A's vs. RAYS

The A's trail the season series, 4-3...are 2-2 in Tampa Bay and lost two of three in Oakland...have won 12 of the last 20 games overall...however, have lost three of the previous five season series and are 25-27 against the Rays since 2007...all-time, the A's are 84-52 (.618) against Tampa Bay, which is the second best record against the Rays by any AL team...are 47-21 in Oakland and 35-30 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The Athletics turned the 21st triple play in franchise history Tuesday night, the eighth in Oakland history...it was the first since Randy Velarde's unassisted triple play at New York on May 29, 2000...it was the A's first triple play turned in the Coliseum since July 18, 1983 against Detroit.

Yoenis Céspedes is batting .353 (49 for 139) since the All-Star Break, which ranks third in the American League.

Josh Donaldson is 15 for 37 (.405) with six RBI in 10 games since he was recalled from Sacramento August 14.

Jonny Gomes has hit safely in all seven of his career games against the Rays (9 for 25, .360).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 a doubleheader turns into a tripleheader as the A's need 18 innings to win the second game of a twinbill, 9-8...the doubleheader, which starts at 1:34 and ends at 9:06, ends when Ted Kubiak's RBI single finishes the 5 hour, 8 minute second game.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games...are 14-13 over the last 27 contests after going 16-2 over the previous 18 games...are 10 games over .500 for the season, which is one short of the season-high of 11 (67-56, August 22)...are 30-15 (.667) since the start of July, which is the **best record in the American League** and third best in the majors...are 24-14 (.632) since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the AL...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by six games...are tied for the second Wild Card slot with Baltimore and Detroit, the second consecutive day they have held at least a share of a playoff spot...prior to that, last held a playoff spot August 11... trail Tampa Bay by 2½ games for the first slot...had a season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1 but have gone 45-27 (.625) since then, which is the **best record in the American League** and third best in the majors...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 53 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

SHUTOUTS: The A's were shut out last night for the 15th time this season, which is the most in the majors...the last time the A's were shut out more than 15 times in a season was 1979 when they were blanked 17 times...however, have two shutouts in the last eight games and 11 for the season, which ranks third in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.09 ERA (114 er in 250.2 ip) over the last 27 games after logging a 2.52 ERA over the previous 34 contests from June 14 to July 25...now have a 3.49 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...rank second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.375) and fewest home runs allowed (109) and third in opponents batting average (.245) and on-base percentage (.306)...have the third fewest strikeouts (856)...A's starting pitchers are 8-11 with a 4.46 ERA (80 er in 161.1 ip) over the last 27 games after going 15-6 with a 2.47 ERA over the previous 34 contests from June 14 to July 25...now have a 3.81 ERA (317 er in 749.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the AL.

DON'T WALK: The A's have issued 39 walks in 192.2 innings in August, an average of 1.82 per nine innings...averaged 1.97 walks per nine innings in July and that marked the **first time since at least 1916** that the A's issued fewer than two walks per nine innings in a month of at least 15 games...A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 20 games...that matches the **longest streak in Oakland history** (August 13-September 3, 2006)...have walked just 196 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors with a .232 batting average...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982 and the A's have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...lead the American League and rank second in the majors with 1029 strikeouts (Houston, 1039)...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1226 strikeouts set in 2008...have the second fewest runs scored in the AL (501), the second lowest on-base percentage (.306), third lowest slugging percentage (.386) and third fewest doubles (191)...rank second in walks (423) and third in triples (25)...have hit 93 home runs in 70 games since June 4, which is fifth most in the majors...have 135 home runs overall, which already matches their most in a season since 2009...the last time they had more than 135 in a season was 2007 (171)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff is tied with Colorado for the Major League lead in pickoffs (20)...opponents have been successful in just 77 of 118 (65.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest mark in the American League...the offense is fifth in stolen bases (99)...have been caught stealing just 27 times and rank second in stolen base percentage (78.4%).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat and lead the majors in last at bat wins...those are the most last at bat wins by an A's team since they had 26 in 2004...have lost each of their last two one-run decisions after winning 11 of the previous 12...are 19-15 (.559) in one-run games overall...are tied for second in the American League in one-run wins and are tied for the third best record...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL, the second best record and are tied for the second most games...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...are 25-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

WALK-OFF WINS: The A's have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...that is the second best total in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 15 set in 2004...have eight "walk-off" wins since July 3...five of the "walk-off" wins have been by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...11 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this eight-day, seven-game road trip to Tampa Bay (0-1) and Cleveland (four games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-2) and Kansas City (1-2)...went 5-1 on their last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Minnesota (2-1)...have won seven of the last eight home games and are 28-11 (.718) in the Coliseum since June 6...for the season, are 39-27 (.591) at home compared to 28-30 (.483) on the road...have the third best home record in the American League...have a 3.01 ERA (210 er in 627.2 ip) at home compared to 4.10 (227 er in 498.1 ip) on the road...rank third in the AL in home ERA and seventh in road ERA.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 18 rookies this year, which is the most in the majors and tied with the 1983 club for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the 18 have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have combined to pitch 200 games, which is third most in Oakland history (232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Donaldson, Doolittle, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, the fourth time in the last six years they have used it at least 20 times...currently have eight players on the DL (Braden, Carignan, Devine, Griffin, Inge, Norberto, Sizemore, Sogard)...the 20 players have combined to miss 804 games (40.2 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL every day since June 6.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season, the 23rd of his career...the A's are 11-10 (.523) in his starting assignments and his teams are 12-10 (.545) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 15 of his 21 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his last start to snap his losing streak at a career-high three games...is now 3-4 with a 5.14 ERA (28 er in 49.0 ip) and .292 (56 for 192) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 5-3 with a 2.46 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks fifth among American League rookies with 97 strikeouts and needs three more to become the 10th rookie in Oakland history to strike out 100...also ranks fifth among AL rookies in starts (21) and sixth in innings pitched (129.1) and wins (8)...his

3.48 ERA is second lowest among AL rookies with 100 or more innings pitched and his .243 opponents batting average is third lowest.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in his last four starts and has surrendered just six in 129.1 innings for the season...is averaging 0.42 home runs per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Gonzalez, WASH 0.41)...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.340).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .219 (23 for 105) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the American League...has held the opponents number four hitter to a .158 (9 for 57) batting average, which is second lowest in the AL (Verlander, DET .152)...opponents are 28 for 122 (.230) with 11 walks (.299 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average is ninth lowest in the AL...has issued 31 of his 50 walks and allowed four of his six home runs to left-handed hitters.

