A's vs. RANGERS

The season series is tied at seven games each...the A's are 3-5 in Texas compared to 4-2 in Oakland...have lost five of the previous six season series and are 58-70 (.453) against Texas over that span (since 2006)...are 299-314 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 160-146 in Oakland and 139-168 in Texas...have an all-time record of 396-396 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 14 for 14 in save opportunities in 17 games since returning to the closer role August 11.

Josh Donaldson is batting .297 (43 for 145) with seven home runs and 21 RBI in 39 games since he was recalled from Sacramento August 14.

Jonny Gomes is hitting .339 (19 for 56) with runners in scoring position, including .480 (12 for 25) with RISP and two outs...his batting average with RISP and two outs leads the majors.

Brandon Moss has seven home runs in his last 23 games and is batting .359 (28 for 78) with 16 RBI and 18 runs scored over that span.

Cliff Pennington is 24 for 71 (.338) with 12 runs scored, three home runs and 10 RBI over his last 21 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1971 Vida Blue strikes out four Milwaukee Brewers in his final start of the season to bringh his season total to 301...he joins Rube Waddell, who struck out 302 batters in 1903 and 349 the following season, as the only two Athletic pitchers to fan 300 in a single season...in 2002 the A's clinch their second AL West title in the last three years and win their 100th game of the season with a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle...Miguel Tejada collects his 200th hit of the season in that game to become the first Oakland player to reach the 200 plateau.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last nine games after winning eight of the previous nine contests and 17 of the previous 21...are 87-67 (.565) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...have clinched a winning record for the first time since 2006 (93-69)...the 87 wins are 13 more than last year, which is the A's biggest improvement since 1998-99 when they went from 74 wins to 87...the last time the A's improved by more than 13 games in a non-strike shortened season was 1987-88 when they went from 81 wins to 104...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by four games...are in sole possession of the second Wild Card slot, ½ game behind first place Baltimore and two games ahead of third place Los Angeles...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 35 days (since August 22) and 55 of the last 67 (since July 21)...have the best record in the majors since the start of July (50-25) and since June 2 (65-37), the date the A's snapped their season-high nine game losing streak...have the best record in the AL since the All-Star Break (44-24)...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 85 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won last night, 3-2, in 10 innings...it was their fifth consecutive game decided by one run and they are 2-3 over that span...however, have won 16 of their last 22 one-run games and are 29-18 (.617) in one-run decisions overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are now 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...have the second most extra inning wins in the AL and are tied for the second best record...12 of the A's 15 extra inning games have lasted more than 10 innings...including a 14-inning contest that lasted 5 hours, 43 minutes Saturday afternoon in New York, which was the second longest time of game in Oakland history (6:00, at New York, August 9, 2002)...have a Major League leading 13 "walk-off" wins...are 21-14 in games decided in the last at bat...the 21 wins are second most in the AL to Baltimore (24)...are 27-26 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have struck out 1322 times this season, which is an on-going Athletics franchise record (previous: 1226 in 2008) and the second highest single season total in American League history...are two short of the AL record of 1324 set by Tampa Bay in 2007...lead the majors in strikeouts.

THE LONG BALL: Josh Reddick has 29 home runs and Yoenis Céspedes has 21...it marks the first time since 2007 that two Oakland players have hit 20 home runs in the same season (Cust and Swisher)...have 99 home runs since the All-Star Break, which is tied with the White Sox for the **most in the majors.**..have 182 home runs overall, which is tied for sixth in the American League and tied for seventh in the majors...it is a 59.6% increase over last year's total of 114...the A's are 73-37 (.664) when they homer, including 37-13 (.740) with two or more home runs

