ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday...have now won nine of the last 13 games, 18 of the last 25 and 24 of the last 33...are 85-64 (.570) for the season, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...it is the A's best record after 149 games since they were 86-63 in 2006...have clinched a winning record for the first time since 2006 (93-69)...the 85 wins are 11 more than last year, which is the A's biggest improvement since they went from 91 wins to 102...the last time the A's improved by 12 or more games was 1998-99 when they went from 74 wins to 87...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by four games...are tied with Baltimore for the first Wild Card slot, 4½ games ahead of third place Los Angeles...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 30 days (since August 22) and 50 of the last 62 (since July 21)...have the **best record in the majors** since the start of July (48-22) and since June 2 (63-34), the date the A's snapped their season-high nine game losing streak...have the **best record in the AL** since the All-Star Break (42-21)...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 80 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in four consecutive games...it is the first time A's starters have tossed fewer than five innings in four straight games since May 18-21, 1996...the last time they did it in more than four straight games was July 19-25, 1993 when they did it in an Oakland record seven consecutive games...Tommy Milone did not factor in the decision yesterday...that snaps a 23-game streak in which A's starting pitchers recorded the decision...it was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1980...had a 26-game streak from August 22-September 19, 2010...A's starters have a 3.75 ERA (373 er in 894.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (92).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 31 runs in 34.0 innings (8.21 ERA) over the past four games after yielding just 21 runs, 19 earned, over their previous nine games (80.0 ip, 2.14 ERA)...however, have a 3.50 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (132), are tied for the most pickoffs (21), rank second in opponents batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.377) and third in on-base percentage (.306) and shutouts (13).

OFFENSE: The A's rank second in the American League with 317 runs scored since the All-Star Break (63 games, 5.03 per game)...were last in the AL in runs before the break (319, 3.71 per game)...have been shut out 16 times, which is tied with Miami for the most in the majors...it is also the third highest total in Oakland history and the most since 1979 (17)...the record is 19 in 1978...are batting .251 (551 for 2195) since the All-Star Break after hitting a Major League low .225 before the break...are batting .236 overall, which is second lowest in the majors...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have the third lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.309) but rank third in walks (501)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98)...A's pinch hitters are batting an AL leading .289 (22 for 76)...pinch hitters also lead the AL in doubles (7), walks (13) and on-base percentage (.385), rank second in slugging percentage (.461) and are third in RBI (15).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have struck out 76 times over the past seven games (10.86 per game) and now have 1264 for the season, which is an on-going Athletics franchise record (previous: 1226 in 2008)...it is also the sixth highest single season total in American League history...the AL record is 1324 by Tampa Bay in 2007...lead the majors in strikeouts.

THE LONG BALL: Josh Reddick has 29 home runs and Yoenis Céspedes has 19...the A's have not had two players hit 20 or more home runs since 2007 (Cust and Swisher)...have 89 home runs since the All-Star Break, which is second most in the majors (CWS, 92)...have 172 home runs overall, which ranks seventh in the American League but is ninth in the majors...it is a 50.9% increase over last year's total of 114...the A's are 71-34 (.676) when they homer, including 36-11 (.766) with two or more homers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this 10-game road trip to Detroit (1-2), New York (three games) and Texas (four games), their final trip of the season...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Seattle (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-1)...it marked the A's second consecutive 6-1 trip, which ties for the sixth best road trip in Oakland history...are 41-33 (.554) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL...have clinched a winning record on the road for the first time since 2006 (44-37)...went 2-1 on their last homestand, a brief three-game stand against Baltimore...are 44-31 (.587) at home, which is the fourth best home record in the AL and the second best home record by an A's team over the last six years (47-34 in 2010).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won 14 of their last 17 one-run games and are now 22-15 (.595) in one-run decisions overall, which is the third best record in the American League...have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...are 20-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the 20 wins are second most in the AL to Baltimore (22)...are 26-23 in games decided in the seventh inning or later...are 9-3 (.750) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the second best record...11 of the A's 12 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings.

ROOKIES: The A's currently have 14 rookies on the roster...have used 18 rookies overall, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (20)...11 of the 18 have been pitchers and they have combined for an Oakland record 257 games pitched...have 42 wins, which is two short of the record of 44 set in 2009...have 538 strikeouts, which is second best to the record of 618 in 2009...have 660.0 innings, which is third best behind 780.2 innings in 2009 and 736.2 innings in 1983.

