A's vs. TIGERS

The A's trail the season series, 3-2...lost last night's series opener in Detroit after splitting a fourgame set in Oakland May 10-13...split the season series last year, 5-5...the A's went 4-4 in Oakland and 1-1 in Detroit...have won two season series over the last six years, lost two and split two...are 30-28 (.517) against Detroit since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 238-231 against the Tigers...that includes 134-103 in Oakland, 102-126 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 906-984 against the Tigers

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 12 for 12 in save opportunities in 15 games since returning to the closer role August 11.

Coco Crisp is a .320 (106 for 331) career hitter against Detroit, his highest average against any American League team.

Josh Donaldson is batting .304 (35 for 115) with nine doubles, six home runs and 17 RBI in 32 games since he was recalled from Sacramento August 14.

Josh Reddick is 10 for 20 (.500) with seven runs, two home runs and five RBI in five games against the Tigers this year...is 15 for 33 (.455) in nine games in his career against Detroit, his highest average against any American League team.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1972 Dick Williams uses a club record 30 players and 10 pinch hitters in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss to Chicago...Catfish Hunter and Gonzalo Marquez are the only two to deliver a pinch hit...1974 Reggie Jackson collects three hits, including the 1000th of his career, in a 4-3 loss at Kansas City...in 1998 Dave Stewart wins his 19th as the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 5-3 to clinch their seventh AL West title...in 2000 the A's set an Oakland record by walking 15 times in a 7-4 win at Baltimore.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the past two games...however, have won eight of the last 11 games, 17 of the last 23 and 23 of the last 31...are 84-63 (.571) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 147 games since they were 85-62 in 2006...have clinched a winning record for the first time since 2006 (93-69)...the 84 wins are 10 more than last year, which is the A's biggest improvement since 2000-01 when they went from 91 wins to 102...are in second place in the AL Widd Card, ½ game ahead of second place Baltimore/New York and 3½ games ahead of third place Los Angeles...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 28 days (since August 22) and 48 of the last 60 (since July 21)...have the **best record in the majors** since the All-Star Break (41-20) and since the start of July (47-21)...also have the **best record in the majors** since June 2 (62-33), the date the A's snapped their season-high nine game losing streak...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 78 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

DON'T WALK: Dan Straily allowed five walks Sunday afternoon, which snapped a streak of 44 consecutive games where A's starting pitchers walked three batters or fewer...it was the longest streak in Athletics franchise history...the previous high was 41 from July 16-August 28, 2001...A's starting pitchers have issued just 224 walks for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...are averaging 2.27 walks per nine innings (887.2 ip), which is the lowest mark by A's starters since at least 1921 (2.36 in 1974).

THE LONG BALL: Yoenis Céspedes hit his 19th home run of the season Friday night, which is second most on the A's to Josh Reddick (29)...the A's have not had two players hit 20 or more home runs since 2007 (Cust and Swisher)...have 88 home runs since the All-Star Break, which is second most in the majors (CWS, 92)...have 171 home runs overall, which ranks seventh in the American League but is ninth in the majors...it is a 50.0% increase over last year's total of 114...the A's are 70-34 (.673) when they homer, including 36-11 (.766) with two or more homers.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high 12 runs last night (previous: 11, April 30 at Boston)...have now allowed 21 runs in 17.0 innings over the past two games after allowing 21 runs (19 earned) over its previous nine games (80.0 ip, 2.14 ERA)...however, have a 3.48 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (130), rank second in opponents batting average (.245), on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.375) and pickoffs (20) and third in shutouts (13)...A's starting pitchers have recorded the decision in each of the last 22 games, which is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1982...had a 26-game streak from August 22-September 19, 2010...A's starters are 16-6 with a 3.20 ERA (47 er in 132.0 ip) over this current 22-game streak...have a 3.72 ERA (367 er in 887.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (92).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's struck out nine times last night and now have 1241 for the season, which is an on-going Athletics franchise record (previous: 1226 in 2008)...it is also the seventh highest single season total in American League history...the AL record is 1324 by Tampa Bay in 2007...lead the majors in strikeouts.