OFFENSE: The A's have scored the second most runs in the American League since the All-Star Break with 339 (68 games, 4.99 per game)...were last in the AL in runs before the break (319, 3.71 per game)...have been shut out 16 times, which is tied with Miami for the most in the majors...it is also the third highest total in Oakland history and the most since 1979 (17)...the record is 19 in 1978...are batting .248 (593 for 2388) since the All-Star Break after hitting a Major League low .225 before the break...are batting .236 overall, which is second lowest in the majors...the lowest batting average in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have the third lowest on base percentage in the AL (.309) but rank third in walks (523)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.99)...A's pinch hitters are batting an AL leading .280 (23 for 82)...pinch hitters also lead the AL in doubles (7), walks (14), on-base percentage (.384) and slugging percentage (.476) and rank third in RBI (16).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.48 ERA, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...lead the AL in pickoffs (23), have allowed the second fewest home runs (139), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.377), third in batting average (.246) and shutouts (13) and fourth in on-base percentage (.307)...A's starting pitchers have not recorded the decision in any of the past six games after recording the decision in each of the previous 23 games...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1980...had a 26-game streak from August 22-September 19, 2010...A's starting pitchers have a 3.72 ERA (381 er in 921.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL and have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (95).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one or more errors in each of the past four games (eight errors total) and now have 104 errors on the season, which is second most in the American League...A's outfielders rank second in the AL in assists (36).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-5 on this 10-game road trip to Detroit (1-2), New York (1-2) and Texas (1-1), their final trip of the season...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Seattle (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-1)...it marked the A's second consecutive 6-1 trip, which ties for the sixth best road trip in Oakland history...are 43-36 (.544) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL...have clinched a winning record on the road for the first time since 2006 (44-37)...went 2-1 on their last homestand, a brief three-game stand against Baltimore...are 44-31 (.587) at home, which is the fourth best home record in the AL and the second best home record by an A's team over the last six years (47-34 in 2010).

ROOKIES: The A's currently have 14 rookies on the roster...have used 18 rookies overall, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (20)...11 of the 18 have been pitchers and they have combined for an Oakland record 272 games pitched...have 43 wins, which is one short of the record of 44 set in 2009...have 572 strikeouts, which is second best to the record of 618 in 2009...have 699.1 innings, which is third best behind 780.2 innings in 2009 and 736.2 innings in 1983.

SIX SERIES IN SIX CITIES: The A's are 11-7 during this 20-game stretch where they will play 17 of 20 games on the road...two of the six teams the A's have faced over this stretch are currently in first place in their division (Texas, New York), one is tied for first in its division (Detroit), one has sole possession of the first Wild Card slot (Baltimore) and another is two out in the Wild Card race (Los Angeles)...the stretch began with a seven-game trip to Seattle and Los Angeles, continued with a three-game series at home against Baltimore and concludes with this 10-game road trip to Detroit, New York and Texas.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 28th start of the season...the A's are 15-12 (.556) in his starting assignments and his teams are 16-12 (.571) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 20 of his 27 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 17 times and walked two batters or fewer 17 times.

RUNS ALLOWED: Allowed just one run in his last start and has allowed one run or fewer in 14 of his 28 ca starts...however, is 8-0 with six 28 career decisions in those 14 starts...is one of four starting pitchers since 1918 to allow one run or fewer in at least 14 of his first 28 career appearances...the only one with more is Stephen Strasburg (15) and the other two are Justin Verlander and Dwight Gooden.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his 27 starts...is 0-8 with a 5.03 ERA (35 er in 62.2 ip) in those starts...is 11-0 with a 2.45 ERA (29 er in 106.2 ip) in 16 starts with support of two runs or more.

RECENTLY: Is 2-1 with a 1.86 ERA (6 er in 29.0 ip) in four starts in September...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA in September...is 4-1 with Sept. 21 at NYY a 2.63 ERA (14 er in 48.0 ip) over his last

seven starts since August 19...went 5-3 with a 2.46 ERA over his first 13 starts and then went 2-4 with a 6.15 ERA over his next seven starts from July 7 to August 14.

ROOKIE WIINS: Won his 11th game of the season September 15, which is tied for fourth most by a rookie in Oakland history...is also fifth among American League rookies in wins...Tommy Milone has 13 wins and they are the second rookie combo in Oakland history to win 10 or more games...the other time was in 2009 when Brett Anderson had 11 and Trevor Cahill 10...A's rookie pitchers have combined for 43 wins, which is second most in Oakland history...the record is 44 in 2009.

