WEST COAST WOES: The Red Sox today continue a 9-day, 9-game West Coast road trip with the last of 3 tilts in Oak-land...The Sox were swept in a 3-game series by the Angels in Anaheim to begin the trek and have dropped the 1st 2 games in Oakland...Following this weekend's series, the club concludes the trip with 3 contests in Seattle.

- Including last night's 7-1 loss, the Red Sox have been outscored 39-8 over the 1st 5 games of the trip, scoring 2 runs or less in each contest...It is the club's longest streak scoring 2 runs or less since 4/26-5/1/08, and the club has not gone 6 games without more than 2 runs since 7/25-30/78.
- Boston gave up a season-high 20 runs Friday night in a 20-2 loss, with the 18-run margin of defeat Boston's largest since a 22-1 loss to the Yankees on 6/19/00...In the last 2 contests, Sox starters have gone 3.0 innings or less in backto-back games for the 1st time since 9/18-19/05.

ROAD RUN: Of Boston's remaining 28 games, 17 are on the road...The Sox are in the midst of a 26-game stretch from 8/9-9/5 during which they play 19 contests on the road, going 7-15 in that stretch thus far.

The Sox have lost 6 straight road contests, their longest losing streak away from home this year and longest overall since a 7-gamer on the road from 9/7-25/11...They are 8th in the AL at 30-34 (.469) in away games this year...The club is 29-29 (.500) on the road since 4/23, 6th best in the AL in that time, despite losses in 18 of their last 27 road tilts.

RECENT RESULTS: The Sox have lost 5 straight tilts, matching their longest drought of the year for the 4th time, 1st since 7/2-7...Boston's last longer slide was 6 losses to begin the 2011 season, which also marked the last time the club was swept in back-to-back series of at least 3 games.

♣Boston is 9-21 (.300) since 8/1, dropping 7 of 9 sets in that time...The Sox are 19-29 (.395) since the All-Star break.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Red Sox are a season-high 10 games under .500 and in 4th place in the AL East, 15.0 games behind the division-leading Yankees, which marks their largest deficit in the division this year...Boston trails the Orioles for 2nd place by 12.0 games and the club is 10.5 games behind the 3rd-place Rays...The Sox are 12.0 games out in the AL Wild Card race.

VS. OAKLAND: The Red Sox and A's conclude a 3-game series in Oakland tonight, their last match-up of 2012...The A's hold a 7-1 advantage in the season series thus far, the 1st time the Sox have dropped the season set to Oakland since 2009 (4-5)...Regardless of today's outcome, the Red Sox this year will have their fewest ever wins against the A's franchise.

- Boston has lost 7 straight to Oakland after winning their 1st match-up of the season on 4/30...It is the Sox longest losing stretch vs. the Athletics franchise since an 8-game spell against Philadelphia in 1932 (5/2-28).

 The Sox have lost all 5 games at the Coliseum this year
- and have won just 7 of their last 29 road games against the A's dating back to 7/26/06...Boston is in danger of being swept in Oakland for the 2nd time this year (also July). Boston has not been swept in consecutive road series in Oakland since 1988 (5/27-29 and 8/29-31).

DUSTIN'S DOZEN: Dustin Pedroia drove in Boston's only run last night and has hit in each of the last 12 games, going 17-for-50 (.340) with 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI and 8 runs...It matches David Ortiz (since 7/2) for the Majors' longest active hit streak...This is Pedroia's 3rd double-digit streak this year behind 14 and 13-game stretches.

Pedroia has hit safely in all but 1 of 26 games since 8/5, batting .358 AVG (106 AB)...His 38 hits during that span are tied for 2nd in the Majors, trailing only Derek Jeter (39).

APPROACHING 1.000: Dustin Pedroia has 996 hits. 4 shy of becoming the 31st player in Sox history to reach 1,000 in his career... He would be just the club's 2nd primary 2nd baseman to reach the mark, joining Bobby Doerr (2,042).

♣ Pedroia's next game will be the 832nd of his career... Since 1918, only 5 players have reached 1,000 hits within their 1st 832 Major League games with the Red Sox: Nomar Garciaparra (746th game), Wade Boggs (747th), Johnny Pesky (774th), Ted Williams (814th) and Jim Rice (827th).

