ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and five of the last six games, after winning eight of the previous nine games and 17 of the previous 21...are 85-66 (.563) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...it is the A's best record after 151 games since they were 88-63 in 2006...have clinched a winning record for the first time since 2006 (93-69)...the 85 wins are 11 more than last year, which is the A's biggest improvement since they went from 91 wins to 102...the last time the A's improved by 12 or more games was 1998-99 when they went from 74 wins to 87...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by four games...are in sole possession of the second Wild Card slot, two games behind first place Baltimore but 2½ games ahead of third place Los Angeles...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 32 days (since August 22) and 52 of the last 64 (since July 21)...have the **best record in the majors** since the start of July (48-24) and since June 2 (63-36), the date the A's snapped their season-high nine game losing streak...have the **best record in the AL** since the All-Star Break (42-23)...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 82 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost back-to-back one-run, extra-inning games (2-1 Friday in 10 innings, 10-9 in 14 frames yesterday)...however, have won 14 of their last 19 one-run games and are now 22-17 (.564) in one-run decisions overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are 9-5 (.643) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and the third best record...12 of the A's 14 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...have a **Major League leading** 13 "walk-off" wins...are 20-13 in games decided in the last at bat...the 20 wins are second most in the AL to Baltimore (23)...are 26-25 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not factored in the decision in the past three games to snap a 23-game streak in which starters recorded the decision...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1980...had a 26-game streak from August 22-September 19, 2010...Jarrod Parker tossed 8.0 innings Friday night, snapping a streak of four consecutive games where A's starting pitchers tossed fewer than five innings...it was the first time A's starters tossed fewer than five innings in four straight games since May 18-21, 1996...A's starting pitchers have a 3.67 ERA (376 er in 922.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (93).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 43 runs in 56.2 innings (6.83 ERA) over the past six games after yielding just 21 runs, 19 earned, over their previous nine games (80.0 ip, 2.14 ERA)...however, have a 3.50 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...have allowed the second fewest home runs in the AL (136), rank second in slugging percentage (.377), are third in shutouts (13), and rank fourth in both opponents on-base percentage (.307) and batting average (.246)...also are tied for the most pickoffs (21).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored the second most runs in the American League since the All-Star Break with 327 (65 games, 5.03 per game)...were last in the AL in runs before the break (319, 3.71 per game)...have been shut out 16 times, which is tied with Miami for the most in the majors...it is also the third highest total in Oakland history and the most since 1979 (17)...the record is 19 in 1978...are batting .250 (570 for 2283) since the All-Star Break after hitting a Major League low .225 before the break...are batting .236 overall, which is second lowest in the majors...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have the third lowest OBP in the AL (.309) but rank third in walks (511)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have struck out 100 times over the past nine games (11.11 per game) and now have 1288 for the season, which is an on-going Athletics franchise record (previous: 1226 in 2008)...it is also the third highest single season total in American League history...the AL record is 1324 by Tampa Bay in 2007...the 1288 strikeouts are the most in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: Yoenis Céspedes hit his 20th home run of the season yesterday, joining Josh Reddick (29) in the A's 20-homer club...it marks the first time since 2007 that two Oakland players have hit 20 home runs in the same season (Cust and Swisher)...have 94 home runs since the All-Star Break, which is tied for most in the majors (CWS)...have 177 home runs overall, which ranks seventh in the American League but is ninth in the majors...it is a 52.6% increase over last year's total of 114...the A's are 71-36 (.664) when they homer, including 36-12 (.750) with two or more homers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this 10-game road trip to Detroit (1-2), New York (0-2) and Texas (four games), their final trip of the season...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Seattle (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-1)...it marked the A's second consecutive 6-1 trip, which ties for the sixth best road trip in Oakland history...are 41-35 (.539) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL...have clinched a winning record on the road for the first time since 2006 (44-37)...went 2-1 on their last homestand, a brief three-game stand against Baltimore...are 44-31 (.587) at home, which is the fourth best home record in the AL and the second best home record by an A's team over the last six years (47-34 in 2010).

ROOKIES: The A's currently have 14 rookies on the roster...have used 18 rookies overall, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (20)...11 of the 18 have been pitchers and they have combined for an Oakland record 263 games pitched...have 42 wins, which is two short of the record of 44 set in 2009...have 552 strikeouts, which is second best to the record of 618 in 2009...have 676.0 innings, which is third best behind 780.2 innings in 2009 and 736.2 innings in 1983.

