A's vs. RED SOX

The A's have won the season series as they lead 6-1 with two games remaining...the six wins are the A's most against the Red Sox since 2006 (7-3)...went 2-1 in Boston and are 4-0 in Oakland...the last time the A's won more than four games from Boston in Oakland was in 1988 when they went 6-0...this marks the second time in the last three years the A's have won the season series (5-4 in 2010)...are 33-29 against Boston since 2006...that includes 21-9 in Oakland, 11-19 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 225-275 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 133-114 in Oakland, 91-160 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 867-1056 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's scored 20 runs in a game last night for the fourth time in Oakland history, the second time against Boston (21, June 14, 1969)...it was the A's highest scoring game since a 23-2 win over Texas on September 30, 2000...the 18-run margin of victory tied for second highest in Oakland history (23-2 on Sept. 30, 2000 vs. Texas; 21-3 on June 18, 2000 at Kansas City)...it matched the Athletics all-time best margin of victory against Boston (24-6 on May 1, 1929)...had 39 total bases, which tied the fourth best total in Oakland history...had 10 extra base hits, the 12th time in Oakland history the A's had at least 10 extra base hits in a game.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1906 Jack Coombs and Boston's Joe Harris go the distance in a 24 inning, 4-1 A's victory that lasts four hours and 47 minutes...in 1974 Sal Bando hits a two-run homer in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...in 2002 Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Minnesota 7-5 to set a franchise record with their 18th consecutive win...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won their 74th game of the season last night, which matches the season total from last year...have won seven straight, nine of the last 10 and 13 of the last 15 to improve to a season-high 17 games over .500...those are the A's most games over .500 since they finished the 2006 season 24 games over (93-69)...are 74-57 (.565), which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...have won four straight series for the first time since July 9-25, 2010...have not won more than four straight since May 28-June 14, 2007 when they won five in a row...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by four games for the second consecutive day...that is the closest the A's have been to first since July 31 when they were 3½ back...have not been closer than that since April 14 when they were three back...are in sole possession of the first Wild Card slot, one game ahead of Baltimore and 3½ games ahead of third place Tampa Bay...the 3½ game lead is the A's largest of the season...are 37-15 (.712) since the start of July, which is the best record in the majors...are 31-14 (.689) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the American League and second best in the majors (Cincinnati, 34-14)...had a season-high nine-game losing streak from May 22-June 1 but have gone 52-27 (.658) since then, which is the best record in the majors...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 61 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have a seven-game winning streak, which matches the season high (July 18-25)...have not won more than seven straight since June 8-18, 2006 when they had a 10-game winning streak...have outscored the opposition 59-19 during the streak and have trailed in just seven innings...are batting .312 (83 for 266) with 25 doubles, one triple and 16 home runs...have a 2.43 ERA (17 er in 63.0 ip) and .207 (48 for 232) opponents batting average.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high five home runs yesterday, which was their most in a game since September 11, 2009 at Minnesota when they also hit five...hit four home runs Thursday at Cleveland and this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have hit nine or more home runs in back-to-back games (last: 11, June 27-28, 1996)...now have 151 home runs for the season, which is already their most in a season since 2007 (171)...have hit 109 home runs in 77 games since June 4, which is third most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 32 runs in the last two games, which is the third best two-game total in Oakland history (34, June 14-15, 1969 at Boston; 34, June 18-19, 2000 at Kansas City and vs. Baltimore)...scored 32 runs over a 16-game stretch earlier this year from May 15-June 1...were tied for last in the American League in runs scored as recently as August 14 but now rank ninth...lead the majors with 1089 strikeouts...that is the 10th highest single season total in Athletics history (9th is 1094 in 2011, 8th is 1104 in 1964; record is 1226 in 2008)...are batting .236, which is a season high but second lowest in the AL...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been shut out 15 times, which matches last year for the third highest single season total in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979)...rank third in the AL in walks (437) and tied for third in triples (26)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

