### A's vs. TIGERS

The season series is tied at two games each after splitting a four-game set in Oakland May 10-13...split the season series last year, 5-5...the A's went 4-4 in Oakland and 1-1 in Detroit...have won two season series over the last six years, lost two and split two...are 30-27 (.526) against Detroit since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 238-230 against the Tigers...that includes 134-103 in Oakland, 102-125 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 906-983 against the Tigers

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's currently have 14 rookies on the roster...have used 18 rookies overall, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (20)...11 of the 18 have been pitchers and they have combined for an Oakland record 248 games pitched...A's rookies have 42 wins, which is two short of the record of 44 set in 2009...have 525 strikeouts, which is second best to the record of 618 in 2009...have 641.2 innings, which is third best behind 780.2 innings in 2009 and 736.2 innings in 1983.

**Grant Balfour** is a perfect 12 for 12 in save opportunities in 15 games since returning to the closer role August 11.

**Coco Crisp** is a .322 (106 for 329) career hitter against Detroit, his highest average against any American League team.

**Josh Donaldson** is batting .313 (35 for 112) in 31 games since he was recalled from Sacramento August 14.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 2000 Jason Giambi breaks Jose Canseco's single season RBI record as he drives in two runs in the A's 12-3 win at Baltimore...he would go on to finish the season with 137 RBI...in 2002 Billy Koch saves his 40<sup>th</sup> game in the A's 7-4 win over Anaheim to become the first pitcher in major league history with 40 saves and 10 wins in the same season.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won eight of the last 10 games, 17 of the last 22 and 23 of the last 30...are 84-62 (.575) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 146 games since 2006 when they were also 84-62 (won game 147)...have clinched a winning record for the first time since 2006 (93-69)...the 84 wins are 10 more than last year, which is the A's biggest improvement since 2000-01 when they went from 91 wins to 102...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by three games...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, 1½ games ahead of second place Baltimore and 4½ games ahead of third place Los Angeles...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 27 days (since August 22) and 47 of the last 59 (since July 21)...have the **best record in the majors** since the All-Star Break (41-19) and since the start of July (47-20)...also have the **best record in the majors** since June 2 (62-32), the date the A's snapped their season-high nine game losing streak...went 15-13 in June, 19-5 in July and 18-10 in August, marking the first time the A's have posted a winning record in three consecutive months since 2006 when they did it in the final four months...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 77 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

**DON'T WALK:** Dan Straily allowed five walks Sunday afternoon, which snapped a streak of 44 consecutive games where A's starting pitchers walked three batters or fewer...it was the longest streak in Athletics franchise history...the previous high was 41 from July 16-August 28, 2001...walked 47 batters in 267.1 innings during the 44-game streak (1.58 per nine innings), which included 12 games without a walk and 19 games with just one...have issued just 223 walks for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...are averaging 2.27 walks per nine innings (883.0 ip), which is the lowest mark by A's starters since at least 1921 (2.36 in 1974).

**THE LONG BALL:** Yoenis Céspedes hit his 19<sup>th</sup> home run of the season Friday night, which is second most on the A's to Josh Reddick (29)...the A's have not had two players hit 20 or more home runs since 2007 (Cust and Swisher)...have 88 home runs since the All-Star Break, which is second most in the majors (CWS, 89)...have 171 home runs overall, which ranks seventh in the American League but is ninth in the majors...it is a 50.0% increase over last year's total of 114...the A's are 70-34 (.673) when they homer, including 36-11 (.766) with two or more homers.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last 10 games and have a 2.83 ERA (28 er in 89.0 ip) over that span...have a 3.41 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (126), rank second in opponents batting average (.244), on-base percentage (.304), slugging percentage (.372) and pickoffs (20) and third in shutouts (13)...A's starting pitchers have recorded the decision in each of the last 21 games, which is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1982...had a 26-game streak from August 22-September 19, 2010...A's starters are 16-5 with a 2.97 ERA (42 er in 127.1 ip) over this current 21-game streak...have a 3.69 ERA (362 er in 883.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (89).

