THE TWINS: The Twins opened their 10-game road trip with three consecutive losses in Seattle before splitting the first two games in Oakland...today, the Twins will finish their three-game series in Oakland...following this series the Twins will travel to Texas for a four-game series starting tomorrow...11 of the Twins next 15 games will be played on the road...they are 27-34 away from Target Field this season.

TWINS LOSE TO OAKLAND: The Twins lost to the Athletics last night by a score of 4-1...Cole De Vries (2-5) was the starter and loser as he worked 5.2 innings allowing two runs on six hits...he struck out three and walked three...Anthony Swarzak allowed two runs on four hits in 0.2 innings...the Twins had just four hits and did not leave a runner on base...Ben Revere had a hit, scored a run and stole his 29th base of the season...Trevor Plouffe hit into a 5-4-3 triple play in the fifth inning...the Twins did not record a walk and sent just 28 batters up to the plate.

TRIPLE PLAY: Trevor Plouffe hit into a 5-4-3 triple play in the fifth inning last night...it was just the eighth triple play ever turned against the Twins (since 1961) and the first since Mike Redmond hit into 5-4-3 triple play on August 27, 2007 at Cleveland.

ZERO LEFT ON BASE: The Twins did not leave a runner on base last night...it marked just the eighth time in Twins history (since 1961) and first time since David Wells threw a perfect game vs. the Twins on May 17, 1998 at New York...the last time the Twins recorded a hit and left nobody on base was April 12, 1996 at Baltimore when they lost 3-2.

MAUER CHASING BATTEY: Joe Mauer has caught 829 career games and is just two away from tying Earl Battey (831) for first on the Twins all-time games caught list...in terms of starts, Mauer passed Battey for first with his 795th start on Saturday in Seattle...last season, Mauer passed Butch Wynegar (759) and moved into sole possession of second, catching his 760th career game, August 5 at Chicago (AL).

SEASON SERIES WITH OAKLAND: The Twins are looking to win the season series today...they have not lost a season series to Oakland since 2009 when they went 4-6...last season they went 4-4 against Oakland and went 6-3 against them in 2010...they are 3-1-2 in their last six seasons against the A's since 2006.

DROPPING THE HAMMER ON THE A'S: Josh Willingham went 1-for-3 last night and has now hit safely in all eight games vs. Oakland this season...in the eight games against his former team, he has hit five home runs, while batting .433 (13-for-30) with 14 runs batted in and a slugging percentage of 1.000...he has driven in multiple runs four times against the Athletics this season.

G'DAY MATE: Today's starter Liam Hendriks is one of 28 Australian-born players to ever play in the Majors and one of six to play this season (five are pitchers)...the other Aussies to play this season are Grant Balfour (OAK), Travis Blackley (SF/OAK), Josh Spence (SD), Luke Hughes (MIN/OAK), and Rich Thompson (LAA/OAK).

REVERE SEEKING 30: Ben Revere is just one stolen base away from becoming the fourth player in club history with consecutive 30-steal seasons (34 last season)...Chuck Knoblauch stole 30-plus in four straight seasons from 1994-97, Rod Carew stole 30-plus in four straight from 1973-76, and Cesar Tovar stole 30-plus in three straight from 1968-70... additionally, Revere is looking to become the first player in baseball since Otis Nixon (1994 with Boston and 1995 with Texas) to record back-to-back seasons with at least 30 steals and zero home runs.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, PAUL MOLITOR!: Former Twin and St. Paul native Paul Molitor is celebrating his 56th birthday today...the Hall of Famer played three seasons with the Twins from 1996-98, leading the American League in hits with 225 as a 39-year old in 1996...he recorded his 3,000th while playing for the Twins on September 16, 1996 at Kansas City and was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2004...he is currently a Twins minor league baserunning/infield coach.

THIS AND THAT:

- Justin Morneau needs just one walk to pass Tony Oliva (448) and move into sole possession of ninth on the Twins all-time walks list.
- Dating back to August 2, Justin Morneau has hit .357 (25-for-70) hitting safely in 16 of 18 games, including 11 straight.
