BOSTON RED SOX (62-71) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-57)

WEST COAST SWING: The Red Sox tonight continue a 9-day, 9-game West Coast road trip with the 2nd of 3 tilts in Oakland...The Sox were swept in a 3-game series by the Angels in Anaheim to begin the trek and dropped last night's series opener at Oakland, 20-2...Following this weekend's series, the club concludes the trip with 3 contests in Seattle.

♣The Sox gave up a season-high 20 runs last night and the 18-run margin of defeat was Boston's largest since they lost to the Yankees, 22-1, on 6/19/00 at Fenway Park...For the 1st time in a game since at least 1918, 5 different Red Sox pitchers allowed at least 1 home run.

ROAD RUN: Of Boston's remaining 29 games, 18 are on the road...The Sox are in the midst of a 26-game stretch from 8/9-9/5 during which they play 19 contests on the road, going 7-14 in that stretch thus far.

The Sox have lost 5 straight road contests, their longest losing streak away from home this year and longest since a 7-gamer on the road from 9/7-25/11...They are 8th in the AL at 30-33 (.476) in away games this year...The club is 29-28 (.509) on the road since 4/23, 6th best in the AL in that time, despite losses in 17 of their last 26 road tilts.

RECENT RESULTS: The Sox have lost their last 4 games and have dropped 6 of 8 sets since 8/2...Boston went 9-20 (.310) in August, the club's worst August mark since 2006 (9-21, .300)...The Sox are 19-28 (.404) since the All-Star break.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Red Sox are a season-high 9 games under .500 and in 4th place in the AL East, 14.0 games behind the division-leading Yankees, which matches their largest deficit in the division this year...Boston trails the Orioles for 2nd place by 12.0 games and the club is 9.5 games behind the 3rd-place Rays...The Sox are 12.0 games out in the AL Wild Card race.

CLOSE CALLS: Despite last night's 18-run deficit, 12 of Boston's last 16 games have been decided by 3 runs or less, with the club going 5-11 in those 16 tilts...3 of Boston's last 9 contests have been decided in the last at-bat, including 2 in extra innings, with 4, 1-run contests in that time.

VS. OAKLAND: The Red Sox and A's continue a 3-game series in Oakland tonight, their last match-ups of 2012...The A's hold a 6-1 advantage in the season series thus far, the 1st time the Sox have dropped the season set to Oakland since 2009 (4-5).

- A-Boston has lost 6 straight to Oakland after winning their 1st match-up of the season on 4/30...lt is the Sox longest losing stretch vs. the A's since also losing 6 straight from 6/13-8/3/69...Boston has not dropped 7 consecutive games to the Athletics franchise since an 8-game spell against Philadelphia in 1932 (5/2-28).
- 4 The Sox have lost all 4 games at the Coliseum this year and have won just 7 of their last 28 road games against the A's dating back to 7/26/06...Boston was swept in its series in Oakland in July, their 1st time being swept by the A's since 5/23-25/08 in Oakland (0-3).

LASER SHOW: Dustin Pedroia has hit in each of the last 11 games, going 16-for-46 (.348) with 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 7 RBI and 8 runs in the 11-game stretch...It is the 2nd-longest active hit streak in the Majors behind David Ortiz (12 games since 7/2)...This is Pedroia's 3rd double-digit hit streak this season behind 14 and 13-game stretches.

♣ Pedroia has hit safely in all but 1 of 25 games dating back to 8/5 and ranks 2nd in the AL with a .363 AVG (37-for-102) in that time, trailing only TB's Jeff Keppinger (.365).

BACKSTOP BARRAGE: Jarrod Saltalamacchia went deep last night and has homered in 2 of his last 3 and 3 of his last 8 contests...<u>His 23 long balls in 2012 are 2nd most in a season by a Red Sox catcher since 1997, trailing Jason Varitek's 25-homer season in 2003.</u>

STARTING LINE: James Loney has hit safely in all 6 games with Boston since being acquired in a 9-player trade with the Dodgers on 8/25...He is 8-for-21 (.381) in the 6 tilts... Loney also collected an RBI in each of his 1st 4 starts with the Sox through 8/30, matching Matt Stairs (6/30-7/3/95) for the longest such steak to begin a Sox career since 1935.

AUGUST RUSH: Red Sox batters led the Majors with 290 hits in August, 1 shy of the club's most in an August over the last 15 seasons since 1997 (291 in 2005)...Boston also topped the Majors with 70 doubles in August and ranked 4th in the AL with 139 runs during the month.

