.

MINNESOTA NICE: He is the 28th Minnesota native to play for the Twins and one of three on the current roster with Joe Mauer and Glen Perkins being the others...he is a 2003 graduate of Eden Prairie High School where he also played football and was All-State in baseball and Class 3A Player of the Year in his senior season...attended the University of Minnesota, where he was named Second-Team All-Big Team as a Junior.

- Went 12-10, 4.52 (197.0 ip, 99 er) with 61 walks and 144 strikeouts in 42 career games (29 starts) with the Golden Gophers (from 2004-06). He is one of four Minnesotan's pitching in the Big Leagues this season...along with Perkins, Josh Johnson
- (Miami) and Steve Edlefsen (San Francisco).