RUNS ALLOWED: Did not allow a run in his last start and has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 22 career starts...is one of three starting pitchers to allow one run or fewer in at least 12 of his first 22 career appearances...the other two are Stephen Strasburg (14) and Justin Verlander (12)...has allowed two runs or fewer in 14 of his 22 starts and exactly six runs four times.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 21 starts and is 0-7 with a 6.04 ERA (32 er in 47.2 ip) in those starts...is 8-0 with a 1.98 ERA (18 er in 81.2 ip) in 12 starts with support of two runs or more

THE FIFTH INNING: Has allowed 17 of his 51 (33.3%) runs in the fifth inning...has a 7.45 ERA (16 er in 19.1 ip) in the fifth inning and a 2.78 ERA (34 er in 110.0 ip) in all other innings.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season today...Tommy Milone has 24 starts, marking the third time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with 20 or more starts...the other times were 1978 (Keough 32, Johnson 30) and 2009 (Cahill 32, Anderson 30)...is scheduled to make the 61st start by a rookie this year, but the A's will fall short of the Oakland record of 116 starts by a rookie set in 2009...has eight wins and Milone has 10...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with eight or more wins (1978, 1979, 2009)...rookies have 31 of the A's wins this year...the only times in Oakland history rookies have combined for more wins is in 2009 (44) and 1983 (38).

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times this year relievers blew a save in his start (Fuentes, May 29; Cook, June 22)...earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas...tossed a career-high 8.0 shutout innings and yielded just one hit, a Young single to lead off the eighth inning, in a 12-1 victory over Texas June 4 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the first inning June 9 at Arizona, snapping his career-high scoreless streak at 18.0 innings...struck out a career-high nine batters in a 2-1 victory at Seattle June 27...extended his winning streak to a career-high three games in a 6-1 victory over Boston July 2 in Oakland...allowed just four runs during the winning streak, which spanned four starts (3 er in 26.2 ip, 1.01 ERA)...did not walk a batter for the first time in his career at Minnesota July 15...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings in a 2-1 win over New York July 21 in Oakland.

LAST START: He combined with Ryan Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland to snap a career-high three-game losing streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed six of the hits...put runners in scoring position in each of the first three innings, allowing four hits and a walk, but stranded all five base runners...also put runners on first and third with two outs in the sixth before retiring each of the final seven batters he faced.

PARKER vs. TAMPA BAY: Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 4-1 A's loss in Oakland on August 1...allowed a RBI single to Joyce in the first, a RBI single to Roberts in the fourth and a RBI double to Pena in the sixth...the A's were limited to a run on five hits by Cobb, Peralta and Rodney.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts (20.2 ip, 22 h, 6 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 21 so, 2 hr)...struck out 21 batters in 20.2 innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .271 (13 for 48) against right-handed hitter and .281 (9 for 32) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...opponents were 4 for 29 (.138) with runners in scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (6-5, 3.16 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season...was reinstated from the disabled list August 10 and is 0-2 with a 6.19 ERA (11 er in 16.0 ip) and .338 (23 for 68) opponents batting average in three starts since his return...is 2-0 with a 1.98 ERA (3 er in 13.2 ip) in two starts against American League East teams this year compared to 4-5 with a 3.36 ERA (30 er in 80.1 ip) in 13 starts against everyone else...is scheduled to pitch on four days rest...is 2-4 with a 4.22 ERA (23 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA (10 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 11 of his 15 starts, including one run or fewer three times...is 3-2 with a 2.98 ERA (48.1 ip, 49 h, 21 r, 16 er, 15 bb, 34 so, 5 hr) in nine career games, eight starts, against Tampa Bay...is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (6 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts at Tropicana Field.

The A's bullpen is 4-2 with a 3.09 ERA (23 er in 67.0 ip) and .235 (59 for 251) opponents batting average in the month of August after going 9-0 with a 2.24 ERA and .189 batting average in July...the 13 wins are the most in the majors since the start of July...for the season, leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in wins (23)...ranks second in the AL and fourth in the majors with a 2.87 ERA...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.212) and third lowest on-base percentage (.297) and slugging percentage (.339)...issued the second most walks (154) in the AL...has 230 strikeouts in 223.0 innings over its last 74 games (9.3 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings)

- Recorded his 12th save of the season in his last appearance Tuesday and now has 22 in his career...that is the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher (previous: Graeme Lloyd, 17).
- Has not allowed a run in 18 of his last 19 outings (1 er in 18.2 ip, 0.48 ERA)...now has a 1.45 ERA (6 er in 37.1 ip) and .120 (15 for 125) opponents average over his last 36 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Is tied for third among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.162), is sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.268), tied for sixth in games pitched (57) and is eighth in innings pitched (57.1).
- Has a 0.79 ERA (3 er in 34.0 ip) in 32 appearances at home compared to a 5.01 ERA (13 er in 23.1 ip) in 25 outings on the road.