OFFENSE: The A's rank third in the American League with 303 runs scored since the All-Star Break (61 games, 4.97 per game)...were last in the AL in runs before the break (319, 3.71 per game)...have been shut out 16 times, which is the most in the majors...it is also the third highest total in Oakland history and the most since 1979 (17)...the record is 19 in 1978...are batting .250 (531 for 2123) since the All-Star Break after hitting a Major League low .225 before the break...are batting .236 overall, which is second lowest in the majors...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have the third lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.308) but are tied for third in walks (492)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98)...A's pinch hitters are batting an AL leading .289 (22 for 76)...pinch hitters also lead the AL in doubles (7), walks (13) and on-base percentage (.385), rank second in slugging percentage (.461) and are third in RBI (15).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this 10-game road trip to Detroit (0-1), New York (three games) and Texas (four games), their final trip of the season...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Seattle (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-1)...it marked the A's second consecutive 6-1 trip, which ties for the sixth best road trip in Oakland history...are 40-32 (.556) on the road, which is the second best road record in the AL...need one more win on the road to clinch a winning record on the road for the first time since 2006 (44-37)...had their Oakland-record tying 12-game road winning streak snapped Thursday...went 2-1 on their last homestand, a brief three-game stand against Baltimore...are 44-31 (.587) at home, which is the fourth best home record in the AL and the second best home record by an A's team over the last six years (47-34 in 2010)...have clinched a winning record at home for the third consecutive season.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's 3-2 win Friday night was their 14th win in their last 17 one-run games...are 22-15 (.595) in one-run decisions overall, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the 20 wins are second most in the American League to Baltimore (22)...are 26-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the second best record...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings.

ROOKIES: The A's currently have 14 rookies on the roster...have used 18 rookies overall, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (20)...11 of the 18 have been pitchers and they have combined for an Oakland record 251 games pitched...have 42 wins, which is two short of the record of 44 set in 2009...have 529 strikeouts, which is second best to the record of 618 in 2009...have 647.2 innings, which is third best behind 780.2 innings in 2009 and 736.2 innings in 1983.

SIX SERIES IN SIX CITIES: The A's are 8-3 during this 20-game stretch where they will play 17 of 20 games on the road...one of the six teams the A's will face over this stretch is currently in first place in their division (Texas), two are tied for first in their division and tied for the second wild card spot (Baltimore/New York), one is within three games in the Wild Card race (Los Angeles) and another is three games out in its division (Detroit)...the stretch began with a seven-game trip to Seattle and Los Angeles, continued with a three-game series at home against Baltimore and concludes with this 10-game road trip to Detroit, New York and Texas.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...was reinstated from the disabled list August 21 after beginning the season on the 60-day DL as he continued his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments and are 32-35 (.478) in his career...has tossed six or more

innings in each of his five starts, allowed one run or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer all five times.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 3 for 25 (.120) with runners in scoring position, including 0 for 10 with RISP and two outs...has allowed a .211 (43 for 204) average with runners in scoring position over the last three years after yielding a .314 mark in his rookie season of 2009...the seven, eight and nine hitters in the batting order are a combined 4 for 34 (.118) off him.

TO START A SEASON: Allowed one run or fewer in each of his first four starts to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1918 to begin his season with four consecutive starts of one run or fewer...was the first Oakland pitcher to start the season by winning his first four starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990 (April 9-May 4)...the four-game winning streak matched the longest of his career (third time, last: September 6 to October 2, 2010).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Minnesota August 21 in Oakland...it was his first start since June 5, 2011 at Boston and his first win since May 26, 2011 at Los Angeles (AL)...allowed his only run in the first inning when Revere singled, stole second, went to third on a ground out and scored on a wild pitch...faced the minimum the rest of the way as he was aided by a triple play in the fifth inning.

SECOND START: He combined with Cook and Balfour on a two-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Cleveland August 27...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...retired each of the first 13 batters before Brantley singled in the fifth...that gave him a streak of 20 consecutive batters retired dating back to his last start...also allowed a leadoff double to Lillibridge in the sixth...allowed just two runners into scoring position.

THIRD START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 6-2 win over Boston September 2 in Oakland...shutout the Red Sox on two hits over the first five innings...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a Ross RBI single.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle September 8...the A's scored a run in the first and he allowed an unearned run in the second...Saunders doubled, went to third on a Drew error and scored on a Robinson fielders choice...the A's scored four times in the fourth inning and he blanked the Mariners on four hits over his final four innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles last Thursday...shutout the Angels on five hits over the first six innings...then allowed five runs in the seventh inning...Hunter led off the inning with a home run and Trumbo had a RBI double...was relieved by Chavez with the bases loaded and two outs and he allowed all three runs to score plus one of his own....Weaver, Jepsen and Maronde combined to shutout the A's on four hits.