IN AUGUST: The A's finished August with an 18-10 record, which was third best in the American League...it was the A's best August since going 21-6 in 2006...went 19-5 in July after going 15-13 in June...this marks the first time the A's have posted a winning record in three consecutive months since 2006 when they did it in the final four months...the offense set an Oakland record for strikeouts in a month with 235 (previous: 233 in August, 2008)...hit 39 home runs, which were the A's most in a month since August, 2004 (also 39)...the pitching staff had 206 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest single month total in Oakland history...the bullpen had 11 saves, which were the A's most in a month since September, 2006 (also 11).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.66 ERA (42 er in 142.0 ip) over the last 16 games and now have a 3.44 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...have four shutouts over the last 15 games and 13 for the season, which is tied for second in the AL and majors...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (114) and rank second in opponents batting average (.243), on-base percentage (.304) and slugging percentage (.373)...are tied with Colorado for the most pickoffs in the majors (20).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-2 with a 3.04 ERA (32 er in 94.2 ip) over the last 15 games...have a 3.76 ERA (331 er in 792.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the AL...have the fewest home runs (79) and walks (208) in the AL...have walked three batters or fewer in each of the last 30 games, including an Oakland record 25 straight games with two or fewer from August 2-29.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Boston (1-0) and Los Angeles (three games)...have won eight of the last nine home games and are 40-27 (.597) for the season, which is tied for the third best home record in the American League...need one more home win to clinch a winning record at home for the third consecutive season...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (2-1) and Cleveland (4-0), matching the sixth best road trip in Oakland history (min. 6 games)...it was the best since April 24-May 2, 2006 when they also went 6-1...are 34-30 (.531) on the road and have a season-high tying six-game road winning streak (also July 1-25)...following this homestand, the A's will play 17 of their next 20 games on the road...have a 3.00 ERA (212 er in 636.2 ip) at home compared to 3.94 (242 er in 552.1 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat and **lead the majors in last at bat wins...** are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL, the second best record and are tied for the second most games...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...are 26-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later...are 12-3 (.800) over their last 15 one-run games and are 20-15 (.571) in one-run decisions overall.

WALK-OFF WINS: The A's have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...that is the second best total in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 15 set in 2004...have eight "walk-off" wins since July 3...five of the "walk-off" wins have been by home run, which is one short of the Oakland record of six (2004)...11 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI.

CDIEFIN'S CAREER HIGHS

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season, his first since being reinstated from the disabled list today...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in seven of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer all eight times.

BRIEFLY: Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 after combining for a 6-3 record and a 2.66 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...made his Major

League debut and went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA in eight starts before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list August 5 with right shoulder tightness...went 1-0 with a 4.90 ERA (7.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 7 so) in two rehab starts with Sacramento on August 22 against Salt Lake and August 27 at Colorado Springs.

3-0: Is 3-0 in five starts since the All-Star Break, the first three wins of his Major League career...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin his career 3-0 since Rich Harden in 2003...no pitcher in Oakland history has started his career 4-0 with all of his *outings* coming as a starter...the last A's pitcher to begin his career 4-0 with all his *wins* coming as a starter is Erik Hiljus in 2001...began his career with three no decisions...since 1918, the only other pitcher in Athletics history to begin his career with three consecutive no decisions, all as a starting pitcher, is Willie Adams (June 11-July 31, 1996).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 9 for 45 (.200) with one walk (.217 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .161 (20 for 124) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .333 (13 for 39) after that.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.19 ERA (3 er in 22.2 ip) and .163 (13 for 80) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and a 3.68 ERA (9 er in 22.0 ip) and .241 (20 for 83) opponents average after that.

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Tossed at least 6.0 innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first seven starts before leaving his last start on August 4 after 1.2 scoreless innings with shoulder tightness...is the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1918 to begin his career with seven consecutive games of six or more innings and three runs or fewer...the previous high was five by John Henry Johnson (1978) and Dave Hamilton (1972)...is the second Major Leaguer to do it over the last 18 years...the other is Jered Weaver, who had nine straight with Los Angeles (AL) in 2006.

FOUR HITS OR FEWER: Allowed eight hits in his fourth start after allowing four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts...is just the sixth player since 1918 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of six or more innings and four hits or fewer (last: Jeremy Hellickson, TB, August 2-15, 2010).

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is one of three rookies currently in the A's starting rotation (Milone, Parker)...is scheduled to make the 64th start by a rookie this year, but the A's will fall short of the Oakland record of 116 starts by a rookie set in 2009...rookies have 34 of the A's wins...the only times in Oakland history rookies have combined for more wins is in 2009 (44) and 1983 (38).