SIX SERIES IN SIX CITIES: The A's are 9-6 during this 20-game stretch where they will play 17 of 20 games on the road...two of the six teams the A's will face over this stretch are currently in first place in their division (Texas, New York), one has sole possession of the first Wild Card slot (Baltimore), one is ½ game out in its division (Detroit) and another is 2½ out in the Wild Card race (Los Angeles)...the stretch began with a seven-game trip to Seattle and Los Angeles, continued with a three-game series at home against Baltimore and concludes with this 10-game road trip to Detroit, New York and Texas.

A's vs. YANKEES

The A's trail the season series, 4-5, after dropping the first two games of this 3-game set...had previously won four of seven meetings in Oakland, including a four-game sweep July 19-22...it was just the A's second four-game sweep against New York since 1914 (July 14-16, 1972 at New York)...are 7-7 against the Yankees over the last 14 games but are 8-22 over the last 30...have lost four consecutive season series to the Yankees and are 11-32 (.256) against New York since 2008...that is the worst record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 225-266 against the Yankees...that includes 124-121 in Oakland and 101-145 in New York...all-time, the A's are 766-1132 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 12 for 12 in save opportunities in 15 games since returning to the closer role August 11.

Josh Donaldson is batting .301 (40 for 133) with 19 runs, 11 doubles, six home runs and 19 RBI in 36 games since he was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento August 14.

Brandon Moss has seven home runs in his last 20 games and is batting .362 (25 for 69) with 16 RBI and 15 runs scored over that span.

Jonny Gomes leads the majors with a .500 average (12 for 24) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

in 1973 Vida Blue wins his 20th as the A's win at Chicago 10-5 to clinch their third consecutive AL Western Division title...in 1988 Jose Canseco steals his 40th base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season and his career, his fifth since being reinstated from the disabled list September 1...the A's are 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in nine of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer all 12 times.

FIRST LOSS: Was charged with his first loss of the season in his last start after starting his career 6-0...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to start his career 6-0...since 1927, the only Athletics pitcher to begin his career at least 6-0 is Jim Nash, who went 7-0 over his first nine career starts in 1966...the six-game winning streak matched the longest by an Athletic this year (McCarthy, April 27-June 19).

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his first 12 starts, which is the longest streak to start a career by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1918...has walked just 12 batters in 69.2 innings, an average of 1.55 per nine innings...has 56 strikeouts for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.67.

IN SEPTEMBER: Is 3-1 with a 2.52 ERA (7 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts in September...has walked just two batters in 25.0 innings while striking out 21...is tied for the American League lead in wins in September.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 13 for 71 (.183) with one walk (.194 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .197 (38 for 193) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .273 (18 for 66) after that...has yielded a .196 (35 for 179) batting average with the bases empty compared to .263 (21 for 80) with runners on base...five of his eight home runs allowed have been solo shots...has allowed a .387 (12 for 31) batting average to the opponents number three hitter compared to .193 (44 for 228) against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-0 with a 1.73 ERA (8 er in 41.2 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 4-1 with a 3.54 ERA (11 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more

BRIEFLY: Is 3-1 with a 2.52 ERA (7 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list September 1...was placed on the 15-day DL August 5 with right shoulder tightness...went 1-0 with a 4.90 ERA (7.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 7 so) in two rehab starts with Sacramento on August 22 against Salt Lake and August 27 at Colorado Springs...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 after combining for a 6-3 record and a 2.66 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...made his Major League debut and went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA in eight starts before going on the DL.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is one of four rookies currently in the A's starting rotation (Milone, Parker, Straily)...this is the second time this year the A's have four rookies in the rotation (August 3-6)...prior to that, the last time the A's had at least four rookies in the rotation was in 2009 when they did it from June 2 through the end of the season...is scheduled to make the 78th start by a rookie this year, which is the fourth most games started by rookie pitchers in Oakland history (116 in 2009, 93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...rookies have 42 of the A's wins, which is second most in Oakland history...the record is 44 in 2009.

CAREER OPENERS: Went 6-0 with a 1.94 ERA over his first 11 starts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in NL, 1913 in AL), he is just the second pitcher to be undefeated in at least his first 11 Major League appearances, all starts, while maintaining an ERA under 2.00...the other is Jered Weaver, who went 9-0 with a 1.95 ERA over his first 12 starts with the Angels in 2006...is the only ML pitcher since at least 1918 to allow three runs or fewer and walk two batters or fewer in each of his first 11 career starts...the previous best was eight by Brian Holton, who did it from September 7, 1986-June 9, 1989 (had 112 relief appearances during that stretch)...is the first Athletics pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings and allow three runs or fewer in each of his first seven starts...the previous high was five by John Henry Johnson (1978) and Dave Hamilton (1972)...is the second Major Leaguer to do it over the last 18 years...the other is Jered Weaver, who had nine straight with Los Angeles (AL) in 2006... is just the sixth pitcher since 1918 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of six or more innings and four hits or fewer (last: Jeremy Hellickson, TB, August 2-15, 2010)...is one of two Athletics since 1918 to begin his career with three consecutive no decisions, all as a starting pitcher (Willie Adams, June 11-July 31, 1996).