LEFTY LEDGER: The Sox face left-hander Brett Anderson today and are 25-17 (.595) when facing a lefty starter this season, 2nd-best in the AL and tied for 5th best in the Majors.

Boston batters have posted an AL-high .458 SLG vs. LHP (3rd in ML) and rank 2nd in the AL with 54 homers and 201 RBI off lefties...<u>Cody Ross leads the AL with a .714 SLG and a 1.119 OPS off southpaws</u>.

LEADER OF THE PACK: Scott Podsednik is batting .344 (45-for-131) in 40 games with Boston, tops in the AL and 5th in the Majors among players with at least 50 PA this year.

AUGUST RUSH: Red Sox batters led the Majors with 290 hits in August, 1 shy of the club's most in an August over the last 15 seasons since 1997 (291 in 2005)...<u>Boston also topped the Majors with 70 doubles in August, led by Dustin</u> Pedroia's ML-high 12, 2-baggers, which matched his single-month career-high (also 9/08)...Pedroia also ranked among AL August leaders in hits (2nd, 40) and XBH (T-3rd, 16).

LEADER BOARD: Boston batters have tallied a Major League-high 457 extra-bases hits, including an ML-best 297 doubles this year...The club is 2nd in the Majors with 650 runs, trailing only Texas (678)...They are 2nd in the AL in hits (1,254), 3rd in total bases (3rd in ML, 2,018) and 4th in AVG (.269)

BACKSTOP BARRAGE: Jarrod Saltalamacchia has homered in 2 of his last 4 and 3 of his last 9 contests...His 23 long balls in 2012 are tied for 2nd most by a catcher in the Majors this year, 1 shy of CWS' A.J. Pierzyński (24).

27 PLAYERS, 34 STINTS: With LHP Franklin Morales going on the 15-day disabled list Tuesday (left shoulder inflammation), the Red Sox have had 27 different players on the DL this season for 34 separate stints, both of which are the most by a Sox team since at least 1971 and, according to STATS, the most by any team since at least 1987...13 players who have been on the DL with the Sox this year are current or former All-Stars.

ROSTER CROWD: The Red Sox have had 53 players appear in a game this year, the most in the Majors this year and 4 more than their entire 2011 total (49)...<u>The Red Sox</u> have only used more than 53 players in a season once before, with 55 in 1996...The Red Sox also had 53 players appear in a game in 2010, 2006 and 1995.

. \$29 different non-pitchers have appeared in a game for Boston this season, up from 23 a year ago.

BOBBY V. AT THE HELM: Bobby Valentine, in his 1st season as Red Sox manager, ranks 4th among active Major League skippers in games (2,323) and 5th in wins (1,179)... He is 41st on the all-time managerial wins list with Hughie Jennings next at 1,184.

HONORING NO. 6: The Red Sox family is mourning the loss of Johnny Pesky, who passed away on 8/13 at the age of 93...The team will wear a black patch with a white No. 6 on the left sleeve of their home white and alternate jerseys, and the right sleeve of their gray road uniforms will have a black armband for the remainder of the season in honor of Pesky.

Struck out 6 over 101 pitches...Gave up an unearned run in the 1st inning when Alex Gordon scored on a sac fly by Billy Butler...Exited with a 5-1 lead after Boston plated 5 unanswered runs.

Earned his 50th career win in his 112th Major League game, becoming the 5th-fastest Red Sox hurler to reach the 50-win mark since 1918 after Jon Lester, Tex Hughson, Dave Ferriss and Roger Clemens... Became the 4th Japanese-born pitcher to reach the 50-win plateau in the Major Leagues along with Hideo Nomo (123), Hiroki Kuroda (53) and Tomo Ohka (51).

Snapped his 6-start winless streak dating back to 5/16/11 vs. BAL...It was the 2nd-longest winless stretch of his career after a 7-gamer from 9/7/10-4/11/11...His 5 games without a win to start 2012 are his most ever to begin a season.