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco *June 24* in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Posey in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings...left trailing 2-1 but Derek Norris hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to get him off the hook...became the 43rd pitcher in Oakland history to start in his Major League debut...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Texas *June 29*...tossed 6.0 shutout innings and allowed just two hits...left with a 2-0 lead but Balfour was charged with four runs in the eighth...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Boston *July 4* in Oakland...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a careerhigh 14.0 innings...the streak ended when Ortiz hit his 400th career home run to lead off the fourth inning...earned his first Major League win in the A's 6-3 victory at Minnesota *July 13*...combined with Blevins and Miller on a five-hit shutout in the A's 16-0 win at Toronto *July 25*...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three of the hits.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Toronto August 4...allowed a leadoff single to Escobar but then retired each of the next five batters before leaving the game with a 1-1 count on Sierra with two outs in the second inning...went on the disabled list the next day with right shoulder tightness.

GRIFFIN vs. BOSTON: Had a no decision in his only career start, a 3-2 A's win in Oakland earlier this year on July 4...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings...the streak ended when Ortiz hit his 400th career home run to lead off the fourth inning...also allowed a Gonzalez RBI single in the sixth...left after six innings with the scored tied at 2-2.

MINORS: Combined for a 7-3 record and a 2.82 ERA in 17 games, all starts, with Midland and Sacramento...began the year at Midland and was 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA in seven starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento May 11...went 3-2 with a 2.81 ERA in eight starts with the River Cats before he was promoted to Oakland June 24...was 4-2 with a 3.07 ERA in 10 starts overall with Sacramento...issued 18 walks in 102.0 innings, an average of 1.59 per nine innings...struck out 91 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.06...allowed a .211 opponents batting average, including .181 (33 for 182) against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (46 for 193) against right-handers...surrendered just home runs in 102.0 innings, an average of 0.62 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (2-0, 0.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was reinstated from the disabled list August 21 after beginning the season on the 60-day DL as he continued his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's win at Cleveland on Monday (7.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 4-2 with a 2.86 ERA in seven career starts against Boston...has not faced the Red Sox this year...went 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year...went 1-1 with a 4.62 ERA during a six-start rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Sacramento...was limited to just 13 starts last year and was 3-6 with a 4.00 ERA when he was placed on the disabled list June 7.

The A's bullpen is 2-0 with eight saves, no blown saves, a 1.64 ERA (44.0 ip, 27 h, 10 r, 8 er, 12 bb, 43 so, 2 hr) and .174 (27 for 155) opponents batting average over its past 17 games (since August 14)...for the season, is second in the AL and third in the majors with a 2.79 ERA...has the second lowest opponents batting average (.208) and slugging percentage (.331) in the majors and third lowest on-base percentage (.294)...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in wins (24)...has issued the second most walks (163) in the AL...has 249 strikeouts in 243.0 innings over its last 81 games (9.2 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings).

- Has 15 saves for the season and now has 25 in his career...that is the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher (previous: Graeme Lloyd, 17).

LAST START: He combined with Blevins, Neshek and Scribner on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win at Cleveland last Tuesday...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed seven of the hits...allowed at least one hit in each of the first five innings before retiring the side in order in the sixth...the biggest threat came in the fourth inning when Duncan single and Lillibridge doubled to start the inning, but he retired each of the next three

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento
 June 2.

JERRY BLEVINS

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he
 was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.

- Homered in each of his first two games with the A's and three of his first four...including July 6
 against Seattle when he hit the pinch-hit game-ending home run in the 11th inning...is the first
 rookie in Athletics history with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run and the 10th player in Oakland
 history with a pinch-hit game-ending home run...he is the first Athletic with a pinch-hit "walk-off"
 home run in extra innings since Paul Lehner on April 22, 1950 against Boston.
- Had his career-high tying six-game hitting streak snapped August 2 against Toronto (7 for 22, .318).
- Had his first career three hit game August 11 at Chicago.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...
doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.

- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...
 the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched
 the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest
 a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian
 Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.

- Threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point during the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...that was
 the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by
 Tim Wakefield in 1998.
- Was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May...based on a
 minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and
 the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest single-month mark of his career and
 the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).
- Left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with the injury... was reinstated July 3.

RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous

- high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.
- Was the only A's player named to the American League All-Star team and pitched a perfect seventh inning, striking out Harper and Wright...it was his first career All-Star selection...he is the seventh Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team, along with Wayne Gross (1977), Matt Keough (1978), Jose Canseco (1986), Mark McGwire (1987), Ben Grieve (1998) and Andrew Bailey (2009).

