ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five in a row, seven of the past eight and 11 of the past 13 to improve to a season-high 15 games over .500...have not been more than 15 games over .500 since finishing the 2006 season 93-69...are 35-15 (.700) since the start of July, which is the **best record in the majors**...are 29-14 (.674) since the All-Star Break, which is the **best record in the American League** and second best in the majors (Cincinnati, 33-14)...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by 4½ games, which is the closest the A's have been to first place since they were also 4½ back on August 3...are in sole possession of the first Wild Card slot, one game ahead of Baltimore...had a season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1 but have gone 50-27 (.649) since then, which is the **best record in the majors**...have won each of the past four series, are 5-2-1 over the past eight and 11-3-2 over the past 16...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 59 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

DON'T WALK: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 25 games, which is the **longest streak in Oakland history** (previous: 20, August 13-September 3, 2006)...have walked just 205 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have issued 52 walks in 237.2 innings in August, an average of 1.97 per nine innings...averaged 1.97 walks per nine innings in July and that marked the **first time since at least 1916** that the A's issued fewer than two walks per nine innings in a month of at least 15 games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.41 ERA (31 er in 116.0 ip) over the last 13 games after logging a 4.56 ERA over the previous 19 contests from July 26 to August 15...now have a 3.42 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (112) and rank second in opponents batting average (.242), on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.372)...A's starting pitchers are 9-2 with a 2.70 ERA (25 er in 83.1 ip) over the last 13 games after going 3-9 with a 5.09 ERA over the previous 19 contests...have a 3.73 ERA (324 er in 781.1 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the AL.

SHUTOUTS: The A's had back-to-back shutouts Monday and Tuesday...it was their first time recording consecutive shutouts since September 27-28 of last year at Seattle, the final two games of the 2011 season...have four shutouts in the past 13 games and have 13 for the season, which is tied for second most in the majors...however, have been shut out 15 times this season, which is the most in the majors...the last time the A's were shut out more than 15 times in a season was 1979 when they were blanked 17 times.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-1 on this eight-day, seven-game road trip to Tampa Bay (2-1) and Cleveland (3-0)...with a win today, would match the sixth best road trip in Oakland history...the last time the A's went 6-1 or better on a road trip was April 24-May 2, 2006 (6-1, Texas 3, Kansas City 2, Los Angeles 2)...have won the past five road games, their second longest road winning streak this year...the season-high is six games (July 1-25)...went 5-1 on their last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Minnesota (2-1)...have won seven of the last eight home games and are now 28-11 (.718) in the Coliseum since June 6...for the season, are 39-27 (.591) at home and 33-30 (.524) on the road...the home record ranks fifth in the American League and the road record also ranks fifth...have a 3.01 ERA (210 er in 627.2 ip) at home compared to 3.89 (235 er in 543.1 ip) on the road...rank third in the AL in home ERA and are fourth in road ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's have a .233 batting average, which is second lowest in the majors to Seattle (.232)...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982 and the A's have hit under .233 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...lead the majors with 1080 strikeouts...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1226 strikeouts set in 2008...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.306) and third fewest runs scored (528)...are tied for third in triples (26) and are fourth in walks (429)...have hit 100 home runs in 75 games since June 4, which is fourth most in the majors...have 142 home runs overall, which is their most in a season since 2007 (171)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat and **lead the majors in last at bat wins**...those are the most last at bat wins by an A's team since they had 26 in 2004...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL, the second best record and are tied for the second most games...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...are 26-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later...are 12-3 (.800) over their last 15 one-run games and are 20-15 (.571) in one-run decisions overall...are tied for fourth in the AL in one-run wins and have the fourth best record.

WALK-OFF WINS: The A's have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...that is the second best total in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 15 set in 2004...have eight "walk-off" wins since July 3...five of the "walk-off" wins have been by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...11 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI.

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff is tied with Colorado for the Major League lead in pickoffs (20)...opponents have been successful in just 78 of 119 (65.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest mark in the American League...the offense is tied for fourth in stolen bases (102)...have been caught stealing just 29 times and rank second in stolen base percentage (77.9%).