SIX SERIES IN SIX CITIES: The A's are 9-4 during this 20-game stretch where they will play 17 of 20 games on the road...two of the six teams the A's will face over this stretch are currently in first place in their division (Texas, New York), one is tied for the first Wild Card slot (Baltimore), one is two games out in its division (Detroit) and another is 4½ out in the Wild Card race (Los Angeles)...the stretch began with a seven-game trip to Seattle and Los Angeles, continued with a three-game series at home against Baltimore and concludes with this 10-game road trip to Detroit, New York and Texas.

A's vs. YANKEES

The A's lead the season series, 4-3...all seven games have been played in Oakland...were swept in a three-game series May 25-27 before sweeping a four-game series July 19-22...it was just the A's second four-game sweep against New York since 1914 (July 14-16, 1972 at New York)...are 7-5 against the Yankees over the last 12 games but are 8-20 over the last 28...have lost four consecutive season series to the Yankees and are 11-30 (.268) against New York since 2008...that is the worst record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 225-264 against the Yankees...that includes 124-121 in Oakland and 101-143 in New York...all-time, the A's are 766-1130 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 12 for 12 in save opportunities in 15 games since returning to the closer role August 11.

Josh Donaldson is batting .317 (39 for 123) with 10 doubles, six home runs and 19 RBI in 34 games since he was recalled from Sacramento August 14.

Brandon Moss has six home runs in his last 18 games and is batting .339 (21 for 62) with 15 RBI and 14 runs scored over that span.

Seth Smith hit the 100th double of his career yesterday afternoon.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1970 Vida Blue no hits the Minnesota Twins in the A's 5-0 win at the Coliseum...only a fourth inning, two out walk to Harmon Killebrew prevented Blue from tossing a perfect game...in 1992 Dennis Eckersley becomes the second pitcher in baseball history to record 50 saves when he preserves Ron Darling's 6-5 win at Chicago...he would go on to save a franchise record 51 games and win both the AL MVP and Cy Young awards.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 27th start of the season...the A's are 15-11 (.577) in his starting assignments and his teams are 16-11 (.593) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 19 of his 26 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and walked two batters or fewer 16 times.

ROOKIE WINS: Won his 11th game of the season in his last start, which is tied for fourth most by a rookie in Oakland history...is also tied for fourth among American League rookies in wins...Tommy Milone has 13 wins and they are the second rookie combo in Oakland history to win 10 or more games...the other time was in 2009 when Brett Anderson had 11 and Trevor Cahill 10...A's rookie pitchers have combined for 42 wins, which is second most in Oakland history...the record is 44 in 2009.

MORE ROOKIES LEADERS: Has a 3.51 ERA, which is the lowest among American League rookies with 120 or more innings...ranks fifth in strikeouts (119), innings pitched (161.1) and games started (26)...the strikeouts are fifth most in Oakland history...is one of two A's rookies with at least 20 games started (Milone, 29), marking the third time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with 20 or more starts...the other times were 1978 (Keough 32, Johnson 30) and 2009 (Cahill 32, Anderson 30)...is scheduled to make the 77th start by a rookie this year, which is the fourth most games started by rookie pitchers in Oakland history (116 in 2009, 93 in 1983, 82 in 1978).

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 4-1 with a 2.93 ERA (13 er in 40.0 ip) over his last six starts since August 19...went 5-3 with a 2.46 ERA over his first 13 starts and then went 2-4 with a 6.15 ERA over his next seven starts from July 7 to August 14.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just nine home runs in 161.1 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Gonzalez, WASH 0.43)...since 1992, the only A's pitcher with a lower mark is Tim Hudson in 2004 (0.38, 8 hr in 188.2 ip)...has allowed seven of his nine home runs to left-handed hitters...ranks eighth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.360).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .225 (29 for 129) with runners in scoring position, which is sixth lowest in the American League...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .194 (14 for 72) batting average, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