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's struck out 12 times Sunday afternoon and now have 1232 for the season, which is an Athletics franchise record...the previous high of 1226 was set in 2008...it is also the seventh highest single season total in American League history...the AL record is 1324 by Tampa Bay in 2007...the 1232 strikeouts are the most in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank third in the American League with 301 runs scored since the All-Star Break (60 games, 5.02 per game)...were last in the AL in runs before the break (319, 3.71 per game)...have been shut out 16 times, which is the most in the majors...it is also the third highest total in Oakland history and the most since 1979 (17)...the record is 19 in 1978...are batting .250 (523 for 2089) since the All-Star Break after hitting a Major League low .225 before the break...are batting .236 overall, which is second lowest in the majors...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have the third lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.308) but are fourth in walks (488)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98)...A's pinch hitters are batting an AL leading .301 (22 for 73)...pinch hitters also lead the AL in doubles (7), walks (13), on-base percentage (.398) and slugging percentage (.479) and rank third in RBI (15).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin their final road trip of the season tonight, a 10-game trip to Detroit (three games), New York (three games) and Texas (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Seattle (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-1)...it marked the A's second consecutive 6-1 trip, which ties for the sixth best road trip in Oakland history...are 40-31 (.563) on the road, which is the **best road record in the AL**...need one more win on the road to clinch a winning record on the road for the first time since 2006 (44-37)...had their **Oakland-record tying** 12-game road winning streak snapped Thursday...went 2-1 on their last homestand, a brief three-game stand against Baltimore...are 44-31 (.587) at home, which is the fourth best home record in the AL and the second best home record by an A's team over the last six years (47-34 in 2010)...have clinched a winning record at home for the third consecutive season.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's 3-2 win Friday night was their 14<sup>th</sup> win in their last 17 one-run games...are 22-15 (.595) in one-run decisions overall, which is the third best record in the American League...have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the 20 wins are second most in the American League to Baltimore (21)...are 26-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the second best record...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings.

**SIX SERIES IN SIX CITIES:** The A's are 8-2 during this 20-game stretch where they will play 17 of 20 games on the road...two of the six teams the A's will face over this stretch are currently in first place in their division (New York, Texas), one has the second wild card spot (Baltimore), one is within three games in the Wild Card race (Los Angeles) and another is three games out in its division (Detroit)...the stretch began with a seven-game trip to Seattle and Los Angeles, continued with a three-game series at home against Baltimore and concludes with this 10-game road trip to Detroit, New York and Texas.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 12<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his career, his fourth since being reinstated from the disabled list September 1...the A's are 9-2 (.818) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in nine of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer all 11 times.

**6-0:** Is 6-0 with a 1.94 ERA over his first 11 starts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in NL, 1913 in AL), he is just the second pitcher to be undefeated in at least his first 11 Major League appearances, all starts, while maintaining an ERA under 2.00...the other is Jered Weaver, who went 9-0 with a 1.95 ERA over his first 12 starts with the Angels in 2006...Griffin is the first pitcher in Oakland history to start his career 6-0...since 1927, the only other Athletics pitcher to begin his career at least 6-0 is Jim Nash, who went 7-0 over his first nine career starts in 1966...since 1918, no Athletics starter has begun his career better than 7-0...the six-game winning streak matches the longest by an Athletic this year (McCarthy, April 27-June 19) and is tied for the second longest active streak in the American League (Nate Jones, CWS 8)...the last A's pitcher with a seven-game winning streak is Trevor Cahill (October 1, 2010-May 9, 2011)...Griffin began his career with three no decisions...since 1918, the only other pitcher in Athletics history to begin his career with three consecutive no decisions, all as a starting pitcher, is Willie Adams (June 11-July 31, 1996).

**THREE RUNS AND TWO WALKS OR FEWER:** Is the only Major League pitcher since at least 1918 to allow three runs or fewer and walk two batters or fewer in each of his first 11 career starts...the previous best was eight by Brian Holton, who did it from September 7, 1986-June 9, 1989 (had 112 relief appearances during that stretch).

**IN SEPTEMBER:** Is 3-0 with a 0.89 ERA (2 er in 20.1 ip) in three starts in September...has walked just one batter in 20.1 innings while striking out 18...is tied for the American League lead in wins in September.

**SINCE THE BREAK:** Is 6-0 with a 1.91 ERA (10 er in 47.0 ip) and .223 (39 for 175) opponents batting average in eight starts since the All-Star Break...the six wins are tied for eighth in the American League...the ERA is the lowest in the AL since the break among pitchers with 40 or more innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 12 for 66 (.182) with one walk (.194 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .181 (32 for 177) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .262 (16 for 61) after that...has yielded a .182 (30 for 165) batting average with the bases empty compared to .247 (18 for 73) with runners in scoring position.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 1.14 ERA (4 er in 31.2 ip) and .170 (19 for 112) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and a 2.70 ERA (10 er in 33.1 ip) and .230 (29 for 126) opponents average after that.

**BRIEFLY:** Is 3-0 with a 0.89 ERA (2 er in 20.1 ip) in three starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list September 1...was placed on the 15-day DL August 5 with right shoulder tightness...went 1-0 with a 4.90 ERA (7.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 7 so) in two rehab starts with Sacramento on August 22 against Salt Lake and August 27 at Colorado Springs...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 after combining for a 6-3 record and a 2.66 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...made his Major League debut and went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA in eight starts before going on the DL.

**SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER:** Tossed at least 6.0 innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first seven starts before leaving his start on August 4 after 1.2 scoreless innings with shoulder tightness...is the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1918 to begin his career with seven consecutive games of six or more innings and three runs or fewer...the previous high was five by John Henry Johnson (1978) and Dave Hamilton (1972)...is the second Major Leaguer to do it over the last 18 years...the other is Jered Weaver, who had nine straight with Los Angeles (AL) in 2006.

**FOUR HITS OR FEWER:** Allowed eight hits in his fourth start after allowing four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts...is just the sixth pitcher since 1918 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of six or more innings and four hits or fewer (last: Jeremy Hellickson, TB, August 2-15, 2010).

**ROOKIE STARTERS:** Is one of four rookies currently in the A's starting rotation (Milone, Parker, Straily)...this is the second time this year the A's have four rookies in the rotation (August 3-6)...prior to that, the last time the A's had at least four rookies in the rotation was in 2009 when they did it from June 2 through the end of the season...is scheduled to make the 75<sup>th</sup> start by a rookie this year, which is the fourth most games started by rookie pitchers in Oakland history (116 in 2009, 93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...rookies have 42 of the A's wins, which is second most in Oakland history...the record is 44 in 2009.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Los Angeles last Wednesday...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings and did not allow a run...scattered six hits and did not walk a batter...allowed just one base runner past second base and that came in the fourth inning when he put runners on first and third with one out...got Aybar to foul out and Wells to fly out to end the threat...now has an 11.1 inning scoreless streak.

**GRIFFIN vs. DETROIT:** Is making his first career appearance.

**MINORS:** Combined for a 7-3 record and a 2.82 ERA (102.0 ip, 79 h, 39 r, 32 er, 18 bb, 91 so, 7 hr) in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...began the year at Midland and was 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA in seven starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento May 11...went 3-2 with a 2.81 ERA in eight starts with the River Cats before he was promoted to Oakland June 24...was 4-2 with a 3.07 ERA in 10 starts overall with Sacramento...issued 18 walks in 102.0 innings, an average of 1.59 per nine innings...struck out 91 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.06...allowed a .211 opponents batting average, including .181 (33 for 182) against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (46 for 193) against right-handers...surrendered just seven home runs in 102.0 innings, an average of 0.62 per nine innings.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Brett Anderson (4-1, 1.93 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 loss at Los Angeles last Thursday...shut out the Angels on five hits over the first six innings and then allowed five runs in the seventh inning...allowed one run or fewer in each of his first four starts to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1918 to begin his season with four consecutive starts of one run or fewer...was the first Oakland pitcher to start the season by winning his first four starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990 (April 9-May 4)...is 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA (14.1 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, all starts, against Detroit...has not faced the Tigers since May 29, 2010 at Detroit when he combined with Ziegler and Breslow on a five-hit shutout in a 6-0 win...tossed 5.2 innings and left after 70 pitches in his first start after his rehab assignment.

**24-11, 2.86 ERA (440.0 ip, 330 h, 154 r, 140 er, 185 bb, 403 so, 37 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 42/57 (73.7%)**

The A's bullpen is 2-0 with 14 saves, no blown saves, a 2.57 ERA (87.2 ip, 60 h, 31 r, 25 er, 34 bb, 80 so, 4 hr) and .190 (60 for 315) opponents batting average over its past 32 games (since August 14)...ranks second in the American League and third in the majors with a 2.86 ERA overall...the last time the bullpen had an ERA under 3.00 was in 1990 (2.35)...has the lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.208), second lowest slugging percentage (.329) and third lowest on-base percentage (.294)...has issued the second most walks in the AL (185), is tied for the second most wins (24) and has allowed the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners to score (31.2%, 58 of 186).

**First Hitters: 16-57 (9 bb, 1 hbp)**

- Is a perfect 12 for 12 in save opportunities in 15 games since returning to the closer role August 11 (12.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 3.55 ERA).
- Has a 6.75 ERA (4 er in 5.1 ip) and .333 (7 for 21) opponents batting average in seven outings in September...logged a 4.50 ERA and .233 opponents average over his first 21 appearances and then had a 1.56 ERA and .119 opponents average over a 39-game stretch from May 20 to August 27.
- Ranks fifth among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.175), is tied for sixth in games (67), is eighth in slugging percentage (.279) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (65.2)...the innings pitched are 1.2 innings short of his career high of 67.1 in 2009.
- Has a 1.21 ERA (5 er in 37.1 ip) in 36 appearances at home compared to a 5.27 ERA (14 er in 27.1 ip) in 31 outings on the road.
- Has faced Detroit twice this year (1.2 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 3-2 with three blown saves and a 2.63 ERA in 27 appearances in his career against the Tigers (27.1 ip, 19 h, 8 r, 8 er, 14 bb, 36 so, 3 hr).
- Has 29 career saves, which is the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in opponents on-base percentage (.266).