ROOKIES: The A's have used 18 rookies this year, which is the most in the majors and tied with the 1983 club for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the 18 have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have combined to pitch 209 games, which is second most in Oakland history (232 in 2009)...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Carter, Céspedes, Cook, Donaldson, Doolittle, Milone, Norris, Parker, Scribner).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, the fourth time in the last six years they have used it at least 20 times...currently have eight players on the DL (Braden, Carignan, Devine, Griffin, Inge, Norberto, Sizemore, Sogard)...the 20 players have combined to miss 844 games (42.2 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL every day since June 6.

A's vs. INDIANS

The A's have won the season series, leading 7-2 with only today's game to play...lost the first two meetings but have won seven straight since then...have now won four season series over the past seven years and are 34-26 against Cleveland since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 257-222 against the Indians...that includes 136-98 in Oakland and 121-124 in Cleveland...all-time, the A's are 892-1015 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's had a season-high seven doubles in last night's win, their most since recording an Oakland record tying eight doubles August 26, 2011 at Boston.

Grant Balfour is a perfect 8 for 8 in save opportunities since returning to the closer role on August 11.

Chris Carter has 12 home runs since he was recalled from Sacramento June 29, which is tied for sixth in the AL over that span.

Yoenis Céspedes is batting .342 (55 for 161) since the All-Star Break, which ranks third in the American League.

Josh Donaldson is 20 for 57 (.351) six doubles and 10 RBI in 15 games since he was recalled from Sacramento August 14.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1995** the A's tie a club record with three triples in a 7-2 win at Baltimore...Brent Gates has one of them and adds a single and double to fall a home run short of the cycle...in **2001** Eric Chavez homers twice and has eight RBI in the A's 15-0 win at Baltimore.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season, the 24th of his career...the A's are 12-10 (.545) in his starting assignments and his teams are 13-10 (.565) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 16 of his 22 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times.

RECENTLY: Is 1-0 with a with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) and .241 (13 for 54) opponents batting average over his past two starts after going 0-3 with a 6.85 ERA and .337 opponents batting average over his previous four starts...the three-game losing streak was the longest of his career...is now 3-4 with a 5.07 ERA (31 er in 55.0 ip) and .292 (63 for 216) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 5-3 with a 2.46 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks fifth among American League rookies with 104 strikeouts...is the 10th rookie in Oakland history to strike out 100...also ranks fifth among AL rookies in starts (22) and sixth in wins (8) and innings pitched (135.1)...his 3.52 ERA is second lowest among AL rookies with 100 or more innings pitched.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just seven home runs in 141.0 innings...is averaging 0.47 home runs per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...ranks sixth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.351).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .227 (25 for 110) with runners in scoring position, which is sixth lowest in the American League...has held the opponents number four hitter to a .167 (10 for 60) batting average, which is the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors (Bass, SD .111)...opponents are 30 for 128 (.234) with 11 walks (.300 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has issued 32 of his 52 walks and allowed five of his seven home runs to left-handed hitters.

RUNS ALLOWED: Has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 23 career starts...has allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and exactly six runs four times.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 22 starts and is 0-7 with a 6.04 ERA (32 er in 47.2 ip) in those starts...is 8-0 with a 2.16 ERA (21 er in 87.2 ip) in 13 starts with support of two runs or more.

THE FIFTH INNING: Has allowed 18 of his 54 (33.3%) runs in the fifth inning...has a 7.52 ERA (17 er in 20.1 ip) in the fifth inning and a 2.82 ERA (36 er in 115.0 ip) in all other innings.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season today...Tommy Milone has 25 starts, marking the third time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with 20 or more starts...the other times were 1978 (Keough 32, Johnson 30) and 2009 (Cahill 32, Anderson 30)...is scheduled to make the 63rd start by a rookie this year, but the A's will fall short of the Oakland record of 116 starts by a rookie set in 2009...has eight wins and Milone has 11...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with eight or more wins (1978, 1979, 2009)...rookies have 33 of the A's wins this year...the only times in Oakland history rookies have combined for more wins is in 2009 (44) and 1983 (38).