*Dustin Pedroia led the Majors with 12 doubles in August, matching the most of his career in a single month (also 9/08)...He tied for 2nd in the AL with 40 hits and tied for 3rd in the circuit with 16 extra-base hits in August...Jacoby Ellsbury tied for 2nd in the Majors with 11 August doubles.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT: Red Sox batters knocked 9 hits last night and have combined for at least as many in 8 of their last 10 contests... Over the last 10 tilts, the team is batting .312 (116-for-372) with 18 doubles, 11 homers and 54 runs.

LEADER BOARD: Boston batters have tallied a Major League-high 457 extra-bases hits, including an ML-best 297 doubles this year...The club is 2nd in the Majors with 649 runs and 613 RBI, trailing only Texas (675 R/652 RBI)... They are 2nd in the AL in hits (1,250), 3rd in total bases (3rd in ML, 2,014) and 4th in AVG (.270).

MAKING AN IMPACT: Scott Podsednik is batting .354 (45-for-127) in 39 games with the Red Sox, tops in the AL and 2nd in the Majors to PHI's Kevin Frandsen (.357) among players with at least 50 plate appearances this year...Pedro Ciriaco is tied for 3rd in AVG among AL players in that group.

CENTER OF ATTENTION: Despite having a season-long 8-game hit streak and career-long tying 6-game stretch with multi-hits snapped Wednesday, Jacoby Ellsbury owns a .327 AVG (16-for-49) with 10 runs over his last 11 games.

APPROACHING 1,000: Dustin Pedroia has 995 hits, 5 shy of becoming the 31st player in Sox history to reach 1,000 in his career...<u>He would be just the club's 2nd primary 2nd baseman to reach the mark, joining Bobby Doerr (2,042).</u>

27 PLAYERS, 34 STINTS: With LHP Franklin Morales going on the 15-day disabled list Tuesday (left shoulder inflammation), the Red Sox have now had 27 different players on the DL this season for 34 separate stints, both of which are the most by a Sox team since at least 1971 and, according to STATS, the most by any team since at least 1987...13 players who have been on the DL with the Sox this year are current or former All-Stars.

ROSTER CROWD: Zach Stewart Wednesday night became the 53rd player to appear for Boston this year, the most in the Majors this year and 4 more than their entire 2011 total (49)...The Red Sox have only used more than 53 players in a season once before, with 55 in 1996.

429 different non-pitchers have appeared in a game for Boston this season, up from 23 a year ago.

BOBBY V. AT THE HELM: Bobby Valentine, in his 1st season as Red Sox manager, ranks 4th among active Major League skippers in games (2,322) and 5th in wins (1,179)... He is 41st on the all-time managerial wins list with Hughie Jennings next at 1,184.

FIVE YEARS AGO: 5 years ago today, in only his 2nd Major League start, Clay Buchholz threw a no-hitter at Fenway in a 10-0 win over the Orioles...It was the 1st no-hitter ever by a Red Sox rookie...He walked 3, hit a batter and recorded 9 K's.

HONORING NO. 6: The Red Sox family is mourning the loss of Johnny Pesky, who passed away on 8/13 at the age of 93...The team will wear a black patch with a white No. 6 on the left sleeve of their home white and alternate jerseys, and the right sleeve of their gray road uniforms will have a black armband for the remainder of the season in honor of Pesky.

PREVIOUS OUTING: Suffered the loss on 8/9 at CLE as the Red Sox were defeated 5-3...Allowed 4 runs on 7 hits and 2 walks over 4.1 innings...Struck out 4 while tossing 94 pitches...With Boston leading 3-1, gave up 3 runs in the 5th inning...Exited with the score tied 3-3 and was charged with an additional run in the frame... The Indians plated their final run in the 8th off Craig Breslow on an RBI by Jason Donald.

MORE 2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Won his 10th game of the season on 7/18 vs. CWS...Ended his 7 game stretch permitting at least 1 HR in each at SEA on 7/1, the longest such streak by a Sox lefty since Roger Moret from 8/17-9/29/73 (10)...Snapped a streak of 14 GS to begin his career, allowing less than 5 runs in each on 6/8 vs. WAS...Fanned 9 at BAL on 5/22, becoming the 1st Sox lefty other than Jon Lester to register that many K's in a game since Casey Fossum in 2002 and the 1st Sox lefty other than Lester with 9 K's in a road game since Bruce Hurst in 1988...Earned back-to-back wins for the 1st time and set a new single-season-career high with his 3rd win vs. CLE on 5/12...Fanned 8 in 4.0 IP on 5/1 vs. OAK, becoming the 1st Sox with that many K's in an outing of 4.0 IP or less since Tim Wakefield in 2003... Earned his 1st win since 8/10/10 at CWS on 4/26...Became the 1st Sox 24 years old or younger to fan 7 in a game since 2008 vs. TB on 4/15.
