THE LATEST: Tonight, Angels play the fifth contest (3-1) of a six-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Oakland 1-0)...Six of Angels' next nine games are vs. Athletics...LAA has won six of seven games and 10 of last 13 affairs...Despite winning 10 of 13 games, the Halos have gained just a half game in the wild card race in the span...A victory tonight would move the club back to a season-best 10 games over .500 and clinch the fourth of last five series played...LAA is 24-25 since the All-Star break and 5-6-1 in last 12 series...Angels are 8.5 games behind first-place Texas in West, 4.5 games behind Oakland for the wild-card lead and 3.5 games behind Baltimore for the second wild-card spot...Following this road trip, Angels open a seven-game homestand vs. Detroit (Sept. 7-9) and Oakland (Sept. 10-13).

WHAT'S NEXT? Following this trip, 16 of Angels' next 19 games will be at home...Halos have 27 games remaining, 18 contests against teams with winning records (OAK - 6, TEX - 6, DET - 3, CWS - 3) and nine vs. $\underline{\text{teams with losing records (SEA-6, KC-3)}}... \\ \text{Five of Angels' last six opponents are in playoff contention...} \\ \text{LAA}$ must go 18-9 over last 27 games to reach 90 wins.

HOT HALOS: Chris lannetta is batting .386 (22/57) with 12 RBI over his last 16 games...Torii Hunter's .357 (66/185) average since All-Star break ranks second in A.L...Albert Pujols has hit in 12 straight and is batting .367 (22/60) with five HRs and 15 RBI his past 15 games...Since being recalled, 24 of 26 outings by Kevin Jepsen have been scoreless...16 of last 31 hits for Kendrys Morales have gone for extra bases (7 2B & 9 HR).

STRONG UP THE MIDDLE: Angels' middle infielders Howie Kendrick and Erick Aybar have combined to hit .345 (71/206) with 30 runs scored since August 1st...In the span, **Kendrick** is hitting .340 (35/103) and **Aybar** is at .350 (36/103).

FAST FACT: Halos bullpen has posted a 2.01 ERA (22.1 IP - 5 ER) over club's last 10 games, compared to a 7.09 mark (72.1 IP - 57 ER) in Angels previous 22 games.

UP NEXT VS. DETROIT: Detroit leads 2012 series 5-2 and has won three of last four meetings...Halos are 56-36 overall vs. Tigers since '02, including a 25-22 mark at Comerica in span...However, Angels have dropped 13 of last 19 games in Detroit... Halos are 13-8 in last 21 meetings at Angel Stadium.

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2012 season series 7-6 (six matchups remaining)...LAA has won six of last nine games in Oakland (2-10 in previous 12 games here)...Since 2004, the Angels hold a slight edge in the series (89-76).

RUN ROOKIE RUN: Mike Trout's 108 runs are a new Angels' single-season rookie record (previously Devon White, 103 runs in 159 games in 1987)...Despite missing the first 20 games of the year, Trout is the first player in the Majors to score 100 runs this season...Trout's 43 stolen bases are second most in club history by a rookie – record is 48 SBs by Gary Pettis (1985)...25/40: At age 21, Trout is the youngest player ever with a 25 HR/40 SB season and the first MLB rookie ever to accomplish the feat.

ABOUT ALBERT: Puiols has 29 HRs this season...He is the only player ever to hit 30+ homers over his first 11 major league seasons (2001-2011)...Only three players in M.L. history have hit 30 or more home runs in 12 consecutive seasons at any point during their careers: Barry Bonds, 13, 1992-2004, Alex Rodriguez, 13, 1998-2010 & Jimmie Foxx, 12, 1929-1940.

OFFENSE (2012 vs. 2011): 18 3+ HR games for Angels this season – 21 total 3+ HR games over previous two seasons...10+ hits a MLB leading 67 times (totaled 46 10+ hit games in 2011)...LAA ranks second in MLB in '12 batting .275 (club hit .253 in 2011)...LAA has 166 HRs (4th in MLB) - totaled 155 HRs in 2011...Halos are on pace to score 750+ runs (2011 club logged 667 runs, lowest total in 19 seasons)...For just the fifth time in club history, the Angels have three players with at least 25 home runs (Trumbo, Pujols & Trout).

