A's vs. INDIANS

The A's lead the season series, 5-2...won last night's series opener in Cleveland after winning four of six over two series in Oakland...each team has won three seasons series over the previous six years and the A's are 32-26 against Cleveland since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-222 against the Indians...that includes 136-98 in Oakland and 119-124 in Cleveland...all-time, the A's are 890-1015 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 8 for 8 in save opportunities since returning to the closer role on August 11.

Chris Carter hit a home run Saturday and now has 11 home runs since June 29, the day he was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento...the home runs are tied for 10th most in the American League over that span.

Yoenis Céspedes is batting .344 (52 for 151) since the All-Star Break, which ranks third in the American League.

Josh Donaldson is 17 for 48 (.354) with six doubles, a home run and seven RBI in 13 games since he was recalled from Sacramento August 14...three of the RBI have given the A's the lead and another two tied the game.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 2002 the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three in a row, five of the past six and nine of the past 11 to improve to a season-high 13 games over .500...have not been more than 13 games over .500 since they finished the 2006 season 93-69...are 33-15 (.688) since the start of July, which is the **best record in the majors**...are 27-14 (.659) since the All-Star Break, which is the **best record in the American League** and second best in the majors (Cincinnati, 31-14)...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by 5½ games...are tied with Baltimore for the first Wild Card slot, ½ game ahead of Tampa Bay and one game ahead of Detroit...had a season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1 but have gone 48-27 (.640) since then, which is the **best record in the majors**...have won each of the past three series, are 4-2-1 over the past seven and 10-3-2 over the past 15...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 57 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

SHUTOUTS: The A's recorded their 12th shutout of the season last night, their third in the past 11 games...the 12 shutouts rank third most in the American League...however, were shut out last Thursday for the 15th time this season, which is the most in the majors...the last time the A's were shut out more than 15 times in a season was 1979 when they were blanked 17 times.

DON'T WALK: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 23 games, which is the **longest streak in Oakland history** (previous: 20, August 13-September 3, 2006)...have walked just 202 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have issued 48 walks in 219.2 innings in August, an average of 1.97 per nine innings...averaged 1.97 walks per nine innings in July and that marked the **first time since at least 1916** that the A's issued fewer than two walks per nine innings in a month of at least 15 games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.89 ERA (120 er in 277.2 ip) over the last 30 games after logging a 2.52 ERA over the previous 34 contests from June 14 to July 25...now have a 3.46 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the American League (111) and rank second in opponents batting average (.243), on-base percentage (.304) and slugging percentage (.373)...A's starting pitchers are 10-11 with a 4.22 ERA (85 er in 181.1 ip) over the last 30 games after going 15-6 with a 2.47 ERA over the previous 34 contests from June 14 to July 25...now have a 3.77 ERA (322 er in 769.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors with a .232 batting average...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982 and the A's have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...lead the American League and rank third in the majors with 1052 strikeouts...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1226 strikeouts set in 2008...have the second fewest runs scored in the AL (513), the second lowest on-base percentage (.305), fourth lowest slugging percentage (.387) and are tied for the fourth fewest doubles (198)...are third in walks (426) and triples (26)...have hit 97 home runs in 73 games since June 4, which is fourth most in the majors...have 139 home runs overall, which is their most in a season since 2007 (171)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won last Friday night, 5-4, and have now won 12 of their last 15 one-run games...are 20-15 (.571) in one-run decisions overall...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat and **lead the majors in last at bat wins.**..those are the most last at bat wins by an A's team since they had 26 in 2004...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL, the second best record and are tied for the second most games...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...are 26-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff is tied with Colorado for the Major League lead in pickoffs (20)...opponents have been successful in just 78 of 119 (65.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest mark in the American League...the offense is fifth in stolen bases (100)...have been caught stealing just 29 times and rank second in stolen base percentage (77.5%).

WALK-OFF WINS: The A's have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...that is the second best total in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 15 set in 2004...have eight "walk-off" wins since July 3...five of the "walk-off" wins have been by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...11 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this eight-day, seven-game road trip to Tampa Bay (2-1) and Cleveland (1-0)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-2) and Kansas City (1-2)...went 5-1 on their last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Minnesota (2-1)...have won seven of the last eight home games and are now 28-11 (.718) in the Coliseum since June 6...for the season, are 39-27 (.591) at home compared to 31-30 (.508) on the road...have the third best home record in the American League...have a 3.01 ERA (210 er in 627.2 ip) at home compared to 3.99 (233 er in 525.1 ip) on the road...rank third in the AL in home ERA and are seventh in road ERA.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 18 rookies this year, which is the most in the majors and tied with the 1983 club for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the 18 have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have combined to pitch 205 games, which is second most in Oakland history (232 in 2009)...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Donaldson, Doolittle, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, the fourth time in the last six years they have used it at least 20 times...currently have eight players on the DL (Braden, Carignan, Devine, Griffin, Inge, Norberto, Sizemore, Sogard)...the 20 players have combined to miss 828 games (41.4 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL every day since June 6.

MILONE'S CAPEED HIGHS

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season...the A's are 14-10 (.583) in his starting assignments and his teams are 19-10 (.655) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 17 of his 24 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 21 times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Earned the win in his last start, a 5-1 decision against Minnesota last Wednesday...the win snapped his career-high three-game losing streak...is now 1-3 with a 5.91 ERA (21 er in 32.0 ip) and .262 (33 for 126) opponents batting average over his last five starts...however, has walked just four while striking out 26.

DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last 11 starts, which is the longest streak by an A's starter since Gil Heredia had a 14-game streak from May 29-August 11, 1999...Milone has seven walks and 62 strikeouts in 73.0 innings over this 11-game stretch...for the season, ranks third in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.76) and seventh in strikeout to walk ratio (3.73)

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for third among American League rookies with 10 wins...is the ninth rookie in Oakland history to win 10 games...ranks fourth with 112 strikeouts and is the ninth rookie in Oakland history with 100 or more strikeouts...is tied for the lead among Major League rookies in complete games (1)...ranks second among AL rookies in innings pitched (153.1) and third in games started (24).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-3 with a 2.34 ERA (22 er in 84.2 ip) and .206 (64 for 310) opponents average in 12 starts at home compared to 4-6 with a 5.77 ERA (44 er in 68.2 ip) and .313 (88 for 281) opponents batting average in 12 starts on the road...has the sixth lowest home ERA in the American League and the fifth highest road ERA...has allowed 17 of his 20 home runs on the road and ranks

fourth in the AL in road home runs allowed...has allowed 16 runs in his last four home starts after allowing seven over his first eight.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 5-1 with a 1.84 ERA (10 er in 49.0 ip) in seven starts against American League Central teams and 5-8 with a 4.83 ERA (56 er in 104.1 ip) in 17 starts against everyone else.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 24 starts and is 4-7 with a 2.81 ERA (27 er in 86.1 ip) in those games...is 6-2 with a 5.24 ERA (39 er in 67.0 ip) in 11 starts with run support of three runs or more.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is one of two A's rookies with at least 20 games started (Parker, 22), marking the third time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with 20 or more starts...the other times were 1978 (Keough 32, Johnson 30) and 2009 (Cahill 32, Anderson 30)...is scheduled to make the 62nd start by a rookie this year, but the A's will fall short of the Oakland record of 116 starts by a rookie set in 2009...has 10 wins and Parker has eight...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with eight or more wins (1978, 1979, 2009)...rookies have 32 of the A's wins...the only times in Oakland history rookies have combined for more wins is in 2009 (44) and 1983 (38).

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles May 21 in Oakland...became the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum...tossed a complete game three-hitter in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (NL) in Oakland June 20...allowed just two base runners over the final seven innings...it was the first complete game by an A's rookie in the Coliseum since Barry Zito on September 10, 2000 against Tampa Bay...combined with Grant Balfour and Ryan Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Seattle June 25...tossed seven innings and allowed all seven of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Texas June **30**...allowed a leadoff home run to Beltre in the second inning, snapping a career-high 15.0 inning scoreless streak...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Minnesota **July 14**...allowed a career-high 10 hits...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over New York July 20 in Oakland...struck out a career-high 10 batters, matching the most ever by an Oakland pitcher against the Yankees (fourth time, last: Bobby Witt, July 2, 1993)...did not walk a batter or allow a run, the ninth time in Oakland history a pitcher had at least 10 strikeouts with no runs or walks (last: Brandon McCarthy vs. Seattle, September 3, 2011).

LAST START: Earned the win in his last start, a 5-1 decision against Minnesota last Wednesday...allowed a run in the second inning when a Butera groundout scored Doumit, but that was the only run he would surrender in eight innings.

MILONE vs. CLEVELAND: Had a no decision in his only career start, a 6-4 A's win August 17...pitched on 12 days rest as the A's had off days August 9 and 13...allowed a grand slam to Duncan in the fourth inning but then retired six of the final seven batters he faced...left after five innings with the scored tied at 4-4 and the A's scored twice in the eighth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Travis Blackley (4-3, 3.52 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 19th appearance and 12th start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his 23rd appearance overall this year...is 3-3 with a 4.04 ERA (29 er in 64.2 ip) in 11 starts and 1-0 with a 3.28 ERA (9 er in 24.2 ip) in 11 relief appearances...ranks second in the American League in pickoffs (7) and is tied for second in balks (2)...tossed 5.2 innings in his last appearance August 20 against Minnesota...it was the longest outing by an A's reliever this season (previous: 3.2, Blackley, May 22 vs. Los Angeles and Norberto, Aug. 4 vs. Toronto)...was charged with the loss in his only career appearance against Cleveland, an 18-6 loss while pitching for Seattle July 16, 2004...allowed one run in the first and surrendered six in the third...including back-to-back-to-back home runs by Lawton, Martinez and Blake.

The A's bullpen is 2-0 with seven saves, no blown saves, a 1.74 ERA (31.0 ip, 19 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 37 so, 2 hr) and .174 (19 for 109) opponents batting average over its past 13 games (since August 14)...for the season, ranks second in the AL and third in the majors with a 2.84 ERA...has the second lowest opponents batting average (.209) and slugging percentage (.335) in the majors and third lowest on-base percentage (.294)...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in wins (24)...has issued the third most walks (157) in the AL...has 240 strikeouts in 228.0 innings over its last 77 games (9.5 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine

- Has 15 saves for the season and now has 25 in his career...that is the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher (previous:
- Has not allowed a run in 20 of his last 22 outings (2 er in 21.2 ip, 0.83 ERA)...now has a 1.56 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) and .119 (16 for 135) opponents average over his last 39 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in games pitched (60), is fourth in opponents batting average (.159) and sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.264) and innings pitched (60.1)...is tied for the fifth in most walks (24).
- Has a 0.79 ERA (3 er in 34.0 ip) in 32 appearances at home compared to a 4.78 ERA (14 er in 26.1 ip) in 28 outings on the road.