ANDERSON vs. DETROIT: Is 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA (14.1 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, all starts...has not faced the Tigers since May 29, 2010 at Detroit when he combined with Ziegler and Breslow on a five-hit shutout in a 6-0 win...tossed 5.2 innings and left after 70 pitches in his first start after his rehab assignment...yielded three of the hits and did not walk a batter...his other two starts came in 2009...the loss was on May 15 at Detroit, in a 14-1 decision...allowed nine runs in 3.1 innings but only three of the runs were earned...was charged with five unearned runs in the first inning after errors by Giambi and Crosby...picked up the win in a 7-1 victory on June 29 in Oakland...blanked the Tigers on four hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the sixth...was relieved by Wuertz with one out in the sixth and runners on first and second and he allowed one of those runs to score.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 4.62 ERA during a six-start rehab assignment...walked just five batters in 25.1 innings (1.78 per nine innings)...allowed a .301 opponents batting average, including .294 (20 for 68) by right-handers and .314 (11 for 35) by left-handers...issued all five of his walks to righties.

underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow July 14...was originally placed on the disabled list June 7...received a Platelet Rich Plasma injection into his elbow June 13 before the decision was made to have surgery...went 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA over his first five starts and did not allow a home run in 34.2 innings...then went 1-5 with a 5.73 ERA over his final eight starts, yielding eight home runs in 48.2 innings...had four walks and 27 strikeouts over his first five starts compared to 21 walks and 34 strikeouts over his final eight...matched his career high by hitting seven batters.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .270 opponents batting average and .335 on-base percentage, both the highest of his three seasons...his opponents average included a .252 (53 for 210) mark against right-handed hitters and .303 (33 for 109) against left-handers...issued just three of his 25 walks to lefties...his opponents average dropped to .221 with runners in scoring position...held opponents to a .216 batting average the first time through the lineup, .245 the second time and .342 after that...surrendered seven of his eight home runs with runners on base.

ON THE BASES: Tied for seventh in the American League with a career-high five pickoffs and now has 14 in his career...opponents were successful in just 5 of 12 (41.7%) stolen base attempts and are 14 for 27 (51.9%) over the last three years after going 14 for 18 (77.8%) during his rookie campaign.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 2.31 ERA over the first three innings of a game and 5.48 ERA from the fourth inning on...was 2-4 with a 3.42 ERA in eight starts during the day, compared to 1-2 with a 4.99 ERA in five starts at night...received run support of two runs or fewer in seven of his 13 starts and was 0-4 in those games...is now 2-20 in 33 career starts with support of less than three runs, 23-4 with run support of three or more...the A's were 5-8 (.385) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings seven times, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (13-10, 3.81 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season...set an Oakland record for wins by a rookie by earning his 13th victory of the season in his last start...broke the previous mark of 12 held by Chris Codiroli (1983) and Joe Blanton (2005)...his wins are the most by an A's rookie since Harry Byrd won 15 for the 1952 Philadelphia A's en route to rookie of the year honors...has picked up the win in each of his last two starts, the sixth time in his career he has won two straight decisions...has never had a three-game winning streak...is now 4-1 with a 2.76 ERA (9 er in 29.1 ip) over his last five starts after going 0-3 with a 7.50 ERA over his previous four starts...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Detroit, an 11-4 A's win in Oakland May 11...he allowed two runs, one earned, over 7.0 innings.

The A's bullpen has allowed 12 runs in 7.2 innings over the past two games after allowing just four runs in its previous nine contests (21.0 ip, 1.71 ERA)...is now 2-0 with 14 saves, no blown saves, a 3.16 ERA (32 er in 91.0 ip) and .200 (66 for 330) opponents batting average over its past 33 games (since August 14)...ranks second in the American League with a 2.98 ERA overall...the last time the bullpen had an ERA under 3.00 was in 1990 (2.35)...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.210), third lowest on-base percentage (.297) and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.333)...has issued the second most walks in the AL (188), is tied for the second most wins (24) and has allowed the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners to score in the AL (31.0%, 58 of 187)