THE FISH WRAP: Trout (age 21) is the youngest player to steal 40 bases in a season since Ty Cobb (21) in 1907 and the youngest player ever with 25 HRs and 40 SBs in a season... Trout is 9 stolen bases shy of tying most SBs in a player's age-20 season or younger (Cobb, 53 SBs in 1907)... Trout is currently leading the A.L. in average (.332) and stolen bases (43/48)...Only two players (one rookie) in the last 63 years have led a league in both AVG & SBs: Ichiro Suzuki in 2001 (.350, 56) and Jackie Robinson in 1949 (.342, 37)...Trout also leads MLB with 108 runs scored...Trout swiped 30 consecutive stolen bases (6/5-8/20) to set a new club record previously held by Gary Pettis (1985, 22 straight)...Since 1974, only Nomar Garciaparra in 1997 (30 HR) has more home runs as a rookie

leadoff hitter than Trout (25 HR)...Angels' club record for HRs in as leadoff batter is 26 by Tony Phillips (1995) and Brian Downing (1982)...Trout scored a run in 15 consecutive games (July 5-23) which tied the modern MLB rookie record and set a new A.L. rookie mark...Streak also established Angels' franchise record...He leads MLB rookies in nearly every offensive category... Trout is only rookie in MLB history with a min. of .340 AVG, 95 R, 24 HR, 70 RBI and 39 SBs after 100 games played into a season...PLAYER OF MONTH: Trout (.392, 32 R, 10 HR, 23 RBI) was named A.L. Player of the Month and A.L. Rookie of the Month for July, the first A.L. player ever to win Player of the Month & Rookie of the Month in same month... Marked his third consecutive monthly rookie honor.

- Earned third win as an Angel in last start, August 30th vs. Boston, marking the first time winning back-to-back starts since June 22-27 at Chicago (AL) and Cincinnati.
- Has allowed a home run in six straight starts, tying his career long streak (May 20 June 16, 2005)...Seven of 14 home runs allowed this season have come since August 3rd.
- Owns a 4.93 ERA (80.1 IP 44 ER) in first three innings of starts this season, compared to a 2.82 ERA (89.1 IP 28 ER) after the third inning (credit Stats).
- Has thrown six innings or more in six of first seven Angels starts with three quality starts.
- Acquired from Milwaukee, July 27th in exchange for INF Jean Segura, RHP Johnny Hellweg and RHP Ariel Pena.
- Registered a 4.30 ERA (90 IP 43 ER) on the road this season compared to a 3.28 mark (79.2 IP 29 ER) at home.
- Has recorded 16 quality starts this season while his club is 17-11 in games he starts.
- VS. OAKLAND: Making 15th career appearance, 11th start vs. Oakland, second start of 2012...Did not factor in decision in last start, August 8th in Oakland (5 IP, 6 H, 4 ER, 5 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR)...Is 5-1 lifetime with a 3.31 ERA (68 IP – 25 ER)...In eight career appearances, five starts at the Coliseum, posted a 2-0 record with a 3.00 ERA (33 IP - 11 ER).
- Made starts in three consecutive team games (July 7th and 8th vs. Houston and 13th vs. Pittsburgh), becoming the first pitcher since Red Faber (Sept. 3 (DH) and 4, 1917) did it with the White Sox
- CAREER: Won the 2009 American League Cy Young Award with Kansas City after posting a 16-8 record with a league best 2.16 ERA and 242 strikeouts in 33 starts for the Royals...Has notched double digit victories each season since 2008...Appeared in first career postseason in 2011, making three starts for the Brewers (1-1, 6.48 ERA)...Greinke will be a free agent after the 2012 season.
- Former first round draft-pick (sixth overall) by the Royals out of Apopka HS (FL) in 2002...Took home Gatorade National Player of the Year honors in 2002...Played alongside teammate Bobby Wilson on AAU team in Florida...Wife Emily (Kuchar) is a former Dallas Cowboys cheerleader and Miss Daytona Beach USA 2008.
- Owns an 88-78 career record with 12 complete games, three shutouts, one save and a 3.82 ERA (1449.1 IP 615 ER) in 266 appearances, 225 starts.