COLLIN COWGILL

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0 for 4 with three walks in three games before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Was recalled by Oakland May 11
- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 with a sprained left ankle...began a rehab assignment
 with Single-A Stockton July 9 and went 1 for 8 (.125) in two games before he was transferred to
 Sacramento July 12...went 3 for 18 (.167) with a RBI in four games with the River Cats before he
 was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 17.

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.
- Stole three bases June 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was his fifth career game of three or more steals, his fourth with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (45) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more three-steal games.
- Was caught stealing after being picked off in the first inning June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), his
 first caught stealing since July 10, 2011 at Texas...that ended his Athletics record streak of 36 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing (caught stealing became an official stat in 1920)...
 broke the previous mark of 28 set by Stan Javier (May 31-October 1, 1995).
- Led off the game with a home run June 27 at Seattle and July 3 against Boston...now has four lead-off home runs as an Athletic and six in his career...the four with the A's are tied for fourth most in Oakland history.
- Finished the game July 3 with a "walk-off" sacrifice fly...it was the 21st game-ending sacrifice fly
 in Oakland history, the first since Dan Johnson on May 15, 2007 against Kansas City...is the first
 Athletic with a leadoff home run and walk-off RBI in the same game since Rickey Henderson on
 August 12, 1992 against Chicago.
- Had the game-ending RBI single July 22 agianst New York.
- Had his third career two-homer game July 25 at Toronto.
- Batted .342 in July, which is his best single-month batting average since hitting .375 in September, 2008...it ranked eighth in the AL.
- Had his second game-ending sacrifice fly of the season August 3 against Toronto (July 3 vs. Boston)...is the second player in Oakland history with two "walk-off" sacrifice flies in one season (Rickey Henderson, 1992)...it was his third game-ending RBI of the season and the fifth of his career.
- Had a career-high tying five RBI August 19 against Cleveland...it was his fith career five RBI game.

FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).
- Was traded to Milwaukee July 29 for George Kottaras.

JOEY DEVINE

Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a

- debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.
- Drew his first walk of the season June 13 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 30 consecutive games without a walk dating back to September 22, 2010...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Scott Hemond had a 31-game streak from May 3 to July 2, 1994...it was his first walk since September 19, 2010 at Minnesota.

- Was acquired from Arizona Aug. 20 for minor league infielder Sean Jamieson.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 23 at Tampa Bay for his first hit as an Athletic...that snapped a career-high 0-for-22 streak (previous: 20, twice, last: May 27-June 2, 2010).

PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings that day against San Diego before he
 was optioned back to Sacramento June 21.

GRAHAM GODFREY

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was
optioned to Sacramento April 21.

 Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits
 for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home
 runs.
- Hit the game-winning pinch-hit two-run home run in the seventh inning June 16 against San Diego, his third career pinch hit home run (last: June 28, 2008 at Pittsburgh)...it snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter and was his first pinch hit since August 29, 2010 against Chicago (NL).
- Hit his third career grand slam July 13 at Minnesota, his first since August 7, 2007 at Detroit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning to finish with five RBI...it was his third career game of five or more RBI, his first since June 12, 2010 against Kansas City when he had a career-high six.
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, the seventh time he has reached the 10-home run plateau in his career.
- Homered in three consecutive games from August 7-12, the second time he has done that in his career (April 22-25, 2006).

A.J. GRIFFIN

 Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 and made his Major League debut that day with a start against San Francisco.

BRANDON HICKS

- · Was claimed off waivers from Atlanta March 13 and was optioned to Sacramento March 15.
- Recalled by Oakland June 23 after batting .272 with 13 home runs and 48 RBI in 65 games with the
 River Cats... was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in hit by pitches (7) at the time of his promotion...also ranked second in strikeouts (76), fifth in extra base hits (37), tied for sixth in doubles (21),
 eighth in home runs (13), ninth in runs (49) and 10th in RBI (48) and slugging (.548).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts July 13 at Minnesota ...it was the first four strikeout game of his
 career.
- Hit his first Major League home run July 18 against Texas, a "walk-off" shot off Michael Kirkman
 in the bottom of the ninth inning...became the fourth player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending
 home run for his first ML home run, the second this year (Derek Norris, June 24)...the other two are
 Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).
- · Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 2.

