THE LATEST: Today, Angels play the fourth contest (2-1) of a six-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Oakland (9/3-5)...**Seven of Angels' next 10 games are vs. A's...LAA has won five of six games and nine of last 12 affairs...Despite winning nine of 12 games, the Halos have gained just a half game in the wild card race in the span...LAA is 23-25 since the All-Star break and 5-6-1 in last 12 series...Angels are 8.5 games behind first-place Texas in West, 5.5 games behind Oakland for the wild-card lead and 3.5 games behind Baltimore for the second wild-card spot...** Following this road trip, Angels open a seven-game home stand vs. **Detroit** (Sept. 7-9) and **Oakland** (Sept. 10-13).

FAST FACT: According to STATS LLC, this is the 13th matchup of Angels/A's on Labor Day since 1961, tied for most meetings in MLB in span.

WHAT'S NEXT? Following this trip, 16 of Angels' next 19 games will be at home...Halos have 28 games remaining, 19 contests against teams with winning records (OAK - 7, TEX - 6, DET - 3, CWS - 3) and nine vs. teams with losing records (SEA - 6, KC - 3)...Five of Angels' last six opponents are in playoff contention...LAA must go 19-9 over last 28 games to reach 90 wins.

HOT HALOS: **Torii Hunter's** .354 (64/181) average since All-Star break ranks second in A.L...**Albert Pujols** is batting .392 (21/55) with five HRs and 15 RBI his past 14 games...**Howie Kendrick** batted .344 (31/90) in August...Since being recalled, 24 of 26 outings by **Kevin Jepsen** have been scoreless...16 of last 31 hits for **Kendrys Morales** have gone for extra bases (7 2B & 9 HR)...**Erick Aybar** hit .341 (31/91) in August.

@ OAKLAND: **A's lead 2012 season series 7-5 (seven matchups remaining) and have won last two games...LAA has won five of last eight games in Oakland (2-10 in previous 12 games here)...**Since 2004, the Angels hold a slight edge in the series (88-76).

RUN ROOKIE RUN: **Mike Trout's 107 runs are a new Angels' single-season rookie record (previously Devon White, 103 runs in 159 games in 1987)...**Despite missing the first 20 games of the year, **Trout is the first player in the Majors to score 100 runs this season...Trout's 42 stolen bases are tied for second most in club history by a rookie – record is 48 SBs by Gary Pettis (1985).**

25/40: At age 21, **Trout** is the youngest player ever with a 25 HR/40 SB season and the first MLB rookie ever to accomplish the feat.

ABOUT ALBERT: **Pujols has 29 HRs this season...**He is the only player ever to hit 30+ homers over his *first* 11 major league seasons (2001-2011)...**Only three players in M.L. history have hit 30 or more home runs in 12 consecutive seasons at any point during their careers: Barry Bonds, 13, 1992-2004, Alex Rodriguez, 13, 1998-2010 & Jimmie Foxx, 12, 1929-1940.**

OFFENSE (2012 vs. 2011): 10+ hits a MLB leading 66 times (totaled 46 10+ hit games in 2011)...LAA ranks second in MLB in '12 batting .273 (club hit .253 in 2011)...LAA has 163 HRs (4th in MLB) - totaled 155 HRs in 2011...Halos are on pace to score 750+ runs (2011 club logged 667 runs, lowest total in 19 seasons)...**For just the fifth time in club history, the Angels have three players with at least 25 home runs (Trumbo, Pujols & Trout).**