LAST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 12-2 loss at Detroit last Tuesday...allowed a career-high five runs on a career-high tying eight hits in 4.2 innings...also surrendered a career-high three home runs...the A's scored a run in the first inning but he allowed single runs in each of the first three innings on a Cabrera sacrifice fly, a Peralta home run and a Cabrera home run...also allowed a two-run home run to Fielder in the fifth.

GRIFFIN vs. NEW YORK: He was the winning pitcher in his only career start, a 4-3 A's win in Oakland earlier this year on July 19...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings and retired 11 straight through the end of the fifth inning...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the sixth inning on a Teixeira sacrifice fly and a Swisher RBI single...was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh.

MINORS: Combined for a 7-3 record and a 2.82 ERA (102.0 ip, 79 h, 39 r, 32 er, 18 bb, 91 so, 7 hr) in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...began the year at Midland and was 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA in seven starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento May 11...went 3-2 with a 2.81 ERA in eight starts with the River Cats before he was promoted to Oakland June 24...was 4-2 with a 3.07 ERA in 10 starts overall with Sacramento...issued 18 walks in 102.0 innings, an average of 1.59 per nine innings...struck out 91 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.06...allowed a .211 opponents batting average, including .181 (33 for 182) against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (46 for 193) against right-handers...surrendered just seven home runs in 102.0 innings, an average of 0.62 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Dan Straily (2-1, 4.13 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career, his third since being recalled Sept. 7...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments... is one of four rookies currently in the starting rotation (Griffin, Milone, Parker)...this is the second time this year the A's have four rookies in the rotation (Aug. 3-6)...prior to that, the last time the A's had at least four rookies in the rotation was in 2009 when they did it from June 2 through the end of the season...is scheduled to make the 79th start by a rookie this year, which is the fourth most games started by rookie pitchers in Oakland history (116 in 2009, 93 in 1983, 82 in 1978))...was the losing pitcher in his last start Sept. 16, a 9-5 loss to Baltimore in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed single runs in the second, third, fourth and fifth...Wieters had solo home runs in the second and fourth and Hardy had a RBI single in the third...walked Reynolds with the bases loaded and two outs in the fifth and was relieved by Blackley, trailing 4-2...prior to his Sept. 7 call-up, combined for a 9-7 record and a 2.78 ERA in 25 starts with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...will be making his first career appearance against Texas.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

25-13, 3.03 ERA (466 ip, 359 h, 172 r, 157 er, 196 bb, 423 so, 43 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 42/57 (73.7%)

The A's bullpen has allowed 23 runs in 28.1 innings (7.31 ERA) over the past six games after allowing just four runs in its previous nine contests (21.0 ip, 1.71 ERA)...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.03 ERA overall...the last time the bullpen had an ERA under 3.00 was in 1990 (2.35)...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.213), third lowest on-base percentage (.298) and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.340)...has the second most wins in the AL (25), has issued the second most walks (196) and allowed the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners to score (31.3%, 62 of 198).

- Was designated for assignment by the Cleveland Indians Aug. 5 and cleared waivers and became a free agent Aug. 1...was signed by the A's and assigned to Sacramento on Aug. 15.
- Has pitched in parts of eight Major League seasons with San Francisco (2005-06), Toronto (2006-10), Baltimore (2011) and Cleveland (2012), recording a 10-20 mark and 4.27 ERA with 38 saves in 261 career appearances.
- Originally signed a minor league contract with the Indians Jan. 19, and posted a 0-0 record and 4.58 ERA (18 er, 35.1 ip) with 28 strikeouts and 16 walks in 26 relief appearances this season.
- His best campaign came in 2007 with the Blue Jays, when he registered a 4-4 mark and 2.14 ERA with 30 saves in 64 appearances, allowing only 51 hits in 67.1 innings while striking out 57 and walking 24 batters.
- In seven relief outings with Sacramento, Accardo scuffled a 1-0 record and 1.17 ERA in 7.2 innings, yielding seven hits while fanning four and issuing three bases on balls.