MORE ROOKIES LEADERS: Has a 3.40 ERA, which is the lowest among American League rookies with 100 or more innings...ranks fifth in strikeouts (126), innings pitched (169.1) and games started (27)...the strikeouts are fifth most in Oakland history...is one of two A's rookies with at least 20 games started (Milone, 30), marking the third time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with 20 or more starts...the other times were 1978 (Keough 32, Johnson 30) and 2009 (Cahill 32, Anderson 30)...is scheduled to make the 81st start by a rookie this year, which is the fourth most games started by rookie pitchers in Oakland history (116 in 2009, 93 in 1983, 82 in 1978).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just nine home runs in 169.1 innings, an average of 0.48 per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Gonzalez, WASH 0.42)...since 1992, the only A's pitcher with a lower mark is Tim Hudson in 2004 (0.38, 8 hr in 188.2 ip)...has allowed seven of his nine home runs to left-handed hitters...ranks sixth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.354).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .221 (29 for 131) with runners in scoring position, which is sixth lowest in the American League...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .187 (14 for 75) batting average, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

WALK/DON'T WALK: Has walked three batters or fewer in each of his last 15 starts (22 bb in 95.2 ip, 2.07 per nine innings)...walked four batters or more in six of his first 12 starts (36 bb in 73.2 ip, 4.40 per nine innings)...has issued a team-leading 58 walks for the season...the fewest walks in Oakland history by a team-leader in a non-strike season is 69 by Doug Johns in 1996.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 6-1 with a 3.04 ERA (26 er in 77.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more and 5-7 with a 3.72 ERA (38 er in 92.0 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest or fewer.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 despite a 2.49 ERA (26 er in 94.0 ip) in 14 starts at home compared to 6-3 with a 4.54 ERA (38 er in 75.1 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has the sixth lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered six of his nine home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.64 ERA (17 er in 58.0 ip) in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 3.80 ERA (47 er in 111.1 ip) in 18 starts at night...is tied for sixth in the American League in day wins.

THE FIFTH INNING: Has allowed 20 of his 65 (30.8%) runs in the fifth inning...has a 6.75 ERA (19 er in 25.1 ip) in the fifth inning and a 2.81 ERA (45 er in 144.0 ip) in all other innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at New York last Friday...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just one run in the fourth inning on a Granderson sacrifice fly...Sabathia shutout the A's on three hits over the first eight inning before Moss had a pinch hit home run in the ninth inning off Soriano to send the game into extra innings.

PARKER vs. TEXAS: He was the winning pitcher in his only career start, a 12-1 A's win in Oakland June 4...tossed a career-high 8.0 shutout innings and yielded just one hit...no-hit the Rangers over the first seven innings...Young then singled to lead off the eighth...walked three batters and did not allow a runner past first base.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts (20.2 ip. 22 h, 6 r, 5 er, 6 bb. 21 so, 2 hr)...struck out 21 batters in 20.2 innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .271 (13 for 48) against right-handed hitter and .281 (9 for 32) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...opponents were 4 for 29 (.138) with runners in scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Travis Blackley (5-3, 3.48 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23rd appearance and 14th start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his 27th appearance overall this year...has appeared in just eight games since the start of August (five relief appearances, three starts) and is 2-0 with a 4.33 ERA (13 er in 27.0 ip) and .233 (24 for 103) opponents batting average over that span... is 4-3 with a 4.11 ERA (33 er in 72.1 ip) in 13 starts and 1-0 with a 2.86 ERA (9 er in 28.1 ip) in 13 relief appearances...ranks second in the American League with seven pickoffs...has been charged with three balks, which is second most in the AL...is 2-1 with a 5.16 ERA (22.2 ip, 26 h, 13 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, all starts, against Texas...including 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA (17.0 ip, 20 h, 9 r, 9 er, 3 bb, 12 so) in three starts this year.

The A's bullpen has allowed 26 runs, 25 earned, in 40.2 innings (5.53 ERA) over the past nine games after allowing just four runs in its previous nine contests (21.0 ip, 1.71 ERA)...ranks second in the American League with a 3.02 ERA overall...the last time the bullpen had an ERA under 3.00 was in 1990 (2.35)...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.213), third lowest on-base percentage (.299) and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.339)...has the second most wins in the AL (27), has issued the second most walks (202) and allowed the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners to score (30.9%, 63 of 204).