THE FISH WRAP: **Trout** (age 21) is the youngest player to steal 40 bases in a season since **Ty Cobb** (21) in 1907 and the youngest player ever with 25 HRs and 40 SBs in a season...**Trout is 11 stolen bases shy of tying most SBs in a player's age-20 season or younger (Cobb, 53 SBs in 1907)...****Trout** is currently leading the A.L. in average (.333) and stolen bases (42/46)...Only two players (one rookie) in the last 63 years have led a league in both AVG & SBs: **Ichiro Suzuki in 2001 (.350, 56)** and **Jackie Robinson in 1949 (.342, 37)...****Trout** also leads MLB with 107 runs scored...**Trout swiped 30 consecutive stolen bases (6/5-8/20) to set a new club record previously held by Gary Pettis (1985, 22 straight)...**Since 1974, only **Nomar Garciaparra** in 1997 (30 HR) has more home runs as a rookie leadoff hitter than **Trout** (25 HR)...Angels' club record for HRs in as leadoff batter is 26 by **Tony Phillips** (1995) and **Brian Downing** (1982)...**Trout scored a run in 15 consecutive games (July 5-23) which tied the modern MLB rookie record and set a new A.L. rookie mark...Streak also established Angels' franchise record...**He leads MLB rookies in nearly every offensive category...**Trout is only rookie in MLB history with a min. of .340 AVG, 95 R, 24 HR, 70 RBI and 39 SBs after 100 games played into a season...PLAYER OF MONTH:** **Trout** (.392, 32 R, 10 HR, 23 RBI) was named A.L. Player of the Month and A.L. Rookie of the Month for July, the first A.L. player ever to win Player of the Month & Rookie of the Month in same month...**Marked his third consecutive monthly rookie honor.**

#37 SCOTT DOWNS (LHP) **AGE: 36**
.200 vs. LH, .282 vs. RH

- Reinstated from Family Emergency List Saturday (missed four games)...Reinstated from 15-day DL, August 18 after missing 20 games with a left shoulder strain.
- **Allowed 11 earned runs in 11 appearances (7.2 IP; 12.91 ERA) since All-Star break...Had allowed just nine ER in first 92 outings as an Angel (83.2 IP).**
- Registered ninth save July 23rd, matching his career-high set with Toronto in 2009...Nine for nine in ninth-inning save opportunities
- Experienced best first-half of career, posting a 0.30 ERA – owns a career first-half ERA of 3.53.
- Since becoming an Angel in 2011, 48 of 53 outings at home have been scoreless (48 IP – 7 ER; 1.31 ERA).

- Tossed 26.1 scoreless innings for Halos in the first half, becoming first Angel reliever in club history to not allow a run before the All-Star break (min. 10 IP).

- Recorded 50th career victory June 11, becoming just the 15th pitcher in MLB history with 50+ wins and 300+ saves.
- Signed minor league free agent contract, Feb. 22nd and was placed on the Angels' 40-man roster, March 30th...Ranks 3rd among actives with 300 career saves.

#40 KEVIN JEPSEN (RHP) **AGE: 28**
.273 vs. LH, .164 vs. RH

- **Has thrown six straight scoreless outings...His 1.19 ERA since July 1st ranks 4th in A.L.**
- Since being recalled, 25 of 27 outings have been scoreless including 13 of 14 appearances at the Big A...Limiting batters to a .179 average (15/84) since July 5th.

- Made big league debut yesterday, becoming the fourth Angel in club history and 14th pitcher in AL history to strike out the only batter he faced in his ML debut.
- Had contract selected from double-A Arkansas Saturday...Went 3-1 with a 1.82 ERA (59.1 IP – 12 ER) in 10 starts with Inland Empire...Promoted to double-A Arkansas, August 2 and went 3-2 with a 3.34 ERA (32.1 IP – 12 ER) in seven appearances (five starts) with three walks and 21 strikeouts.
- Spent nearly two months on the disabled list earlier this season with a strained lat.
- Drafted by Angels in 3rd round of 2011 draft out of the Univ. of Florida...In two minor league seasons, is 11-4 with a 2.22 ERA in 31 appearances (29 starts).

- Compiled a 6.46 ERA (15.1 IP – 11 ER) on the road compared to a 1.65 mark (16.1 IP – 3 ER) at home.
- One for two in save opportunities this season...32 saves in 2011 set Angels' rookie saves record, surpassing Ken Tatum (22, 1969).