LUKE HUGHES

 Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports
 Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over
 a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more
 RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16
 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was
 his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one

- sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history
 to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24,
 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin...
 it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a
 strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI
 in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his twogame rehab assignment.
- · Was reinstated from the DL May 29.
- Struck out four times July 30 against Tampa Bay, matching his career high (June 21, 2006 at Milwaukee and August 14, 2007 at Cleveland).
- Had a career-high tying 13-game hitting streak from July 20 to August 3...hit .263 (15 for 57), which
 was the lowest batting average during a hitting streak of 12 or more games in Oakland history.

KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

GEORGE KOTTARAS

- Was acquired from Milwaukee July 29 for right-handed pitcher Fautino De Los Santos.
- · Was tied for the National League lead with five pinch walks at the time of the trade.
- Hit his first home run as an Athletic August 8 against Los Angeles, snapping a career-high 46-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on April 13 at Atlanta.

BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in
 Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008,
 the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining
 Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.
- Was placed on the paternity list July 13 and reinstated July 16.
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 3.

TOMMY MILONE

Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his
A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in
Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete
game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher

- in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).
- Combined with Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second
 Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings
 and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970).
- Was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles May 21 in Oakland...became the first
 pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum.

BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Started at first base June 6 against Texas...prior to that he had not started at first base since June 24, 2008 and had just two career appearances at first.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.
- Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.
- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the
 first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota,
 August 12-14, 1996.
- Matched his career-high with three hits (fifth time, first since June 20, 2009 at Colorado) and three RBI (fourth time, second time this year: June 12 at Colorado) June 14 at Colorado.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).
- Hit six home runs in interleague play, which tied for fifth in the majors and matched the Oakland interleague record set by Miguel Tejada in 2000.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 11-17...batted .348 with
 three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first Player
 of the Week award.
- Committed three errors in the sixth inning June 23 against San Francisco, tying the Major League
 record for most errors by a first baseman in an inning...it was the seventh time, the first since Jack
 Clark did it for St. Louis on May 25, 1987...since 1984, the only other Athletic to commit three errors in an inning is Kurt Abbott on May 10, 1998 vs. Chicago at shortstop.
- The three errors set an Oakland record for errors in a game by a first baseman...is the first Athletics first baseman to commit three errors in a game since Lou Limmer on August 19, 1954 vs. New York.
- Tied for eighth in the AL with seven home runs in June.
- Hit his 10th home run in his 24th game on July 4 at Boston...in Athletics history, only Dave Kingman reached 10 home runs in fewer than his first 24 games with the club (19 in 1984).
- Had the game-ending single in the bottom of the ninth inning July 20 against New York, his third career walk-off hit (last: July 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee).

JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder...
 made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.
- Recorded his first Major League win July 6 against Seattle when he struck out the side in the 11th inning of the A's 4-1 win.

DEREK NORRIS

- Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut...made his Major League debut with a start at catcher that day against Los Angeles (NL) and went 0 for 3.
- Singled off Madison Bumgarner in the fifth inning June 23 against San Francisco for his first Major League hit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning for his first RBI and first multiple hit game.

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).
- · Matched his career-high with four strikeouts June 29 against the Dodgers.
- Had the game-ending RBI double July 8 against Seattle, his second career "walk-off" hit...the other
 was a single on August 7, 2011 against New York.
- Went 0 for 7 with four strikeouts July 30 against Tampa Bay...is one of 15 players in Oakland history to go hitless in a game with at least seven at bats (last: Matt Holliday, May 3, 2009)...it was his second four-strikeout game of the season (June 19 vs. LAD) and third of his career (August 4, 2009 at Tampa Bay).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak with a first inning single August 2 against Toronto (previous: 20, September 19, 2009-April 20, 2010).

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned back to Sacramento June 16.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint Aug. 2.
- His double in the seventh inning Aug. 5 against Toronto was his first since July 10, 2010, snapping a
 48-game streak without a double...that was the second longest streak by an Athletic since 1993 (58,
 Frank Menechino from April 30, 2003 to May 9, 2004).

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.

- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, his fourth consecutive season with double figures in home runs.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI July 27 at Baltimore, despite not entering the game until the sixth inning...became the third player in Oakland history to drive in five runs off the bench (Mickey Tettleton, August 24, 1986 and Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 3 with a strained left hamstring.

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.

MICHAEL TAYLOR

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 4 and went 3 for 16 (.188) in four games before he was
 optioned to Sacramento May 11.