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago **April 25** in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walk over the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times this year relievers blew a save in his start (Fuentes, May 29; Cook, June 22)...earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston **May 1**...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas...tossed a career-high 8.0 shutout innings and yielded just one hit, a Young single to lead off the eighth inning, in a 12-1 victory over Texas **June 4** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the first inning **June 9** at Arizona, snapping his career-high scoreless streak at 18.0 innings...struck out a career-high nine batters in a 2-1 victory at Seattle **June 27**...extended his winning streak to a career-high three games in a 6-1 victory over Boston **July 2** in Oakland...allowed just four runs during the winning streak, which spanned four starts (3 er in 26.2 ip, 1.01 ERA)...did not walk a batter for the first time in his career at Minnesota **July 15**...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings in a 2-1 win over New York **July 21** in Oakland.

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win last Friday in Tampa Bay...allowed one run in the second, fourth and fifth innings...Zobrist homered in the second, Keppinger had a sacrifice fly in the fourth and Upton hit a RBI double in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-2 but Oakland scored one in the seventh and two in the eighth for the win.

PARKER vs. CLEVELAND: He combined with Ryan Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Cleveland August 19 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed six of the hits...put runners in scoring position in each of the first three innings, allowing four hits and a walk, but stranded all five base runners...also put runners on first and third with two outs in the sixth before retiring each of the final seven batters he faced.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts (20.2 ip, 22 h, 6 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 21 so, 2 hr)...struck out 21 batters in 20.2 innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .271 (13 for 48) against right-handed hitter and .281 (9 for 32) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...opponents were 4 for 29 (.138) with runners in scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (7-5, 3.12 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season...was reinstated from the disabled list August 10 and is 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (13 er in 23.0 ip) and .293 (27 for 92) opponents batting average in four starts since his return...is 3-0 with a 2.18 ERA (5 er in 20.2 ip) in three starts against American League East teams this year compared to 4-5 with a 3.36 ERA (30 er in 80.1 ip) in 13 starts against everyone else...is now 8-0 with a 3.34 ERA (32 er in 86.1 ip) in 13 starts against the East since 2009...has not lost to an AL East team since September 7, 2008 against Boston...is 3-3 with a 2.55 ERA (14 er in 49.1 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-2 with a 3.66 ERA (21 er in 51.2 ip) in eight starts on the road...is 2-3 with a 5.23 ERA (31.0 ip, 27 h, 18 r, 18 er, 16 bb, 16 so, 4 hr) in eight career appearances, four starts, against Boston...earned the win in his only start this year, a 4-2 A's win in Boston May 2...Saltalamacchia scored on an sacrifice fly by Byrd in the seventh, but that was the only run he allowed in 6.2 innings.

The A's bullpen is 2-0 with eight saves, no blown saves, a 1.45 ERA (37.1 ip, 24 h, 8 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 41 so, 2 hr) and .180 (24 for 133) opponents batting average over its past 15 games (since August 14)...for the season, ranks second in the AL and third in the majors with a 2.79 ERA...has the second lowest opponents batting average (.209) and slugging percentage (.334) in the majors and third lowest on-base percentage (.293)...**leads the American League** and ranks third in the majors in wins (24)...has issued the third most walks (158) in the AL...has 247 strikeouts in 236.1 innings over its last 79 games (9.4 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings)...the 364 strikeouts overall are fourth most in the AL.

- Is a perfect 8 for 8 in save opportunities since returning to the closer role on August 11 (7.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1.23 ERA).
- Has 15 saves for the season and now has 25 in his career...that is the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher (previous: Graeme Lloyd, 17).
- Has not allowed a run in 20 of his last 22 outings (2 er in 21.2 ip, 0.83 ERA)...now has a 1.56 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) and .119 (16 for 135) opponents average over his last 39 games (since May 20) after posting a 4.29 ERA and .234 opponents average over his first 21 contests.
- Ranks second among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.159), is tied for fourth in games pitched (60), is fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.264) and seventh in innings pitched (60.1).
- Has a 0.79 ERA (3 er in 34.0 ip) in 32 appearances at home compared to a 4.78 ERA (14 er in 26.1 ip) in 28 outings on the road.
- Has three saves in four games against Cleveland this year (3.1 ip, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 4 for 4 in save opportunities and has a 3.95 ERA in 25 appearances in his career against the Indians (27.1 ip, 24 h, 12 r, 12 er, 11 bb, 39 so, 3 hr).