- **Notched first career save July 30th after pitching innings 6 thru 9...Became the sixth different Halo to record a save this season.**
- Owns a 5-2 record with a 2.84 ERA at the Big A compared to a 1-5 mark with a 6.87 ERA on the road.

- **After batting .197 thru the season's first 40 games, owns the Majors' top average by a shortstop at .315 (92/292; since May 19).**
- Spanning back to June 10 (59 G), batting .338 (74/219) with seven HR and 36 R scored...Average ranks fourth in the A.L. during that span.
- 14-for-17 in stolen bases this season...Dating back to the start of 2011, has been successful in 85% (44/52) of stolen bases attempts.
- Hit seventh home run of the year Aug. 17...Seven homers are the second highest single-season total of career (career-best 10 last year).
- Hit 33rd career triple Friday, giving him sole possession of fourth on the club's all-time list...Garret Anderson is third with 35.
- Leads the Majors in bunt hits (16) and is fifth in infield hits (30)...Since 1974, 77 career bunt hits are tops by an Angel while the 168 infield hits rank third.
- Signed a four-year contract extension on April 19 keeping him in a Halo uniform through the 2016 season.

- Making his third stint with the Angels this season...Has gone 3-for-18 (.167) this season with the club...At the time of his call up, was batting .299 with 30 doubles, seven triples, 14 home runs and 73 RBI with Triple-A Salt Lake...Hit .301 with 20 RBI after the minor league All-Star break.
- Hits in all three Major League starts this year...Doubled off Jarrod Parker on May 23 for first ML hit...The game also marked first big league start (RF)...Made Major League debut in right field May 22 @ Oakland as a 9th inning defensive replacement for Mark Trumbo.

- Batting .280 (14/50) over the last 15 games...Hits in six of last seven games...Hit .278 (22/79) last month after posting a .198 (17/86) clip in July.
- Drew a walk in 18 of 24 games last month while posting a .430 on-base percentage...His 21 free passes in August were tied for the M.L. lead while his .432 on-base percentage ranked second in the A.L...Had a walk in 10 straight games played from Aug. 1 - 11...Eighth Angel to accomplish the feat and first since T. Salmon drew a base on balls in 10 straight games played in 2003.

- Rejoins Halos for his second time this season...Appeared in 38 games this season with the Angels, batting .212 (18/85) with three HR and four RBI...Originally had contract purchased by Angels on May 11 and was optioned back to Triple-A on July 28.
- Hit .217 in 26 games with Triple-A Salt Lake this season with four doubles, two triples, three HR and 13 RBI.
- Connected for third HR of season on June 29, setting a new single-season career high...Logged three of five homers by Angel catchers while Iannetta was on DL.

#48 TORII HUNTER (OF) **.306 vs. LH, .305 vs. RH** **AGE: 37**

- Went 0-for-4 yesterday to end his streak of four straight 3+ hit games...Was the second Angel in franchise history to log four consecutive 3+ hit efforts (also, Dave Chalk, July 23-26, 1978) and was the first major leaguer to accomplish the feat since Danny Valencia July 24-27, 2010...16 3+ hit games this year lead the team and his highest single-season total of career.
- His .354 (64/181) batting average since the All-Star break ranks second in the American League...Over the last two seasons, has combined to hit .337 (104/309) in the months of August and September.
- Season average sits at .305...Prior to this season, average was last above .300 after the All-Star break on Sept. 23, 2009 (.303).
- Batting .351 (97/276) since being moved to the second spot in the lineup...The .351 average is tops by any number two hitters in the Majors...Entered 2012 with a .207 career clip (36/174) batting second.
- Hit career doubles 399 and 400 of career Wednesday...Marked fourth game two-double game of the season.
- Drove in walk-off RBI Tuesday courtesy of a ninth-inning sac fly...Ninth career walk-off RBI and represented ninth game-winning RBI this season (rank third on club).