WALK/DON'T WALK: Has walked three batters or fewer in each of his last 14 starts (22 bb in 87.2 ip, 2.26 per nine innings)...walked four batters or more in six of his first 12 starts (36 bb in 73.2 ip, 4.40 per nine innings)...has issued a team-leading 58 walks for the season...the fewest walks in Oakland history by a team-leader in a non-strike season is 69 by Doug Johns in 1996.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-1 with a 3.26 ERA (25 er in 69.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more and 5-7 with a 3.72 ERA (38 er in 92.0 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest or fewer.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 26 starts...is 0-8 with a 5.59 ERA (34 er in 54.2 ip) in those starts...is 11-0 with a 2.45 ERA (29 er in 106.2 ip) in 16 starts with support of two runs or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 despite a 2.49 ERA (26 er in 94.0 ip) in 14 starts at home compared to 6-3 with a 4.95 ERA (37 er in 67.1 ip) in 12 starts on the road...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered six of his nine home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.64 ERA (17 er in 58.0 ip) in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.01 ERA (46 er in 103.1 ip) in 17 starts at night...is tied for fifth in the American League in day wins.

THE FIFTH INNING: Has allowed 20 of his 64 (31.2%) runs in the fifth inning...has a 7.03 ERA (19 er in 24.1 ip) in the fifth inning and a 2.89 ERA (44 er in 137.0 ip) in all other innings.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 5-2 win over Baltimore last Saturday in Oakland...allowed single runs in the second and third innings on a Reynolds RBI double and a McLouth solo home run...the A's then scored five times in the bottom of the third and he blanked the Orioles on three hits and a walk over his final four innings.

PARKER vs. NEW YORK: He was the winning pitcher in his only career start, a 2-1 A's win in Oakland earlier this year on July 21...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings...allowed his only run in the fourth inning when Rodriguez reached on an infield single, went to third on back-to-back ground outs and scored on an Ibanez single...retired 13 of the final 14 batters he faced after that, including each of the last nine.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts (20.2 ip, 22 h, 6 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 21 so, 2 hr)...struck out 21 batters in 20.2 innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .271 (13 for 48) against right-handed hitter and .281 (9 for 32) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...opponents were 4 for 29 (.138) with runners in scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Travis Blackley (5-3, 3.36 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 22nd appearance and 12th start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his 26th appearance overall this year...has appeared in just seven games since the start of August (five relief appearances, two starts) and is 2-0 with a 3.96 ERA (11 er in 25.0 ip) and .217 (20 for 92) opponents batting average over that span...is 4-3 with a 3.97 ERA (31 er in 70.1 ip) in 12 starts and 1-0 with a 2.86 ERA (9 er in 28.1 ip) in 13 relief appearances...ranks second in the American League with seven pickoffs...has been charged with two balks, which is tied for second in the AL...will be making his first career appearance against New York.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

25-11, 3.00 ERA (453.1 ip, 345 h, 165 r, 151 er, 190 bb, 414 so, 40 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 42/57 (73.7%)

The A's bullpen has allowed 16 runs in 17.2 innings (8.15 ERA) over the past four games after allowing just four runs in its previous nine contests (21.0 ip, 1.71 ERA)...ranks second in the American League with a 3.00 ERA overall...the last time the bullpen had an ERA under 3.00 was in 1990 (2.35)...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.210), third lowest on-base percentage (.296) and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.335)...has the second most wins in the AL (25), has issued the second most walks (190) and allowed the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners to score (30.7%, 59 of 192).

- Is a perfect 12 for 12 in save opportunities in 15 games since returning to the closer role August 11 (12.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 3.55 ERA).
- Has a 6.75 ERA (4 er in 5.1 ip) and .333 (7 for 21) opponents batting average in seven outings in September...logged a 4.50 ERA and .233 opponents average over his first 21 appearances and then had a 1.56 ERA and .119 opponents average over a 39-game stretch from May 20 to August 27.
- Ranks sixth among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.175), is seventh in slugging percentage (.279), tied for ninth in innings pitched (65.2) and is 10th in games (67)...the innings pitched are 1.2 innings short of his career high of 67.1 in 2009.
- Has a 1.21 ERA (5 er in 37.1 ip) in 36 appearances at home compared to a 5.27 ERA (14 er in 27.1 ip) in 31 outings on the road.
- Has not allowed a run in three games against the Yankees this year (3.0 ip, 2 h, 4 so)...is 2-2 with a save and 3.62 ERA in 31 appearances in his career against New York (27.1 ip, 28 h, 12 r, 11 er, 10 bb, 21 so, 5 hr).
- Has 29 career saves, which is the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).