JAPANESE-BORN LEADERS: Has 594 Major League strikeouts, 3rd all-time among Japanese-born pitchers behind Hideo Nomo (1,918) and Hiroki Kuroda (658)...ls 5th among pitchers born in Japan with 111 starts and 6th with 652.2 innings.

SHAKY SUPPORT: His 2.70 runs of support per 9.0 innings (9 RS/30.0 IP) is the 3rd-lowest rate among Major League hurlers with at least 5 games started this season...The Red Sox have not scored a run of support in 3 of his 6 outings including a 14.0-inning drought over his 1st 3 starts from 6/9-21.

STRONG PERIPHERALS: Has surrendered 2 walks or less in 5 of 6 starts in 2012, and is averaging 3.00 walks per 9.0 IP (10 BB/30.0 IP) compared to 5.54 in 2011 (23 BB/37.1 IP)...With 26 K's, is averaging 7.80 K's per 9.0 IP thus far in 2012, which would be his best mark since 2009 (8.19. 54 K's/59.1 IP).

HARD TO HIT: Has held left-handed batters to a .211 average (12-for-57) this season.

Has held opponents to a .242 batting average (597-for-2,463) in his Major League career, 7th among American League pitchers with a minimum of 600.0 innings pitched since 2007.

THE K-MAN: Averaging 8.19 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (594 K's/652.2 IP) in his Major League career, 11th among AL hurlers since 2007 (min. 600.0 IP). ♣Tallied 8.33 K's per 9.0 innings (542 K's/585.1 IP) from 2007-10, the 6th-best rate in American League history through a pitcher's 1st 4 seasons (min. 500.0 IP).

IN THE SUN: Is 14-12 with a 3.80 ERA (79 ER/187.1 IP) and 185 strikeouts in 31 starts during the day...Has fanned 8.89 batters per 9.0 innings in day games during his career, the highest rate among Red Sox starters since 2007 (min. 100.0 IP).

ROAD WARRIOR: Is 24-15 (.615) with a 3.92 ERA (140 ER/321.1 IP) in 55 career road starts compared to 26-18 (.591) with a 4.64 mark (171 ER/331.1 IP) in 57 home games (56 starts)...Has posted a lower ERA on the road than at home in all 5 of his previous Major League seasons from 2007-11.

VS. THE ATHLETICS: Lost his last outing against OAK on 7/2 after going unbeaten in his previous 6 starts against the club since 2008...Is averaging 9.90 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (44 K/40.0 IP) against the A's, his highest career mark against any American League club.

ON REHAB: Went 1-1 with a 2.78 ERA (7 ER/22.2 IP) and 21 strikeouts in 5 starts from 7/30-8/21, all with Triple-A Pawtucket, in his 3rd stint on rehab this season Posted a 3.54 ERA (22 ER/59.2 IP) with 51 strikeouts in 13 combined rehab starts over his 3 rehab stints between High-A Salem (1 GS), Double-A Portland (1 GS) and Pawtucket (11 GS) in 2012.

Made 5 starts between Salem (1 GS), Portland (1 GS) and Pawtucket (3 GS) from 4/23-5/17 before he was removed from his 1st rehab stint on 5/19 due to a right trapezius strain...Began a 2nd rehab stint on 5/26 and allowed just 2 runs in 11.2 IP (1.54 ERA) with 6 hits, 3 walk and 8 K's in 3 starts with the PawSox.

Did not record a strikeout in a start for just the 2nd time in his career (3rd overall), also 4/14/09 at OAK...The 28 pitches were his fewest ever in a start and his 2nd-lowest total all time in a game after tossing 20 in relief on 5/4/11 vs. LAA.

MORE 2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed 1 run over 5.2 innings in a 5-1 Sox win over TOR at Fenway on 6/26 but did not earn a decision...Did not factor in the decision in a 6-5 Red Sox win vs. MIA on 6/21...Dropped his 2nd straight game at Chicago (NL) on 6/15...Fanned 8 batters, his most strikeouts since tallying 9 on 4/23/11 at LAA, but suffered the loss in his 2012 debut on 6/9 vs. WAS...Made his 2012 debut exactly 365 days after undergoing season-ending Tommy John Surgery on 6/10/11.
